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MINUTES OF THE NINTH SESSION

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SYNOD OF THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA, &c.,

HEDELLAT ---- 11 OK OK 1948

Coronto, October 10, 1848.

I. SEDERUNT

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The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada, after Sermon by the Moderator, the Rev. John Jennings, from Re xi. 15, met and was constituted.

In the absence of the Rev. William Proudfoot, Synod Clerk, the Rev. George Murray was chosen Clerk pro tempore.

Proceeded to make up the Roll of Synod.

The Presbytery of London reported, that since the Mr. John Preudlast meeting of Synod they had ordained the Rev. John foot's name added to the Roll of Sy-Proudfoot to the pastoral charge of the United Congregation of St. Mary's and Downie on the 16th of July last, and that his name was added to the Roll of Presbytery. Ordered, that his name be added to the Roll of Synod.

The Rev. Walter Scott being present was invited to take his seat in Court.

The Rev. David Coutts was now chosen Moderator. and took the chair.

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Appointed the Rev. Messrs. Dick, Torrance, and Committee of Bills Fletcher, and Mr. Short, elder, a Committee on Bills and Overtures. and Overtures ; Mr. Dick, Convener. Said Committee to report at next Sederunt. include to trangely

Appointed the Rev. Messrs. Dalrymple, Roy, Lawrence, Jennings, Murray and Skinner, a Comm ttee to mature the business regarding the Theological Institute; Mr. Roy, Convener. Committee to report at Sederunt of to-morrow forenoon.

Rev. Mr. Proudfoot was requested to confer with said Committee.

The Committee was instructed to consider the following points, viz .-- 1. Is it expedient to continue the present system ? 2. The ways and means of supporting the Institution. 3. Its location.

Also, another extract dated 22nd March, 1847.

Parties were heard at length and removed.

After deliberation, it was resolved, on motion of Mr. Jennings, seconded by Mr. Dunbar, To waive consideration of the merits of the appeal, and proceed to hear Mr. Ritchie and Mrs. Clarke on what Mrs. Clarke maintains as the original cause of the whole of her complaints,

Resumed Mrs. Clarke's case in terms of the motion adopted at the close of last Sederunt,

Mrs. Clarke being called on, stated the following as her complaints:

1. That in the act of discipline of which Mary Anderson was the subject, Mr. Ritchie had named her son

who was not a member of the church, as particeps criminis.

2. That he had done so without any authority or acknowledgment from her son.

3. That her son was represented as having committed a crime worse than the most atrocious murder.

The above being read to Mrs. Clarke, she declares that it is a full statement of her original grievance.

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Mr. Ritchie being called upon, stated that, in rebuking Mary Anderson he made use of what he considered the common form in such cases. That he announced the case to the congregation in the terms of her (Mary Anderson's) confession, i. e. that she confessed the sin of fornication with James Clarke. Farther, that in his address to the congregation he endeavoured to point out the aggravated nature of this sin ; that he quoted a passage or passages of the word of God in which this sin is classed with other sins, and amongst the rest, with murder. That, though not distinctly recollecting what he said, he thinks that he may have used such expressions as the following, viz .- That the sin was distinguished from other sins, inasmuch as more than one individual was implicated, and that in some respects it may be said to be worse than murder. Farther, That at the same time he rebuked another woman for the . same sin, and that they were both addressed in the same language.

Mrs. Clarke being asked if she heard the rebuke, stated that being sick she was not present.

Parties being heard were removed.

The Synod proceeded to deliberate in the case.

On motion of Mr. Dalrymple, seconded by Mr. Tor-Goderich petitionrance, ordered: That the petition presented as No. 7 by the Committee of Bills and Overtures being a petition from the Congregation of Goderich on Finance be remitted to the Presbytery of London for transmission to the Treasurer of the Synod's grant,

VI. SEDERUNT .- 2 o'clock, p. m.

The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and was constituted by the Rev. Mr. Coutts, Moderator.

Mrs. Clarke's case resumed.

Resumed consideration of Mrs. Clarke's case.

It was moved by Mr. Jennings and seconded by Mr. Fraser, That having heard the statement of Mrs. Clarke as to the grounds of her complaint against Mr. Ritchie, and having heard Mr. Ritchie's statement, find, that Mrs. Clarke acted in the case under misinformation or misapprehension of what was stated by Mr. Ritchie in the rebuke of Mary Anderson, and therefore, that Mrs. Clarke had no sufficient grounds of complaint. That Mr. Ritchie, in characterizing the offence, should not be restricted or limited to any precise form or set of words. And it appearing that Mr. Ritchie had no intention in what he stated in said rebuke, of injuring the character of James Clarke, or wounding the feelings of his mother, Mrs. Clarke should now feel satisfied to cease from any further complaints. And as she declares that she absented herself from public worship because of imputing a wrong design to Mr. Ritchie in making such statement, recommend her to go to Mr. Ritchie and the Session of West Dumfries, and allow that she is now satisfied with Mr. Ritchie's explanations, and if she shall do so, leave the Session of West Dumfries to replace her in her membership if they shall see cause.

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It was moved in amendment by Mr. Henderson, and seconded by Mr. Lawrence, That the Synod having heard both Mrs. Clarke's and Mr. Ritchie's statement of the original ground of Mrs. Clarke's complaint against Mr. Ritchie, find, That Mr. Ritchie did use James Clarke's name in connexion with the case; That Mr. Ritchie did not say that James Clarke was guilty of a crime worse than the most atrocious murder; That Mrs. Clarke had received an erroneous impression of Mr. Ritchie's language and design; That the form used by Mr. Ritchie has been frequently practised in the church :---and therefore Mr. Ritchie cannot be blamed, and therefore dismiss the complaint as groundless. At the same time, the Synod recommend to the

West Dumfries Session to deal privately and affectionately with Mrs. Clarke, endeavour to bring her to a proper state of mind in reference to this matter, and to take such steps as shall, by the divine blessing, tend to promote the peace and prosperity of the church.

The vote was then taken, when there appeared-for And decided. the motion, 14; for the amendment, 3. Likeas, the Synod did, and hereby do, decide in terms of the motion.

Suitable advices were then addressed to Mrs. Clarke by the Moderator.

In Amendment, it was moved by Mr. Dick, seconded by Mr. Skinner-

That the Overture be now adopted.

The vote being taken, the amendment was carried.

Mr. Koy craved leave to dissent from this Resolution, because he believes that the appointment of an Assistant Clerk will lead to an unnecessary waste of the Synod's funds.

Mr. Torrance also craved leave to dissent.

Mr. Fraser was then appointed Assistant Clerk of Synod.

Agreed, that the salary of the Clerk of Synod shall be £10 per annum, and that of the Assistant Clerk £6. This resolution to take effect from this time.

Adjourned to meet at 63 o'clock.

Concluded with prayer.

VII. SEDERUNT.-61 o'clock, p. m.

The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church met, and was constituted by the Rev. Mr. Coutts, Moderator.

Took up the Report of the Committee on Statistics. Having considered the Report in detail, it was agreed that it be adopted.

Appointed Messrs. Jennings and Dalrymple a Committee to draft a plan for carrying these Statistics into effect. To report to-morrow morning.

Theological Institution. The Committee appointed to mature the business regarding the Theological Institute reported, That they had met and entered upon the consideration of the subject, but had not been able to agree npon any definite scheme.

The subject was discussed at great length, till the hour of adjournment:

Adjourned to meet to-morrow morning at 9 o'clock. Closed with prayer.

VIII. SEDERUNT.—15th Oct., 1848, 9 o'clock, a. m.

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The Synod of the United Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and was constituted by Mr. Coutts, Moderator.

Read the Minutes of last Sederunt.

Ordered, That Mr. Scott remain six weeks in each of the Presbyteries of London, Flamboro' and Toronto, to commence with Toronto. And that Mr. Wm. Christie, when licensed, shall continue six weeks in the Flamboro' Presbytery, and then six weeks in the Toronto Presbytery; and the slx weeks thereafter in the London Presbytery, and that he shall not be required to go to Canada East before the opening of the navigation in spring.

Ordered, That Mr. Kennedy put himself under the direction of the Flamboro' Presbytery after the second Sabbath of December, for one month, and for the same time thereafter under the Toronto Presbytery, and then return to the Presbytery of London.

Appointed Messrs. Jennings and Barrie, a Committee to visit the Theological Institute, and to report at next meeting of Synod.

That the Clerks of Presbyteries send a copy to each congregation within their bounds before the first of January every year; said copy to be filled up by the Clerk of Session and Treasurer of the Congregation, and remitted to the Presbytery Clerk before the first That the returns thus obtained be, by the of March. Clerk of each Presbytery, engrossed in a copy to be trans-mitted before the first of April to the Convener of the Missions' Committee, as the ground of procedure for that Committee, and as a part of its annual report to the Synod.

Agreed, that when the Minutes of Synod are printed, the matter contained in the printed copies shall form sufficient ground of action in all cases, without written extracts from the original manuscript minutes.

APPENDICES.

APPENDIX No. 1.

A SYSTEM OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE CONGREGATIONS UNDER THE IN-SPECTION OF THE SYNOD OF THE UNITED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA.

I.-The title and designation of this Congregation shall be -

II.—There shall be ——— Managers of the temporal affairs of said Congregation, who must be members in full communion.

III.-The duties of said Managers shall be :---

1. To appoint their own Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. The Chairman to have the power of calling Meetings of the Managers when he shall think it necessary; or when requested to do so by at least two of the Managers.

2. To receive and disburse by their Treasurer, all monies which may be raised by the Congregation—either for the support of gospel ministrations, or for any other purpose not properly under the jurisdiction of the Session.

3. To cause to be kept a faithful account in a Book or Books of all their receipts and expenditure, and also regular Minutes of all their Meetings.

4. They shall receive vouchers, through their Treasurer, for al their disbursements.

5. They shall call meetings of the Congregation for secular affairs, when they shall deem it necessary, or when requested to do so by at least

six members, sanctioned by the Session, and the objects of the Meeting specified in writing by said Members.

6. They shall submit all their books and papers containing their infromissions, minutes, and vouchers at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation, or at any General Meeting, when said books and papers may be demanded. It being understood that all accounts shall be balanced up tothe 31st December in each year.

IV.—That should a vacancy of one-third of the Managers occur during the interval of two Annual Meetings, the remaining Managers shall call a General Meeting of the Congregation, for the purpose of electing Managers to fill such vacancy.

V.--A vacancy shall be held to have occurred by such circumstances as--

1. The death of a Manager.

P.

2. By his removal out of the bounds of the Congregation.

3. When any Manager shall have given in a written resignation of his office to the Chairman or Secretary, and the same been accepted.

4. When any Mahager shall not be recognised as a Member by Session of said Congregation.

VI.—That an Annual Meeting of the Congregation shall be held on the most convenient day in the month of January, in each year; and that all members in full communion, and they only, shall have a right to vote at such Annual or General Meeting of the Congregation.

UVII.—That the order of procedure at any Annual or General Meeting shall be as follows :

The Meeting shall appoint a Chairman and Secretary for said Meeting; the Secretary to record the proceedings of such meeting in a book kept for that purpose, which records or minutes shall be signed by the Chairman and Secretary; and said book shall be given in charge to the Clerk of Session—and shall by him be produced at every Annual or General Meeting of the Congregation.

VIH: The Meeting, after the election of their Chairman and Secretary, and after the reading of the minute of the preceding Meeting, shall hear the report of their Managers for the past year, and shall appoint two members to audit their books. Then they shall elect the requisite number of Managers by a majority of votes.

IX.—That the Managers shall be chosen for one year only, but may be re-elected.

X.—That an intimation of every Annual or General Meeting of the Congregation shall be given in the Church at the conclusion of public worship on the Sabbath preceding such Meeting, or on the Sabbath nearest preceding such Meeting on which there shall be public worship in the Congregation.
