# Important Matters In Sessional Programme Of Quebec Legislature

Montread, Que., Dec. 7.—When the fifteenth Quebec Legislature is called into session on Wednesday by Sir Charles Fitzpatrick it will be found that there are many important matters in the address from the Throne. As a general thing the address from the Throne at Quebec, for some years must at any rate, has been a very lengthy document, nor very definite as to what to be expected during the session as the government program. The address this session, however, will have much that is definite as to government program.

The programme, amounced by Sir Lomer Gouin and his ministers during the last provincial elections will be, in large measure, reflected in the address. There will be reference to the fact that \$6,000,000 is to be spent in colonization work. This was the main item in the Prime Minister's platform when he went before the people with a request for a "Peace Mandate" of reconstruction. The address will refer to the reasons which make it necessary that progressive and energetic steps be taken towards colonization, though until the session opensit will not be definitely known how far the matter will be gone into in the address.
