NOTES AND NEWS.

NOVA SCOTIA. The Snow Sheds over the Intercolonial bequids have been commenced. A Railway from the Five Islands, Cumberland County, to meet the Spring Hill and Parrsboro', Railway two miles from Parrsboro' village is the latest project. The principal object of such a line would be to carry coal to the smelting Furnaces

The railway terminus at Parrsboro, the Post understands is to be at Whitehall Creek, which runs east into the river, a few hundred yards below the vil-lage. It is proposed to have a dock constructed to retain the tide in the creek, thereby enabling at least twenty vessels to lay afloat at all times.

A burglar giving his name as Michael Morooney, attempted to enter the residence of Mr. Henry Finlay, Dartmouth, early on Sunday morning. Mr. Finlay was aroused by the noise, and, with the aid of his brother, captured the burglar. On Monday, Morooney was examined before Justice Russell, and committed for trial.

In Boston, Saturday evening, experiments were made with an invention to concentrate the force of from four to ight steam fire engines on one stream of eight steam fire engines on one stream of water. In this way the force of all is thrown into one stream. In the early part of July the doctor found the great circular wall of Troy, and subsequently in the immediate vicinity of Priam's palace he struck a large copper object of singular form, which claimed his attention the more as he discovered gold behind it. To save the treasure from the cupidity of his workmen and preserve it for the benefit of science, he ordered his assistants to quit work, and as soon as they were out of sight he, with the assistance of his wife, succeeded in cutting out the treasure, which proved to be the royal jewelbox mentioned in the Hiad. In and around it were discovered jewelled vases, goblets and bowls, Homeric talents and Trojan spears, and finally, in a hidden corner, the key to the treasure box. In the largest vase he found two magnificent golden head-bands and one frontlet, and four splendid ear-pendants of gold. On these lay fifty-six golden ear-rings of most singular design, and thousands of very small rings, dice and buttons of gold. Then followed six golden bracelets, and seventy-four chains used for adorning the temple. In conclusion Dr. Schiltermann expresses the hope of finding more treasures. 
