**NEW CARLISLE**

A number of people witnessed the hauling of a large load of logs on Saturday, Mar. 12th, at the landings of the Shives Lumber Co. Ltd. on Frog Brook.

The load consisted of two hundred and sixty five (265) logs, cedar and spruce mixed, and was hauled by one pair of horses, Rock and Rowdy, and driven by Ward Donaghy, of Upper Nelson, Northumberland Co.

Mr. Benj. F. Underhill, camp foreman, supervised the work of loading and it was pulled onto the barges without a hitch.

Among the spectators was Mr. Jas. King, game warden of Campbellton, and Mr. R. Bruce McLeod, government scaler, who on invitation of A. J. Sproul, scaler for the Shives Lumber Co., scaled the load, which contained 1242 feet.

The top loaders were Matthew Sargent of Clinton, Ont. Co., and Elijah Porter of Shives Mill, while Chas. Curtis of Blackville, and Patrick Higgins of Renoue River were ground men.

The sleds upon which this load was loaded were built by R. Underhill, the steel castings being furnished by Duncan & McLennan of Campbellton.

This is the largest load of logs as yet hauled in this province by horse power. The L. N. N. train passed down while the load stood intact on the landing, and was viewed by F. M. Anderson, Jas. McDonald and others.





charged this \$100,000 to current expenditure, but when the ministers saw the situation, notwithstanding the audit and their declaration regarding the charging of bridge expenditure to current revenue, they passed an order-in-council transferring the item to permanent account, without any legislative authority whatever, thus lessening the current expenditure.

Instead of the claimed surplus of \$4,454, there was a very large deficit. The expenditure statement had shown an enormous surplus, "excess" of \$1,255,581.82. It had not included this amount nor the interest on the London loan from July 1 to 1907, nor the balance on account of municipal road money collected in 1908 and expended in 1909 under the government in lieu of provincial money for the balance on account of Central Railway investment, \$2,969,955 carried over to 1910, or the unpaid bills of the board of works for work done in 1909 and 1910. The total deficit was \$1,429,125. Thus the deficit was the vast amount of \$1,429,125.

The Central investigation report came in a year ago. One would suppose that all the expenditures had been paid long ago, but an item of \$2,969,955 is to be carried over to 1910. The only reason for carrying over the item must be to try and show a surplus.
