Transmission of Heat.

Heat is transmitted in three ways—by conduction, as when the end of a short rod of iron is placed in a fire and the opposite end becomes warmed—this is conducted heat; by conviction—by means of currents—such as the warming of a mass of water in a boiler, furnace or saucepan; and by radiation, as that diffused from a piece of hot metal or an open fire. Radiant heat is transmitted like sound or light, in straight lines in every direction, and its intensity diminishes inversely as the square of the distance from its center or point of radiation.—Once a Week.
