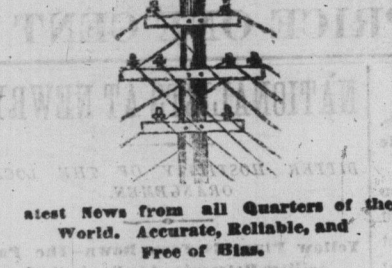

THE SPORTING WORLD

A curling rink and gymnasium combined is to be erected at Port Arthur. The boards will meet to-day at Toronto Junction hotel, Dundas street, at 3.30.

A fourth attempt will be made this afternoon to play off the Ontario Association between the Knox and University college teams.

Mr. Hume Weber wishes to buy the cup horse Retrav, 6 yrs., by Hermit—Quick March, but Lord Brody, his owner and breeder, demands \$30,000.

Harry Hutchins tallied on Nov 12 to beat his own 300 yard record of 302 sec., covering the distance in only 322 sec. and being distressed at the finish.

London and a picked team from Oxford and Cambridge universities played a Rugby game at Charlton on Nov. 14, when the varieties won by a goal to nothing.

An attempt to be made to secure the McGill university grounds for the curling bonspiel to be held at Montreal in connection with the coming winter carnival.

John Flood denies the statement that he intends to make a match with Joe Pendergast and says he will never enter the ring with any other man than John L. Sullivan.

An unfortunate mistake occurred in the heading of the football match reported yesterday. Instead of Knox v. Trinity college it should have read Knox v. University college.

Association football is not in favor with the Scottish universities. The Glasgow students recently gave it up and Edinburgh has not been able to find a team to play a junior team for the challenge.

Mr. Mather, a banker at Berlin, Wis., who sold the racer Johnson to Commodore Kitchin sold \$17,000 out of the transaction after paying \$2000 to a former partner, and then positively declined to buy the racer.

Mrs. Elizabeth Jeff, a bankrupt hotel-keeper at Mold, Eng., said if it hadn't been for her winnings on the turf she would have had to shut up a long time before. She won £450 on Zedone for the Grand National.

Hugh McKenna of Port Arthur and Wm. Hawkins of Winnipeg appeared at Port Arthur for \$200 a side. McKenna was successful in the alleged stakes being awarded to McKenna who weighed 180 lbs. to his opponent's 140.

The newest challenge in walking is that of James Biscoe to Dr. W. L. White of Billows Falls, Vt. Dr. White's horse is to walk up Sand hill, a steep activity half a mile long, and Biscoe is to walk up the same hill backward.

The race between Robert Bink's Lonsdowne and W. J. Ward's Admine actually took place at Woodbine park yesterday, and was easily won by the governor-general's namesake. Aley Gates rode the winner and Mr. Ward had the mount on his own horse.

Jim Macoe has published a challenge in the London Sportsman to the effect that he will box any man in the world four rounds, Queensberry rules, for \$1000. He also states that he returned to England because Sullivan refused to meet him.

Harry Rice, Macoe's manager, fledced about twenty passengers on his way across the Atlantic in the Scotia. One man lost all his money and ruffed his watch. Others were penniless when they landed. One lost \$1500, and is now trying to recover it, and two others lost \$500 each.

On Nov. 10 at Stamford Bridge W. G. George did ten miles in 52 min. 53 sec., beating his own record by 2 1/2 sec., but he was only third in the race, which was one of the handicaps at the Blackheath Harrier's annual meeting. He is still 1 min. 27 sec. behind the best professional record (Deerfoot's).

The team of Australians who will visit England next season will include Garrett, A. Bonnerman, W. G. George, W. F. Fogg, George Gibbon, Blackham, Boyle, McDowell, Bonner, Palmer, Bruce and W. H. Cooper. It is not yet decided whether the eleven will play a series of matches against colonial teams before they start for England.

A seventy-five yard race for \$50 a side on the exhibition grounds yesterday, between John Kennedy of this city and W. Fogg of Kenilworth, was won by the latter by two yards. Frank Martin was referee and stakeholder. Fogg cut out the pace from the start. Kennedy has been matched to run the Corners seventy-five yards on Wednesday next for \$50 a side, the latter giving him two yards start. This will also take place on the exhibition grounds.

Gas, Carothers and James Quirk came together in Frank Martin's last night. Considerable talk led to a match at 85 yards being made, Carothers to receive a yard start, for \$400 a side, Quirk to be allowed \$25 for expenses to run in Toronto. A hundred dollars a side has been put up in the hands of Frank Martin, who has been appointed referee and stakeholder. Another hundred dollars is to be posted on Saturday, and the balance is to be put up on Dec. 11, two days before the race, which is set to take place on Thursday, Dec. 13.
