Earthenware, decorated, printed or sponged, and all earthenware not elsewhere specified, 30 per cent. ad valorem.

India rubber, vulcanized handles for knives and forks, 10 per cent. ad valorem.

Iron, cast-iron forks not handled, gross weight, 10 per cent. ad valorem.

Labels for fish cans and other uses printed or painted, a specific duty of 6 cents per pound, and 20 per cent. ad valorem.
