



REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE APPOINTED TO DRAFT A PLAN OF ACTION, BY THE MEETING OF PERSONS INTERESTED IN THE FORMATION OF A LITERARY ASSOCIATION.

THE Specia. Committee appointed at the meeting of persons interested in the formation of a Literary Association in Montreal, for the purpose of "drafting a plan of action," beg leave to make this their

FIRST REPORT.

Your Committee, having well considered the nature of the subject referred to them, would respectfully make the following suggestions:—

1°. That the objects of the Association be the formation of a literary taste in Canada, the culture and fostering of

letters; and that, among other things, the giving of medals or prizes for literary works or essays of a superior character, (being native productions,) and the assistance of meritorious literary efforts, either within or without the Club, be considered legitimate means of carrying out these objects.

- 2°. That the name and designation of the Association be "THE MONTREAL LITERARY CLUR."
- 3°. That the Association have a local habitation of its own, to be accessible to its Members throughout the year.
- 4°. That the Club consist of Honorary, Corresponding, Life and Ordinary Members: That there be a President and three Vice-Presidents, a Recording and a Corresponding Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Council of —— Members, the duties of which latter shall be to exercise a general superintendence over the affairs of the Association. The office-bearers to be ex efficio Members of the Council.
- 5°. That all Ordinary Members shall be necessarily of the age of twenty-one years: That admission to the Association be open to all whose membership will be advantageous to the objects of the Association; but the names of all candidates must be proposed and seconded, in writing, with the names of the proposer and seconder, and hung up in the rooms of the Association for fourteen days before election, which is to be by ballot, and of which —— black, balls in —— shall exclude.
- 7°. That the literary exercises of each stated Meeting do consist of Essays or Lectures, Discussions or Debates, the subject being, from time to time, appointed by the Council.
- 8°. That no alteration in the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws of the Association be made, unless sanctioned by

a vote of two-thirds of the Members present, specially convened at a Meeting called for that purpose, and of which Meeting a fortnight's notice should be given.

- 9°. That the Club shall have within itself a Permanent or Elective Senate, of which the function shall have reference exclusively to portions of the literary business of the Club, as follows:—
- 1. This Senate shall determine the subject or subjects of Essays or Lectures to which a prize or prizes shall be assigned by the Club.
- 2. It shall decide as to the particular Essay or Lecture to which a prize may be assigned.
- 3. It shall decide as to the particular works for the publication of which assistance either in the way of pecuniary contribution or subscription for copies, may be given by the Club; or, if recommendation alone be thought advisable, it shall decide upon the terms of the recommendation.
- 4. All works to be published as the transactions (literary) of the Club must receive the sanction of the said Senate.
- 5. The Members of this department shall have the exclusive right of admitting into their division those who shall constitute its Members and the ground of such admission shall be exclusively literary, viz: The actual publication of some production which the said Members shall decide to have been of public utility, or some unpublished work considered of sufficient merit and worthy of publication. Admission to be given by ballot, and one, two or three votes shall exclude.
- 6. The Members of this department shall be entitled to the designation of "Fellows of the Montreal Literary Club," and these shall be elected only from the Members of the Club generally, whose designation shall be "Members of the Montreal Literary Club."
- 10°. When an Honorary Member is proposed, the Member who makes the proposal shall state in writing the reasons

for the honour proposed to be conferred; the proposal shall lie on the table for one fortnight, the votes shall be taken by ballot, two out of twenty excluding, and if once excluded the same name shall not, for three years, be again brought forward.

The following Articles of a

CONSTITUTION

Have been adopted:-

ARTICLE I.—This Society bears the name of "THE MONTREAL LITERARY CLUB."

ABTICLE II. Its object is to aid in the culture and foster-

ing of Letters among its own Members, and in the community at large.

ARTICLE III.—The Club consists of Ordinary, C. hary-Life, Corresponding, and Honorary Members.

ARTICLE IV.—Persons of Twenty-one Years of Age are eligible as Members.

ARTICLE V.—Admission to Membership is vested in the Club. Saving the case of original Members provided for in Transitory Article No. 1, candidates for admission as Ordinary Members are nominated by two members at a regular meeting of the Club, and the nomination is in writing, duly signed by the Members nominating. The notice of nomination is exhibited on the notice-board of the Club for the space of fourteen days before the election.

ARTICLE VI.—Such election is held at a regular meeting of the Club, and the voting is by ballot. Twenty votes are required to constitute a valid election; and one black-ball in five excludes.

ARTICLE VII.—A rejected candidate is only to be again nominated after one year from the time of his rejection.

ARTICLE VIII.—The fee payable by Ordinary Members is \$10 per annum, and no Member is entitled to the rights and privileges of Membership while any such fee is unpaid, saving the case provided for in Transitory Article No. 1.

ARTICLE IX.—By the payment of \$80, Ordinary Members become Ordinary-Life Members.

ARTICLE X.—The nomination of Corresponding and Honorary Members is solely vested in the Council, who must be unanimous; and the election takes place, after the usual notice, at a meeting of the Club. The voting is open, and a simple majority of the votes cast decides.

ARTICLE XI.—Corresponding and Honorary Members pay no subscription, and are not liable for any of the expenses of the Club. They cannot put any candidate in nomination, nor vote at any election for the admission of any candidate, nor for the election of the Office-Bearers nor the Council of the Club, nor hold any office therein, nor be Members of Council, nor are they eligible as Fellows; but they are entitled to all the other privileges of Ordinary Members.

ARTICLE XII.—The officers of the Club are a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Secretary, and a Treasurer.

ARTICLE XIII.—The business of the Club is transacted by a Council consisting of the officers of the Club, a Treasurer, and ten other Members. The presiding officer only to vote when there is a tie, or when a unanimous vote of the Council is required.

ARTICLE XIV.—The Officers and other Members of Council are elected from the Ordinary and Ordinary-Life Members at the annual meeting of the Club. The vote is by ballot, and a simple majority of the votes cast at said meeting renders such election valid.

ARTICLE XV.—It is the duty of the Council to attend to all the ordinary, literary and business transactions of the Club.

ARTICLE XVI.—If a vacancy occur among the ten Members of Council, or in the office of Secretary or Treasurer, it is the duty of the Council to fill up the vacancy from among the Ordinary or Ordinary-Life Members eligible; and, if the office of President become vacant, the Vice-President who was elected by the greatest number of votes becomes President; but no vacancy among the Vice-Presidents is filled until the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE XVII.—The Fellows form a permanent body within the Club, in number not exceeding twenty-one. They are selected, in the manner hereinafter provided, from these Members of the Club who have earned for themselves a good literary reputation, or done good service in the cause of Letters.

ARTICLE XVIII.—The Fellows are elected by the Club, from the Ordinary and Ordinary-Life Members, on the nomination of the Board of Fellows, and the voting is carried on at any meeting, after due notice, in the same manner as in the election of Members of Council. The election to the original Fellowships is regulated by the transitory Articles Nos. 2 and 3.

ARTICLE XIX.—When any vacancy occurs in the body

of Fellows, it is the duty of the Fellows to nominate three Members of the Ordinary or Ordinary-Life Members to the Club for election to fill such vacancy; and, in like manner, for every vacancy, three Ordinary or Ordinary-Life Members must be nominated. From the persons so nominated by the Fellows, the Members of the Club, entitled to vote, elect one to fill each vacancy. The voting is by ballot, and a simple majority of the votes cast decides. A vacancy is when, by death, resignation or other cause, the number of Fellows is diminished from the highest number it has ever attained.

ARTICLE XX.—The Fellows determine the subject or subjects of Poems, Treatises, Essays or Lectures, to which a prize or prizes may be assigned by the Club; as also, the particular Poem, Treatise, Essay or Lecture, to which a prize may be assigned. They decide as to the particular works for the publication of which assistance, either in the way of pecuniary contribution or subscription for copies, may be given, and the Club alone determines what assistance, if any is given; and, if recommendation alone be thought advisable by the Fellows, they decide upon its terms. All works to be published, as the literary transactions of the Club must receive the sanction of the Fellows.

Anticle XXI.—The Fellows shall not hold any office in the Club, or be Members of the Council; and if any office-Bearer or Member of Council be elected a Fellow, he shall thereupon cease to be such Office-Bearer or Member of Council.

ARTICLE XXII.—The proceedings and mode of voting of the Fellows are regulated by such rules as they may, from time to time, adopt for their own guidance, and such as do not conflict with any Article of this Constitution.

ARTICLE XXIII.—The proceedings and mode of voting of the Council are regulated by such rules as the said Council may, from time to time, adopt for their own guidance, and as do not conflict-with this Constitution.

ARTICLE XXIV.—The other affairs of this Club are regulated by such By-Laws as the Members may adopt, and such as do not conflict with this Constitution.

ARTICLE XXV.—This Constitution can only be altered

or amended at the annual meeting, on notice given of the alteration or amendment proposed, at least one year before the meeting at which it is proposed to make the alteration and amendment in question, and on the vote of at least two-thirds of the Members present at such meeting; and the terms of no Article not mentioned in such notice can be altered or amended.

TRANSITORY ARTICLES.

ARTICLE I.—The original list of Members will be closed within one hour from the adoption of this Constitution, when all who have signed the Constitution and roll of Members, personally or by proxy, shall become Members of the Club, and they shall the proceed to vote for the Office-Bearers and ten Members of Council.

The names of the original Members who shall not pay their subscription into the hands of the President within ten days from the date of this Constitution, shall be struck from the roll and cease to be Members of the Club.

The Rev. Canon Leach, D.C.L.

Article III.—The six Fellows so elected at the first meeting of the Club (and any others who may be elected as hereinatter, or by the Constitution is provided,) may, from time to time, add to their number until the original twenty-one Fellowships are filled up, by nominating to the Club for election three Ordinary or Ordinary-Life Members for each Fellowship to be so filled. The voting for the candidates thus proposed to be by ballot, and a simple majority of the votes cast decides.
