THE ROUNDED EIFFEL TOWER

After Many Vicissitudes the Daring Aeronaut Achieves His End.

QUESTION AS TO TIME LIMIT May Have Failed by Less Than a Minute to Win the Deutsch Prize.

Paris, Oct. 20.—The Santos-Dumont airship ascended at St. Cloud at 2:38 o'clock this afternoon, and five minutes afterwards began to round the Eiffel Tower.

Santos-Dumont completed his trip successfully, but a question has arisen as to whether it was done within the time limit. M. Deutsch says the aeronaut won the prize.

Santos-Dumont took 30 minutes 47 seconds to make the trip. M. Deutsch offered a prize of 100,000 francs for any machine that would make the trip from St. Cloud to and around the Eiffel Tower and return within 30 minutes.

Santos-Dumont left the factory at 2:30, but on leaving the park his guide rope caught in a tree and he was obliged to descend. He started again at 2:42 p.m., rose 200 yards and then pointed for the Eiffel Tower, the airship going in a straight line. It was seen thru film glasses, to arrive at the tower and round it. The time taken to make the trip was 30 minutes 47 seconds.
