Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Sept. 20.—G. N. W. Despatch—The shutting down of the Consolidated Lake Superior Company's plants, shutting off \$7000 a day in wages alone, has caused a panic in the Canadian Soo, which is in a worse condition than ever before in its history.

The largest plant that hasn't been built in this country is the \$100,000,000 mill, which is more than twice as long as the national capitol at Washington, and that cannot run at its full capacity for 100,000 days, the greater part of which would be wages. It contains as fine machinery as any in the world, but it is a desolate looking place these days. That Messrs. Berwin, Rea and McCall have failed in it is evidenced by the fact that although the mill has been idle for a year they have put up over \$1,000,000 to build two great furnaces at joining and the money or its equivalent has been paid for 135,000 tons of soft coal that has been shipped to the mill in Canada, and the Dominion government has agreed to give a bounty of \$7 a ton on steel rails at a rate of \$100,000,000 worth of rails. But the price of steel rails is declining, and that means a loss to the mill. RECEIVERSHIP. Philadelphia, Pa., Sept. 20.—(Special.)—A meeting of directors of the Consolidated Lake Superior Company, to be held tomorrow in New York, is expected to bring another crisis in the affairs of the long-suffering corporation. The only way out for the company now seems to be a sale of the property to satisfy the claim of the Consolidated Lake Superior & Co., which advanced \$5,000,000 several months ago to put the company on its feet. There have been rumors that Speyer & Co. are interested in the formation of a syndicate to organize a new company, and after a sale of the assets to the Consolidated Lake Superior stockholders in again. Stockholders of the company will, however, doubtless carry the matter into the courts and press for a receivership, in which every asset of a new company would be of no avail.

NEW FIRE MASK. Visor is of mica, and Great Success Predicted. London, Sept. 20.—A member of the Paris fire brigade has invented a new mask, which is said to be a great improvement over all previous ones. It can be fixed to an ordinary helmet and around the neck by straps. The visor is of mica, protected by wire. In front of the mouth two pipes open, one furnishing fresh air and the other carrying off what has been breathed.
