Robert Barry Dickey was the son of Robert McDougal Dickey, M. P. of Cumberland, who was born Nov. 1811, and had reached his ninety-second year. He studied law with the Hon. Alex. Great Discovery. CHICAGO, Ill., July 13.—The promise of a victory over consumption is foreboded, physicians here declare, in the published results of the labors of Prof. Eduardo Maraglio, an Italian physician of Genoa. The results from the subject of Prof. Maraglio's address, entitled "The Struggle of the Body Against Tuberculosis and Its Immunization," presented on the 14th international medical congress held at Madrid last April. The abstracts of this address that appeared soon after the adjournment of the congress were so replete with that he attracted little notice. Briefly stated, Prof. Maraglio asserts that he has produced, after more than 20 years of study and experiment, a serum which, introduced beneath the skin of the arm, as vaccine lymph is used in vaccination, produces a small circumscribed tuberculosis or consumption, as the properly vaccinated individual is to smallpox. Prof. Maraglio says: "These results are the fruit of the labors not only of one person but of a school. They are, in fact, the experimental and clinical researches publicly carried on, either in my medical clinic or in the institute for the study of

When cows are compelled to drink the water of swamps, muddy ponds or sluggish streams, they are liable to take the germs which are always present in the water of such places. These germs, when they are introduced into the milk, are a constant menace to their health, and unless the cows are in good health they cannot give first class milk. Moreover, the mud, often full of germs, which collects on the legs, flanks and udders of the cows, and falls into the milk at the time of milking, is a direct source of infection which is often overlooked.

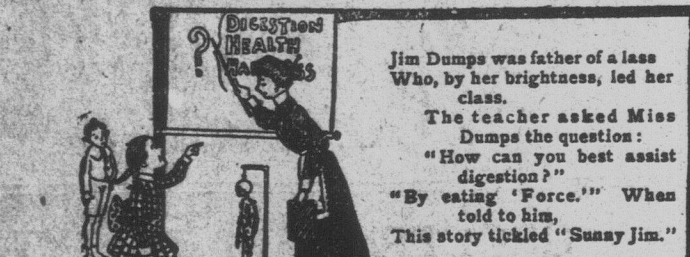
