German Baltic Fleet Cut Off From Home Base By Its Own Mine Fields

Returning from Russian Expedition Found Mine Fields Too Thick to Attempt Passage Through them and Forced to Retire Between Islands of Gothland and Oeland.

London, Aprill 6 ( 3.58 a.m.)-The German Baltic fieet has been cut off from its base by its own mine field, which broke adrift in a storm,
according to a copenhagen despatteh to the Mail. $A$ large number of mines have floated into neutral waters.
The German fleot, returning from a Russlan expedition, found the
mines dangerously thick, and decided to return between the islands of Gothiand and Oelland, untll the sweopers can clear a pasasage.
