





STRONGLY ADVISES CLEANING THE **DIPLOMATIC SLATE** Great Britain and United States

to Settle all Pecuniary Claims

Washington, May 11-Great Bri tain and the United States will begin to clean the diplomatic slate Tuesday, when the international tribunal for the arbitration of outstanding pecuniary claims between the two nations will hold its first meeting here under the presidency of Henri A. Fromageot, of France. This tribunal, created by a special agreement, negotiated by former Ambassador James Bryce and former Secretary of State P. C. Knox, in 1910, will judicially settle claims of private persons of the two nations, some of them dating back to the


