all probability, the intelligence, either that hostilities have commenced in Germany, or that the lovereigns of the great States have thought bett of the matter, and quietly marched their Armie back again. But the question then comes, how will one of them at least, the King of Prussia settle the matter with his people, a vast proportion of the male part of whom he has placed under arms, taking them from their peaceful occupations ? We think that there can be no doubt but that the majority of the Northern Germans are strongly i favor of a Constitutional Government, on the broadest possible principles of freedom, compatible with Mosarchy, while many would go much further than that in the direction of a Republic. The Northern Germans are also strongly attached to the idea of German unity, and, however wild and impracticable some of their theories may be, there is no question, but that they are determin sooner or later, to destroy Austrian influence in Germany. All these people have looked to Prussia and her King for support, and we fear that the disappointment, at what looks very like a betrayn' of their interests, may lead to an explosion in that country, which will be attended with very disasrous consequences to the cause of German liber-Again, if the King of Pussia determines on war

we foresee the most terrible results, and no human seing can pretend to foretell the end. Such a war would be not only the war of opinion, of which Vapoleon foretold the advent at no distant day, the grand struggle between Absolutism and Liberty, but it would be a war of religion -Protestan against Roman Catholic. The question then comes, who would be Prussia's allies? The Northern Protestant Nations are Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Prussia, Hanover, Brunswick Wirtemburg, and some of the smaller States. Sweden and Norway (united under one Crown) are at present much under Russian influence; but n Sweden this influence exerted over the Court is very unpopular with the people, and they are now eagaged in an attempt to liberalize their Constitution. In Denmark, Russian influence redominates, and so, through family connection, t does in Wirtemburg. Brunswick and Hanover would probably at once side with Prussia, and hould the war between her and Austria assume religious complexion, we apprehend that the people of all these countries would compel their Sovereigns to stand up at once for Protestantism and freedom, and the good old cause may again; as at Luczen, be upheld by Swedish bayonets. Already many Swedes are fighting in the Holstein Army. There is also Holland, a highly Protestant Power, with a powerful Fleet and large Army, rich and out of debt. It is true that Dutch and Prussians; but, if the Protestant cause should be imperilled, we believe that even the phlegmatic Dutchmen would rush to the rescue.

Then also it remains to be seen what the three remaining great Powers, England, France, and Russia, will do. It is understood that Russia has listinctly signified her intention to side with Austrin, while England and France are playing the part of peace-maker. As to France, it is doubtful to the last degree how she will act if, in spite of her attempts to settle differences, war should begin. In the first place, she has an hereditary grudge against Prussia; in the second place, abe has always looked with a longing eye on the Rhenish Provinces and on the Rhine as her oundary; and in the third place, a free, strong, nited German Empire would be a most formidable rival. But France, or the French people have an innate dislike to absolutism, and, how ever much the President might be inclined t court a Russian alliance, we think the people would not be inclined to suffer a Russian advannto Central Europe.

Of our own country we can safely say, that nothing but the direst necessity, or the sternest sense of duty, would induce England to arm; but sense of duty, would induce Engand to arm; out we cannot bring ourselves to believe that England would permit Prussis to be destroyed, particularly as we could assist her against flussis at no very great expense. 


