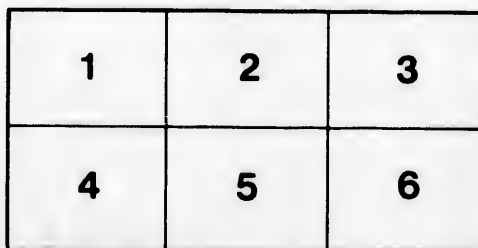

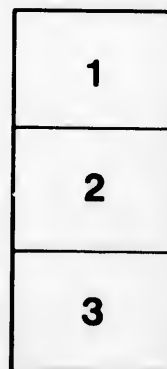

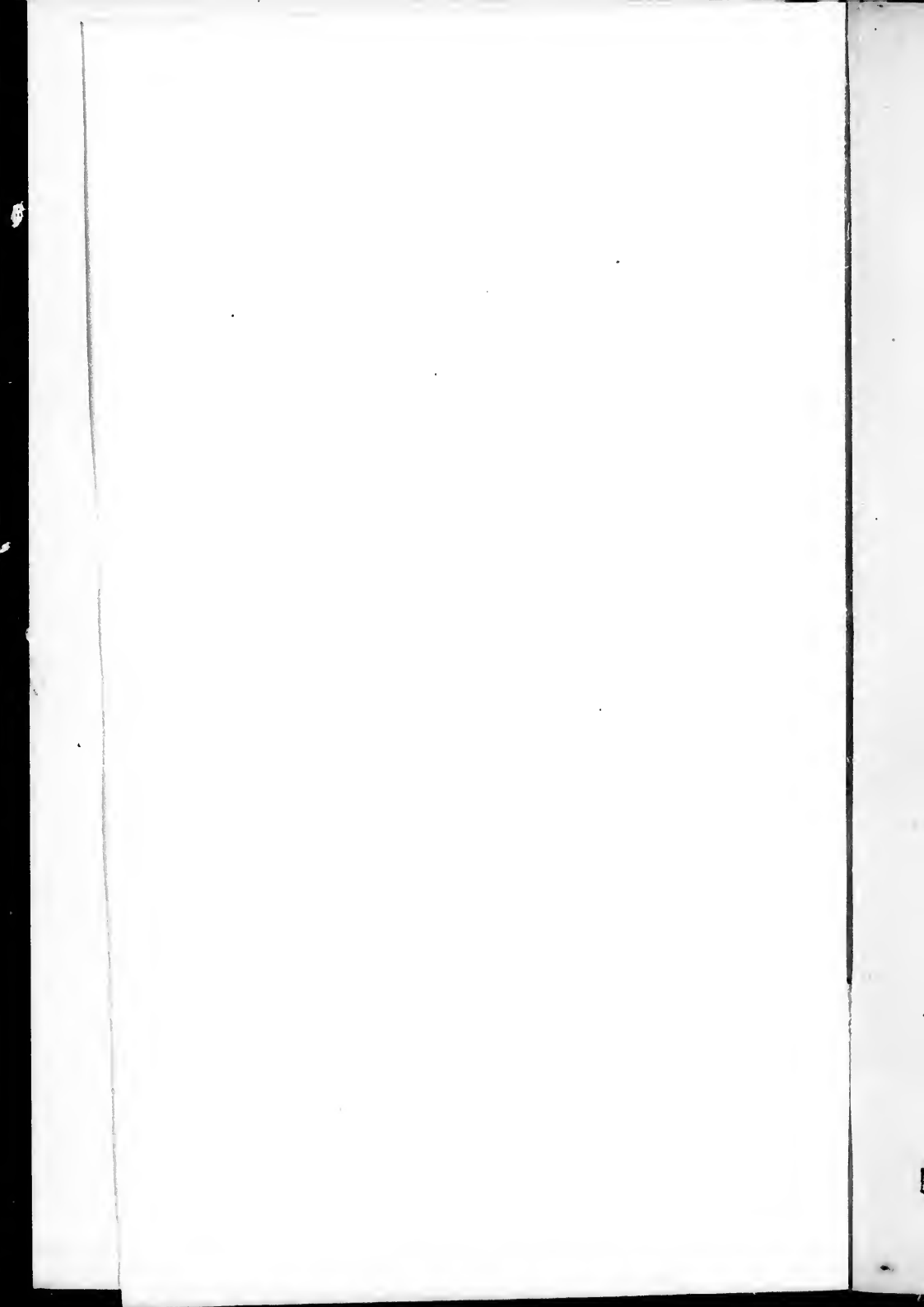

FIRST VICTORIA DIRECTORY

1869 Issue.—A proof of the spirit of enterprise which characterises the colonists in British Columbia is afforded by the receipt in London (through Mr. G. Street, of Cornhill), of the First Victoria Directory and British Columbia Guide." It comprises a directory of "business men and householders in Victoria and the districts, including a large portion of the mainland of British Columbia," together with other particulars, and is compiled and published by Mr. E. Mallandaine, architect. A work of this kind is no small undertaking for a new place of limited dimensions.—*Daily News*.

PREFATORY REMARKS.

Two years have nearly elapsed since this work last issued. Many and important changes have occurred since then. We are now under the shadow of Confederation with the Dominion, to use a borrowed expression. Though often enthusiastically advocated, and as often pertinaciously rejected by its opponents, Confederation may be regarded as an accomplished fact. Become a Government measure, it was carried in the Council. The report of the delegates sent to negotiate terms and the address of the Queen thereon, were adopted simultaneously.

These terms will be found at length further on (A) a constitution followed inaugurating Responsible Government with the first session, after Confederation accomplished. The heads of the bill will be found following the terms. (B) It may not be unnecessary here to add on an absorbing topic at this end of the line, namely the terminus of our Pacific Railway, a few words quoted from a letter by one who has not unaptly been termed the "Great Overlander" Mr. Alfred Waddington "Mr. John Roebling, he says, the engineer of the Niagara bridge span 800 feet, cost £105 per lineal foot, would not mind adapting the principle to a span of 2000 feet or more." Nothing more need be said the greatest possible length not exceeding 1800 feet in one span required for a railway to connect Vancouver and the mainland. A better system even than Niagara bridge that of John Dredge, carried out in many examples, would considerably reduce the cost, with increased strength,

PREFATORY REMARKS.

The labours of the Joint High Commission at Washington have produced anything but satisfaction here. Great fears are entertained on the San Juan question, as elsewhere dissatisfaction on the fisheries question. Reliable maps have been found in the archives of this colony, bearing the impress of high official sanction in the United States, which clearly give San Juan and other islands over to the British.

A. PREAMBLE.

During the last Session of the Legislative Council, the subject of the admission of the Colony of British Columbia into the Union or Dominion of Canada was taken into consideration, and a resolution on the subject was agreed to, embodying the terms upon which it was proposed that this Colony should enter the Union.

At the close of the Session, delegates were sent by the Government of this Colony to Canada, to confer with the Government of the Dominion with respect to the admission of British Columbia into the Union upon the terms proposed.

After considerable discussion by the delegates with the Members of the Government of the Dominion of Canada, the Terms and Conditions hereinafter specified were adopted by a Committee of the Privy Council of Canada, and were by them reported to the Governor General for his approval.

Such Terms were communicated to the Government of this Colony by the Governor-General of Canada, in a dispatch dated July 7th, 1870, and are as follow :

TEXT OF THE TERMS.

1. Canada shall be liable for the debts and liabilities of British Columbia existing at the time of Union.

2. British Columbia not having incurred debts equal to those of the other Provinces now constituting the Dominion shall be entitled to receive, by half-yearly payments in advance from the General Government, interest at the rate of five per cent. per annum on the difference between the actual amount of its indebtedness per head of the population of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick (\$27-77), the population of British Columbia being taken at 60,000.

3. The following sums shall be paid by Canada to British Columbia, for the support of its Government and Legislature, to wit, an annual subsidy of \$35,000, and an annual grant equal to 80 cents per head of the said population of 60,000, both half-yearly in advance, such grant of 80 cents per head to be augmented in proportion to the increase of population, as may be shown by each subsequent decennial census, until the population amounts to 400,000 at which rate such grant shall thereafter remain, it being understood that the first census be taken in the year 1881.

4. The Dominion shall provide an efficient mail service, fortnightly, by steam communication between Victoria and San Francisco, and twice a week between Victoria and Olympia; the Vessels to be adapted for the conveyance

of freight and passengers.

5. Canada will assume and defray the charges for the following Services:—

- A. Salary of the Lieutenant Governor.
- B. Salaries and allowances of the Judges of the Supreme Courts and the County and District Courts.
- C. The charges in respect to the Department of Customs.
- D. The Postal and Telegraph Services.
- E. Protection and encouragement of Fisheries.
- F. Provision for the Militia.
- G. Lighthouses, Buoys, and Beacons, Shipwrecked Crews, Quarantine and Marine Hospitals, including a Marine Hospital at Victoria.
- H. Geological Survey.
- I. The Penitentiary.

And such further changes as may be incident to and connected with the services which by the British North America Act of 1867 appertain to the General Government, and as are or may be allowed to the other Provinces.

6. Suitable Pensions such as shall be approved of by Her Majesty's Government shall be provided by the Government of the Dominion for those of Her Majesty's Servants in the colony whose position and emoluments derived therefrom would be affected by political changes on the admission of British Columbia in the Dominion of Canada.

7. It is agreed that the existing Customs Tariff and Excise Duties shall continue in force in British Columbia until the Railway from the Pacific Coast and the system of Railways in Canada are connected, unless the Legislature of British Columbia should sooner decide to accept the Tariff and Excise Laws of Canada. When Customs and Excise Duties are, at the time of the Union of British Columbia with Canada, leviable on any Goods, Wares or Merchandise in British Columbia, or in the other Provinces of the Dominion, those Goods, Wares, or Merchandise may, from and after the Union, be imported into British Columbia from the Provinces now composing the Dominion, or from either of those Provinces into British Columbia, on proof of payment of the Customs or Excise Duties leviable thereon in the Province of Exportation, and on the payment of such further amount (if any) of Customs or Excise Duties as are leviable thereon in the Province of Importation. This arrangement to have no force or effect after the assimilation of the Tariff and Excise Duties of British Columbia with those of the Dominion.

8. British Columbia shall be entitled to be represented in the Senate by Three Members, and by six Members in the House of Commons. The representation to be increased under the provisions of the "British North America Act, 1867."

9. The influence of the Dominion Government shall be used to secure the continued maintenance of the Naval Station at Esquimalt.

10. "The provisions of the "British North America Act, 1867," shall (except those parts thereof which are in the terms made, or by reasonable intendment may be held to be specially applicable to and only affect one and not the whole of the Provinces now comprising the Dominion, and except so far as the same may be varied by this Minute) be applicable to British Columbia, in the same way and to the like extent as they apply to the other

provinces of the Dominion, and-as if the Colony of British Columbia had been one of the Provinces originally united by the said Act.

11. The Government of the Dominion undertake to secure the commencement, simultaneously, within two years from the date of the Union, of the construction of a railway from the Pacific towards the Rocky Mountains, and from such point as may be selected east of the Rocky Mountains, towards the Pacific, to connect the Seaboard of British Columbia with the railway system of Canada; and further, to secure the completion of such railway within ten years from the date of Union.

And the Government of British Columbia agree to convey to the Dominion Government, in trust, to be appropriated in such manner as the Dominion Government may deem advisable in furtherance of the construction of the said line of railway, a similar extent public lands along the line of railway throughout its entire length in British Columbia, not to exceed, however, 20 miles on each side of the said line, as may be appropriated for the same purpose by the Dominion Government from the public lands in the North-West Territories and the Province of Manitoba. Provided that the quantity of land which may be held under pre-emption right or by Crown Grant within the limits of the tract of land in British Columbia to be so conveyed to the Dominion Government, shall be made good to the Dominion from contiguous public lands; and provided further, that until the commencement, within two years as aforesaid from the date of Union, of the construction of the said railway, the Government of British Columbia shall not sell or alienate any further portions of public lands of British Columbia in any other way than under right of pre-emption, requiring actual residence of the pre-emptor on the land claimed by him. In consideration of the land to be so conveyed in aid of the construction of the said railway, the Dominion Government agree to pay to British Columbia, from the date of Union, the sum of \$100,000 per annum, in half-yearly payments in advance.

12. The Dominion Government shall guarantee the interest for ten years from the date of the completion of the works, at the rate of five per centum per annum, on such sum, not exceeding £100,000 sterling, as may be required for the construction of a first class Graving Dock at Esquimalt.

13. The charge of the Indians, and the trusteeship and management of the Lands reserved for their use and benefit shall be assumed by the Dominion Government, and a policy as liberal as that hitherto pursued by the British Columbia Government shall be continued by the Dominion Government after the Union.

To carry out such policy, tracts of land of such extent as it has hitherto been the practice of the British Columbia Government to appropriate for that purpose, shall from time to time be conveyed by the Local Government to the Dominion Government in trust for the use and benefit of the Indians on application of the Dominion Government; and in case of disagreement between the two Governments respecting the quantity of such tracts of Land to be so granted, the matter shall be referred for the decision of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

15. The Constitution of the Executive Authority and of the Legislature of British Columbia shall, subject to the provision of the "British North America Act, 1867," continue as existing at the time of the Union until altered

under the Authority of the said Act, it being at the same time understood that the Government of the Dominion shall readily consent to the introduction of Responsible Government when desired by the inhabitants of British Columbia, and it being likewise understood that it is the intention of the Governor of British Columbia, under the authority of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to amend the existing Constitution of the Legislature by providing that a majority of its members shall be elective.

The Union shall take effect according to the foregoing terms and conditions on such day as Her Majesty by and with the advice of Her Most Honourable Privy Council may appoint (on addresses from the Legislature of the Colony of British Columbia, and of the Houses of Parliament of Canada, in Terms of the 146th section of the "British North America Act, 1867,) and British Columbia may in its addresses specify the Electoral Districts* for which the first election of Members to serve in the House of Commons shall take place.

* *Electoral Districts.*

DISTRICT OF VICTORIA.—Lake North Saanich, South Saanich, Esquimalt (including Meichosin and Highland Districts), Sook, Salt Spring, and Cowichan (including Somenos Quamucnan, Cominaken, Shawingan, and Chemainis.)

DISTRICT OF NANAIMO.—Nannimo (including Mountain, Cedar, Cranberry and Comox.)

DISTRICT OF NEW WESTMINSTER.—New Westminster city and suburbs, Langley, Chilliwack and Burrard Inlet.

DISTRICT OF YALE —Yale, Hope, Rock Creek, Lytton, Nicola Lake, Cache Creek, Kamloops and Okanagan.

DISTRICT OF LILLOOET.—Lillooet, Clinton, 21-Mile House, Canoe Creek and Lake La Pache.

DISTRICT OF KOOTENAY.—Wild Horse Creek, Perry Creek and French Creek.

[B.] THE CONSTITUTION ACT, 1871.

Comprises 49 sections and a schedule.

By Sec. 3, the Executive Council shall not exceed five persons such as the Governor shall think fit, including in the first instance, the Colonial Secretary, the Attorney Gen. and Commissioner of Lands and Works. By Sec. 4, in case of vacancy by death, resignation, etc., the Governor may appoint substitutes during pleasure, and prescribe their duties. The duties of present Executive officers shall be those of the new Council so far as not repugnant to this act. Sec. 5. By Secs. 6 and 7 a Legislative Assembly may be established consisting of 25 members; all of whom shall be elected from 12 electoral districts (*see above*) all legislation shall be subject to the "British North America Act, 1767," or to any order of Her Majesty in Council or any act of Parliament passed to effect Confederation with Canada. No person holding any office of emolument shall be eligible as member of the Assembly, but members of the Executive Council not disqualified for Assembly, provided elected while holding such office. Secs. 8 & 9. Any disqualified member sitting and voting shall forfeit \$2000 each day, recoverable by action of debt or information. Secs. 10, 11, 12. All existing laws with respect to voters and members, unless absolutely repugnant to this Act, shall remain in force. Sec. 13. In the absence of dissolution by the Governor, members shall hold their seats during four years and no longer. Sec. 16. Secs. 23, 24 and 25 provide that nine members including the Speaker shall constitute a quorum; the majority of votes present shall carry any measure, a casting vote by the Speaker in case of tie. Secs 38 to 42 provide for the payment of mem-

bers \$5 a day for a period of 50 days and 15 cents per mile going and coming from the place of residence of each member to the House of Assembly. By Sec. 43 the omission or neglect to elect a member in any district shall not invalidate the Assembly or its proceedings. By Sec. 44 the immunities and privileges of members shall not exceed those of the British House of Commons. The appointment to public offices shall rest with the Governor and the Executive Council, except to the Executive Council itself. This act to be construed as subject to all the provisions of British North America Act, 1867.
