WHEN the Sun or Moon is, either in whole or in part, obscured by a shadow which gradually comes over their disks and then glides off, this phenomenon is called an *eclipse*. Eclipses are either those of the Moon or of the Sun. The moon's orbit is inclined to the plane of the earth's orbit in an angle of about five degrees; and it is only when the full moon, or change, happens at or near the *nodes* that an eclipse can take place, because the sun, moon, and earth are then nearly in the same place; at all other times of full or change, the shadow of the moon falls either above or below the earth, and the shadow of the earth either above or below the moon. The duration of a lunar eclipse lasts all the time the moon is passing through the earth's shadow; and the shadow being considerably broader than the moon's diameter, a lunar eclipse sometimes last three or four hours. An eclipse of the moon is visible to the whole hemisphere of the earth to which the moon is visible. It begins on her eastern side, and goes off at her western side.

An eclipse of the Sun is produced by the moon passing between the earth and the sun, and intercepting a part of the whole of his disc from our view. An eclipse of the Sun can only happen when the moon is in conjunction with the Sun, that is at the time of *new moon*. The eclipse is said to be *partial* when only a part of his surface is obscured; *total*, when the whole of the sun's disk is obscured; and *annular* when the moon cuts off a circle in the middle of the sun, leaving a ring of light all round the dark figure in the middle, which forms a beautiful phenomenon. An eclipse of the sun begins on the western side of the disk and ends on the eastern. The number of eclipses in any year cannot be less than *two*, and those both of the sun, nor can there be more than *seven*, in which case there will be *five* of the sun and *two* of the moon, and the moon's eclipses will be total.

This column gives the time of high water at the principal ports in the Basin of Minas.

MAGNITUDE, MOTIONS, AND OTHER PHENOMENA OF THE PRIMARY PLANETS.

The Planet MERCURY is the nearest to the Sun of any that have yet been discovered, although a space of 37 millions of miles intervenes between it and the central luminary. Mercury revolves around the Sun in the space of 87 days 23 hours, which is the length of its year; but the time from one conjunction to the same conjunction again, is about 116 days. Mercury was long considered as the smallest primary planet in the system. Its diameter is estimated at 3200 miles, and consequently its surface contains above 32,000,000 of square

MANURES are among the first requisites in successful farm management. They are the strong moving power in agricultural operations. They are as the great steam engine which drives the vessel onward. Good and clean cultivation is, indeed, all-important; but it will avail little without a fertile soil; and this fertility must be created, or kept up, by a copious application of manures. The great art of saving and manufacturing manure, consists in retaining as long as possible the best advantage, these soluble and gaseous portions. All neat farming, all profitable farming, and all satisfactory farming, must be attended with a careful saving of manures. Probably more than one-half of all the materials which exist in the country are lost, totally lost, by not attending to the drainage of stables and farm yards. The practice of many farmers, shows how little they are aware of the hundreds they are losing every year by suffering this most valuable of their farm products to escape. There are not a few who carefully, and very ingeniously as they suppose, place their barns and cattle yards in such a manner, on the sides of hills, that all the drainage from them may pass off into the neighboring streams or highways.

miles, and is therefore sufficiently ample to contain 8,960,000,000 of inhabitants, which is more than 11 times the present population of our globe. In its revolution round the Sun, its motion is swifter than that of any other planet yet discovered; being no less than at the rate of 109,800 miles every hour. Its *eccentricity*, or the distance of the Sun from the centre of its orbit, is above 7 million of miles.

Of all the luminaries of heaven, the Sun and Moon excepted, the planet VENUS is the most splendid and conspicuous. She appears like a brilliant lamp amidst the lesser orbs of night, and alternately anticipates the morning dawn and ushers in the evening twilight. The diameter of Venus has been computed at about 7800 miles; and consequently its surface contains 191,134,944 square miles, and would contain a number of inhabitants equal to more than 53,500 millions, or nearly 67 times the population of our globe. revolves in an orbit which is 433,800,000 of miles in circumference, in the space of 224 days 16 hours; its rate of motion is therefore about 80 thousand miles every hour, 1330 miles every minute, and about 22 miles every second. Its distance from the Sun is 68 millions of miles; and its distance from the earth, when nearest us, is about 27 millions of miles, which is the nearest approach that any of the heavenly bodies (except the Moon) make to the earth. Yet this distance, when considered by itself, is very great; for a cannon ball would require 6 years and 3 months to move from the earth to the nearest point of the orbit of Venus, although it were flying every moment at the rate of 500 miles an hour. At its greatest distance from us, it is 163 millions of miles.

The Planet MARS is about 145 millions of miles from the Sun. When at its greatest distance from the earth, it is 240 millions of miles from us; and when nearest the earth, it is only 50 millions of miles distant. The orbit of Mars is 901,064,000 of miles in circumference. Through this space it moves in one year and 322 days; consequently its rate of motion is 54,649 miles every hour, which is more than a hundred times the greatest velocity of a cannon ball. The diurnal rotation of this planet, or its revolution round its axis, is accomplished in 24 hours, 39 minutes, 21 seconds. This planet bears a more striking resemblance to the earth than any other planet in the solar system. Its distance from the Sun, compared with that of the other superior planets, is but a little more than that of the

The most common practice is to seed to grass with some grain crop. The only advantage of this is the saving of labour by sowing two crops at one ploughing. The disadvantage is the shading and retarding of the grass by the overgrowth of the grain. All crops dry up the soil, by the leaves pumping up the water through the stems and scattering it to the winds. It requires more labour, but is enough better to repay it, to prepare the land late in the fall, and sow grass very early in the spring with nothing else. If well seeded on a rich soil, the young plants will quickly spring up, and soon be out of the reach of drouth. It will make a good crop the first year. If not sown quite early it will be likely to fail. Thick seeding is the main requisite, and will be found to be highly advantageous. Half a bushel of mixed timothy and clover will nearly double the crop from ordinary quantities, and render it finer and softer. The coarse and harsh character of hay from new meadows would be avoided by heavy seeding. A mixture of different species, always produces more grass, especially in pastures, than only one or two sorts.

earth, and the length of the day is nearly the same as ours, and it has evidently a succession of seasons. This planet is estimated to be about 4200 miles in diameter, which is only a little more than half the diameter of the earth. The number of square miles on its surface is more than 55 millions, which is about six millions of square miles more than on all the habitable parts of our globe, and would contain a population of 15,500 millions, which is 19 times the number of the inhabitants of the earth.

JUPITER, when nearest the earth, is the most splendid of all the nocturnal orbs, except Venus and the Moon. Its distance from the Sun is 495 millions of miles, and the circumference of its orbit, 3,110,000,000 of miles. Around this orbit it moves in 11 years and

EVERY farmer should be constantly fixing up his barns, stables, and yard fences—constantly adding to the comforts and conveniences of his domestic animals—constantly improving in neatness, cleanliness, and efficient shelter. Racks for fodder, and troughs for meal, are easily made, and frequently save their cost several times over, by keeping hay from mud and meal from waste. Every field should have a good gate to enter it, and these gates may be constructed in winter by every ingenious farmer who has a workshop and a few simple tools. Houses and barns, which stand in bleak situations, are often severely swept by wintry winds. Trees and belts of evergreens prove great promoters of both economy and comfort, in lessening the amount of fuel consumed to keep the house warm and much fodder to keep up the animal warmth of stock. And what renders this natural ornament of more general usefulness, is its cheapness. The pleasing decoration of foliage, furnished by ornamental trees and shrubs, and rustic structures covered with the drapery of climbers, is perfectly within the means of the poorest cottager.

315 days, at the rate of nearly 30,000 miles every hour. A faint idea of this distance may be acquired by considering that a cannon ball, flying 500 miles every hour, would require more than 91 years to pass over this space; and a railway carriage, running at the rate of 40 miles an hour, would require nearly 1,150 years before it could reach its orbit. When nearest the earth it is about 400 millions of miles distant, and when at its greatest distance from us, no less than 590 millions of miles distant; yet its apparent size, in this case, does not appear very much diminished. This planet revolves around its axis in the space of ⁹ hours, ⁵⁵ minutes, ⁴⁹ seconds. This rotation is far more rapid than that of any of the other planets. The circumference of Jupiter is 278,600 miles, and therefore its equatorial

Jupiter is 11 times larger in circumference than the earth, and moves round the sun in 4332 $\frac{1}{2}$ of our days, and round its axis in 9 hours, 56 minutes; therefore its year will be 10,470 days. This planet is the largest in the system, being 89,000 miles in diameter, and consequently 1400 times larger than the earth. Its surface contains nearly 25 thousand millions of square miles, with accommodation for nearly seven billions of inhabitants, which is nearly 50 times the number of human beings that have existed on the earth since its creation. Such an immense globe, moving forward in its

A DISAGREEABLE object to every one who has any appreciation of the neat or beautiful, or a dislike to slovenly practices, is the common throng of weeds along road sides. There are some land-owners who are careful to keep their fields comparatively clean, who throw all kinds of rubbish into the highways, along the borders of which immediately spring up thistles, mulleins, burdocks, mayweed, nettles and briars, rendering the public thoroughfare, which should present an agreeable picture to every one, a disgusting and repulsive object to the eye. But unfortunately the evil does not end here; these weeds being entirely neglected, furnish a most abundant seedling to the neighboring farms, and the weeds thus introduced are not easily eradicated. The yearly loss to farmers occasioned by weeds, must amount to a very large sum. With many one-fourth part of the crop is composed of pig-weeds, foxtail and others, and an equal proportion of meadow and pasture land occupied with mulleins and thistles, johnswort and brier bushes.

Its distance from the Sun is 906 millions of miles, which is nearly twice the distance of Jupiter. To move around its orbit a cannon ball would re-

THE summer harvests are now secured—the chief and remaining labours of the season are the sowing of winter grain and securing the crops of autumn. But there are many other operations that should not be neglected. In many places there are muck swamps, now comparatively dry, that may afford a large quantity of the material for manure. Compost heaps for farm use should be made wherever practicable, near the field or spot to which they are to be applied, with a view to save cartage. Cellars should be thoroughly cleaned and ventilated and whitewashed, and prepared for the crops of autumn vegetables. A cellar in confusion and infested with foul matter, is a most unsuitable place to stow eatables. Hogs should be fed early to fatten; a few weeks at the commencement, early in autumn, may be more than equal to as many weeks towards winter. Keep them clean, and they will thrive better—feed regularly, and they will fatten faster; and if there is an abundant apple crop, half the cost of fattening may be saved by feeding refuse apples in sufficient abundance.

When nearest the earth, Saturn is 311 millions of miles distant—an interval which could not be traversed by a railway carriage at the rate above stated in less than 2315 years; and even a cannon ball moving with the velocity above mentioned, would require 184 years. This planet revolves around the Sun in the space of about 29½ years. The circumference of Saturn being 248,000 miles, the parts about the equator will move at the rate of 24,000 miles an hour. Its year will consist of 25,150 days. This planet is nearly a thousand times larger than the earth. Its surface contains more than 19,600 millions

THERE are very few soils that do not need artificial drainage. Lands that are tenacious enough to hold manures well, do not allow water to pass rapidly through them. It has been shown that a single acre of soil a foot deep, holds at a wet season a surplus of more than two thousand barrels of water, which if discharged would leave the land moderately moist, and right for vegetation. The only way to get rid of this flood promptly, is to provide artificial channels for its discharge. The land when thoroughly drained may be worked at almost any time, the owner not being compelled to wait till the best time for sowing or cultivating has past. Crops may be planted *early*, and sometimes doubled from this cause alone. Less labour will manage the farm, as there will be less time lost in waiting tediously for water to flow off. Drainage prevents very effectually all injury from drought, because if the soil does not become soaked and muddy, it keeps mellow and does not bake hard.

of square miles, and, consequently, at the rate of 280 inhabitants to a square mile, it would contain a population of about 5½ billions, which is 6,860 times the present number on our globe.

URANUS is the most distant planet of the solar system, except Neptune, so far as our knowledge yet extends. Its distance from the Sun is 1,800,000,000 of miles, which is double the distance of Saturn. When nearest the earth, it is distant from us about 1,705,000,000 of miles. In order to acquire a rude conception of this distance, let us suppose a steam carriage to set out from the earth, and to move, without intermission, 40 miles every hour; it would require more than 4865 years, before it could reach this planet; and a cannon

FARMERS should make it a standing rule whenever cattle are made to pass a fence, whether through bars or slip-gap, to leave one pole for them to pass under. This gives them a downward tendency, and lessens their inclination to jump or look upwards, as they are sure to do when a lazy one throws down a part of the rails, and makes them vault the rest. Cattle may be taught to go over any fence, by the careful training they often get for this end, and performed as follows:—first starve them, or give them poor feed, which will make them light and restless. As soon as they go over the lowest part of the fence after better provender, make them jump back again, and put on one more rail, "I guess that will keep 'em out." Next day, (as of course they will be in mischief again,) repeat the process, adding another rail; in a short time they will take care of themselves, and harvest the crops without charge!

ball, flying at the rate of 12,000 miles every day, would require 389 years to reach the nearest point of its orbit. The circumference of the orbit in which Uranus revolves about the Sun is 11,314,000,000 of miles, through which it moves in about 84 years. It is the slowest moving planet in the system, and yet it pursues its course at the rate of 15,000 miles every hour. Six Satellites are supposed to be connected with Uranus. It is about 35,000 miles in diameter, and 110,000 miles in circumference, being 81 times larger than the earth, and 4,000 times larger than the Moon. Its surface contains 3,848,460,000 of square miles, which is 78 times the area of all the habitable portions of the earth, and would accommodate more than one billion of inhabitants, which is 1,347 times the population of our globe.

interior, 13½ cents. Letters weighing more than one oz., but under 1½ oz., will be charged *three* rates of postage instead of 4 as formerly —if exceeding 2 oz., but under 2½ oz., five rates instead of six, and so on adding one rate for every additional ½ oz. Newspapers 2 cents. *Must be prepaid.*

A Mail for CANADA is also made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be specially addressed, "*Closed Mail, or Canada.*" Letters 12½ cents—*prepayment optional.*

British reprints of copyright Works from the United States, by *Steamer*, are charged letter postage.

LAND MAILS.

Letters posted in NOVA SCOTIA, addressed to any place within the Province, *if prepaid* 5 cents; *if not prepaid*, 7 cents. Letters mailed for delivery within the County 2 cents; *if not prepaid*, 7 cents. Letters pre-paid may be sent from one Way office to another without passing through a Post Office. If unpaid will be sent to the nearest Post Office, taxed 7 cents, and forwarded to destination.

Letters to CANADA and NEW BRUNSWICK, 5 cents—*prepayment optional.* Letters to PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND, 5 cents, *must be prepaid*: if posted wholly or in part unpaid, they will be forwarded and charged 5 cents in addition to the postage. Letters for the UNITED STATES (except to Oregon and California) 10 cents; to Oregon and California, 15 cents—*must be prepaid.*

Official letters addressed to the Provincial and Military Departments, are exempt from prepayment.

Registered letters for the Provincial Public Departments and the Military Departments, addressed to Halifax, can be sent without prepayment of postage or registry fee.

REGISTRATION.—Letters for registry must be posted *half an hour* previous to the closing of the Mail by which they are to be sent. The postage as well as the Registration fee *must be prepaid.* The registration of a letter addressed to any place in Nova Scotia, British North America, or the United States is 10 cents; to the United Kingdom, 8½ cents; to Australia and all other places, when passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents. No registered letters forwarded between two Way offices.

Registration is applicable to all descriptions of letters and parcels, whether they contain articles of value or not. Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a letter; but a registered letter can be traced when one unregistered cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A registered letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an unregistered letter. "Moreover, the safety of an unregistered letter is dependent on the integrity of a post office clerk during the whole time it remains in his custody, frequently for hours, and even days, whilst a registered letter will almost invariably have to be acknowledged at the moment of its passing into an officer's hands, and cannot therefore be suppressed without leaving him individually accountable for its disposal." "If the consequences were limited to the mere risk of the loss of the money so sent, the senders of money in unregistered letters might reasonably urge, that if they choose to

encounter the risk, they should be free to do so; but higher considerations are involved in the question, and the chance of loss to the careless remitter is really but the smallest part of the evil associated with the practice." The attentive perusal of the above remarks by those who are in the habit of sending money by mail in unregistered letters is strongly recommended, and it is further suggested that letters containing money should invariably be secured with wax, and not by the usual method, by mucilage, or self sealing envelope.

Letters posted in any city or town in the Province for delivery in the same city or town, are charged 2 cents; if unpaid they are taxed 4 cents.

Letters *prepaid* by stamp dropped into the box during the night and up to 4.30 A.M. will be forwarded by the mails despatched the same morning.

Semi-daily Mail to and from Dartmouth, postage 2 cents. If unpaid 4 cents.

All letters are charged by weight irrespective of distance, and a uniform rate of postage of 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., has been established throughout British North America. The rates of postage mentioned all refer to a *single letter*. If it exceeds the $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. it is charged double and so on according to weight. Ship letters 5 cents, Letters for Consignees, *free*.

PRINTED BOOKS transmitted through the Province are charged *one cent per oz.* up to 48 ozs. PRINTED BOOKS, Magazines, Reviews or Pamphlets, binding rollers for prints or maps not exceeding *two feet* in length, markers and every thing appertaining to such publications, are sent between Nova Scotia and the United Kingdom, and also between Nova Scotia, Bermuda, Newfoundland, and the British West Indies, at the following rates:—for a single volume not exceeding 4 ozs., 3d. sterling; above 4 ozs. and not exceeding 8 ozs., 6d. sterling; above 8 ozs. and not exceeding one pound 1s. sterling; and so on, adding 1s. for every additional pound or fraction of a pound. *Must be prepaid.*

PERIODICALS, BRITISH OR FOREIGN, posted *within* the Province for delivery *within* or *without* the Province, *two cents each number, must be pre-paid.*—Those published in the Province, and all Agricultural reports, whether published in the Province, or elsewhere, *pass free.*

BRITISH AND COLONIAL NEWSPAPERS, and small religious periodicals, such as the British Workman, Penny Post, Child's paper, Play Hour, Sabbath School Visitor, and others of a like description, whether British or Foreign, posted either *within* or *without* the Province, *free.* All other Newspapers are charged *one cent each*, if mailed *within* the Province; if mailed *without*, for delivery *within* the Province, the postage is collected on delivery. One Copy, called an exchange copy, of any Newspaper, if addressed to a Newspaper Publisher in Nova Scotia, *passes free.*

Handbills, Lithographed Letters, Circulars and other printed matter of like description, posted *within* the Province and addressed to any place *within* or *without* the same, *one cent per oz. must be prepaid.*

All papers printed by order of the Imperial Parliament, or by her Majesty's command, or by the Legislative Council or House of Assembly of this Province, or by virtue of an address of the Council or Assembly, are transmitted by post, *within* the Province *free.*

Mails for all places named in the foregoing table are made up at 8 p.m., except the second semi-daily mails for Windsor and Truro, which are made up at 2 p.m. Mails from all those places are due at Halifax by the eastern and western morning and evening trains from Truro and Windsor. The shore mails from Lunenburg, Liverpool, &c., are due at 7 p.m.

No printed paper, whether Newspaper, book, pamphlet, or other paper, shall be transmitted either free or at a reduced rate of postage, unless it is sent, 1, Without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends. 2, There shall be no words or communication printed on the paper after its publication, or upon the cover, nor any writing or marks upon it, or upon the cover, except the name and address of the sender and of the person to whom sent. 3. There shall be no paper or thing enclosed with it. Where these conditions are not fulfilled the whole will be charged letter postage.

The word "Newspaper" means any publication issued not less frequently than once a week, and containing notices of passing events—and the word "Periodical" means any publication issued at regular intervals, but less frequently than once a week.

Masters of vessels are entitled to receive for each letter they may deliver, when inwards bound, 2½ cents.

PARCEL POST.—The charge on Parcels, limited to places within the Province is if under 8 ounces, 12½ cents; above 8 ozs. but less than a pound, 25 cents; above 1 and not exceeding 2 pounds, 50 cents; above 2 but not exceeding 3 pounds, 75 cents; beyond this weight no parcel can be sent, and must not exceed 1 foot in length or breadth, and six inches in thickness. *Must be pre-paid.* The charge on parcels to New Brunswick, or Canada is for a parcel under 8 oz. 25 cts.; if more than 1 and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cts.; more than 2 and not exceeding 3 lbs., 75 cents; beyond which weight no parcel can be sent.—Size same as above.—*Must also be pre-paid.*

PATTERN POST.—Patterns of Merchandize can be sent by post between Nova Scotia and Great Britain at the following rates:—for a packet not exceeding 4 oz. 7 cents; under ½ lb. 12½ cents; not exceeding 1 lb. 25 cents; above 1 and not 1½ lbs. 37½ cents; above 1½ and not 2 lbs. 50 cents; every additional ¼ lb. 12½ cents; no parcel to exceed 2 feet in length, breadth or depth, *Must be prepaid.*

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race; Gulf and River St. Lawrence, and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax harbour. *A fixed white light*, elevated 58ft. above the Sea level, and visible 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of the Island, at the entrance of the Eastern Passage to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed red light*, on the seaward sides to distinguish it from Saubro and Meagher's Beach.

lights, elevated 45ft. and visible 8 miles. Octagonal Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

SAMBRO ISLAND LIGHT—On the S.W. side of the entrance to Halifax Harbour. *A fixed white light*, elevated 115ft. above the Sea, and visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat. $44^{\circ} 26' N.$ Long. $63^{\circ} 35' W.$ Guns are fired in answer on the approach of vessels in foggy weather. A fog trumpet has been placed on Sambro Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of the trumpet will be of *five Seconds* duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, and will be audible from 6 to 10 miles in calm weather.

In standing in for the land off Halifax harbour, you may know on which side of the harbour you are, by a remarkable difference that takes place immediately from its mouths, in the colour of the shores; for if it should be red you are to the eastward of it, and if white, you will be to the westward of it.

West from Halifax.

CROSS ISLAND LIGHT—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. *Two lights placed vertically, 34ft. apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles.* Building red, Lantern painted black. Lat. $44^{\circ} 19' N.$ Long. $64^{\circ} 9' W.$

BATTERY POINT LIGHT—At the entrance to Lunenburg harbour. *A fixed white light*, visible 12 miles. White square building. Lunenburg harbour is easy of access, spar buoys have been placed in the bay and entrance to the harbour on the sculpin rock, haddock shoal, Battery point shoal and head shoal. In approaching the harbour from seaward the buoy on sculpin rock painted *red and black* in horizontal stripes may be left on either hand, giving it a berth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted *black* and must be left on the port hand going in.

IRON-BOUND ISLAND LIGHT—Entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light*, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is placed on a square white tower, on the southern side of the Island, 70ft. above sea level, and visible from all points of approach.

PORT MEDWAY HARBOUR LIGHT—On Admiralty Head, W. side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. *A fixed white light*, 44ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles. Spar buoys have been placed in the channel to Port Medway harbour as follows:—On the breaking ledges, Nautilus rock, corner ground, and edge of flats off Bangs' point. In approaching the Channel from seaward *red* buoys must be left on the starboard hand, and *black* buoys on the port hand passing in.

LIVERPOOL LIGHT.—S. end of Coffin's Island. *A revolving light*, appearing full at intervals of two minutes, 80ft. above sea level. Building octagon, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT LIGHT—Entrance to the inner harbour of Liverpool. *A white fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the harbor hand when entering the harbour.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND LIGHT—Off Liverpool. *A revolving red light*, 40ft. above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situated nearly in the centre of the Island. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' 31'' N.$ Long. $64^{\circ} 47' 15'' W.$ The lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling which is painted white.

GULL ROCK LIGHT—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbour. *A white fixed light*, 51ft. above sea level. Square white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 39' N.$ Long. $64^{\circ} 66' W.$

SHELBURNE LIGHT—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbour. *Two fixed white lights vertical*—the upper light 100ft. above sea level and visible 18 miles; the lower light 28ft. below the lantern at the top of the building and visible ten miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

BARRINGTON LIGHT—On Baccaro Point E. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A revolving light*, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds and elevated 49ft. visible 12 miles. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND LIGHT—*A red fixed light*. Octagonal white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 27' N.$ Long. $65^{\circ} 36' W.$ It is high water at Cape Sable, full and change, at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, and the spring tides rise 12ft., neaps 6ft.

SEAL ISLAND LIGHT—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. *A fixed white light*, 80ft. above high water, and may be seen, when approaching, from any point of the compass, at the distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. *The Blonde Rock*, lies about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. by W. from the Light House:—Between this rock and the Island, there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them.

PUBLICO HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbour, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. *A fixed white light*, 28ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12ft.) Square white building standing 50 fathoms from low water mark.

FISH ISLAND LIGHT—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tuskent River. *Two fixed horizontal, white lights* visible at a distance of 12 miles.

YARMOUTH LIGHT—On the Island of Cape Forchu, W. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A bright revolving light*, 115ft. above sea level, visible $\frac{1}{4}$ minute and invisible half a minute, and may be seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building painted red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' N.$ Long. $66^{\circ} 09' W.$

BRIER ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the western side. *A white fixed light*, 92ft. above sea level, and visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building.

WESTPORT LIGHTS—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white fixed lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island light, 40ft. above high water mark, and visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

BOAN'S HEAD LIGHT—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. *Alternate flashes red and white*, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On Point Prim at the entrance of the Gut. *A fixed white light*, 76ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted red and white vertically.

PORT WILLIAMS (late Marshall's Cove) LIGHT—*Two fixed white lights*, 20ft. apart perpendicularly, and visible from all points of

approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE LIGHT—*A red fixed light*, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut light; and W. 15 miles from Black Rock light.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT—*A white fixed light*, 55ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

SPENCER'S POINT—*A white fixed light* is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

PARRSBORO' LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. *A white fixed light*, 30ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT—*A white fixed light*, 95ft. above high water level (rise and full 40 to 45ft), and visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66ft. from the Bluff.

BURNT COAT HEAD LIGHT—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. *A white fixed light*, 75ft. above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT—The Gannet rock is 40ft. above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. *A white flash light*, 20 seconds dark and 40 seconds light in each minute. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the old Proprietor to the seal Islands off Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northern-most and southernmost of the *Murr Ledges*, there is a range of *dangerous rocks* and *shoals*, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the lighthouse about 4 miles. From this range, farther westerly, about 6 miles, lies a *dangerous breaker*, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S.W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS—*Two white fixed lights*, about 48ft. above high water, and bear from each other E.S.E. and W.N.W. distant about 200ft., by which circumstance (the two light houses at the same station) they are distinguished from all others upon the coast. Both buildings white. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights in one, as they will then not be more than $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than 5 miles to the east of the lights.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND LIGHT—On Swallow Tail point, N.E. side of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 130ft. above high water, and visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat. 44° 45' 22" N. Long. 66° 41' 4" W. This is a conspicuous mark in the South Channel between Brier Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER LIGHT—On an Island at the entrance to the River. *A white fixed light*, 40ft. above high water, and visible 11 miles.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT—This is an American light, at the western entrance to Passamaquoddy Bay. *A plain white light*.

E. W. SUTCLIFFE, General Grocer, 133 Barrington Street, opposite the Parade.

CAMPO BELLO LIGHT.—On N. E. extremity of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 64ft. above the sea. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbour at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay to Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS.—Upon this projecting headland, *two fixed white lights*, one above the other, distant 28ft. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81ft., and visible 15 miles. Building red and white in stripes of 6in. broad each, horizontally, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N. B. HARBOUR LIGHT.—On Partridge Island, at the entrance of the River and Harbour. *A white fixed light*, 120ft. above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Fog Horn or Steam Whistle is sounded at intervals of 10 seconds in a minute during the prevalence of fogs and snow storms, and can be heard at a distance of 4 to 6 miles. There is also a *Bell Buoy* anchored at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the Island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The sound of the bell can be heard 3 miles. The **BEACON LIGHT** within Partridge Island exhibits a *white fixed light* 35ft. above high water, and visible 10 miles. Building white and black in vertical stripes.

QUACO HEAD LIGHT.—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light* 70ft. above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, and visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT.—On the point of that name in Westmorland, N. B., nearly opposite Apple River light in Cumberland. *A brilliant fixed light*, 151ft. above the sea, and visible 15 miles. Square white building.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND LIGHT.—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay, Lat. $45^{\circ} 43' 13''$ N., Long. $64^{\circ} 37' 25''$ W., 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT.—On Hotty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. *Two fixed horizontal lights*, 40ft. above high water, and visible about 10 miles. Square white building.

East from Halifax.

EGG ISLAND LIGHT.—Off Jeddore. *A revolving light*, 85ft. above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately red and white faces. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $44^{\circ} 30' 51''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$ W.

OUTER BEAVER OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND LIGHT.—*A revolving white flash light* 70ft. above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls painted on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island a considerable distance. Lat. $41^{\circ} 49'$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 21'$ W.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT.—On the S.W. point of the Island. *A bright flash light* of 10 secs. duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, 60ft. above the sea level.

CRANBERRY ISLAND LIGHT—(Cape Canso.) *Two white fixed lights* placed vertically 12 yards apart, the upper 75ft., the lower 45ft., above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. $45^{\circ} 19' 43''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 55' 29''$ W. A fog trumpet has been placed on Cranberry Island, in operation during thick or foggy weather. Each blast of the trumpet will be of *five seconds* duration, with intervals of 20 seconds, and will be audible from 6 to 10 miles in calm weather.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR LIGHT—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebueto Bay. *A fixed white light*, 30ft. above high water, and visible 8 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$ W.

EDDY, or SAND POINT LIGHT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. Entrance to the Strait of Canso. *Two horizontal fixed lights*, 24ft. apart, elevated 25ft. each, and visible 8 miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE—*A white fixed light*, 110ft. above high water, and visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat. $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$ N.

CAPE ST. GEORGE LIGHT—(Antigonish Co.) On the N. side of the Cape. *A revolving white light* every half minute, and visible 25 miles. 350ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 55' 0''$ W.

PICOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S.E. point of the Island. *A white fixed light*, 52ft. above sea level, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

PICOU HARBOUR LIGHT—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light* 65ft. above sea level, and visible 12 miles. *A small red light* is shown below the lantern. Building octagon, in red and white stripes vertically.

ARICHAU LIGHT—On Marache point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 31ft. above high water, and visible 8 miles. Square white building.

GREEN ISLAND LIGHT—Near the S. E. end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichau. *A fixed red light*, elevated 70ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 28' 51''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the Keeper's dwelling which is painted white. Height from base of dwelling to top of lantern, 31ft.

LOUISBURGH LIGHT—On light house point, N. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 85ft. above high water, and visible 10 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes.

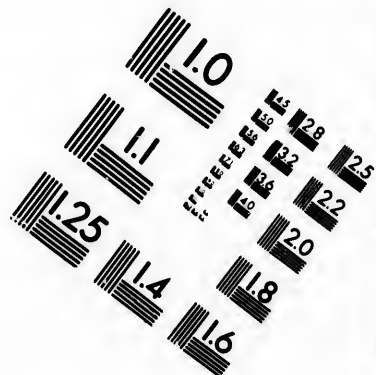
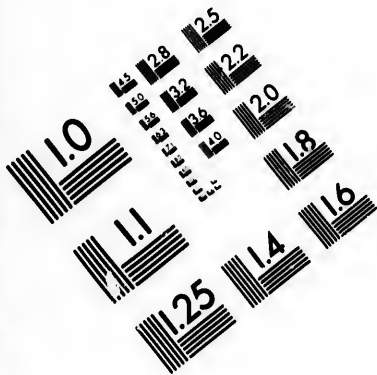
SCATTARI ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. E. point of the Island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90ft., and visible 15 miles. Building white, Lat. $40^{\circ} 2' 13''$ N., Long. $59^{\circ} 40' 18''$ W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N.N.E., or to the southward of S.S.W., nor approached nearer than $\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton between Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat. $46^{\circ} 11' 5''$ N., Long. $59^{\circ} 47'$. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 sec., 65ft. above high water. Building octagon, painted white.

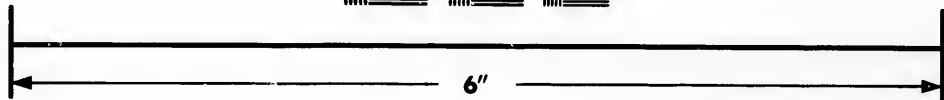
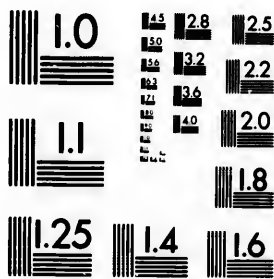
LOW POINT LIGHT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B. harbour. *A white fixed light*, elevated 70ft., and visible 14 miles. Building painted red and white vertically.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND LIGHT—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's, (E. coast of Cape Breton). *Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds*, elevated 77ft., and visible 14 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. $46^{\circ} 25' N.$, Long. $60^{\circ} 25' 30'' W.$

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND LIGHTS—On the S. point of the Island, Lat. $47^{\circ} 11' 20''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 9' 36''$ is an octagon light house exhibiting *a revolving white light every minute*, elevated 140ft., and visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S.S.E. southward to W. On a rock, 26ft. from the end of the Island, in Lat. $47^{\circ} 13' 59''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 8' 20''$ is another similar building of the same height showing *a white fixed light*, visible 20 miles, between N. by E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. northward to E.N.E. A bell is sounded during a fog, and a gun fired every 4 hours.

MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND LIGHT—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the mainland. *A white fixed light*, near the centre and summit of the Island, elevated 208ft., and visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building.

To vessels in dangerous proximity to the Island, the light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs on the sides of the Island.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—*A fixed light*, shows *red* on the N. side; and *white* to the southward, elevated 54ft., and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat. $46^{\circ} N.$ Long. $61^{\circ} 31' 40'' W.$

CAPE RACE, N.F.L. LIGHT—*A revolving white light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every half minute, elevated 180ft., and visible 17 miles. The S.E. face of the building is striped red and white vertically. Lat. $46^{\circ} 39' 41'' N.$, Long. $63^{\circ} 7' 00'' W.$

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT—On an Island at E. entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme S. W. point of the Island. *A fixed white light*, elevated 479ft. Building circular, faced with fire bricks of a light colour, visible $28\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $32\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Lat. $51^{\circ} 53' N.$ Long. $55^{\circ} 26' W.$

POINT AMOUR LIGHT—Labrador coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the S. E. point of Forteau Bay. *A fixed white light*, visible $18\frac{1}{2}$ nautical or $21\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building circular, faced with fire brick of a light colour. Lat. $51^{\circ} 27\frac{1}{2}' N.$ Long. $56^{\circ} 51' W.$

ANTICOSTI—There are three excellent lights on the Island of Anticosti:—**THE SOUTH WEST POINT LIGHT** is on the extremity of the point—the tower is of a conical form, 75ft. high—the light is bright, and *revolves* every minute, and can be seen from N. N. W. to about S. S. E. The lantern is elevated about 100ft. above the sea at high water, and can be seen 15 miles. **HEATH POINT LIGHT** is of the same form, dimensions and colour as the one above, showing a bright *fixed light* from W. N. W. to N. E. by N.—the lantern is elevated 110ft. above the sea—and is visible 15 or 18 miles in clear weather—lighted from April to December, 15. The light house must always be kept open southward of Cormorant point. **WEST POINT LIGHT** shows a *fixed light*, elevated 112ft. and is visible 15 miles. Tower circular, faced with white fire brick.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT—E. coast of Gaspe, at the extreme point of the Cape. *A fixed white light*, elevated 136ft. and visible $16\frac{1}{2}$ nautical, or $19\frac{1}{2}$ statute miles. Building circular faced with fire brick of a light color.

An air or fog whistle is sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a gun, fired every hour, in case the whistle is out of order, at the above four lighthouses.

For 1 square rigged vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.

" 2 Do. 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 3 Do. 2 balls close up, one out and one in.

" 4 Do. 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do. a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.

" 6 Do. a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

" 7 Do. a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do. a pendant under two balls close on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 9 Do. a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 10 Do. a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted at the east or west yard arm, according to the quarter the vessel first appears in.

When sailing vessels are reported from an outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:—

For a square rigged vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Two lanterns, one *red* and the other *white*, are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

The *red* lantern is always shewn at the end of the yard arm, and the *white* one at the inner halliard, E. or W., according to quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the mast-head :

A Union Jack—a Flag Ship.
