FIFTEEN HOURS BUT THEY ESCAPE DEATH

Nine Persons Have Many Hardships, But Pass Thru as if by Miracle.

Boston, Dec. 14.—A story of hardship and miraculous escape from death was related by the crew of the New York barkentine Emilia, who were brought here to-day by the Clyde liner New York, which rescued the crew last Sunday, 15 hours after they had been carried adrift on a fragment of their vessel, the Emilia, which left Portland, Dec. 7, with pine lumber for Fall River, struck on Diamond Shoal, off Cape Hatteras, at 1 o'clock last Saturday night during a heavy gale. The vessel was found to pieces half an hour later. No lives were lost. The captain of the vessel was W. E. Reemie of Machias, Me., and besides his crew of seven men, he had his wife with him.

The voyage was smooth until last Saturday, when the weather appeared threatening. At noon Capt. Reemie decided to reduce sail and steer for Diamond Shoal Lightship. The wind increased, and a heavy vapor came over the water, followed by occasional snow squalls, which made it impossible to see ahead of the bowsprit. At eight o'clock soundings were taken, but no bottom could be found. The captain decided that he was well off shore. Half an hour later the lookout reported that he made out the glimmer of a light, but could not see it. This was the reflection of one of the two beacons, as the mist again settled. Suddenly the barkentine brought up on what was afterwards proved to be Diamond Shoal, and great waves threatened to sweep overboard.

The entire crew and the captain's family were crowded into the forward deckhouse. A few minutes before Mrs. Reemie was carried from the pilot-house to the cabin, but she escaped injury.

Within a quarter of an hour after the wreck struck the mizenmast went overboard and at the same time a great sea reached the bow. The Emilia was entirely clear of the bottom at times, and with each reaching wave the great bow of the vessel began to go to pieces and in a short time the main deck gradually went to pieces. The crew attempted to construct a raft, but as the storm continued the task was abandoned. The forward deckhouse remained attached to a portion of the main deck and when seas swept it away the captain, his wife and crew were able to hold their positions, and the waves dashed over them frequently and they were obliged to stand in a foot of water. The wreck was drifted about twenty miles in a southeasterly direction and in the path of the coast steamer, the noon Sunday, the steward found matches in a tin box and by tearing off parts of the interior of the hull was able to start a fire on the remaining portion of the deck. The fire attracted the attention of the coast steamer, and the wreck was still running high, all the castaways were taken from the wreckage.

FATHER IGNATIUS' POWER RAISED GIRL FROM DEAD

Priest Who Claims Divine Power Tells of Miracle Performed in 1862.

New York, Dec. 14.—A London despatch to The Herald says: Continuing his avowal of the odd, even to the raising of the dead, Father Ignatius, the Welsh clergyman, proceeded to recount to a representative of The Daily Express on Tuesday various occasions on which he had performed what he called miracles. One notable occasion, it appears from Father Ignatius' statement, was in the year 1862, when one night a woman earnestly besought Father Ignatius to save her daughter, who was dying of typhoid fever. "Suddenly," said Father Ignatius, "I felt the command of Our Lord upon me and I rose up. All I said to my friend was: 'Do bring your relic with you.' He had a wonderful, beautiful relic, a piece of the true cross. We had a long walk and went as fast as we could.

"When we reached the house the girl was dead. She had been dead two hours and the body was already composed for burial. Upon an involuntary impulse, however, which I felt to be inspired, I took the relic of the cross from my friend and laid it upon the dead girl's breast. Then, in the words of the prophet, I cried: 'In the name of Jesus Christ, I say unto thee arise.' Slowly and stiffly the corpse arose in bed and my friend, turning to me cried: 'What have you done?' 'I have done nothing,' I replied, 'but the Lord has done great things indeed.' Father Ignatius further declares that upon sprinkling the dried corpse of a killed workman with Lourdes water and uttering a divine command the man got up and walked home.

"OFFERED WITHOUT REPLY."

What Manchester Courier Thinks of Canada and Britain.
