AUTOMOTIVE WORLD

Two friends, W. A. Chryst and C. M. PARIS WILL SYNCHRONIZE TRAFFIC

Paris will soon try out a system of synchronized traffic regulation modeled on that of New York City. Because of the complicated way in which Paris streets wind about and cross each other at every angle, it has been impossible to apply synchronization as used in a geometrical city like New York, but the scheme the French police will attempt is to open three or four blocks of continuous traffic on the principal thoroughfares. Traffic will be regulated by red and green lights.
