

The new charter provides that the Mayor and each of the four commissioners shall have three votes each on any question before the Municipal Council. Mr. Kelley's contention was that while this voting power might apply to the general affairs of the Municipality it should not have effect in purely parish matters, for which the parishes tax themselves. The section was not altered. Hon. Mr. Maxwell pointed out that the elective control of the commissioners over the non-elective employees of the city was insufficient, but Mr. Estabrooks thought the section under which a commissioner could suspend or discharge a non-elective head of a department was sufficient. These were about the only matters discussed at the meeting. Mr. H. B. Schofield inquired if it were the intention to submit the charter to a general meeting of citizens before presenting it to the Legislature. Mr. Estabrooks said that it is not considered advisable to do this. The charter will, therefore, go before the Legislature and the responsibility of amending or passing it as it now is will rest solely with that body. The action of the Citizens' Committee will certainly prolong the debate in the Legislature and throw a responsibility on that body it should not have been asked to undertake.






