

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# MINUTES

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Synod of Hamilton and London,

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HELD IN BRANTFORD.

APRIL 8TH, 9TH AND 10TH, 1889.

At Brantford, and within Zion Church there, the eighth day of April, one thousand and eight hundred and eighty-nine years, at half past seven o'clock, p. m., which day and place the Synod of Hamilton and London of the Presbyterian Church in Canada met, and after a sermon by the retiring Moderator, the Rev. Dr. James, of Walkerton, from Revelation, chapter 5, v 14th; was duly constituted by prayer.

Henderson, Dr. Laing, Mr. Caswell, ministers; and Messrs. A. J. McKenzie and Dr. Macintyre, elders.

# BUXTON FUND.

The Clerk read the report of the committee on the Buxton Fund, showing that the sum of \$230 had been received during the year and paid over to Mr. King. On motion of Dr. Cochrane, duly seconded, the report was received and adopted, thanks tendered the Convener and the committee, and the committee re-appointed for the following year. # LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

# ONTARIO INSTITUTE FOR THE BLIND.

A letter was read from Principal Dymond of the Blind Institute, inviting the members of Synod to visit the Institution, The Olerk was

instructed to acknowledge Mr. Dymond's invitation with thanks, in the hope that as many members as can conveniently, will respond to it.

# PETITION FROM MAITLAND PRESBYTERY.

There was read a petition from the Presbytery of Maitland, asking the Synod to transfer to said Presbytery, a portion of the mission field under the Presbytery of Bruce. Messrs. McQuarrie and Ross were heard in support of the petition. After deliberation, the following deliverance was agreed to on the motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Dr. Thompson:

"The Synod recommend the Presbytery of Maitland to confer with the Presbytery of Bruce, and also if they see fit, with the Presbytery of Owen Sound in the Synod of Toronto and Kingston, in the matter of dividing the mission field, now under the sole care of the Bruce Presbytery, and report the result of their negotiations to the next Synod, and also if they deem it needful, to the Home Mission Committee, at any of the meetings during the year."

# PETITION FROM MR. McPHERSON.

There was read a petition from Mr. McPherson, of Stratford, regarding the annuity still unpaid him by the congregation of Knox Church, Stratford, and in regard to which the Synod at its last meeting took action, by the appointment of a committee to confer with all parties, with a view to an amicable settlement of the matter in dispute. There were also read minutes of the Stratford Presbytery, transmitting said petition to the Synod, also minutes of meetings held by the committee, with all the parties in Stratford, and their report to the Synod. Dr. Proudfoot presented the report and spoke to it, followed by Dr. Laidlaw.

On motion of Dr. Thompson, duly seconded, the report of the committee was received, and the thanks of the Synod tendered them for their diligence.

Mr. McPherson was then heard at considerable length, in support of his petition.

On motion of Dr. Laing, the petition was received. At this stage of the proceedings, Mr. McPherson withdrew his petition, inasmuch as the matter was fully before the Synod, by the report of the committee.

After deliberation, it was moved by Dr. James, seconded by Dr. Laing, and agreed, that a small committee be appointed along with Drs. Proudfoot and Laidlaw, to bring in a deliverance, on the report submitted by the committee on the Stratford case.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned until 2 p, m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

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# THIRD SEDERUNT.

Zion Church, Brantford, the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine, two o'clock, p m.

The Synod again met pursuant to adjournment, Rev. George Cuthbertson, Moderator. The Synod engaged in devotional exercises, conducted by the Moderator, Mr. Gustavus Munro, engaging in prayer.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

# COMMITTEE ON THE STRATFORD CASE.

The Moderator appointed the following committee on the Stratford case: Dr. Proudfoot, Convener, Drs. Laidlaw, Laing, Thompson, McMullen, James and Cochrane, and Messrs. A. D. McDonald, F. McCuaig, and Alex. Henderson, ministers, and Messrs D. D. Wilson, T. W. Nisbet and Dr. T. M. Macintyre, elders.

# LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Dr. McMullen on behalf of the committee appointed, to consider applications for the licensing of students, gave in their report, recommending that leave be given to the several Presbyteries, to take on trials for license, Messrs. Pettinger, Hossack, Hutt, Jansen, McMillan and Needham.

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

The report on temperance was presented by Mr. W. M. Martin.

The report was received, and it was agreed to consider the recommendations seriatim.

Ater certain emmendations had been made, the recommendations were adopted as a whole, and are as follows:—

- 1. That the attention of Presbyteries be again called to the large number of sessions not reporting, and that they seek to impress the duty upon sessions, of yielding loyalty to the supreme court in this matter.
- 2. That while approving strongly of the provision made for imparting scientific temperance instruction in the Public Schools, the Synod earnestly urge our people to see that such instruction is regularly imparted from the text book authorized by the education department, and further would respectfully urge upon the Minister of Education, that value should be given to the examinations on this text book, as is the case with the other subjects.
- 3. In view of the unanimous expression of opinion on the part of our sessions, reporting, that intemperance has greatly increased in those counties, where the Scott Act was repealed a year ago; the Synod earnestly urge all its ministers to bring the subject of temperance prominently

before the people from the pulpit and otherwise, and would also recommend the teaching of the quarterly temperance lesson, in all our Sabbath Schools.

4. That this Synod call upon all its officebearers, members and adherents, both by precept and example, to use their utmost endeavors against the evils of intemperance.

5. Nothwithstanding the late repeal of the Scott Act in a number of counties, the Synod would express the earnest hope, that the friends of temperance and prohibition will never relax their efforts, until total prohibition is obtained, and the liquor traffic is removed from our country.

# REPORT ON SABBATH SCHOOLS.

The report on Sabbath Schools was presented by Mr. T. W. Nisbet, the Convener. On motion of Mr. Robert Hamilton, duly seconded, the report was received and unanimously adopted, and special thanks tendered the Convener, for his arduous labors in its preparation.

# DEPUTATION FROM THE METHODIST CHURCH.

The Rev John Kay and Rev. Dr. Young, of the Canada Methodist Church, were then introduced to the Synod by Dr. Cochrane, and conveyed the fraternal greetings of the city ministers and the Niagara Conference, in felicitious terms. The Moderator made a happy response to the addresses of these ministerial brethren.

# REPORT ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Mr. W J. Dey, Convener of the Committee on Sabbath observance, gave in the report.

On motion, the report was received.

The recommendations were then considered senatim and adopted as follows:—

1 That the Synod fix a day on which the obligation and importance of the Sabbath, as a day of rest and worship, be laid before our congregations and Sunday Schools, as enjoined by the Assembly. The last Sabbath of May is recommended for this purpose.

2. That Presbyterians be urged to send a deputation to each M. P. and M. P. P., in their parliaments, to solicit his support in securing the enforcement of our Sabbath laws, and in securing better legislation against Sabbath violation by railroad and steamboat companies and all other offenders against the law of the Sabbath.

3. That the Synod approve of the formation of a Sabbath Alliance for Western Ontario, and appoint at least one minister and one elder or laymen for each of its Presbyteries, to meet with the representatives of other churches for the formation of such Alliance; and that such deleters the such deleters of the such alliance is the such deleters.

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It was further moved by Dr. McMullen and seconded by Dr. Thompson, that the Synod endorse the petition of the Presbytery of Hamilton to the Dominion Government, praying for the closing of the Welland Canal, during the whole of the Lord's day, and that the Moderator and Clerk sign said petition in name of the Synod, and transmit the action of the Synod to the Government.

The hour of adjournment having arrived the Synod adjourned to meet again at 7.30 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

# FOURTH SELERUNT.

Zion Church, Brantford, the ninth day of April, one thousand  $\epsilon$ ight hundred and eighty nine.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment at 7.80 p. m., and engaged in devotional exercises, conducted by the Moderator, Dr. Battisby engaging in prayer.

The minutes of last sederunt were read and sustained.

# EVANGELISTIC WORK.

Dr. Battisby according to previous appointment addressed the Synod on "Evangelistic work, its place and power," and Mr. P. Wright, of Stratford, on the "Best methods of Evangelistic work."

# REPORT ON THE STATE OF RELIGION.

Dr. Fletcher, Convener of the Committee on the state of religion, presented the report. On motion of Mr. Robert Hamilton, the report was received and thanks tendered to the Convener, for the preparation of the excellent report submitted.

The recommendations of the committee were adopted as follows:

That the Synod exhort its ministers and elders, to discountenance
that insidious form of Sabbath desceration, in the frequenting by church
members and adherents of places of public resort, under color of religious
sorvice, and also the questionable practice of converting the ordinary diet
of public worship into a sacred concert of popular entertainment.

2. That the Synod would earnestly recommend the General Assembly, to urge pastors and elders in their visitation to call attention to the importance of family worship, and use their best endeavors to secure the regular observance of it, at least on the part of all heads of families, in full communion with the church, and faithfully to impress on parents, the scriptural duty of systematic religious instruction in the family, and to remind them that while they are availing themselves of all the advantages of the Sabbath School, they are not to neglect their own home duty.

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# HOME MISSIONS IN THE NORTHWEST.

Dr. Robertson, Superintendent of Missions in the Northwest, addressed the Synod by request, after which the Synod adjourned to meet to-morrow morning at nine o'clock.

The Moderator then pronounced the benediction.

# FIFTH SEDERUNT.

Zion Church, Brantford, the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at 9 a. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment and was constituted by the Moderator, Mr. George Sutherland engaging in prayer.

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

# TRANSFERENCE OF FORDWICH AND GORRIE.

A petition of the congregations of Fordwich and Gorrie in the Presbytery of Maitland to be transferred to the Presbytory of Saugeen, in the Synod of Toronto and Kingston, was read. On motion, the petition was transmitted to the General Assembly for final action.

# BRANTFORD YOUNG LADIES COLLEGE.

The Clerk read the annual report of the Brantford Young Ladies College, setting forth the efforts of the Directors to raise the college to a still higher standard of excellence and efficiency. Dr. Laing, Dr. Thompson and Dr. T. M. Macintyre were heard in support of the report. On motion of Dr. Laing, seconded by Dr. Thompson, the report was received.

On motion of Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. John Gray, of Windsor, the following was unanimously adopted:—

The Synod express pleasure at the good work done by the college, and the efforts of the Board of Directors to increase its efficiency, and make it in every way worthy of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, and invite the hearty co-operation of ministers and members of church by increasing the attendance during the ensuing college year; commend it to parents and guardians as an institution, where young ladies may have not only a thorough christian training, but a christian home, and appoint the Rev. Hector McQuarrie, visitor for the ensuing year.

Mr. McQuarrie, Mr. McDonald, Mr. McLean and Mr. D. D. McLeod, (of the Presbytery of Barrie) addressed the Court on matters appertaining to the college.

## PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The committee to examine the records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Sarnia, Stratford, Chatham, Huron, Maitland and Bruce, reported the same as carefully and correctly kept, and the records were ordered to be attested in accordance with said reports.

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# NEXT MEETING.

It was agreed that the Synod should meet next year in Windsor, and within St. Andrew's Church there, on the third Monday of April, 1890, at half-past 7 p. m.

The hour of adjournment having arrived the Synond adjourned to meet again at 2 p m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

Zion Church, Brantford, the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, at two p. m, the Synod again met, the Moderator presiding. The Moderator conducted devotional exercises, Mr. A. Beamer engaging in prayer

The minutes of last Sederunt were read and sustained.

# AGED AND INFIRM MINISTERS FUND.

The discussion on this subject was renewed and finally, the following deliverance was adopted, on motion of Dr McMullen, seconded by Dr. Thompson.

That the Synod tender cordial thanks to Mr. Macdonald for his excellent address on the Aged and Infirm Ministers Fund, and express regret that the amount received by the committee from the congregations within the bounds of this Synod has fallen so far below the sum which the committee asked for; commend the scheme to the generous consideration and liberality of the congregations within the bounds, and record gratification that arrangements have been completed for prosecuting the canvass for the raising of the proposed \$200,000.

# THE STRATFORD CASE.

Dr. Proudfoot, from the committee, presented the following report and recommendation:—

To the Reverend, the Synod of Hamilton and London, now in session,—the committee on the Stratford case, beg respectfully to report that after protracted and earnest consideration, and also conference with

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Reverends T. McPherson and P. Wright, your committee rejoice to find that there is no such alienation between their prethren, as should prevent the settlement of the matter.

In view of all that has been found, your committee beg to recommend that the decision of last meeting of Synod be re-affirmed, in accordance with which Mr. McPherson agrees to accept \$1,500 as final settlement of his claim; and that in order to bring the whole matter fully before the congregation of Knox Church, Stratford, a Commission of Synod be appointed to proceed to Stratford with Synodical powers, finally to issue the case; and that this Commission be instructed to take immediately whatever steps may be necessary to bring before them all parties and papers in the case.

# AUDITORS REPORT.

Mr. Alex. Henderson gave in the report of the auditors, showing that the receipts for the year amounted to \$195.83, with an expenditure of \$167.86, and that there were arrears amounting to \$260.

The report was received and the thanks of the Synod given to Mr. George Rutherford the Treasurer, for his unwearied services given for so many years to the Synod, in the office he holds.

It was further agreed on the motion of Mr. Alex. Henderson, seconded by Mr. A. J. McKenzie, that the Treasurer be instructed to send to the Presbytery clerks, a list of all the congregations within their respective Presbytery bounds, which are in arrears to this fund, with the respective sums due, with the view of having all arrears paid up before next meeting of Synod, and also instruct Presbyteries to see that the Synod's assessment is collected regularly from year to year.

Mr John Gray, Convener of the committee to prepare for a religious conference at the next meeting of Synod, presented a report recommending that the subject for consideration be the engaging of the lay element, in the religious work of our congregations. On motion made the report was received and the recommendation adopted.

# JESUIT ESTATES BILL.

Dr. James from the committee appointed to prepare a deliverance on the Jesuit Estates Bill presented the following report and recommendations, which on motion of Dr. Laing, seconded by Mr. M. McGregor, were adopted with but one dissentient. Whereas, in an act passed in July, 1888, by the Legislature of the Province of Quebec, intituled "An Act respecting the settlement of the Jesuits' Estates," there are statements which accord to the Bishop of Rome, otherwise styled the Pope, and his authorized agents, certain civil rights, within the Dominion of Canada and which recognize him as the Head of the Romish church, and as possessed of authority to interfere in the administration of civil affairs and to give validity to legislation left dependent on his saiction.

Whereas by said act the sum of \$400,000 taken from the public funds of the Province are placed at the disposal of the Pope without any restriction, except that the money "Shall be expended exclusively in the Province."

Whereas this money is expressly declared to be a "compensation" for the alleged loss of certain property known as the Jesuits' Estates, which escheated to the Crown; which the act expressly declares that "the government does not recognize any civil obligation but merely a moral obligation" to make such compensation and this is avowedly done in consideration of the Pope's "granting permission" to the Government to sell these public lands.

Whereas the said act expressly recognizes as existing between the Province of Quebec and the See of Rome a "glorious concordat" that is, that the establishments of the Jesuit Fathers in this province are always allowed in accordance with their deserts and if they ask for it, to participate in the grants which the government of this province allows other institutions to encourage teaching, education, industries, arts and colonization.

Whereas by commemorating in the political history of the country that "glorious concordat" said act provides that all the rights of the province in and to the Laprairie Common "be transferred to the Society of Jesus," which is confessedly an alien society.

Therefore, be it resolved—That this Synod utters its condemnation of this act, and protests determinedly and earnestly against such enact ments, and more particularly against the claims of the Pope and the acknowledgement of them against the recognition by the Legislature of civil rights as if possessed by him, against the alleged Concordat and against the gifts of money and lands to the Pope and to this Society of Jesuits, as

- (1.) Contrary alike to the letter and spirit of the laws of this British Empire generally, and of this Dominion in particular.
- (2.) Subversive of the civil and religious liberty which has been secured to us as British citizens and derogatory to the Sovereignty and supremacy of the Queen.
- (3.) Inconsistent with and destructive of that religious equality and freedom which are understood to obtain throughout this Dominion,

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docu ance along matt Dr. 1 McQ J. Cl bestowing on the church of Rome an excess of privilege beyond the favor conceded by the King at the time of the conquest to the inhabitants of Canada, viz:—"To profess the worship of their religion, according to the rites of the Romish church as far as the laws of Great Britain permit."

(4.) A malversation of the public funds and public domains.

(5.) Unjust and oppressive to our Protestant minority in the Province of Quebec who are conscientiously opposed to the endowment and maintenance by taxes, levied to a great extent upon them of what they regard as deadly error.

(6.) Endangering the liberty, peace and prosperity of our country and tending to deprave public morals and destroy personal independence, inasmuch as the Society of Jesus thus established and endowed has by its well known principles, aims and practices invariably proved an intolerable evil, in all countries in which it has been established.

Also, whereas the Dominion Government has decided to "leave said act to its operations" and has been sustained by an overwhelming majority of the House of Commons in refusing to disallow it; be it resolved.

That this Synod urge all the christian people under its care to inform themselves fully regarding this matter, to rise above all party considerations and unite in defence of our civil and religious liberty, and to see that only such men be returned to represent them in Parlament as will not be found wanting in the conflict which the persistent aggressiveness of the Romish hierarchy is forcing on our country.

Further in regard to the recent incorporation of the Society of Jesuits, the Synod expresses its regret that a Society which in every country, Romen Catholic as well as Protestant, it has been found necessary to suppress in the interests of public welfare, peace and morality, and which is not tolerated in great Britain or any other part of the Empire, should have been re-established and granted co-porate existence and rights in one of the provinces of this fair Dominion; and also expresses the hope that in some way the constitutionality of this Act may be tested so as to secure its amendment or repeal.

In order to give effect to the above resolutions, the Synod authorizes the Moderator and Clerk, in its name, to sign such petitions and other documents as they may deem to be of service in securing the disallowance of the Jesuits' Act, and appoints the following ministers and elders along with the Moderator and Clerk, a committee to watch the whole matter, and do what may be found necessary from time to time, viz: Dr. Laing, Dr. McMullen, Mr. Ball. Dr. Battisby, Mr. McAdam, Mr. McQuarrie, J. S: Henderson, Dr. James. Mr. R. Hamilton, ministers; J. Charlton, M. P., J. C. Eckford, T. W. Nisbet, Thos. Gordon and D

D. Wilson, elders; and resolves to call the attention of the General Assembly to this matter, praying the Supreme Court to adopt whatever measures it may judge proper so as to afford direction to the people generally, in the grave and momentous crisis which is upon us.

On motion of Mr. Hamilton, the cordial thanks of the Synod were given to the ministers and office-bearers of Zion Church, for the use of their building and the arrangements made for the work of the Synod, to the committee on accommodation, and the friends in Brantford for the generous hospitality extended, to the railways for reduced rates, and to the press for reports of the Synod's proceedings.

The business being finished and praise having been engaged in, the Moderator declared the Synod adjourned to meet in St. Andrew's Church, Windsor, on the third Monday of April, A. D., 1890, at half-past 7 o'clock, p. m., and the sederunt was closed with the benediction.
