P R E F A C E.

The Publisher owes an apology to the Public for the somewhat incomplete nature of the Canadian Churchman's Almanac on this its first appearance.

The Clergy were requested by circular to send in information regarding their several localities, but only a few responded to the call. While therefore the general information contained in the Almanac is reliable, and it is hoped will be found to be judiciously arranged and adapted for reference, the local information regarding the different dioceses, the towns and villages in those dioceses, their churches, societies, &c., will, from the cause above alluded to, be found to be exceedingly meagre and incomplete.

The Publisher however trusts that the circulation of the Almanac will cause a wider interest in its establishment as a regular annual, and that in future he will receive from the Clergy, not later than the 1st November in each year, such local information as will, when collected together, make the Almanac complete and useful.

The orders for the proposed Sheet Calendar have been so limited that the Publisher has found it necessary to limit the undertaking for this year to the Almanac.

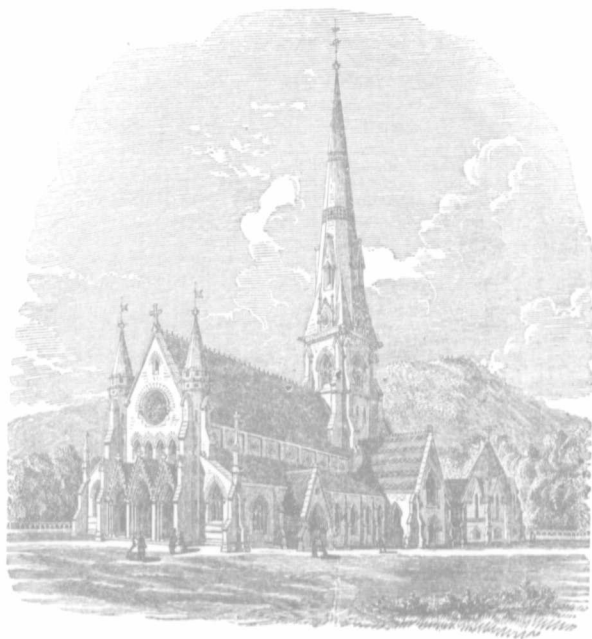

2. A partial eclipse of the sun, June 25, 1862, invisible in Canada.
3. A partial eclipse of the sun, Nov. 21, 1862, invisible in Canada.
4. A total eclipse of the moon, Dec. 6, 1862, visible in Canada.
5. A partial eclipse of the sun, Dec. 20, 1862, invisible in Canada.

Universities in Canada.

UNIVERSITY OF TRINITY COLLEGE, TORONTO.

Constituted by Royal Charter, July, 1852.

The University of Trinity College was constituted by a Royal Charter, bearing date 16th July, 1852, and empowered to confer Degrees in Divinity, Arts, Law and Medicine.

The Convocation of the University consists of the Chancellor, the Provost and Professors of Trinity College, and all persons admitted to the Degree of Master of Arts, or to any Degree in Divinity, Law, or Medicine, in the University.

No degree can be granted by the University, unless a Supplicant for that Degree shall have passed the Convocation, having been previously approved by the Caput.

The Caput consists of the Vice-Chancellor, and four Members of Convocation, to be elected annually by Convocation at the first meeting in the Michaelmas Term.

The University confers no Degree whatever unless the candidate has previously taken the oaths of allegiance and supremacy, and subscribed the following declaration:—

"I, A. B., do willingly and heartily declare that I am truly and sincerely a member of the United Church of England and Ireland."*

About the same number were sent from England by private benefactors before the College was opened. Valuable additions have been made to the Library by the Government of the State of New York, from the Smithsonian Institute, and from Columbia College. The Bishop of Toronto has also presented upwards of 300 volumes, including many valuable works in Theological, Classical and general Literature. The University of Oxford has recently made a munificent grant of books, published at the University press, of the value of £150 sterling; and Trinity College, Dublin, has kindly presented copies of the works published by the University, amounting to upwards of 80 volumes.

All fees for Matriculation and Degrees are appropriated to the Library Fund. Members of Convocation are, under certain regulations, entitled to the use of the Library.

Museum.—A part of the present building has been fitted up for the temporary reception of a Museum of Natural History, towards which many Mineralogical, Geological, and other specimens have been already contributed.

UNIVERSITY OF BISHOP'S COLLEGE, LENNOXVILLE.

Bishop's College was founded in 1845. It received its Charter (Royal) as an University in 1853. It has four Professional Chairs: Classical, Mathematical, Theological, and that of Belles Lettres.

Besides the College proper, it has also a Junior Department, presided over by one of the Professors, and inspected and directed in its several departments by the other Professors, assisted by Tutors and other Teachers. It numbers at present 21 students in Arts and Theology, and 104 pupils in the Junior Department, in which there is a class in immediate preparation for entering the University. The supreme government of the whole is vested in a Corporate body, presided over by the Bishops of the Church in Lower Canada. The other branches of this body are the Board of Trustees and the College Council; the members of both bodies are appointed by the Bishops jointly. The conferring of Degrees, and all other matters relating to them, are regulated by the Convocation, presided over by a Chancellor and Vice-Chancellor. The immediate source of legislation for the practical working of the Institution is the Council. The executive is lodged in the hands of the Principal of the College, the Rector of the Junior Department, and the other Professors.

The Professors are all members of the Church of England. A system of religious training and teaching is pursued throughout except in cases where the parents wish their sons to be exempted.

The College possesses a respectable Library, Museum and Philosophical Apparatus, as well as a neat Chapel.

The charges are \$2.50 per week, for board to members of the College, besides washing, fuel and lights. For tuition, &c., \$36.00 per annum. The academic year consists of about 40 weeks. Members of the Junior Department pay \$3.00 per week; fuel, lights, and extra supervision being provided. The charge for tuition is the same, viz, \$36.00 per annum: except in the cases of parents resident in Lennoxville and Clergymen's sons.

The terms of residence are as follows: College (1) From first Saturday in September to December 21st; (2) From third Saturday in January to first Saturday in April; (3) From first Saturday in April to last Thursday in June. And in the Junior Department, (1) From 24th August to December 21st; (2) From January 7th to April 6th; (3) From April 6th to last Thursday in June.

The Diocese of Montreal was established in the year 1850, by the division of the old Diocese of Quebec: and contains an extent of country just about the size of England and Wales. By far the greater portion of Canada East, or Lower Canada, was settled by French Roman Catholics, before the Province was ceded to the Crown of England, in 1763: and the majority of the present population are members of the Roman Catholic Church. In consequence of this, the progress of the Church of England has been comparatively much slower than in Upper Canada, and it continues to be attended with much greater difficulties. Nor has the Church in Lower Canada, where the population in the rural districts is much less than in the West, received the same amount of assistance towards endowments, as in the Upper Province. The prosperity of the Church received a great temporary check in the City and Diocese of Montreal, by the loss of the Cathedral, which was totally destroyed by fire, on the 10th of December, 1866.

By means of voluntary contributions, the present magnificent edifice has been constructed. The appropriateness of the architecture, and the completeness of the interior arrangements, leave but little to be desired. The Prince of Wales attended service here, on Sunday, the 25th August, 1860.

LAWS, REGULATIONS, AND CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

1. The Society shall be designated "The Colonial and Continental Church Society"; the object of which shall be to send Clergymen, Catechists, and Schoolmasters to the Colonies of Great Britain, and to British residents in other parts of the world.

2. The management of the Society shall be under the direction of persons who are members of the United Church of England and Ireland, and all the agents of the Society shall likewise be members of the same.

3. The selection, appointment, removal, and field of labor of all the agents, together with the amount of their respective salaries, shall rest entirely with the Committee of the Society. The clergymen employed by the Society shall be subject to the ecclesiastical jurisdiction of their Dioceses; and the Schools shall be open at all times to the visits of the Diocesan, and the parochial or missionary clergy in their respective districts.

4. The religious instruction in all Schools, maintained wholly or in part by the Society, shall be in the Holy Scriptures, and (except in cases where the parents or guardians of the children formally object) in the formularies of the Church of England; and no books shall be used in the Society's Schools except with the approval of the Committee.

5. The affairs of the Society in the Colonies shall be conducted by the General Committee at home, or by Corresponding Committees nominated or approved by them; and the Bishop of the Diocese shall, if so disposed, be President of the several Corresponding Committees in his Diocese.

6. The Society shall be conducted by a Patron, Vice-Patrons, a President, Vice-Presidents, a Committee, Treasurer, and Secretaries, with such other officers as may be deemed necessary.

7. Annual subscribers of one guinea and upwards, or, if clergymen, half-a-guinea, and collectors of £2 12s, and upwards, shall be members of the Society, during the continuance of such subscriptions and collections. Benefactors of ten guineas and upwards, and clergymen making congregational collections to the amount of twenty guineas, shall be members for life.

8. The business of the Society shall be conducted by a Committee, to be elected annually by the members of the Society, and which shall consist of not less than twenty-four members, all of whom shall be eligible to be re-elected. In the event of vacancies by death or resignation, the Committee shall be empowered to fill up the same.

9. The Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, shall be considered (*ex officio*) members of all Committees.

10. The Committee shall meet once in every month, or oftener if needful, five being a quorum, and every meeting shall be opened with prayer.

11. The Committee shall select the Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, and such other officers as they shall deem beneficial to the interests of the Institution, and may also nominate such persons as have rendered services to the Society members for life.

12. All orders made for payment on account of the Society shall be signed by three of the General Committee.

13. The Committee shall annually appoint two or more Auditors for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Society.

14. An anniversary Sermon shall be preached at some church in London, by a clergyman appointed by the General Committee, and an Annual Report of the Society shall be printed for the use of its members.

15. An Annual Meeting of the members of the Society shall be held in London, when the proceedings of the preceding year shall be reported, the accounts presented, and a Committee chosen.

16. A Special General Meeting of the members of the Society, at which not less than thirty shall constitute a quorum, shall be called at any time, at the requisition of the General Committee, or by any thirteen members addressing a letter to the Secretary, specifying the object of the Meeting. Ten days' notice shall be given in three public newspapers of any such intended Meeting, and of the purpose for which it was called, which shall be deemed sufficient publicity.

17. None of the rules of the Society shall be repealed or altered, nor any new ones adopted, but at the Annual Meeting, or at a Special Meeting called for that purpose.

ON THE COINCIDENCE OF HOLY DAYS.—When two holy days fall together, the question arises which is to have the precedence. The best plan in this case is to observe the superior holy day, commemorating the inferior by the use of its collect. The following seem to bethe holy days to which all others should give way; Advent Sunday; Christmas Day; Circumcision; Epiphany; Ash Wednesday; all the days of Holy Week; Easter Day with Monday and Tuesday; Low Sunday; Ascension Day; Pentecost with Monday and Tuesday; Trinity Sunday. In all other cases the Festivals should have precedence of the Sunday.

It is quite wrong to mingle the Services by using *e. g.* the Lessons for for one and the Epistle and Gospel for the other.

Advent is a Season of Devotion and Penitence intended to prepare us for the celebration of the Lord's Nativity. Advent Sunday is the beginning of the Ecclesiastical year and is always the Sunday nearest the Feast of St. Andrew whether before or after or on the very day.

THE CENSUS OF 1861.

The following is the result of the Census of the Population of Great Britain and Ireland, taken on 8th of April, 1861:—

England and Wales.....	20,061,725
Scotland.....	3,061,117
Islands in the British Seas.....	143,779
Ireland.....	5,764,543—29,031,164

The Army serving abroad and in Ireland and the Navy and Merchant Seamen are not included.

This return shows that we have an addition since the Census of 1851 of more than a million and a half to the population of the United Kingdom. This fact, sufficiently significant of the vigor and progress of the country, can hardly fail to prove a powerful, though silent, appeal to Churchmen, to persevere in their exertions to spread the influence of Christianity among the masses of the people, so that, under God, their increasing numbers may prove a blessing to the land in which we dwell.

SIGNS OF THE WEATHER.

Extracted from a Manual of the Barometer, compiled by Rear-Admiral Fitzroy and published by the Board of Trade.

"To know the state of the air, the barometer and thermometer should be watched.

"The words should not be so much regarded for weather indications as the rising or falling of the mercury: for if it stand at changeable, and then rise towards fair, it presages a change of wind or weather, though not so great as if the mercury had risen higher; and, on the contrary, if the mercury stand above fair and then fall, it presages a change, though not to so great a degree as if it had stood lower; besides which, the direction and force of wind are not therein noticed.

"It is not from the point at which the mercury may stand that we are alone to judge of the state of the weather, but from its rising or falling; and from the movements of immediately preceding days as well as hours.

"It should always be remembered that the state of the air foretells coming weather, rather than shows that present—(a fact too often overlooked).

"If the barometer has been about its ordinary height, say near 30 inches (at the sea-level), and is steady, or rising, while the thermometer falls, and dampness becomes less, north-westerly, northerly, or north-easterly wind, or less wind, less rain or snow may be expected. On the contrary, if a fall takes place with a rising thermometer and increased dampness, wind and rain may be expected from the south-eastward, southward, or south-westward.

"A fall with a low thermometer foretells snow.

"When the barometer is rather below its ordinary height, say down to near 29½ inches (at the sea-level), a rise foretells less wind, or a change in its direction towards the northward, or less wet; but when it has been very low, about 29 inches, the first rising usually precedes strong wind.

"Indications of approaching changes of weather, and the direction and force of winds, are shown less by the height of the barometer than by its falling or rising. Nevertheless, a height of more than thirty (30.0) inches (at the level of the sea) is indicative of fine weather and moderate winds.

"A rapid rise of the barometer indicates unsettled weather; a slow movement, the contrary; a steady barometer, with dryness, foretells very fine weather. A rapid and considerable fall is a sign of stormy weather and rain (or snow). Alternate rising and sinking indicates unsettled and threatening weather. A sudden fall of the barometer, with a westerly wind, is sometimes followed by a violent storm from N.W., or N., or N.E. A barometer begins to rise considerably before the conclusion of a gale, sometimes even at its commencement. Although it falls lowest before high winds, it frequently sinks very much before heavy rain.

"The longer a change of wind or weather is foretold before it takes place, the longer it will last, and, conversely, the shorter the warning the less time, whatever causes the warning, whether wind or a fall of rain or snow.

"A few of the more marked signs of weather, are the following:—Whether clear or cloudy—a rosy sky at sunset presages fine weather; a red sky in the morning bad weather, or much wind (perhaps rain); a grey sky in the morning, fine weather; a high dawn, wind; a low dawn, fair weather*. Soft-looking or delicate clouds foretell fine weather, with moderate or light breezes; hard-edged, oily-looking clouds, wind. A dark, gloomy, blue sky is windy; but a light, bright blue sky indicates fine weather. A bright yellow sky at sunset presages wind; a pale yellow, wet:—and thus by the prevalence of red, yellow, or grey tints, the coming weather may be foretold very nearly; indeed, if aided by instruments, almost exactly. Small inky-looking clouds foretell rain. High upper clouds crossing the sun, moon, or stars, in a direction different from that of the lower clouds, or the wind then felt below, foretell a change of wind. After fine clear weather, the first signs in the sky of a coming change are usually light streaks, curls, whips, or mottled patches of white distant cloud. Dew is an indication of fine weather; so is fog. Remarkable clearness of atmosphere near the horizon, distant objects, such as hills, unusually visible, or raised (by refraction); and what is called 'a good hearing day,' may be mentioned among the signs of wet, if not wind, to be expected."

* "A 'high dawn' is when the first indications of daylight are seen above a bank of clouds. A 'low dawn' is when the day breaks on or near the horizon, the first streaks of light being very low down."
