## BLY AT HOME

prominent Winwipeg rotall mor want made an appeal a short time ago through the daily press to the prople of the eity to patronize their home industries in the way of rotail
ntores and not to send their money mast for goods which can be bough Just as cheaply and as well at home It is a regrettable fatt that a great deal of this sort of buying is done by the people of not only Winnipeg but of all Weatern Canada. In the busy fall und Christmas seasons when money is
plentiful and the gresit bulk of tho shopping is done it is no uncommon thing for orders ranging in value from $\$ 25$ up to $\$ 150$ and $\$ 2(0)$ to be sent to Toronto or Montreal from people Ifving in Manitoba or the Territories, and or ders for smaller amounts than the above are quite numerous. These purchases are mostly made on catalogue urotations and cover almost every line of goods worth mentloning. The consequence is that western merchanis
both in the city and country are robthed of just so much bustness which legitimately belongs to them. The agfravating feature of all this is that the buyer gains nothing at all by the mall order business and is more often than not a loser. It stands to reason that goods bought from catalogue are far lesa likely to prove satiafactory than when the purchaser has had a chance 4.) examine them for himself before buying. It very often trensplres that the article is not what it appeared to bo in the catalogue and could have theen bought at home for less money. A fow cunes gatned on one articte will nint make up for the overchargea which are usually made on others in a long order and inferiority in the goods often teduces what appeared to be a saving to a positive loss. And when the purchaser takes into considcration the fact that the local atore-
keeper whom he has passed by in the hour when he has a little ready cash spend has perhaps carried him in more than one season of adversity the urruy of arguments agatnst this unpatriotic practice as about complete. In conclusion it may be sald that if current reports are to be belleved the rutall merchanta themselves have not ail been perfectly free from this objecllonable practice and some of them set their customers a very bad example in this respect. We know of one man who is at the head of a large dry goods buriness in Winnipeg who habitually
places his personal clothing orders With eastern tallors and who has been known to declare that there in not a Lallor in Winnlpeg who can make decent suit of clothes. Of course such statements ure very fur from being she case and betray a most lamentable want of patriotism and consistency on the part of that particular man. As a matter of fact thls clty has just as good taflors as can be found any whert In the east and while the shops may not be so handsomely fitted up the
quality of the work they turn out will compare more than favorably with anything the east can produce. From this it will be seen that even in tradIng circles there are some erroncous ideas which will have to be exploded before the retall merchant of the west will fully come into his own.

## HEALTHY REAL ESTATE CONDITIONS.

The real estate men and loan companies of Western Canada have experlenced a welcome change in the conditions surrounding their business during the past two or three years in the fact that whereas before it was a most dimcutt thing to find purchasers for farm and elty property at any price, to-day the difficulty seems to be find property for the purchasers who are flocking into the country. Thls has probably been the largest year in the history of the business so far as transfers are concerned and in cvery respect the real estate business of the country is in better shape than for a long time. Choice residential properiy In the city has met with ready pate throughout the year and the loan companies have taken advantage of the opportunity to unload much of the pioperty they have been carrying since the depression of several years ago. They have made the prices of this property so reasonable In many vases that of pays householders better to buy than to continue renting or build for themselves. For the most purt loan
compantes have been inclined to dis. courage building lately as they would rather give a man a good bargain on some of the houses they hold for sale than lend him money with which to build a new place. Most of the pur chases of WInnlpeg real estate male this year have been declded bargalns so far as prices go. Many of the old houses which have changed hands have been thoroughly overhauled and modernized and there is a decided improve ment to be noted in the residential properties of the clty.

## CHEAP COAI.

One of the features of the fuel trade of this country is the growing demand for the lignite coal which comes from the vioinity of Estevan In Aoutheastern Aselnibola. It is now quike a number of yours since this coul was first rendered accesalble by the extension of the Sourls branch of the Canadian Pactife Rallway to Estevan, and during most of those years it has been ateadaly growing in favor especlally with the consumer in rural parts of Manitoba, untll to-day it ds one of the most important ruels on our list. The quality of the coal bas not always been satisfactory but with increased knowledge of the velus, bet ter handling faclities and more sultable stove grotes it has reached a degree of isatiafactoriness wich the or dinary consumer which ensures a steady demand for the coal in future. The price, \$1.00 per fon for car lots at the mine, is low when compured with other fuels, as on this basis it. can be delivered to the consumers in Winnipeg for $\$ 4.50$ per ton. This is

Is is fortunate for the prople of thle country that we have such a supply of cheap coal conventent to our markets, as there is no doubt but that is has some effect in holding down the prices of other fucis. The Pennsylvania anthracke and bituminous coal fletds are kowned by one of the most despotie monopolies on this continent and $k$ might be expected that were it not for the presence . . extensive cool beds in the prairve resions of both the United States and Canula which rendor the settlors so some extent inde, pendent of that source of supply there would be no mercy shown in regard to the grice of coal.
