This handsome old book contains 33 finely engraved colored maps, including 6 American, with extensive descriptions. It also has the list of subscribers, and 13 pp., of plates, containing over 700 engravings of their coats of arms.

There are 3 very fine American maps in the above, including "An exact chart of the River St. Lawrence from Fort Frontenac to the Island of Anticosti, showing the soundings, rocks, shoals, etc., with views of the lands and all necessary instructions for navigating that river to Quebec," engraved by Jefferys, also a large chart of the River Mississippi, by Lieut. Ross, etc., etc.
