



As to the latter the New York Herald has pointed out that nothing is to be gained by exaggerating the extent of the paralysis caus-ed by the exercise of this right, and that it is idle to attribute the falling off of commerce in certain branches to this cause, when it is obvious that to the war itself, as apart from search to this cates, as apart from search the major part of this lessening of commerce is due. On the other hand, it should be remembered that certain of commerce have been "Robin Hood, and his Merry Men." largely stimulated by the war, and that business men in the States are supplying large quantities of goods to Britain and her Allies, which she would never do but for the war. Indeed, so much is this so, that the in-fluence of the German born is being used to try to get Congress to pass a bill to prevent the citizens of the bill to prevent the citizens of the States from supplying contraband goods to Britain and her Allies. This movement is due to the fact that Ger-many and her Allies cannot get a safe passage of contraband to her bor-ders, while her opponents with their command of the seas, can do so. The intimation of Britain that she would offer no objection to the transfer of German steamers to American own-ers, provided use is not made of the Neil, Thomas Redmond, John Sage, purchase-money or the steamers to assist her enemies in the war, is a reasonable suggestion. But the sug-gestion that these steamers might be used by American owners to facilitate trade between North and South Am-formed them that there is no crimintrade between North and South America, will not meet with the approval of the German enemies of Britain in the States. They do not want to see America capturing the German ship-ping trade with South America. Brit-ain would like to see it, however, and would also promote in every reason-able way means for facilitating com-merce in South American trade is brought to the normal, the better for South America, the better for the States and Great Britain, and the bet-ter for the Newfoundiand fish trade with the Brazils.






