ANOTHER MINERAL BELT TRIBUTARY TO GREENWOOD—A CAMP OF FREE MILLING ORES.

Pacific Mining Letter No. 15.—Relating to Long Lake Camp, Boundary Creek District, B.C.

Greenwood, B.C., Sept. 28.—Of the many mining sections which encircle Greenwood, Long Lake Camp, which lies eight miles north of this town, is one of the most interesting. While practically all the other camps yield copper ores that constitute smelting propositions, the Long Lake region is a free milling belt. Its ore bodies consist of veins of pure white quartz, occurring in diorite with dykes of granite traversing the country formation. Inasmuch as the Long Lake ore is amenable to treatment without sections the best constitutes a poor quality of ore, but is as compared with the other sections of the Boundary Creek country.

As to ore values in the camp very high assays have been gotten, many of them running up into the hundreds of dollars to the ton. The quartz carries free iron, lead and tellurides, and where the latter are present the values run very high. Considerable quantities of the ore are rather lean, and a conservative estimate made by experts, leaving out of account the rich chert in the deposits, places the average values at from \$24 to \$41 to the ton.

Size of Quartz Leads.

The Long Lake ledges run nearly north and south, traversing the country formation at an acute angle, and are usually of small dimensions, but some of them run from six to eight feet in width. These show a strong outcrop, and so far as opened up, reveal well defined walls, with an average dip of about 45 degrees towards the east. The merits of Long Lake Camp have not yet been proved, as development work has several strong indications that the ore is rich, and that operations have been attended with encouraging results.
