The Quarterly Meetings of this Committee shall be held in Toronto, on Thursday, the 6th of August; and at London on Thursday, the 5th of November, 1874; at Hamilton on Thursday, the 11th of February; and Thursday, the 7th of May, 1875, in Toronto. Each meeting to commence at 10 o'clock a.m. The members of the Committee are requested to give the Secretary early notice of their intention to be present at the Sessions, that provision may be made for their entertainment among the friends.

The attention of Missionaries is requested to the following Resolution of the Committee, passed in August, 1872:—That the Secretary shall, previously to each Quarterly Meeting, prepare a tabular view of the numerical and financial state of the missions; also a synoptical statement of the business to be done; and in order to do this, missions shall hold their quarterly meetings sufficiently early to enable them to have their reports to the Mission Office not less than one week previous to the meeting of the Committee; and in case any of the missionaries shall fail in doing so, their reports shall not be read, nor their grants sent, until the succeeding meeting. The Committee earnestly hope that all the brethren will assist in enabling the Secretary to carry out the above arrangement, so that they may have time to discuss what really pertains to the good of the mission work.

REPORT.

ADDRESS OF THE GENERAL MISSIONARY COMMITTEE,
*To the Ministers, Collectors, and Friends of the Primitive Methodist
Missions in Canada:*

DEAR FELLOW WORKERS: By time's quick flight another opportunity is afforded us to address you in our Annual Report, which is to us a real pleasure, especially when a review of our past labors shows them to have been prosperous. In the course of a year very considerable changes take place. In many of these changes your Committee cannot but rejoice, as we are sure you also do, inasmuch as they tend to advance the Kingdom of Christ. Every political change which removes a system or institution of despotism or cruelty, takes away a barrier to, and thus hastens the universal reign of Jesus our blessed Lord and Saviour. The rapid growth of material wealth among the people is a subject of rejoicing to us, inasmuch as while it gives them the means of increased home comforts, social position, and education, when sanctified to God's service, it is made a blessing to the church and the world. We rejoice that God, in the developments of His providence, and the condescension of His grace, has linked you and us with a work so glorious in its nature, and so blessed in its results; results more blessed and glorious than those of any other enterprise. For whilst many other praiseworthy institutions affect man's social position and happiness through the whole of the present life, it is Christianity that gives to those institutions and enterprises their mightiest motive power and noblest impulses. But for Christianity, many of those institutions would never have existed, and others could never have accomplished what they have. And then, Christianity is not only the best earthly boon that man possesses, but it affects and makes glorious his eternal future, inasmuch as it sanctifies his depraved nature, stamps upon him the Divine image, elevates him to the presence of Christ, and gives him eternal possession of the home in heaven. How grand the work, to lift an immortal soul from the deepest misery of hell to the highest bliss of heaven! In view of these facts, dear friends, you will not wonder that your Committee should be more than ever solicitous that

you should not only continue to aid us in this great and good work, but that you should increase that aid as God gives you ability to do so. We are deeply anxious that you should realize the honor and blessedness of being co-workers with God in bringing about the world's salvation, and thus accomplishing the merciful purposes of a loving God, as developed in the glorious scheme of human redemption by Jesus Christ.

It is with joyous thanksgiving to the Author of all Good that we again report progress for the past year. We have reason to believe that during the past year the Agents of the Society have in many instances devoted themselves earnestly and fully to the work of building up the cause of Christ, in connection with the denomination of which they are the standard-bearers; and while they have thus consecrated themselves to the work of God, and the membership has co-operated, the Divine blessing has been given, revivals have been the happy result, the Church has been quickened, and souls have been saved. Times of great spiritual refreshing have been experienced on many of the Stations, and though some have reported numerical decreases, and two are stationary, the greater number have reported increases, some of them very good increases.

The following is a brief financial statement for the past year:—

Thus it will be seen that the expenditure has overrun the income by \$98 49c.

We now with confidence appeal to the friends of our Mission work for a largely increased income the present year. What we want is to raise the contributions to the General Mission Fund to \$10,000. This we absolutely need to give to the Mission Stations—the amount of help they should have—and enable the committee at the same time to enter those doors of usefulness opening before us. It is a very simple question to ask how is the sum of nearly \$2000 in advance of last year to be raised; and the question is far from being unanswerable. It is a very simple process. Let those friends who attend the public meeting increase their contribution to the public collection, and let those friends who are unable to attend feel that they are as much under an obligation to give a collection as those who do attend, and let them send it. Then, let those who are comparatively well off, and yet have not given

a subscription of more than a dollar or two a year, resolve to double or more than double it, and in doing so they would not only communicate, but receive increased good. And if the friends of our Missions act upon these suggestions, there will be no difficulty in raising the amount of money named, and even more. And then, when we think of how the sun of prosperity shines upon us, and how largely the blessings of divine providence are bestowed in the very bountiful harvest which is now being gathered in. In view of such bountiful blessings, and whilst the hearts of all are filled with good cheer and gratitude, we appeal to our people for a noble Missionary offering this year. It will not be to the credit of the Church to let the amount be less than that already named. Remember it is the cause of Jesus and immortal souls, and the fruit of your giving you will see again, in redeemed happy spirits before the throne of God in heaven.

The following Table, as a comparative view, shows the increase of the body in Canada since the Jubilee year, numerically and financially; and considering the numbers lost to us by removals in that time, it is a record which speaks for itself, and needs no remarks.

We greatly rejoice that the parent body is in a most encouragingly prosperous state. Spiritually, there has been during the year a great quickening; numerically, there is an increase of over 4,000 members; financially, they never stood so well. And the last Conference has laid us under a lasting debt of gratitude for the liberality they have shown to us. They have made us a grant this year of nearly \$3,000 to aid in carrying on our Mission work; and nearly \$3,000 more to form a balance from which to enable us to pay our August and Nov. grants promptly; and these sums were voted by the Conference without a single dissenting voice or vote. They have also a second time sent out the Rev. S. Antliff, D.D., the retiring President of their Conference, who was also for five years their efficient Missionary Secretary, and whose services amongst us in counsel, and public labors, in visiting, preaching, and otherwise aiding our Stations, we deem worthy of acknowledgment in this Report. They are also sending out several young men to labor on our Stations. And we are sure that you feel that such evidences of sympathy and substantial support should strengthen the bonds of affection, and perpetuate the union so happily existing between us.

They are vigorously prosecuting the work at home and abroad. The home missionaries are, many of them, working with an energy worthy of the success they are experiencing. The report read at the Metropolitan Missionary Meeting says: "During the year, upwards of 4,400 open air services have been conducted (on Missions alone), and more than 218,000 visits have been made to the homes of the people. Who can tell the good, varied and great, resulting from these various services addressed to thousands of men, women, and children?"

They do not retain by far all who are led to Christ by them, or the body would soon grow to very large proportions. As shown by the report, the most hardened characters are attracted by their open-air services, follow to their churches, get converted, and are scattered to every part of the world; and many of them are known afterwards to become earnest workers for the cause of Christ. The following extract will show how the good seed is sown, takes root, and bears fruit. It relates to a station on which Rev. W. Dinnick is laboring:

"During the winter, for some seven weeks, meetings have been got up for the working men, and addressed by the working men. Nearly 200 persons have attended some of those week night services. One of the working men addressing the people, said: 'I was brought up with-

out ever hearing of Jesus. I never kept a labour, who would come change attend; in it another, and me. I gave could be considered part of it up. I was but with all after birth, and labour's wife also.'"

"In the cheered, especially great liberality and their love of their master well. On the meeting opened, a meeting gathered, had been a native course of

out ever hearing a parent pray, or even hearing in my home the name of Jesus. I was very sceptical, the Bible I never read, the Sabbath I never kept. I believed in no Christ being able to save, but my neighbour, who was a swearing character, came to this new chapel, and became changed to a praying man, and followed me up till he got me to attend; in it I became convicted under one minister, led to Christ by another, and finally in the road, got the clear evidence God had saved me. I gave myself to reading the Bible to see if my Sunday trading could be continued. In six weeks I read the New Testament through, and part of the Old. Nothing justified my Sabbath work, and I gave it up. I was a father to five infant children, and had a delicate wife; but with all, I trusted, and God opened my way. To-day I have a better birth, and am a better man. My wife is now converted, my neighbour's wife and three sisters have since been saved, and you may be also."

A good work is being done in Australia. The cause is growing, and our brethren in that distant field are earnest and hopeful. Like ourselves they have their difficulties in the migratory habits of the people. But God is with them, and they are doing a good work.

The African Mission still claims a large share of attention and support, and is likely to do; and this it ought to have. It is cheering to read how the people whom the missionaries have gathered together are entering into the work themselves. In them we have a strong evidence that the grace of God received into the heart makes the hand liberal.

Of this, the following report from Fernando Po is an encouraging evidence:

"In the Island of Fernando Po, West Africa, our brethren are still cheered, encouraged, and rewarded with success. Mr. Holland reports great liberality on the part of the young church in Santa Isabel. They and their friends have contributed over £220 towards the building fund of their new church, and at their missionary meeting did exceedingly well. On the Sabbath of their preparatory sermons they had a prayer meeting at 6.30 a.m. On the Monday the collecting boxes were opened, and the amount exceeded that of last year. To the missionary meeting the white and coloured population, saints and sinners, gathered, expecting to be deeply interested and anxious to know who had been the best beggar and who the most liberal giver. Mr. Brown, a native teacher from Bassupu, gave a very humorous speech, in the course of which he denounced in strong language the rum trade—told

of its impoverishing and enervating influence on the Boobees,—kings, chiefs, and people. Then Mr. W. Barleycorn, a coloured man from George's Bay, in a very neat speech, contended that the African is not an inferior race, but has mental powers quite equal to those of other nations if properly cultivated. Mr. Prince, another coloured man, in a good speech, referred to the advantages of education in connection with Christianity, and mentioned a number of Africans who had attained positions of eminence and honour, both in the mercantile and intellectual world. Then Mr. Luddington, in his speech, moved the audience to tears, groans and prayers, while describing, somewhat minutely, how he had, by great entreaty, saved the life of a poor Boobee who was condemned to die. The collection amounted to £55 11s. 4½d., being £15 10s. 10d., more than last year. Well done, Santa Isabel."

What an example to people living under so much better circumstances. A collection of \$270 at a Missionary meeting in a Fernandian congregation of chiefly negroes. But these people can by the grace of God, do more than work and give; they can suffer also, as evidenced by the following from the speech of the Rev. D. T. Maylott, returned Missionary:

" Some people say, ' It is all very fine; the report looks nice—what about the actual work?' I will give you a specimen or two of the actual work at Isabel, so that you may judge for yourselves. Sometime ago the Spanish Government sent forth a declaration that all the children of that place were to be sent to the Spanish school. The inhabitants of the town—that is, the black people—preferred to send their children to our school. The consequence was, that some of them were fined. I shall never forget a scene that occurred when this command was given by the governor. There came up to the mission-house about twenty individuals, with an old woman called ' Mamma Job.' She said, addressing us missionaries:—' You daddies no see persecution like this in your country, you no stand dem tings. You stand by us, we no want you to go to prison or suffer; only you stand by us, and den we go to prison—we suffer—we do any ting for you.' (Applause.) We said we would stand by them, and would not leave them, as we were sure the committee would stand by us. Some of them were actually sent to prison. One old woman was sentenced by the rough and uncouth Commissary of Police to three months' imprisonment. Mr. Holland and I visited her one Sunday morning before service. The prison was a very poor place, for they put the prisoners there not to feed them, but to

famish them. They have nothing to eat except what their friends take them. We took some food that my wife had prepared, and gave it to her, and when she saw it the tears streamed down her cheeks and she cried, 'Bless the Lord; it is good to be here this morning; it is good to be in the Spirit on the Lord's-day anywhere.' I said, 'Mamma, I am very sorry indeed that you cannot be at the service this morning, but we shall pray for you, and if our friends in England knew where you were they would pray for you; but do not be disheartened.' 'Oh, no, sir; I would not be disheartened, I don't lose heart at all; and though I no come to church this mornin', the Lord live in dis place all de same.'"

And these people can make sacrifices also for Christ's sake (if it is proper to speak of anything we do for him as a sacrifice.) Wm. N. Barleycorn, a civilised converted coloured man, brought to Christ under the labors of our Missionaries, at the call of those Missionaries, and as he and they believe, the call of God, has given up business with fair prospects, left his family behind and gone into the bush to lead his benighted fellow countrymen to the Saviour; and when we think of the devotion of those men who have left their comfortable English homes, and circuits, and gone to the deadly climate of that African Island, not knowing but that in a few weeks they might be laid in the grave, and after suffering more than can be described, declare their readiness to return after being a little recruited. How paltry the offering of a few dollars appears compared with that of men who sacrifice health, and risk life. The words of Mr Maylott, at the last Annual Missionary Meeting already referred to, are words which should decide every lover of God's cause to make greater efforts, and to practice greater liberality than ever in the past. Speaking on the entrance of our people into the heathen work, he said:

"We have only just struck the rock, and the oil is going forth; we have only just touched the springs, and the vibration is sending music into our ears. We have only just struck the mine, and we find that in the foreign field of labour there is precious ore—gems to be laid at the Saviour's feet and jewels to deck the missionary coronet of our great Redeemer. We have only just got into the bush, but the cry beyond is, 'come and help us;' and we ask you to-night to aid us in this great and glorious work; and I cannot but think that this Connexion, which represents a thousand ministers, has within it men who are willing to go. I would rather go back to Fernando Po next month than take the best circuit that Conference could offer me. I would rather offer myself

again upon the altar, than I would have all the emoluments and all the honours associated with Church labour and life at home. Not but what I love home and friends; but the Gospel to every creature must be preached, and how can they believe except they hear, and how can they hear except the preacher be sent? Some one must go; and those who go, feeling the love of Christ in their hearts, 'shall doubtless return again with rejoicing, bringing their sheaves with them.' (Applause.) It is quite a mistake to suppose that the claim of missions is more imperative on those brethren who have gone out than on you friends at home. Is not that a noble and brave spirit displayed by good brother and sister Griffiths, who have left our shores, and left behind them their two children. The good woman said to me a short time ago, 'My parents are somewhat opposed to my going, and those little ones are very dear to me; but I love Jesus Christ, and I feel that I must go where the call of the Master is.' As I stood, some thirteen months ago, on the piazza of the mission-house in Isabel, I was talking to Sister Luddington, and she said, 'We have a dear child in England, and we love Minnie as well as our lives; but when God called us to Africa, we left Minnie with God and our friends, and came to do His work in this distant land.' I claim that these mothers have parental hearts, and that these parents have instincts and feelings as noble and as great as you have in this meeting to-night—(hear, hear)—but Divine love has gone beyond parental love, and raised them to an elevation of self-abnegation and devotion that gains your approval, that must bring down heaven's blessing, and result in good to the church."

Here is a devotion which is an evidence that the spirit which burned in the Martyrs is in the church still—the spirit which we pray may baptize you and us—the spirit which will make success a certainty in any country. We now bring before you a special work, upon which your Committee, at the direction of Conference, has just entered—a work which we think worthy of sympathy, and which is commended to your hearty and liberal support.

Last year an earnest appeal was made on behalf of a Mission to Manitoba, and also to Montreal. This matter has not been slumbering during the year; and when it came up for consideration in the late Conference, there was evidenced the grandest spirit of enthusiasm and missionary zeal ever witnessed in the Canadian Primitive Methodist Conference. In about half-an-hour nearly \$500 a year for five years was subscribed for the former mission, and about \$130 for the latter.

A missionary was immediately appointed to, and is now laboring in Manitoba, and the intention is to send another before long. We commend Brother Clark and his work to the liberality of all our friends. The intention and earnest wish of your committee is to make this mission, and the Montreal one, independent of the General Mission Fund, so that the other parts of the work may not be embarrassed. A separate secretary and treasurer have been appointed, viz.: S. R. Briggs, Esq., and Rev. T. Guttery. And to our friends throughout the country we strongly appeal on behalf of these two funds. Some will prefer to contribute to the one, and some to the other; and as has already been the case, some will feel a pleasure in contributing to both, and of course, to those able to do it, the last is the most excellent way. And we believe there are hundreds of people among our friends who are able to do it, who would be blessed in doing it, and who no doubt will do it. In reference to Montreal, we should have had a cause there long ago, as it is believed many of our people have settled there from time to time, and that there are many openings for usefulness. We appeal for Manitoba in behalf of those who have gone from Ontario, and elsewhere. But strongly we appeal on behalf of the Indian tribes, who from various considerations have a claim upon us for the bread of life—the blessed Gospel of Jesus.

We have also opened a new Station at St. Catharines, with good prospects of soon raising a good society, and doing good amongst the fast increasing population of the town.

We commence the present year with brighter prospects than for many years past. Never perhaps was our sky clearer, nor our sun brighter than now. Our missionaries go with stronger confidence to the great work into which God by his providence has called them. They feel strongly drawn to entire devotion to that work. They go to their work with the settled purpose to labor and pray, and expect still greater success than the past has ever witnessed. And what can prevent it? When on the part of God's servants and people there is whole-souled devotion to the work of Jesus Christ; when they are filled with quenchless love to the perishing souls of men, clothed with the power and influence that comes from the baptism of the Holy Ghost; when they are conscious that they have with them the glorious presence of Him who has said "Behold I am with you always, even unto the end," enabling them to do and dare anything for Him, and willing to endure anything for his sake; when men are filled with a spirit like this, noth-

ing daunts them, and nothing can prevent them ultimately succeeding. There may be simplicity, but there is also a sublimity—a grandeur—a heroism in this spirit which nothing can surpass, and also a power to which even human love of sin succumbs, and in penitence the subject of this love is found at the mercy seat by faith imploring forgiveness. Such scenes as these, multiplied by hundreds, we not only long for, but look for and expect. Our souls are full of hope in relation to the future.

In conclusion, beloved friends, let us entreat you, individually, for Christ's sake, to seek and secure still more of the missionary spirit—for your families' sake, for the Church's sake, for the sake of the perishing around you, and for the sake of the heathen beyond you—we appeal to you for still greater liberality in supporting the institutions of the Church generally, but the Missionary cause in particular. Let your souls devise liberal things, and by liberal things you shall stand. God sees His Church's needs. He gives to you that by which those needs can be met. He says to each—"now thou art my steward, be faithful;" your thank offerings for abundant harvests, and large commercial gains. God has claims upon you for His cause; and that in proportion to the abundance and increase by which His gracious providence enriches you. And then let it be remembered that God gives to you, that you may give to His cause; not that His may be the advantage, but that you and this fallen world may be enriched, and blessed, and glorified eternally. Dear friends, our mouths are filled with arguments by which we would appeal to you for increased support of a work so good, so blessed, so eternally glorious. We ask you to contemplate the time when this sinful world of ours, regenerated, shall be found in adoration at the feet of Jesus; every heart renewed, every soul glowing with the love of God, every mouth filled with the praises of Jesus, and one universal song bursting forth from a regenerated race, swelling like the sound of many waters, or the voice of thunder rolling along the hill sides, ringing down the vales, till the whole earth reverberates with the loud and perpetuated praises of our blessed redeeming Lord, and one shout of praise goes up to heaven, and all voices blend in the song "Hallelujah! for the Lord God Omnipotent reigneth; for the kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our God and His Christ, and He shall reign forever." And as you gaze down from the shining seats of glory, and behold those grandest scenes that earth will ever witness, and see in them accomplished the purposes of our loving God, in more than Paradise restored, which of you will regret

Praying that you may so nobly act your part as to hear at last the welcome words, "well and faithfully done." Amen.

Any member of delegation unable to take his appointment must give timely notice to the Superintendent of the station. \$2 fine will be imposed in case of wilful neglect.
