REPORT  
OF THE  
MANAGING COMMITTEE  
OF  
**St. George's Society,**  
FOR 1871.

---

The Committee of Management of the St. GEORGE'S SOCIETY of Toronto, have much pleasure in submitting to the members, at this their Thirty-seventh Annual Meeting, a report of the proceedings of the Society for the past year, and in being able to congratulate them upon the very satisfactory condition of the Society's affairs, as exhibited in an increase in the membership, and in a very substantial augmentation of the funds placed at the disposal of the Committee for the beneficent purposes of the Society.

The total receipts from all sources, inclusive of \$361 77 on hand at the beginning of the year, amounted to \$2,709 70, of which \$100 were the proceeds of a Debenture which became due, and \$90 more Life Members' subscriptions both which sums belong to the Society's permanent investments. Among the receipts, it is pleasant to notice that the sum of \$16 00 was received back from former recipients of relief, an example which may be commended to many others who, it is believed, are quite able, but not so mindful of their obligations.

The total disbursements amount to \$2,555 84, leaving a balance still in the Treasurer's hands of \$153 86, in addition to the sum of \$300 temporarily deposited at interest,

and to the Sum of \$75 50 appropriated to the Tent, both of which sums belong to the balance of cash available for charitable purposes, which therefore amounts to \$529 36.

The liabilities of the Society, which, at the end of the previous year were \$72 50, have all been discharged, leaving nothing now outstanding on account of last year.

The investments of the Society, taken at their par value, consist of—1st. Canada Permanent Building Society stock, \$1,000, dividends 11 per cent.; 2nd. Provincial Permanent Building Society stock, \$600 00, dividends 9 per cent.; 3rd. City of Toronto Debenture, \$125, interest 6 per cent.; 4th. Government Debenture Phinps' Fund, \$1,000, interest 5 per cent.; and, 5th. Tent, \$190. Total, 2,915.

In carrying out a contract with Mr. James Adams, made in 1870, the Committee had to provide funds to pay for the Tent, amounting to \$331 50, which was done by appropriating the sum of \$190 from the permanent funds, and \$141 50 from the ordinary funds of the Society, it being understood and minuted upon the books, that all funds derived from the Tent be applied in restoring these advances until the whole amount is replaced. In pursuance of this resolution, the sum of \$66 00 has been so applied. The Tent now therefore stands charged with \$265 50, of which \$190 is due to the permanent funds, and \$75 50 to the ordinary cash funds of the Society.

During the year 1,174 applications for pecuniary aid, advice or employment were received and entered upon the books, which were all investigated and attended to as far as practicable by the Committee; and the sum of \$964 29 was disbursed for the relief of those in destitute circumstances, including advances for burials and for passes over the different railways. In addition to this pecuniary aid, a number of deserving persons have been assisted by advice, by obtaining admission for them to the General Hospital and other charitable institutions, in procuring employment and the appliances necessary thereto, and in various other ways of which no record is kept.

Ninety-nine new members were proposed and elected, of whom eleven were Life Members, making the total number now upon the books 429, of whom eight are honorary, ninety one are life, and three hundred and thirty are ordinary members; several of the latter, however, the Committee

regret to notice are in arrear with their subscriptions. The receipts for members subscriptions were \$451 as compared with \$396 in the preceding year, and the Committee are pleased to be able to report that the total receipts for subscriptions and donations exceed those of any previous year.

The Committee deeply regret to have to record the loss by death of one of the officers for the year, Dr. Tempest, who was for several years one of the Society's physicians, whose kindness of heart and readiness to attend at all times to the wants of the destitute sufferers referred to him by the Society, should not be forgotten; and also to report the deaths of the following members: Messrs. Dalrymple Crawford and James Grand.

The Anniversary of the Society's Patron Saint was duly celebrated. On Sunday, the 22nd of April, divine service was attended by the members in St. James' Cathedral, the use of which was again kindly given by the Very Reverend the Dean. The service was performed by the Rev. Dr. Beaven, the Rev. Provost Whitaker and the Rev. W. S. Darling, and an eloquent sermon was preached by the Rev. Edwin Day, one of the Society's Chaplains. The service was largely attended, and the handsome sum of \$172 58 was added to the Society's funds from the collection. The musical part of the service was ably conducted by Mr. John Carter.

On the following Monday evening, St. George's Day, the members of the Society, with their friends to the number of about 180, met together at a social supper in the Mechanics' Institute, which was a most pleasant and successful affair. It is not expected that this annual reunion will add much to the funds of the Society, the more immediate object being to promote a spirit of kindness and good feeling among the members, and Englishmen and their descendants generally, and on this occasion there was a small deficit which, however, is not borne by the Society.

Some difficulty was experienced in determining the place for holding the Annual Pic-Nic, which was eventually decided in favour of West Lodge Grounds, on the outskirts of the city. The Pic-Nic was held on the 15th August, the Civic holiday, and was in many respects most successful. A large number of members and others with their families were present and joined in the games and other amusements.

provided. The numbers present, as well as the receipts from the sale of tickets, would have been very much increased had not a thunder storm and rain occurred about the middle of the day. The pecuniary result was an addition of \$40 10 to the charitable fund.

At the request of the Committee, the Rev. Hugh Johnston, M.A., very kindly consented to deliver a lecture in behalf of the Society, on the subject of his recent visit, in company with the President of the Society and others, to the Pacific coast, including British Columbia, as also the intermediate States. This lecture was a highly interesting one, and the eloquent lecturer was attentively listened to by the large audience, which nearly filled the Music Hall. The chair was ably filled, by request of the Committee, by the Hon. Chief Justice Draper, C. B., the oldest living Past President of the Society. The net proceeds of the lecture, \$96 27, formed a welcome addition to the charitable fund.

Finding that the available funds were becoming much reduced, a special appeal for assistance to enable them to carry on the charitable work of the Society during the winter was made by the Committee early in the fall, and was liberally responded to, no less a sum than \$440 67 having been collected and added to the Society's funds. The annual recurrence of this special collection, which falls upon only a small portion of the members, has suggested the question as to whether it would not be more equitable to increase the very small subscription now paid by both Life and Ordinary members to double their present amounts; a suggestion which the Committee recommend to the consideration of the members.

The established custom of making a bountiful provision for the deserving poor at Christmas was this year duly observed; a special subscription being taken up for that purpose. The amount collected in money was \$633 13, in addition to numerous donations in kind, a list of which will appear. The number of English families who received tickets was 540, representing about 2,700 persons who were thus enabled to enjoy a good Christmas dinner, which, but for the timely bounty of the Society very few of them would have obtained. The provisions given away comprised 5,783 lbs. beef, 870 lbs. mutton, 578 lbs. pork, 4,000 lbs. bread, 83 lbs. tea, 50 lbs. coffee, besides raisins, vegetables, &c.,

&c. About 500 lbs. of bread which remained were sent to the Boys' Home, the Girls' Home, and the Protestant Orphan's Home, and a number of families not English were also supplied. The distribution took place on Saturday, December 23, in the store on Front street, lately occupied by Messrs. M. & L. Samuel, kindly granted by these gentlemen for that purpose.

The Committee are pleased to be able to report, that as the result of a better and more suitable class of emigrants being sent out, as well as the more efficient arrangements for their distribution by the Emigration Department, a much less number of newly arrived immigrants were applicants for assistance than in the previous year, and these mostly arising from sickness, shipwreck or other misfortunes. Numbers of even the most deserving, however, and who form a welcome addition to our industrial population, find it necessary to obtain assistance to pass through the first winter, more especially those connected with the building trades and other out-door employments. Arriving during the summer, they are scarcely able to do more than keep their families and make themselves a home before winter sets in, they are thrown out of employment, and want stares them in the face. The relief of such cases is one of the most satisfactory uses to which the funds of the Society can be applied. There are several other classes of recipients equally deserving, but the Committee regret to notice that there are many instances where the same applicants come up year after year, and where the giving of charity is only another name for encouraging improvidence. The utmost care, discrimination and firmness are required to eliminate such cases, and to apply to them the Apostolic injunction, "that he that will not work, neither shall he eat."

In conclusion, the Committee would press the urgent claims of the Society on the support of all Englishmen and their descendants, and more particularly the present membership. It is believed that with a little effort every member of the Society could get at least one new member to join its ranks during the coming year, and the Committee venture to express the hope that that effort will not be wanting.
