

INCOME TAX SAYS BREWER **ALL INCOMES**

Milwaukee, Wiss., July 21.—In his ddress before the Association of Ag-nits of the Northwestern Mutual Life Company of this city, of which he is in trustee, Justice David J. Brewer, of the United States Supreme Court,

of the United States Supreme Court, said: "Under the hue and cry of today we must have an income tax which means a tax upon all incomes, and if that power to tax all incomes is giv-en to the Government, we will see the states, taxed, not out of their ex-istence, but out of their vitality. The idea leads up to the question of plac-ing the entire power in the control of the nation."
