### COMING TO FREDERICTON.

A Great Knight of Pythias Event.  
Fredericton will be the scene of an important gathering of the Knights of Pythias, on or about the 20th inst. Frontier Lodge of St. Stephen, has an excursion every year, but this season has gone beyond its usual attempt and invited other lodges to unite in a grand trip to this city. New Brunswick and Union Lodges, of St. John, with Calais Lodge, of Calais, have co-operated and there is every prospect of a successful trip. Should the five take part it will make the full strength about 115. There will be two bands—the Grand Fullerton, of St. John, and Calais, of St. Stephen—and should satisfactory arrangements be made the lodges from the other two places will be accompanied by a band each. It is confidently expected that the turnout will be the largest ever made by any secret society in the street of the capital. The Knights of the Pythias have never made one parade in this city, and it occurred about eight years since the opening of a provincial exhibition. No doubt our citizens will be glad to welcome the Knights of Pythias, and the prominent places of interest should be made available to all sight-seers from the four towns named.

### The Streets and the Canteens.

Some days ago Road Master Casey issued a circular in which he requested that the streets be kept clean. A merchant yesterday drew the attention of a Gazette reporter to the fact that while the merchants were attending cheerfully and carefully to the instructions, that the road master himself was a little dilatory in seeing to some matters which are altogether within his province. "Look," says the merchant, "at the gutters of the back streets and at the gutter on the main street of Queen street. What about the long grass and the barbed wire on the walks; look at Phoenix Square; look at the streets covered with litter and rubbish; 't would,' he said, 'go round town with a team and collect at least three good truck loads of rubbish from the streets without trouble.'"

### The Walk to the Bridge.

### City Council and the Assessment Law.

To the Editor of THE GLAZIER.—I attended a meeting of the city council on Tuesday evening expecting to learn something a little definite in reference to our antiquated assessment law, so far as the opinions of members could be had, but I must add that I was somewhat disappointed in my expectations. The report in reference to the action taken by the committee to confer with a number of citizens as arranged for, being read, Ald. Hazen moved that a committee of five be appointed to deal with the question. He mentioned a few points in the assessment law which he thought might be considered, as though they were the only material things in dealing with the assessment law, and, in fact, he exhibited so little heart in his language that I made up my mind that his reforms had not much to expect in the way of a radical change at the hands of Ald. Hazen in the assessment law. But my opinion was strengthened when the chairman remarked there was no hurry about it, that the legislature would not meet till February; besides the next council meeting in (6 months hence) would have an opportunity of saying something upon the subject.

### Now is the first place I would ask is not the present council the right one to deal with the question, as this is the council that was petitioned?
