**LAWS AND REGULATIONS**  
**OF THE**  
**NEWFOUNDLAND SCHOOL SOCIETY.**

---

I. This Society shall be designated **THE NEWFOUNDLAND SOCIETY FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.**

II. The Schools shall be managed by Masters and Mistresses of the United Church of England and Ireland, and conducted, as nearly as circumstances may permit, on Dr. Bell's System.

III. This Society shall consist of a Patron, Vice Patron, President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary, or Secretaries, and also of Governors, and Life and Annual Members, and such other Officers as may be deemed necessary for conducting its affairs.

IV. Each Subscriber of One Guinea annually, or upwards, shall be a Member.

V. Each Subscriber of Ten Guineas, or upwards, shall be a Member for Life.

VI. Each Subscriber of Five Pounds annually, or of Twenty Guineas at one time, shall be a Governor, and entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.

VII. An Executor paying a bequest of Fifty Pounds, or upwards, shall be a Member for Life.

VIII. The business of the Society shall be conducted, and all its Officers appointed, by a Committee of not less than Twelve; of whom Nine, who shall have attended the greatest number of times during the year, shall be eligible for the ensuing year.

IX. The Patron, Vice-Patron, President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretaries, shall be considered *ex-officio* Members of the Committee; the ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held once every month.

X. Three Members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum; and in case of Equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

XI. Five Auditors, three of them not being Members of the Committee, shall be appointed by the Committee annually, for the purpose of auditing the Accounts of the Society, of whom three shall be a quorum.

XII. A General Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held in London annually, on the Second Wednesday in May, when the Proceedings of the foregoing year shall be reported, and the Accounts presented, and a Committee chosen.

XIII. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time, at the requisition of the General Committee, or any nine Members, by letter addressed to the Secretary.

XIV. Ten days notice of all General Meetings shall be given in at least three Newspapers. Those Members of the Society, who reside within the limits of the Three-penny Post, shall be summoned by letter to attend; and when such General Meetings are Special, the object of them shall be Mentioned in the summons.

XV. At all General Meetings, and at those of the Committee, the Patron, or, in his absence, the Vice-Patron, or should he be absent, the President, or in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list, who may be present, or in the absence of all the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, and, in his absence, such Member as shall be voted for that purpose, shall preside at the Meeting.

XVI. None of the Laws of the Society shall be repealed, or altered, nor any new law established but at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

#### PROPER FORM OF A DONATION BY WILL.

*Item—I do hereby give and bequeath the sum of*

#### RULES FOR ASSOCIATIONS.

1. That the Object and Constitution of The Newfoundland School Society have our cordial approbation.
2. That it is expedient to form ourselves into an Association, to be called The \_\_\_\_\_ Association; the endeavour of which shall be to promote the object of the above Society, by soliciting donations and subscriptions in its favour.
3. That this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Secretary; and a Committee, which shall consist of Members.
4. That this Association shall furnish the Committee of the Parent Society, on or before the first of April, in each year, with a short Statement of its Proceedings, including an Abstract of its Cash Account, with a Remittance of the Balance.

THE  
FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE  
NEWFOUNDLAND SCHOOL SOCIETY.

---

IN reviewing the proceedings of the past year, and glancing at the recent existence of this Institution, your Committee rejoice in the opportunity of ascribing thanksgiving and praise to the Giver of all good for the establishment, growth, and steady advancement of the Society in prosperity and usefulness.

Before your Committee detail their proceedings, they would submit for the sanction of the Subscribers, an alteration in the Law of the Society relating to the General Annual Meeting of its Members. It is proposed, that the General Annual Meeting shall be held in future on the second Wednesday in May, and not, as at present, on the third Tuesday in the same month.

Your Committee have been occupied, during the

last twelve months, rather in maturing and consolidating those relations which the Society had previously formed with Newfoundland, than in establishing additional Schools.

They have felt it to be their duty to pursue this course, in consideration of the large expense already incurred in building Schools, and dwellings for the Masters, the cost of which is not yet wholly defrayed; but, although your Committee have deemed it inexpedient, at present, to extend the sphere of their operations so widely as might be wished, they have yet to acknowledge, with gratitude, the liberality of their Friends, both at home and in Newfoundland, which has enabled them to carry on what has been so prosperously begun, and to send to their destined employment in the Island, one additional Master and two Mistresses—Mr. and Mrs. Hopper, and Mrs. Simmons, who were mentioned in the last Annual Report as, at that time, engaged by your Committee. Another important step has also been taken, in the visit which your Assistant-Secretary has lately made to the Colony:—much valuable information has been obtained, which will prove of essential use to the Society:—the actual wants and resources of the Island are now better understood, and a reciprocal feeling of kindness between its Inhabitants and the Mother Country has been called forth, which this Institution is well calculated to cherish and in-

crease, and from which the happiest and most important benefits may be justly expected.

As soon as Mr. Willoughby arrived in Newfoundland, he waited upon the Governor, Sir Thomas Cochrane, to whom he presented his letter of introduction from Lord Bathurst, and was most kindly received: at a subsequent interview, His Excellency assured him of his favourable sentiments on the subject of the education of the poor generally, and was pleased to express his particular approbation of this Institution, and suggested to your Assistant-Secretary several points of importance for the consideration of your Committee. Mr. Willoughby visited all the stations where the Society has established Schools, and he had the gratification of finding them in a prosperous state; the Teachers giving general satisfaction and upholding the character of the Society.

Your Committee will now proceed to detail, as briefly as may be, the circumstances of each School, in the order observed in their former Reports, beginning with the Central School at

#### ST. JOHN'S.

This important establishment is conducted by Mr. and Mrs. Jeynes, who have been much encouraged by the uniform approbation expressed at the public examination of the Children, and by the liberal support which this School has received from the inhabitants.



In a letter, dated the 4th of January last, Mr. Jeynes observes, " Mr. Willoughby's visit has proved most beneficial to the Society, and we look forward to still greater improvements should he be permitted to return to Newfoundland." Of his own School he says, " My Boys are becoming more attached, and the spirit of the School is improved; our Adult School is increasing; they have brought their portion of candles and promised their share of wood, so that the expense of those articles will continue to decrease."

" January 17, 1827.—Knitting goes on briskly; there is much demand for knit cuffs and gloves: spinning will commence to-morrow. My School at Quidi Vidi continues to increase by the admission of some I did not expect; thus we have reason to believe that our Schools will gradually rise upon their own foundation, and in the public esteem."

It being very desirable to obtain a piece of ground, adjoining the South side of the Society's Premises in St. John's; on applying for the same to His Excellency the Governor, it was immediately granted; thus a Play-ground is obtained for the School, and a Garden for the Master.

#### QUIDI VIDI.

We find the following notice in Mr. Willoughby's Journal, of this little offset from the Central Stem at St. John's:—" Sunday, August 13, 1826. In

the afternoon, I went to see the Quidi Vidi School, which has been opened about a fortnight, for the season. Many of the Children are occupied in the Fishery; the number present was twenty-five; Boys and Girls, very interesting:—scarcely one of these knew a letter when the School was first opened; several of them can now read the Testament, say the Church Catechism, and repeat many of Watts's Hymns for Children, two of which they sung very prettily."

#### TRINITY HARBOUR.

At this Station the population is about 700, but the number of inhabitants who reside in the numerous creeks which indent the bay, is supposed to be upwards of 4000.

From one of these settlements called Old Perlican, containing about 500 inhabitants, a Petition was brought over by your Assistant-Secretary for a School-master and Mistress, with which, however, it is impossible to comply until the funds of the Society are in a more prosperous state.

The Schools under the care of Mr. Fleet continue to go on well, and keep up their usual numbers. The attachment of the Children is undiminished: the Parents are very grateful for the attention which is paid to their little ones, and the utility of the Institution is freely acknowledged by all classes. The good-will of the people, as de-

scribed by Mr. Fleet, is highly creditable to them, and well deserves to be gratefully recorded.

“ On Monday, the 30th January, 1826 (he says), The inhabitants and others assembled early in the morning, and made forward into the woods, together with the Clergyman, Magistrates, and School-master, accompanied by the Commander of H. M. S. *Snape*, Lieutenant Bullock, and his crew. Went in the distance of seven miles, and returned out in the evening with *thirty-two* large timbers, requiring eight men to haul each stick, and landed them upon the School-ground—gave three cheers, and each one returned home.”

“ February 1.—This morning the inhabitants and others met again according to promise, made forward into the woods to the same place, and came out in the evening with *twenty-eight* large timbers—the weather so severe that several were seared with the frost; landed them as before with the others, and returned home.”

“ Saturday, 4.—Those who were able assembled again this morning, and made forward into the woods: the weather still severe—came out safe in the evening with *thirty* timbers, and dismissed.”

“ Saturday, 27.—Had the pleasure this afternoon of helping up the ground-timber of the School-house to the place whereon it is to stand: my heart rejoiced at this welcome sight, and fervently do I pray that God will mercifully carry on the work.”

The foundation of the building was laid June 2, 1826, and is supposed to be nearly finished. When your Assistant-Secretary was at Trinity, he found a zealous and liberal friend in Mr. Kelson, who takes a lively interest in the concerns of your Society. Mr. Drawbridge, on the part of the House of Messrs. Garlands, of Poole, has enlarged the former grant to the Society, by the gift of an additional piece of ground, immediately adjoining the School-house, by which the Society's premises are greatly improved.

Your Assistant-Secretary remarks, in his Journal, on visiting Trinity, "I found Mr. Fleet in high spirits, quite pleased with his employment, and the school in good order, presenting the appearance of an English National School of interesting healthy Children. Could the people of England see the Children of other places in the Colony, who are still destitute of instruction, and contrast them with those who are receiving it, or who have already left our Schools, they would, I am sure, do their utmost to convey the blessing of education to all. The Girls' School has felt much the want of a Mistress to teach them to sew, &c., but they have made great progress in writing, reading, arithmetic, &c."

Your Committee regret to state that Mrs. Simmons has been under the necessity of relinquishing her engagement with the Society, in consequence

of her declining health. The retirement of such a valuable Teacher will be severely felt in Trinity, where her labours have been already particularly useful, and where the improvement of the females under her care has surpassed her own expectations. But we trust that this dispensation of Providence will be acquiesced in with meekness, and that the prayer of faith will ascend to Him who can supply all our need.

#### HARBOUR GRACE.

This is a very important station, situate on the northern shore of Conception Bay, on the western coast of Newfoundland. It has a safe and spacious harbour; much of the land contiguous is in cultivation, and the number of inhabitants is about 2800, but the whole population of Conception Bay is supposed to be 18 or 20,000.

From Port de Grave, one of the adjacent settlements, containing between one and 2,000 inhabitants, a petition was put into the hands of your Assistant Secretary, earnestly requesting the Committee to establish a School there, but which they are again most reluctantly compelled to refuse in the present limited state of their finances. The Committee are placed in the same difficulty with regard to Western Bay, Northern Bay and Ochre Pit, in Conception Bay, containing upwards of 1000 inhabitants, among whom there are at least

400 Children, who would thankfully receive instruction.

At Harbour Grace Mr. and Mrs. Kingwell have each a flourishing School, and both appear fully to enjoy the confidence of the Parents and the affection of their Children. The confined limits of the room in which the Children assembled for instruction having proved injurious to the health of several, it became necessary to take immediate steps for building a suitable School-House. Great difficulty would have been experienced in procuring ground for this purpose, but for the kindness of a warm friend to this Institution, who purchased and presented to the Society, an eligible piece of land in the best part of the Harbour, where Mr. Kingwell immediately commenced building his School, and before the close of the year he had the satisfaction of seeing it completed, and his Children comfortably accommodated therein. The necessity for this expense will appear further by the following extracts from Mr. Kingwell's correspondence:—

“April 12th.—The number of scholars in attendance is 107, but to our grief we were obliged to send back 20 for want of room: some of the dear Children wept much, thinking they were late; on being assured they were in good time, and that it was only for want of room, they returned quietly home, but with a determination to get in first on the morrow.”

“ 13th.—As yesterday, after stowing away 107 in our little room, we were obliged to send home 21, but we are determined, by God’s blessing, that this shall be remedied, for we cannot bear it any longer, without trying to get them accommodated as soon as possible.”

Mr. Willoughby observes in his Journal, that when he visited Mr. Kingwell’s Sunday School, he found about 80 very interesting, cleanly, and orderly Children assembled. Mr. W. took charge of a class, who repeated the Collect for the day, gave a very simple explanation of it, and read a chapter in the New Testament in a manner which would have done credit to a School in England.

#### CARBONNIERRE.

Carbonnierre is situate on the northern shore of Conception Bay. The harbour is very spacious and safe, and more land is said to be cultivated at this settlement than in any other part of the Island. The population is reckoned at 1550. This is the second station established by the Society in this extensive Bay, in the various settlements of which as it has been already stated, there are supposed to be 18 or 20,000 inhabitants. Great credit is due to Mr. and Mrs. Teulon for discretion and patience in the performance of their duties; sometimes under trying circumstances. Mr. Willoughby describes them as being “ quite well and happy in their charge.”

and speaks of their schools in very favourable terms. In June last Mr. Teulon writes as follows :—

“ During the past seven months upwards of 100 Scholars, comprising nearly an equal number of both sexes, have been received into the Schools ; of Children from 5 to 12 years old, about 90, and of adults 17. Most of these have attended as well as their circumstances would permit, and their attachment to the School has increased ; their general conduct is so much improved, that it is acknowledged by all their friends ; and they make evident progress in their learning. Many of the parents rejoice in the Institution, and profess an anxiety to make the best return in their power.”

“ Jan. 6th, 1827.—This winter has deprived us of several young pupils, and the School has not been replenished as I anticipated by fresh admissions. But several of those who have left us, and the greater part of those who remain, have here learned to read their Bibles, and in a measure to understand them. Upwards of 40 girls have, under Mrs. Teulon’s teaching, learned to knit, besides their other acquirements of spelling, reading, writing, and plain needle-work ; and in a few instances there appears to be a habit of thought and inquiry which is very promising.”

“ Some of the Children have learned in less than a year’s regular attendance to read well, to write, to sew, to knit, and, I trust, to pray for the mercy and favour of God.”



### PETTY HARBOUR

Is distant nine miles from St. John's. From its vicinity to the capital, and the character of its population, coming chiefly from the western parts of England, it is a very interesting Station. Your Assistant Secretary in his Journal has thus briefly recorded his visit to Petty Harbour :—

“ Found Mr. and Mrs. Martin well and busily engaged with their School ; about 50 very clean and interesting Children present—an equal number of girls and boys, in very good order. I heard them read in the Bible, and questioned them from the 14th chapter of St. John ; they answered with great credit to their teachers, and apparently with much feeling ; they repeated the Church Catechism,\* and Marsh's Explanation of it very well. The Girls knit, sew, and mark ; the elder Boys are many of them engaged in the fishery.”

The following extracts from Mr. Martin's Letters and Journal will be found very satisfactory :—

---

\* It being the object of this Society to supply the moral wants of the uneducated part of the community of Newfoundland, while it adopts Dr. Bell's System of Instruction, it is cautious of giving offence by insisting on the *general* introduction of any particular Catechism. The Society intends that all the children of the Schools should receive instruction in the Holy Scriptures, and that upon one or more days in the week, the children of the Establishment should be instructed in the Church Catechism, and that the attendance of all other children at such Seasons should be left to the discretion of their parents.

“ April 5th, 1826.—Our Schools are prospering, and afford us the greatest encouragement. Part of the vacation I spent at St. John’s, and speaking of this place, always reminds me of the attentions of Mr. Cock, of whose kindness and friendly disposition we can hardly say enough.”

“ We have opened an Adult Evening School, with 27 Scholars, most of whom have made a considerable advance, being regular in their attendance, and very thankful for the means they have had. Our Sunday School too affords us very great encouragement; we have 24 Boys and 24 Girls, total 48. Of this number 25 can repeat the Church Catechism and answer Marsh’s Questions; the greater part of them repeat psalms or hymns, and many say whole chapters.”

“ The bridge, which is to extend from (our) south side to north, is to be finished this spring; I have visited that side and find that a general wish prevails to send their children if they could.”

“ All is encouraging; the Children appear to have an affection for us, and (I rejoice to say it) are improving in their conduct.”

“ The clearing of a plot of ground to build on, has cost us much labour, though the people have done a great deal. We have had this season four gangs of men to work gratuitously; on one day there were twenty; so willing are the people to shew how they value the benefits which the Society is conferring on their Children; but they are too poor to

give any money, though I am persuaded they would cheerfully subscribe if they were able. We have now as much ground as we want, for building and gardening, in one lot, retired and every way convenient, and when all is cleared by the help of the inhabitants, will become a very pleasant and valuable property. It has been duly secured to the Society by a liberal grant from the Governor."

"Friday, October 27th.—This day has been a memorable one. The first stone of the foundation of the Society's School-House here has been laid. I felt much on the occasion; the Children stood round and sung the 122d Hymn. Thought of that text, "Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it."

#### BONAVISTA

Is distant from St. John's nearly 100 miles. This station, situate on the western shore of Newfoundland, was occupied by the Society for the first time last summer, when Mr. and Mrs. Hopper were appointed to labour there. Its population is reckoned at 2317 souls. Bonavista is therefore likely to become in a short time one of our most important posts.

Mr. Hopper derived great advantage from finding your Assistant Secretary on the Island at the time of his arrival.

As soon as Mr. Willoughby could leave St. John's, he repaired to Bonavista, where having made his object known, he immediately received

the most cordial welcome and support from the principal inhabitants. Mr. Alexander, a resident magistrate, insisted upon his taking up his abode with him, while he remained there. Your Assistant Secretary immediately began to solicit subscriptions for establishing a School in the place; he says, "I found the inhabitants all delighted with the prospect of a School for their Children. In about four hours I obtained 50*l.* 8*s.* and many promises to haul out timber for the building and for fire-wood. I had not time to see half the number who could, and will, I have no doubt, subscribe on Mr Hopper's arrival."—Mr. Willoughby's next care was to fix on an eligible site for the proposed School. He selected a very desirable spot of ground adjoining the churchyard, but found it was already appropriated. He applied, however, to the owner of the land, and having represented to him for what object it was wanted, he most readily gave it to the Society. For this prompt and liberal gift your Committee desire to record their grateful acknowledgments: the land has been since duly secured to the Society. Another kind friend presented for the use of the School, a Canadian stove of the value of 12*l.* Under such auspicious circumstances did your Institution begin its benevolent career in Bonavista. The building will be commenced forthwith.

On November 6, Mr. and Mrs. Hopper opened a School with 10 children: on the 26th of the fol-

lowing month the number had increased to 102, and Mr. Hopper was receiving more applications for boys than he could admit, on account of the smallness of the rooms.

Mr. Hopper observes in one of his letters, "The Girls are much pleased with the knitting, and the Parents likewise; it is quite a new thing here, as very few have ever seen it done."

Your Committee could easily enlarge these extracts, but enough, they presume, has been given to afford very satisfactory evidence, that, although on a limited scale, and with but scanty means, this Society is carrying on, in Newfoundland, an interesting and important work. Before they conclude the history of the Society's proceedings in the island, your Committee would advert to a petition which has been received from Green's Pond, with the Coves immediately adjacent in Bonavista Bay, the population is upwards of 1100, and the inhabitants have manifested such impatience to obtain the benefits of education, that they have not only subscribed £86, and provided sufficient timber, but have actually commenced the building of a School, trusting to the liberality of the Society to provide a Master and Mistress for it.

Under these circumstances, your Committee have been compelled in a manner, to comply with the Petition, and have accordingly resolved to send out a Master and Mistress to Green's Pond, in the Spring of the next year, for which resolution they

fully believe the present meeting will cheerfully indemnify them.

#### HOME.

Your Committee in adverting to their domestic proceedings, are compelled to own that they have not been distinguished by that activity and consequent increase of means which the urgent necessities of the Society demand. It has been found impracticable to visit all the Associations, but at an expense which, under present circumstances, your Committee have thought it neither right nor convenient to incur;—they are persuaded, nevertheless, that an adequate and permanent support might be obtained to the Institution by the appointment of a Clerical Secretary whose time and abilities would be wholly devoted to this work, when not engaged in the service of the Society in London: and your Committee venture to hope, that should a favourable opportunity arise of adopting such an important measure, the friends of the Institution will give it their sanction and support.

The Society has already more than 20 Associations in different counties, from which the sum of £664 11s. 8d. has been received during the last year. A much larger number of efficient auxiliaries might be formed, were the objects of the Society more stately presented to the notice of the nu-

merous friends of Scriptural Education throughout the country.

At Birmingham, a Public Meeting was held last August, at which the Rev. Henry Budd, the Rev. James Harris, and Samuel Codner, Esq., assisted; and a deputation consisting of the Rev. John Peers, the Rev. R. Lugger, and Samuel Codner, Esq., visited Poole, Bridport, Sidmouth, Teignmouth, Chudleigh, Newton, Dartmouth, Totness, Devonport, and Exeter.—Mr. Codner also experienced much kindness from the friends of the Society at Hereford, Gloucester, Liverpool, Manchester, Bath, and Buxton;—at the latter place, His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin, and His Grace the Archbishop of Tuam, met a few friends at St. Ann's Hotel, and the sum of £40 was collected. The interest excited in all the before-mentioned places, needs only to be cherished to become every year more productive.

Your Committee have particular pleasure in announcing the establishment of a City of London Ladies' Association, during the last year; from which it is expected much assistance will be derived to the Society, both as regards the increase of its funds, and the activity of its operations.

Mr. Codner visited Ireland in the Autumn of last year, on behalf of this Society, and met with the kindest reception wherever he had an opportunity of advocating the Society's objects.—At Cork a

Public Meeting was held on the 9th of October, in the Mansion House, at which the Mayor presided; and on the 26th of the same month, another meeting was held in Dublin, the Rev. T P. Magee in the Chair. Considerable attention was awakened on both these occasions; and the Society obtained the support of the following distinguished individuals:—His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin, His Grace the Archbishop of Tuam, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Waterford, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Elphin, and the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Clogher, the Earl of Mount Cashel, and the Right Hon. Henry Goulburn. The encouragement which has thus been given to the Society in the sister kingdom, may be considered as the earnest of more efficient aid, when the peculiar claims of the poor of Newfoundland on that country are better understood. Of the 90,000 souls which constitute the population of that Colony, at least one half are Irish, or the descendants of Irish parents; this fact alone, it is presumed, is a strong ground for expecting assistance and sympathy, not only from the rich, but from all classes of the community in Ireland.

The finances of the Society have been aided considerably by contributions of work, from the Ladies of Teignmouth, Gloucester, Hereford, Brighton, White Roothing, and London and its vicinity. The produce of such Sales during the



last year, amounts to the sum of £271. 2s. 2d. ; and the Ladies of Clapham having kindly contributed a further supply of work, it is intended shortly to have a sale at that place.

Your Committee desire to record their grateful acknowledgments to the following Gentlemen who have preached for the benefit of the Society, viz.:—  
The Rev. Andrew Brandram, M. A., Rev. R. C. Dillon, M. A., and Rev. Thomas Mortimer, M. A.

And your Committee would particularly and respectfully appeal to their Clerical Friends in general, to give the Society all the support in their power by preaching in its behalf, and affording to their brethren an opportunity of advocating its claims from their pulpits.

Your Committee desire to mention with gratitude, the following grants, which have been made with the greatest readiness to the Society, besides various smaller grants of Books, &c., from benevolent individuals who feel a deep interest in the welfare of the Children in your Schools.

From the *British and Foreign Bible Society*, 500 Bibles, and 1,000 Testaments. From the *Prayer Book and Homily Society*, 1,250 Homilies as Tracts, and 10 Volumes of Select Homilies. From the *Tract Society*, 4,000 Small Tracts, 10,000 Hand-bills, and 12 Sets of Loan Tracts. From the *Sunday School Society*, 5,000 Spelling Books, and 400 Alphabets on boards.

To his Excellency the Governor and to the various Members of the Government in Newfoundland—to the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations—to the Gentlemen of the Naval and Military service, as well as to the Merchants and Inhabitants of the Colony in general, the grateful acknowledgments of your Committee are due, for the courtesy and hospitality shewn to your Assistant Secretary on his recent visit to the Island, and for the support they have so liberally afforded to this Institution.

The thanks of your Committee are also particularly due to T. H. Brooking, Esq., and Charles Cock, Esq., of St. John's, who from the first establishment of the Society, have given it their most disinterested and efficient support; and who on all occasions have afforded to your Masters every kindness and attention, as well as the benefit of their experience and advice. The Society is also indebted wholly to these Gentlemen for the *gratuitous* management of their concerns in the Island.

Your Committee have much pleasure in stating that His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin and His Grace the Archbishop of Tuam have accepted the office of Vice Patrons; and that the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Norwich, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Waterford, the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Elphin, the Right Hon. the Earl

of Mount Cashel, the Right Hon. Henry Goulburn, M. P., and Charles Hyde Villiers, Esq., M. P., have been added to the list of the Vice Presidents of the Society.

The number of Scholars admitted into the Schools, according to the latest returns, is as follows, viz.:—

making a total of 1,239 individuals, Children and Adults, who are participating in the benefits of this Institution, in which number are not included the 429 children in the *Sunday* Schools, who, for the most part, are also *daily* Scholars.

The Society is under great obligations to the kindness and liberality of several pious and affluent individuals, but for whose opportune assistance and munificent donations, your Committee would have had the painful duty this day of declaring an almost ruinous defalcation in their funds.

The payments have exceeded the receipts by £203 10s. 2d., which sum is still owing to your

Treasurer. Your Committee feel great regret in being obliged to state that the annual Subscriptions in London and its vicinity, have made little or no advance ; and they avail themselves of the present opportunity to urge their friends to do their utmost to obtain additional Subscribers ; for while they cannot be too thankful for the very liberal donations they have recently received ; it is to the *annual* subscriptions, chiefly, they must look for those permanent supplies, which will enable them to carry on and to complete the benevolent designs of the Society.

In concluding their Report, your Committee would again acknowledge with devout thankfulness that Divine guidance and protection under which the Society has thus far happily advanced.

The prospect, especially in Newfoundland, is indeed most cheering—seven Schools attended by nearly 1,000 children—the teachers fulfilling their arduous duties—the people thankful and zealous, contributing money and timber according to their ability, and crying out for more Schools. At *Home*, suitable teachers offering themselves willingly to the work ; waiting only for pecuniary means to send them forth. — While however your Committee desire to walk by faith, they would avoid presumption :—without means they can do nothing—but He who has said “The silver is mine, and the gold is mine,” has hitherto supplied them.

To Him, therefore, in renewed faith and prayer, they cheerfully commit the cause of Education in Newfoundland.—He has blest, and He will bless it, if in the Spirit of *Israel*, we individually plead with Him on its behalf, and say, “I will not let thee go except thou bless me !”
