HORRIBLE ABORTION CASE

FRIGHTFUL DOINGS OF A DRUNKEN PHY-SICIAN IN GEORGETOWN-CORONER'S

From the Toronto Telegraph.

Georgetown, Nov. 12.—One of the most horrible affairs that we have every heard of occurred in this town yesterday, and is now the universal topic of conversation. The facts of the case, as elicited at the Coroner's inquest, are as follows;—

the power of members of the Executive Council, or of the Privy Council to hold more than one seat. This is at least anomalous; Councillors are supposed to be made out of clever men, and if there is any advantage in dual representation it must be that it gives to those of narrow experience and ordinary mental power the opportunity of profiting by the instruction of their superiors. Attorney General Macdonald promised it would not happen again under any circumstances, and the motion was accordingly withdrawn.

But after all the bill coming from the source it does is not so bad. It provides that no person holding office under the Dominion or the Province shall be eligible as a member of the Assembly, excepting of course the members of the Executive Council of Ontario, and, after the example of Britain, officers of Her Majesty's army and navy, and all members of the militia not receiving permanent salaries. The bill likewise disqualifies Senators, Privy Councillors and pub lie contractors, and makes the penalty for violation of the statute \$2,000 per day for every day an ineligible pers may sit and vote. Any member of the Executive Council who resigns his office, and within one month takes any other office in said Council shall not be held to have vacated his seat in the Assembly; and any member of the Executive Council who sits or votes in the House of Commons shall forfeit his office as Councillor. The Bill in its present form grants much that was re-quired; a slight effort of generosity would make it include all.
