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BY-LAWS.

No. 182--A BY-LAW

To make Provisions for Draining a Certain Locality in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter named.

Jan PASSED JULY 5TH, 1869.

WHEREAS a majority of the resident owners of the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot No. 21, in the 12th Concession; Lot 21, and the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 22, in the 13th Concession; and Lots Nos. 21, 22, and 23, in the 14th Concession, in the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the aforesaid Township, to cause a drain to be made, commencing in Fuce's Creek, about forty rods north of the allowance for Road between Concessions Nos. 12 and 13, thence south-easterly along said Creek, following an old outlet to the Concession line between Concessions No. 13 and 14, thence north-easterly along said Concession line to the line between Lots No. 21 and 22; thence south-easterly to the centre of the 14th Concession; thence north-easterly along the centre of the 14th Concession across Lot No. 22, and to within about 34 rods of the line between Lots Nos. 23 and 24.

And whereas the Petitioners and Council are of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the above Lots and Roads in that locality to have said Drain constructed, have ordered levels and plans to made, and received a Report thereon, with an estimate of the costs of said Drain, amounting to the sum of \$753.

Be it therefore enacted, by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, and the amendment thereto, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

I. That the said Drain shall be made in accordance with the plan and the estimate of the same, made by Arthur Jones, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the present year, the sum of \$653, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the Lands in the locality aforesaid, in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each lot as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and forming a part of this By-law, subject nevertheless, to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

III. That the sum of \$100 assessed on the road allowances in the aforesaid locality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the aforesaid Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Reeve.

IV. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let by public contract in sections to the lowest bidder, (and the whole drain not in any case to exceed the estimate), who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

V. That Messrs. White and Morrison are hereby appointed Commissioners for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor.

VI. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work.

VII. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham *Banner* newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No. 183—A BY-LAW

To make Provisions for Draining a certain Locality in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter described.

PASSED JULY 30TH, 1869.

WHEREAS Charles Bavin and others, being a majority of the resident owners of the Lots numbered 18 and 19, the south-east halves of Lots numbered 20 and 21, in the 15th Concession; Lots 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21, in Concession 16; and lots numbered 137, 138 and 139, Talbot Road, in the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the said Township of Raleigh, praying the Council to cause a Drain or Water Course to be opened, commencing on the easterly side of the 138 and 139 side road, at a point southerly of the big Ridge, thence north-west following the side road in rear of the Talbot Road Lots, thence easterly along the southerly side of the same to the easterly side of the 18th and 19th side road, thence north-west along the easterly side of said Side Road 18 and 19, to the line of road between Concessions 14 and 15; also for a Branch Drain from the 18 and 19 Side Road across lots numbered 19, 20 and about sixty rods on the westerly side of Lot 21, on the southerly side of the line of road between Concessions numbered 15 and 16.

And whereas, this Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit that portion of the Township to make said Drain, have ordered the levels to be taken, and have received a report thereon, with an estimate of the costs, amounting to the sum of \$1,299.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Council of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, 32nd Vict., Cap. 43, passed by the Legislature of Ontario, A. D., 1869.

I. That the aforesaid Drain and Branch shall be made in accordance with the report and estimate of the same, furnished to this Council by A. Jones, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the present year, the sum of \$1,049, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands in the locality described in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each lot, as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and forming a part of this By-Law, subject nevertheless to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

III. That the sum of \$250, assessed on the road allowances in the aforesaid locality, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the aforesaid Corporation, out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Reeve.

IV. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let in sections by public contract to the lowest bidder, (and the whole Drain not in any case to exceed the estimate), who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

V. That Messrs. Manning and Morrison are hereby appointed Commissioners

for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor.

VI. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work.

VII. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No. 184—A BY-LAW

To authorize the Deepening of a certain Water Course in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter named.

PASSED JULY 30TH, 1869.

WHEREAS Robert Ritchie and others, being a majority of the resident land owners of the Lots numbered 20, in the 11th Con.; Lots numbered 20, 19 and 18, on the 10th Con., have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, to deepen the Water Course running through the north-west half of Lot numbered 20, in the 11th Concession, to the line between Concessions numbered 9 and 10, commencing on the north-west half of Lot 20, in the 11th Concession, near the centre of said Lot numbered 20, in a Ditch or Water Course, thence north-westerly along the said Ditch or water-course to about level stake No. 13, through the north-west half Lot-number 20, in the 11th Concession, and part of the south-east half of Lot 20, in the 10th Concession, thence westerly, following said Water Course through Lots No. 20, 19, and 18, in the 10th Concession, to the Road between Concessions numbered 9 & 10.

And whereas, the Council being of the opinion that the deepening of the said Water Course would greatly benefit the above mentioned lands, and the Roads connected, have ordered the levels to be taken, and received a report thereon, with an estimate of the costs of the work, amounting to the sum of \$475.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, 32nd Vict., Cap. 43, passed by the Legislature of Ontario, A. D., 1869:

I. That the said Water Course shall be deepened and widened in accordance with the survey and plan of the same, made by Arthur Jones, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the present year, the sum of \$443, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands above described in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each Lot as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and forming a part of this By-Law, subject nevertheless to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

III. That the sum of \$30 assessed on the road allowances benefitted by said drainage, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the aforesaid Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Reeve.

IV. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let in sections by public contract to the lowest bidder, (and the whole Drain not in any case to exceed the estimate,) who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

V. That Messrs. White and Morrison are hereby appointed Commissioners for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor.

VI. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work.

VII. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham *Banner* newspaper six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

No. 185—A BY-LAW

To grant authority to the Trustees of School Section No. 11, in the Township of Raleigh, united with No. 2, Harwich, to borrow the sum of \$187,50, for the purpose of paying one half the costs for erecting a new School House.

PASSED JULY 30TH, 1869.

WHEREAS, the Trustees of School Section numbered 11, in the Township of Raleigh, united with No. 2, Harwich, have made application to the Municipal Council of said Township, to grant them authority to borrow the sum of \$187,50, for the purpose of paying one half of the costs of erecting a new School House.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Acts respect-

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ing the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada; also the Act, Cap. 64 of the Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, and the amendments thereto, passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario.

I. That it shall and may be lawful for the Trustees of School Section No. 11, in the Township of Raleigh, united with School Section No. 2, Harwich, to raise by way of loan, and at a rate of interest not exceeding ten per cent. per annum, the sum of \$187,50, (to be paid on or before the first day of January, 1871); from any person or persons, body or bodies Corporate, who may be willing to advance the same.

No. 186—A BY-LAW

To divide the Township of Raleigh into four Polling Sub-divisions for Legislative purposes.

PASSED JULY 30TH, 1869.

WHEREAS, it is necessary and expedient to divide the Township of Raleigh into four Polling Sub-divisions, as required by the Act, Cap. 21, of the Statutes of Ontario, passed in the year 1869.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Township of Raleigh, assembled under and by virtue of the Municipal and other Acts of Parliament.

I. That the Township of Raleigh shall be divided into four Polling Sub-divisions, under and as required by the Act passed by the Provincial Legislature of Ontario, Cap. 21, in the year 1869.

II. That the first Division shall embrace and consist of all that portion of the Township of Raleigh from the River Thames to the line between Concessions 9 and 10 from the eastern boundary line of the Township, to the line between Lots 12 and 13.

III. That the second Division shall embrace and contain all that portion of the Township lying between the 12 and 13 Side Road, and the Town Line between the said Township of Raleigh and Tilbury East, and the River Thames, and the line between Concessions 9 and 10.

IV. That the third Division shall embrace all that portion of the Township lying between the line between Concessions 9 and 10 to the line between Concessions 13 and 14, from one boundary of the Township to the other.

V. That the fourth Division shall consist of and embrace all that portion of the Township from the line between Concessions 13 and 14 to Lake Erie, from the Western to the Eastern boundary of the said Township of Raleigh.

No. 187—A BY-LAW

To raise certain sums of Money therein mentioned, in the Township of Raleigh for the year 1869.

PASSED JULY 30TH, 1869.

WHEREAS, by By-Law by the Municipal Council of the County of Kent, passed on the 11th of June, 1869, and entitled, a By-Law to raise the sum of \$16,511 91, to meet the current expenses of the County of Kent.

And whereas, the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise the sum of \$1,878 06, as their portion for said year, to be paid to the Treasurer of the County of Kent, without any deduction, on or before the 31st day of December, A. D., 1869.

And whereas, the apportionment of the Legislative School Grant for the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1869, amounts to \$389, according to the apportionment of the Chief Superintendent of Schools.

And whereas the Municipality of the Township of Raleigh is required to raise an equal sum of money, according to law in such case made and provided.

And whereas, it is necessary to raise the following sums of money to meet the current expenses of the Township of Raleigh, for the year, A. D., 1869, viz:—

For the Salaries of Township Officers, the sum of.....	\$522 60
For the support of the Poor in the Township, the sum of.....	318 50
For Non-Resident School Accounts, the sum of.....	511 68
For Miscellaneous Accounts, the sum of.....	272 43
Assessed for Roads under Drainage By-Laws, the sum of.....	541 00

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled under and by virtue of an Act, 29th and 30th Vict., Chap. 51, and the amendments thereto, passed by the Legislature of Ontario, in the years 1868 and '69.

I. That there shall be raised, levied and collected upon all the rateable real and personal property in the Township of Raleigh, the sum or rate of four mills on every dollar thereof, for the aforesaid County purposes; the sum or rate of four mills on every dollar thereof, to meet the current expenses of the Township of Raleigh for the current year; the sum or rate of one mill on every dollar thereof, for the aforesaid School purposes, (except the property of certain Roman Catholic supporters of Separate Schools); the sum or rate of one dollar upon the owner or harbinger of every dog, and the sum or rate of two dollars upon the owner or harbinger of every bitch entered upon the Assessment Roll of the Township of Raleigh, for the year 1869.

II. That if the above sums of money so raised and collected by the said rates, shall exceed in any case the amount so required for the said purposes, respectively, the Treasurer of this Corporation shall pass such excess to any deficiency that may arise to any or either of the purposes mentioned in this By-Law, and if no such deficiency shall happen, then all such excess, if any, shall be kept by the Treasurer and appropriated to the general purposes of the Township, under the direction and control of the Council thereof, as all the monies are which may come into his hands.

III. That the Clerk of this Corporation is required to levy a Special Rate over and above all other rates against the estate, real and personal, of any School Section within this Municipality on the request of the Trustees, who shall furnish him on or before the First day of August with a written statement, signed by such Trustees of the amount of money to be raised, levied and collected by this Council, for Common School purposes in such School Section, such a rate *pro rata*, on all the rateable property in such School Section, as will amount to the sum of money required by such Trustees for the aforesaid purposes, together with the sum of six per cent. on said amount to defray the expenses of levying and collecting the same.

IV. That the Collectors are hereby authorized and required to collect, according to law, the Special Rates levied on the Freeholders and Householdors of such School Sections, the sum of money set opposite their respective names, and to pay the amount so collected, on or before the 14th day of December next, after retaining the sum of six per cent. for levying and collecting said rates, to the Secretary-Treasurer of such School Section, whose receipt with the Corporate Seal attached, and deposited with the Treasurer of this Corporation, shall be his or their acquittance for the sums so paid.

V. It shall be the duty of the Collectors of this Corporation to pay over all monies collected by him or them, to the Treasurer of this Corporation, every two weeks, with a report of all the taxes he or they have received, in Bank Notes or other current funds, under a penalty of the forfeiture of his or their Salary; and to finally collect and pay over all monies collected by him or them, and make a return to the Treasurer by the 14th day of December, according to law: provided that this clause shall not apply to Special School Rates.

VI. That the Collectors shall be allowed the same fees as are allowed to Bailiffs of Division Courts, for all property seized, appraised, advertised and sold by him or them, by virtue of his or their office.

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No. 188—A BY-LAW

To make provisions for Draining a certain Locality in the Township of Raleigh, hereinafter described.

PASSED SEPT. 28TH 1869.

WHEREAS, John Collins and others, being a majority of the resident owners of the lots No. 11, 12, 13 and 14; in the 6th Concession; Lots No. 11, 12, 13 and 14 in the 7th Concession; Lots No. 11, 12, 13 and 14 in Concession A; and the Northwest halves of the Lots No 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14, in the 8th Concession, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, praying the Council to cause a drain or water course to be opened, commencing about the Centre of Love Creek, and on the southeast side of the road between Concessions A and 8; thence, northerly following, said Creek for, say 132 rods, to its intersection with the westerly side of 12 and 13 side road; thence, northwest to the road between Concessions A and 7; thence, southwest along said road for about 6 rods; thence, northerly, on George J. Charleston's farm, following the westerly side of Love Creek for, say 24 rods, to the easterly side of the 12 and 13 side road; thence, northwest to the Big Plains Ditch, in the 6th Concession, Raleigh. And whereas the Council being of opinion that it would greatly benefit the above-mentioned lands, and the roads connected therewith, to make said drain, have ordered the levels to be taken and have received a report thereon, with an estimate of the costs, amounting to the sum of \$957 00

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, 32nd Vict., Cap. 43, passed by the Legislature of Ontario, A. D., 1869.

I. That the aforesaid Drain shall be made in accordance with the report and estimate of the same furnished to this Council by Arthur Jones, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the present year, the sum of \$800, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands above described in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each Lot as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed and forming a part of this By-Law, subject nevertheless to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

III. That the sum of \$157 00 assessed on the Road allowances benefitted by said drainage, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the aforesaid Corporation, out of the general funds of the Municipality on the order of the Reeve.

IV. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let in sections by public contract to the lowest bidder (and the whole drain not in any case to exceed the estimate) who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

V. That Messrs. Dolsen and Peck are hereby appointed Commissioners for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor.

VI. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work.

VII. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper for six weeks previous to the final passing thereof:

No. 189—A BY-LAW

To amend By Laws Nos. 10 and 16 of the Consolidated By-Laws of the Township of Raleigh, published in 1865.

PASSED SEPTEMBER 28TH, 1869.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Corporation of the Council of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of the Municipal Act.

I. That it shall be duty of the Commissioners appointed to expend certain monies in the Rural Road Divisions for the year 1869, to attend to all the duties enjoined on Overseers in said By-Laws, Nos. 10 and 16, as published in the Consolidated By-Laws of the year 1865, with regard to the removal of obstructions in Streams and Water-Courses in the Township of Raleigh, who shall be entitled to the same fees, and liable to the same penalties as set forth in the hereinbefore recited By-Laws, with regard to the duties of Overseers.

IV. That James Toll is hereby appointed Returning Officer for the Fourth Electoral Division, and that the Polling place be at the house of William Stover, on Lot No. 142, Talbot Street,

No. 191—A BY-LAW

For the Consolidation of By-Laws No. 10 and 16, of the Consolidated By-Laws of 1865, of the Township of Raleigh—to provide for the removal of obstructions from all Streams and Water Courses in the Township of Raleigh.

PASSED 15th November, 1869.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act, respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, passed in 1866, and the amendments thereto passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

I. That every freeholder, landholder or occupier of land in the Township of Raleigh, shall, within eight months from and after the passing of this By-law, clear away and remove all the obstructions, such as trees, brushwood, timber, or other material, existing in any stream or water course, and also to construct a swing gate on posts over all streams or water courses whenever a fence crosses, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of the respective Rural Road Division, on any lands held by such freeholder, landholder, or occupier of lands in said Township of Raleigh, and such landholder shall remove all such obstructions which may hereafter exist.

II. In case any such landholder as aforesaid, shall neglect or refuse to clear away any such obstructions in any stream or water course, and to erect the required swing gate aforesaid, on any lands held or occupied by any such landowner in said Township of Raleigh, it shall be lawful, on complaint of a ratepayer to the Commissioner of said Division, for the Commissioners of the several Rural Road Divisions of said Township, to cause the same to be removed, and the required swing gate to be constructed, and for that purpose the said Commissioners shall give at least six days notice, by posting up written notices in at least three public places in their Division, specifying what work is to be let, and shall let the same to the lowest bidder, and said Commissioners, after the work is completed, shall send in a report to the Township Clerk, stating number of lot, concession, and name of the holder of the land (if known) on which the work has been done, with an account of the costs, including Commissioners' fees, and it shall be the duty of the Clerk to lay all such reports before the Council at their ensuing meeting, who, on being satisfied that the work has been properly performed, shall order the several accounts to be paid out of the general funds of the Township.

III. It shall be the duty of the Clerk of said Corporation in making out the Collector's Roll in each year, for said Township, to charge the several accounts so ordered to be paid, against the lands from which such obstructions have been removed, and that that the same be collected in the same manner as other ordinary taxes are levied.

IV. That the Commissioners shall be paid the sum of One Dollar and Fifty cents for each day necessarily employed in letting and receiving the clearing of streams and water-courses, and the construction of said swing gates.

V. Any person knowingly or wilfully obstructing any stream or water-course within the said Township of Raleigh, shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in the County of Kent, be liable to a fine of not more than Twenty dollars, and costs of conviction, for every such offence, and the said fine shall be paid over to the Township Treasurer for general Township purposes.

VI. Any person or persons interfering with such Commissioner of Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh, in the discharge of the duties of his office, in removing such obstructions in any stream or water-course, or erecting the required swing gate in his Rural Road Division, shall, on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace of the County of Kent, be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten dollars nor less than One dollar, together with costs, at the discretion of the Convicting Justice.

VII. On the Commissioner of any Rural Road Division in the Township of Raleigh refusing or neglecting to fulfill the duties herein imposed in this By-law upon such Commissioner, he shall, on conviction thereof before the Reeve, Deputy Reeve or Justice of the Peace of the Township of Raleigh, be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten dollars nor less than One dollar, together with costs, at the discretion of the Convicting Justice.

VIII. That all By-laws passed prior to this By-law, respecting the clearing of streams and water-courses, be and are hereby repealed, saving any rights, proceedings, or things legally had, acquired, or done under the said By-laws Nos. 10 & 16.

III. That the said Silas J. Harvey shall continue to hold Office until he shall resign or be removed from said office by the Council.

To authorize the Deepening and Widening of a Certain Creek in the Township of Raleigh.

PASSED 31st DECEMBER, 1869.

WHEREAS a majority of the resident owners of the N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot No. 14, the S. E. halves of Lots 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19, in Concession No. 7; Lots 14, 15, 16, 17, 18 and 19, in Concession A; Lot No. 20, in the 4th Range by the Eastern Boundary Line; the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot No. 20, Lot 21, and the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 22, in the 8th Concession; the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 22, the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ and E $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 23, and the S. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 24, in the 9th Concession; and Lots Nos. 24 and 25, in the 10th Concession—in the Township of Raleigh, have petitioned the Municipal Council of the aforesaid Township to deepen and widen the Creek known as Flook's Creek, commencing on the road between Concessions Nos. 10 & 11, about the center of Lot No. 24 in said Creek; thence Westerly, following the various courses of said Flook's Creek to the Duck Pond, and thence westerly to the Plains' Drain.

And whereas, this Council being of the opinion that it would greatly benefit the above Lots and the Roads connected therewith to have said Creek made deeper and wider, have ordered the levels to be taken, and have received a report thereon, with an estimate of the costs, amounting to the sum of \$3353 00.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of "An Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada," passed in 1866, and the amendments thereto, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

I. That the aforesaid Flook's Creek shall be deepened and widened in accordance with the plan and estimate of the same, made by Arthur Jones, Provincial Land Surveyor.

II. That there shall be raised, levied and collected, along with the ordinary assessed taxes of the year 1870, the sum of \$3153 00, for the purpose of paying one part of the costs of said drainage, and the costs incidental thereto, assessed upon the lands above described in proportion to the benefit to be derived therefrom by each Lot as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and forming a part of this By-Law, subject nevertheless to an appeal by the parties interested in each case.

III. That the sum of \$200 00 assessed on the road allowances benefitted by said drainage, shall be paid by the Treasurer of the aforesaid Corporation out of the general funds of the Municipality, on the order of the Reeve.

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IV. That the work to be performed under the provisions of this By-Law, shall be let by public contract, in sections, to the lowest bidder, (and the whole Drain not in any case to exceed the estimate,) who shall give security for the due performance of the work contracted for.

V. That the Commissioners of Rural Road Divisions Nos. 1 and 4, for the year 1870, be and are hereby appointed Commissioners for the letting and superintending of the work, who are hereby authorized to grant orders on the Treasurer therefor.

VI. That the said Commissioners shall be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for every day necessarily spent in letting and superintending said work.

VII. That this By-Law shall be published in the Chatham Banner newspaper six weeks previous to the final passing thereof.

To appropriate Certain Sums of Money for the Improvement of Roads and Bridges in the Five Rural Road Divisions in the Township of Raleigh.

PASSED 31ST JANUARY, 1870.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary to appropriate certain sums of money for the improvement of the Roads and Bridges in the Township of Raleigh. Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, by virtue of and under the Act, 29th and 30th Victoria, Chapters 51 and 52, passed in 1866, respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, and the amendments thereto, passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Raleigh, in Council assembled, under and by virtue of an Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, and the amendments thereto passed by the Legislature of Ontario.

I. That George Coutts, nominated by the Reeve, and Hugh McPherson, nominated by the Council, are hereby confirmed in the Office of Auditors, and that their salary shall be the sum of Six Dollars each, and no more.

II. That David Smith, Charles Scaman, and William H. Taylor, are hereby appointed to the office of Assessors; and it shall be their duty to complete and return their Rolls to the Clerk not later than the 15th day of April; and their salary shall be the sum of Sixty Dollars each, and no more.

III. That Joseph Heatherington is hereby appointed Collector for the current year; and he is hereby required to enter into Bonds, on or before the meeting of the Council in the month of May, himself in the sum of \$4000 00, and other good

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freehold sureties to the amount of \$8000 00, which Bond will require him to col-
 lect all rates levied on the Collector's Roll, and to pay over the same, less five per
 cent. on Special School rates, to the Treasurer of this Corporation in manner fol-
 lowing, that is to say: On his receiving the Collector's Roll he shall commence to

 funds, and to pay over the same, under a penalty of the forfeiture of his salary.

IV. That Martin Drew is hereby appointed to the office of Inspector of Licenses,
 and that his salary shall be the sum of Fifteen Dollars, and no more.
