The Hospital has many faithful friends among the men and women of Victoria who hope to be rewarded for years of patient care on its behalf by seeing it stand-fully equipped, with its pr.sision for maternity work and its ward for little cnes-the glory of each citizen who has chosen it to be, not only the living monument of his personal thanksgiving, of his loyal citizenship and of his brotherly love ; but also the perpetua! memorial of that most great and dear Queen and woman whose name remains identified forever with every work of human goodness.

It remains only to ask that Public, whom we know collectively as our perpetual friend, to support the present effort. If. it may seem to some that we ask too much or too often, let it $r_{=}$ remembered that the large band of Hospital Workers who inave waited for years for complete results are only still asking that these may be given them.

It may seem a great deal to ask, but when women have loved and worlsed-slowly, even sometimes, painfully-with one faithful purpose for a long period they gain the assurance that it is not merely " our ' possible but "God's" which " is gained by His world's loving," and they knuw that "God's possible" leaves nothing to be desired!

The work of the Kırmess also will be shared by members of the Auxiliary and the Daughters of Pity, and by ladies and gentlemen not connected with either of the institutions it is intended to assist.
