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
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
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
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





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
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#### THE CHILDREN'S WARD.

#### By the Secretary of the Woman's Auxiliary.

The need of a Children's Ward at the Provincial Royal Jubilee Hospital has long been before the Public, and the Societies interested in the Hospital have held a fund in this behalf for several years. This fund is about complete and the Directors of the Hospital have promised to take the erection of the Ward under immediate consideration.

To assist this project the members of the Woman's Auxiliary and the Daughters of Pity have accepted an offer to take part in this Kirmess, one half of the net proceeds of which is to be devoted towards the furnishings and fittings necessary for the thorough equipment of the Children's Ward when completed.

The Hospital has many faithful friends among the men and women of Victoria who hope to be rewarded for years of patient care on its behalf by seeing it stand—fully equipped, with its provision for maternity work and its ward for little cnes—the glory of each citizen who has chosen it to be, not only the living monument of his personal thanksgiving, of his loyal citizenship and of his brotherly love; but also the perpetua! memorial of that most great and dear Queen and woman whose name remains identified forever with every work of human goodness.

It remains only to ask that Public, whom we know collectively as our perpetual friend, to support the present effort. If, it may seem to some that we ask too much or too often, let it he remembered that the large band of Hospital Workers who have waited for years for complete results are only still asking that these may be given them.

It may seem a great deal to ask, but when women have loved and worked—slowly, even sometimes, painfully—with one faithful purpose for a long period they gain the assurance that it is not merely "our" possible but "God's" which "is gained by His world's loving," and they know that "God's possible" leaves nothing to be desired !

This church, for beauty of architecture and size, ranks among the finest church edifices in Canada. The ladies of the congregation decided to contribute a sum to a special fund intended to reduce the annual charges of the church and also to make a donation, through the Woman's Auxiliary of the Hospital, to the proposed Children's Ward. Infurtherance of these objects they have promoted the Kirmess, the nett proceeds of which will be divided equally between the funds named. The work of the Kirmess also will be shared by members of the Auxiliary and the Daughters of Pity, and by ladies and gentlemen not connected with either of the institutions it is intended to assist.

#### KIRMESS?

The KIRMESS, or Church Fair, derives its name from the old word Kirchmesse, meaning "Church-ale," referring to that portion of the brew given as a tithe to the churches. The word was later used to signify a "gift" and was so applied to any festivity, bazaar or entertainment which gave pleasure to the populace. Still later it was used to designate a soled festival, which expressed by song and dance the joy of man villagers at the completion of a church edifice.

Puritan America, ever ready to organize new charities and preserve the old, has revived and idealized the purest and most graceful features of the festivals of the middle ages and uses its merry-making for the accomplishment of good.
