BUSY WEEK IN STOCK YARDS

Over Four Million Dollars' Worth of Cattle Slaughtered in Chicago in Three Days.

REPRESENT 84,000,000 POUNDS

Biggest Day was Wednesday, When Sixteen Miles of Cars Went Into the Yards.

Chicago, Aug. 9.—Four million dollars worth of cattle in one week!

That is what the commission men and packers at the Union Stock Yards have taken care of this week, and the animals are still coming.

From scorching Kansas, distant Texas and half a score of other states, the farmers are sending their stock Chicago yards, smashing all world's records and putting the stock yard people to the severest test they have experienced.

In stalling, close formation, these cattle would make a procession that would reach for 140 miles.

Standing upon each other's backs, the animals would make a tower of beef at least 70 miles high. If it were possible to mound these creatures over into one heap, they would weigh an annual weighing about 84,000,000 pounds.

This monster would be miles in height, and would reach the top of the Masonic Temple with its tail.

The heaviest of the week was Wednesday. Sixteen miles of cars came into the yards before 3 o'clock on that afternoon.

Nineteen two thousand head of cattle, hogs and sheep were handled before sundown.

Most of them were sold to packers and buyers before they had been in town 24 hours.

The packing houses have been running full time since they were opened up on about 3 o'clock in the afternoon.

Drivers have scarcely had time to take nap, and the railroads have been busy switching engines and cars off to the shippers.

The actual cattle receipts on Wednesday were 23,472. This herd weighed about 28,000,000 pounds on the hoof, and furnished the eating public with about 29,000,000 pounds of beef.

PASSENGER TRAIN SUBMERGED.

Fishing Party Rescue Thirty People by Cutting Holes in Car Roof.

Chicago, Aug. 9.—Advices from Sabine, Texas, state that the southbound Southern Pacific passenger train from Beaumont to Sabine pass, fell thru the bridge over Keith Lake Bayou, seven miles north of that place, yesterday.

The entire train precipitated into the bayou, almost sinking out of sight. Thirty passengers were found, and had it not been for the tug Earnest being anchored nearby with a fishing party aboard they would have perished.

The members of the fishing party and the crew of the tug hastened to the rescue of those in the train and succeeded in getting all the passengers out. Holes were cut thru the roof of the cars.
