

Then prepare your rations so as to give your animal what it needs fully, in the proportion required to obtain the result aimed at, and no more. That is to us perfect doctrine. Only let us say respecting what is called the nutritive ratio, that its fallacy appears to us in the fact that too many theorists mix up the carbohydrates proper with the fat, making no distinction, as if carbohydrates could form fat, and then advise so much of the mixture to so much of albuminoids, say one of the latter to five of the former. In opposition to this fallacy, Jules Crevat has demonstrated that carbohydrates proper, or what he dominates under the general term of sugar, must not be fed in view of producing anything else but heat, or included that part of Her Majesty's dominions.
