T. to have the By-laws amended accordingly, so that no discrepancies may exist.

SEMI-ANNUAL REPORT OF THE G. W. C. T.

MONTREAL, 1st April, 1862.

OFFICERS AND REPRESENTATIVES:

Although our laws do not require me to furnish a report at the semi-annual session of the Grand Temple, I deem it best for the interests of the Order that you should be made acquainted, as far as possible, with the acts of your Executive for the past six months, and the condition and prospects of the Order within this jurisdiction; but I shall be brief. This, our first meeting in Canada East, is convened under favorable auspices, in the City of Montreal—that has so long been the centre of Temperance efforts for Eastern Canada, and where, perhaps, more has been done for Temperance than in any other city in Canada. And I am sure you will all share with me the pleasure I feel in being here among the friends of Temperance and of humanity, “to deliberate on the means best adapted to promote the objects for which we are associated.” May our meeting together prove pleasant and profitable to all, and materially advance the interests of our noble Order, and the cause of Temperance.

I regret to have to reiterate the complaint so often made by my predecessors, that very few of the Deputies have reported—only one having reported according to the form prescribed at the last annual session. But from correspondence with Deputies and other prominent members, I am happy to be able to report the order in a prosperous condition. There are no charges against any of the Temples. Peace and prosperity seems to prevail throughout the entire Order in this Province.

Our financial position, as you will find by the report of the G. W. S., is very encouraging. When we take into consideration the state of the finances at the time he entered upon the duties of his office, and I feel assured you will find that the business of the Grand Temple has been conducted with all possible economy.

At the last session of this Grand Temple, the Executive were instructed to prepare and forward to Parliament, a petition for a Prohibitory Liquor law. A form has been prepared, and will be forwarded immediately. We also thought it advisable, as you are aware, to circulate a petition for general signature throughout the Province. They are in charge of the County Deputies, and I doubt not, will be presented in due time.

The Special Finance Committee, appointed at last session, reported to the Executive in November last the result of their labors. You were made acquainted with it in the last minutes.

At the same meeting of the Executive, business of a painful nature came before us, which received our very careful attention, viz: a charge against the late G. W. S., for violation of obligations by not properly accounting for the funds of the Grand Temple that came into his hands. You will, no doubt, easily perceive that it must be trying to any Executive to deal with a charge of so grave a nature, and that against an old and prominent member of the Grand Temple; but under a deep sense of our duty to the Order, and feeling that the well-being of the I. O. of G. T. in Canada required that their fair name should not be tarnished by so foul a blot as the palliating or cloaking of such conduct, your Executive Committee, as you are aware by the minutes, expelled the late G. W. S. from the Order.

There were also several charges against Champion Temple, No. 174, for violations of the Constitution. These charges were of such a nature, and the action of the Temple in the premises such, that your Executive could do nothing short of declaring the charter forfeited, which was accordingly done.

There has been placed in the hands of the G. W. S. an appeal from Brother Griffith against the action of the Morrill Temple, which appeal will be handed to the proper Committee.

There have been many matters of dispute referred to me for decision, but I have avoided as much as possible giving new decisions, as I have long believed that we have already too many, and as I consider that decisions should, as far as possible, be explanations of existing laws,

rather than annunciation of new ones. I have succeeded in settling most difficulties by giving advice, or referring to existing laws and decisions.

The decisions I have given are as follows:

1. Q.—Does the initiation fee entitle candidates to the quarterly password?

A.—The first quarter's dues should be collected with the initiation fee. When the candidate is initiated, the password must be given.

2. Business must be transacted under the proper head, but the Temple may at any time, by motion, suspend the order of business, and take up any particular head.

3. The fact of an aggrieved member appealing, does not suspend the act of the Temple or Deputy; but the highest decision which has been obtained is binding, until reversed by a still higher authority.

4. A subordinate Temple has no authority to entertain or investigate a charge preferred against a Grand Officer as such.

5. A presiding officer who wilfully destroys papers, or other property, of the Temple or Order, forfeits both his seat and honors.

6. As the Constitution now stands, a member of one Temple cannot legally prefer a charge against a member of another, and a Temple entertaining a charge thus preferred, violates Art. 8, Sec. 3 of the Con. of Sub. Temples.

I regret to call the attention of the Grand Temple to the following irregular proceedings on the part of Temples. It has recently come to my knowledge that some are in the habit of procuring, from private sources, property that ought to be purchased from the G. W. S. I trust this matter will receive your attention.

I also learn that many Temples are very lax in enforcing the prompt payment of quarterly dues. In fact, I have reason to believe that many Temples were in the constant practice of communicating the quarterly password to members that are in arrears, thereby destroying the intention of a quarterly password, and introducing a custom calculated to destroy the financial prosperity of the order; and I am convinced that the decrease of not a few once flourishing Temples may be traced to this cause.

Believing that our interests would be materially advanced by having our principles brought prominently before the public through the Press, I would suggest that you take under your serious consideration the pro-

GRAND WORTHY SECRETARY'S REPORT.

MONTREAL, April 1st, 1862.

To the Grand Worthy Chief Templar, Officers and Representatives, of the Grand Temple of the Independent Order of Good Templars of Canada :

BROTHERS AND SISTERS: As in duty bound, I present you with a report of the statistical and financial condition of the Grand Temple for the past six months. In doing so, I need not remind you that a report from the G. W. S. is a practical, instead of a theoretical report, composed of figures instead of words, and hence is not so apt to interest the majority as more ordinary reports. I shall endeavor to be as concise as possible, and I most respectfully solicit your careful attention to that branch of our work, that should claim the consideration of every member of our order. The financial part of my report will, I trust, be explicit enough to convince you that you stand in a much better condition than you have for some years; and I can assure you that it affords me a great deal of pleasure in being able to report that the old debts against the Grand Temple, have finally been paid, much to the satisfaction of the parties in whose favor they were, and I present you with nearly a clear list, and a much larger amount of cash on hand than you have been able to show for some time. I regret that I am not able to say that I found, on entering upon the duties of my office, the work as easy as I could have wished, on account of the description of books I had to deal with. In reference to the assets of the Grand Temple, I would remark that I have had no easy task in arriving at anything like a correct statement. In a great majority of cases, accounts standing against Temples and individuals have been disputed, they claiming to have paid them to my predeces-

sors. And some to whom I have written in reference to their accounts, have retained a dignified silence; and I am sorry to be compelled to state that they belong to our corps of Deputies. I therefore give you a statement of our Assets as I find them on the books. The correspondence in reference to the Accounts will be placed in the hands of your Finance Committee, who, I trust, will advise some plan to obviate the necessity of reporting amounts, a part of which will never be realized. The liabilities I give, as far as known to me—the books placed in my hands not being very lucid on this subject. You will notice that, under the head of probable liabilities, I note a still further claim of Brothers Donnelley and Barker, against the Grand Temple, for printing, to which I would direct your especial attention. In reference to Brother Donnelley's claim, I would remark that I have not a doubt as to its correctness, although the Books of this office do not recognize the claim. If you refer to the minutes of the G. T., Bowmanville session, you will find the full amount claimed by Brother Donnelley reported among the liabilities of the G. T., having been audited by the Finance Committee. This debt has been standing, to the disgrace of the G. Temple, for years, and it is not just that Brother Donnelley should, after laying out of his money for such a length of time, be a further loser, on account of the negligence of the P. G. W. S. in not entering the proper amount in his books. As to Brother Barker's account, I can only refer you to the Special Finance Committee's report, found in minutes of last session. There is also a claim made on behalf of Mr. Thorne, who held orders against the Grand Temple for printing, and which it is alleged, have not been paid. These orders are in the possession of a gentleman in the city of Hamilton, but I am ignorant of the amount due, he not having informed me, although requested so to do. He claims to have presented them several times to the P. G. W. S. for payment, but always met with the response, "No funds." The other items, under the head of Liabilities, explain themselves.

Having given you a statement of your financial and statistical condition, let us leave the past, and turn our attention to the future. During the next six months a large amount of printed matter will be required, which will necessarily occasion a larger outlay than during the past six months. A supply of Constitutions will be required, as we are nearly out of that article. This will be the greatest expense, and in order to get our work done at the lowest possible rate, we must be prepared to pay cash on the completion of the job. This we cannot do unless Temples are prompt in the transmission of their tax. It is to be hoped that they will bear this in mind, and enable us to meet our engagements promptly. The printing during the past six months has been most economically contracted for—our minutes costing us but a trifle over one half the amount formerly paid. And though you may have thought they were rather long delayed, the difference in the cost, I am convinced, will more than repay for the inconvenience caused by the delay. They would, however, have been sent out sooner, had I been able to place the manuscript in the hands of the printer at an earlier day, and had not some evil-disposed person entered the printing office and abstracted my Annual Report—thus causing me to write another from memory. On this head I would ask you to consider whether it would not be advisable, for the future, instead of having the minutes printed in binding form, as formerly, to have them printed in newspaper form. I admit that they look much better, and are more convenient in pamphlet form, but I much question whether they serve the interests of our cause more in that shape than they would if printed in one sheet. There is not one Temple in ten that ever preserve them, and very many never read them at all; while in point of economy it would be a great saving. I beg to call your especial attention to the large number of Temples that have not made returns to this office for some time, and which will shortly be struck off our list, as having forfeited their Charter. The main cause of the failure on the part of Temples to meet the requirements of the Constitution in this respect, seems to be the loose manner in which they conduct their financial and other business. Being wholly neglected by the Deputy, whose duty it is to visit and encourage them, they give up in despair. In many instances, the Deputy lives at so great a distance, that it is impracticable for him to visit all the Temples under his charge, and hence those the most remote never see him from one year to another. In counties where there are two or more Deputies, the case is just as bad; for, not having their boundaries properly laid out, the one waits for the other, and thus the Temples are neglected. From the number of letters I have received, asking for the appointment of Deputies, I am more than ever convinced of the propriety

of having a Deputy in each Temple. It would obviate a great deal of inconvenience, and be the means of speedily settling difficulties that will arise, which, when not promptly met by a decision, mars and destroys the harmony of the Temple.

In reference to the recommendations of the Special Finance Committee, as seen by their report in the last minutes, they have all been complied with, except the entering to the Dr. of the G. W. S.'s account, "the amount of property Temple purchased for private use." This I considered useless, the amount being entered in expense account. The new accounts have all been opened, and other general accounts, which will show the exact amount for postage, and other expenses. The accounts have all been balanced and closed up to the 18th March, and a balance sheet prepared, which, I trust, will prove satisfactory to the Grand Temple.

In reference to the Books, I think the G. T. would be a gainer to order a new set, and commence anew, not transferring the old balances against Temples and individuals that have been disputed time and again. I can assure you, it is no easy matter to make a pen mark on the folios of the ledger, they have been fingered so often.

In conclusion, let me express the hope that the business of this session may be conducted with promptness, and an eye to our future prosperity. Let there be no disunion sentiments entertained, but all work as a united whole, for by union alone shall we stand. Let our Deputies work more energetically for the future; our Temples pay up promptly; our Grand Temple exercise strict economy; and, with the blessing of our Father in Heaven, we will accomplish much towards freeing our country from the foul stain of intemperance.

Article 1st, Sec. 2, to read as follows:

SEC. 2. Before taking his or her seat, every member shall furnish for the Grand Temple, through the G. W. S., a certificate of rank and good standing in some temple subordinate to this Grand Temple, signed by the W. C. T. and W. S., and bearing date not more than four weeks prior to the meeting of G. T.

ARTICLE II.—SESSION AND REPRESENTATION.

SEC. 1.—The Grand Temple shall hold a Regular Annual Session, commencing on the first Tuesday in November, at 10 o'clock, A. M., and shall continue to meet at the same, or at an earlier hour, from day to day, consecutively, (Sundays excepted) until the close of the session.

SEC. 3.—Every subordinate Temple shall be entitled to one vote for every fifty members, or less, and one for every additional fifty; said Subordinate Temple shall be entitled to elect a Regular and Proxy Representative to cast such votes, who shall be elected annually, at the first meeting in August, to serve one year thereafter; and in case of the regular Representative resigning or neglecting to attend Grand Temple Session, then the Proxy becomes the Regular, entitled to full privileges. A Representative may represent two Temples located in his or her county; such Temples shall pay said Representative's actual expenses, unless the majority object thereto at the time of election; but no Temple can be represented unless the quarterly per-centage has been paid. No one can be elected (or allowed) as a regular Representative, except from the Temple of which he or she is a member.

On the above amendment the vote by Temples was called, and taken with the following result: Yeas, 28; Nays, 9.

The amendment carried.

ARTICLE III.—OFFICERS.

SEC. 1.—The officers of the Grand Temple shall be :

- 1.—Grand Worthy Chief Templar.
- 2.—Grand Worthy Counsellor.
- 3.—Grand Worthy Vice Templar.
- 4.—Grand Worthy Secretary.
- 5.—Grand Worthy Treasurer.
- 6.—Grand Worthy Chaplain.
- 7.—Grand Worthy Marshal.
- 8.—Grand Worthy Deputy Marshal.
- 9.—Grand Worthy Inside Guard.
- 10.—Grand Worthy Outside Guard.

Section 3 of the above Article is struck out. Section 2 is incorporated under Section 1. Sections 4 and 5 remain as before, being numbered respectively Nos. 2 and 3.

ARTICLE IV.—DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

SEC. 1.—The G. W. C. T. shall preside at all the Sessions of the Grand Temple, preserve order therein, and enforce a due observance of the Constitution and By-laws of this Grand Temple. All questions of order, and all decisions made by him, shall be subject to an appeal from his decision to the Grand Temple, and it shall be his duty to put the questions on all such appeals; he may appoint all grand officers, *pro tem.*, and all committees not otherwise provided for; he shall give the casting vote in all cases of a tie, except at the election of officers; he shall order the T. to pay all sums of money voted by the Grand Temple; he may grant Dis-pensations on the application of a Temple, to confer degrees on a member without delay; he shall give such instructions from time to time in the work of the Order, to the Deputies or the Temples, as may be necessary; he may summon any one of the Grand Officers and require from him information respecting his office; he shall personally, or by Deputy, visit each Temple under his jurisdiction, when required so to do.

SEC. 2.—The G. W. Counsellor shall support the G. W. C. T. in presiding, and in his absence shall fill the chair for him; and in the event of a vacancy in the office of G. W. C. T., the Executive shall appoint a suitable person for the balance of the term.

SEC. 3.—The G. W. V. Templar shall assist the G. W. C. T. in conducting the business of the Grand Temple; she shall have special charge of the door, and in the absence of the G. W. C. T. and G. W. C. she shall preside.

SEC. 4.—The Grand Worthy Secretary shall make a just and true record of the proceedings of the Grand Temple at every session, and transmit, as soon as possible after the close of the Annual Session, to the

T., under the seal of the Grand Temple; keep his account in such a manner as will exhibit the sources and amount of receipts, and by whom paid; the purposes and amount of disbursements, and to whom paid; have his account closed up on the first day of the Annual Session in each year, and submit to the Finance Committee, and make a full report to the Grand Temple at the close of his term of office; he shall, previous to his installation, give bonds to the three first named officers, omitting title, in such form and penalty as they shall approve, for the faithful performance of his duties.

SEC. 7.—The Grand Worthy Marshal shall introduce the Grand officers at their installation; new members at their initiation, assisted by the Grand Worthy Deputy Marshal; conduct the processions of the Grand Temple; he shall, at the opening of the Session, see the officers' badges in their proper places, and at the close see that they are collected and put in the possession of the Grand Worthy Secretary.

SEC. 9.—The County Deputy shall be the head of the Order in their respective localities, whose decision shall be final, in all questions pertaining to the working, and Rules of the Order, unless an appeal be made therefrom to the G. T.; they may grant Dispensations to Temples in their counties; organize new Temples within their respective localities, as per Constitution, forwarding the returns at once to the G. W. S.

Time being called, the Grand Temple adjourned to meet again at 9 o'clock A. M., on the 2nd, inst.

Resolved, That the word "October" in the first line of Sec. 10, Art. 4, be expunged, and the word "August" inserted instead thereof; that the word "Degree Templar," occurring in said section, be erased, and the words "Temple Deputy" substituted therefor; and after the words "County Deputy" the following words be added, "and also to decide all matters in dispute, subject to an appeal to the County Deputy."—Carried.

Sec. 10, Art. 4, as amended, reads as follows :

SEC. 10.—At the second meeting (in August) in each year, every Temple shall elect and recommend one from among those eligible to a seat in the Grand Temple, as a Temple Deputy, who shall be appointed by the G. W. C. T. All communications for the Temple shall be addressed to said Deputy, and it shall be his duty to deliver the same immediately (except the pass-word) to the Secretary. It shall also be his duty to confer the Degrees, in accordance with the ritual and usage; exercise a general supervision over the Degree Temple, and install the officers of his Temple, in the absence of the County Deputy; and also to decide all matters in dispute—subject, however, to an appeal to the County Deputy.

Sec. 4, Art. 5, amended to read as follows :

SEC. 4.—Vacancies in the other Grand Offices shall be filled by the Grand Temple, if in session; if not, then by the Executive Committee, and for the term of the former incumbent.

ARTICLE

SEC. 1.—The first five Grand Committee, to act in the recess of the Grand Temple, and perform such duties as may be required of them; to originate laws in all cases of emergency, subject to the sanction of the Grand Temple; to direct the G. W. S. to call meetings at such points within the jurisdiction of the Grand Temple for the best interests of the Order.

SEC. 2.—Act 9, amended, to read as follows :

SEC. 2.—Such revenue shall be expended for the purchase of books, odes, cards, blanks, etc., as may be provided, and any Temple four years in arrears to the Grand Temple party other than the Grand Temple shall be in charge.

SEC. 4.—At each Annual Session, the Grand Temple shall retain, as nearly as possible, what may be received from the Grand Temple for the expenses of the Grand Temple for the year, so estimated shall be assessed upon each member at so much per member. Each member shall forward quarterly returns of November, February, and May, in proportion to the number of members, to the Grand Temple Deputy, or installing officer—as the case may be, and no installing officer shall be appointed until the quarterly returns of the Grand Temple shall be in his hands, and he shall immediately forward the same to the G. W. C. T.

ARTICLE X.

SEC. 1.—On the written application of any person standing in the community, praying to be admitted to the Grand Temple, or Executive Committee, the same, if the majority consider it expedient, shall receive its Charter and the necessary funds, either from the D. G. W. C. T., or one special member.

SEC. 3.—Art. 11 amended to read as follows: before the word Committee, and after the word Grand Temple.

SEC. 6.—Members of a suspended Temple where the Charter has been suspended.

ARTICLE VI.—COMMITTEES.

SEC. 1.—The first five Grand officers shall constitute the Executive Committee, to act in the recess of the Annual Session of the Grand Temple, and perform such duties as may be assigned them; have power to originate laws in all cases of emergency, where there is no constitution to apply; all new decisions, important and official documents, must receive the sanction of the majority of the Committee, before being issued; of said Committee the G. W. C. T. shall be chairman, and he shall direct the G. W. S. to call meetings thereof when business requires, and at such points within the jurisdiction of the Grand Temple as shall seem for the best interests of the Order.

Sec. 2.—Act 9, amended, to read as follows:—

SEC. 2.—Such revenue shall be derived from the Charter fees, the sale of books, odes, cards, blanks, constitutions and assessments hereinafter provided, and any Temple found purchasing such property from any party other than the Grand Worthy Secretary, shall be liable to a charge.

SEC. 4.—At each Annual Session the Finance Committee shall ascertain, as nearly as possible, what amount of money will be necessary in addition to what may be received for Charters, &c., to meet the necessary expenses of the Grand Temple for the current year; and the amount so estimated shall be assessed upon the Subordinate Temples, fixing it at so much per member. Each Subordinate Temple shall, with the quarterly returns of November, February, May, and August of each year, in proportion to the number of members then returned pay to the County Deputy, or installing officer—as the case may be—their quarterly assessment, and no installing officer shall communicate the Pass-word for the quarter until the quarterly returns, and the percentage of the Grand Temple shall be in his hands, and the Installing Officer shall immediately forward the same to the G. W. S.

ARTICLE X.—CHAPTERS, ETC.

SEC. 1.—On the written applications of twelve or more persons, of good standing in the community, praying for a charter to open a Temple, the Grand Temple, or Executive Committee during the recess, may grant the same, if the majority consider it expedient; and such Temple shall receive its Charter and the necessary instructions from the G. W. C. T., or the D. G. W. C. T., or one specially deputed.

SEC. 3.—Art. 11 amended by striking out the word "Standing" before the word Committee, and inserting the word "Executive."

CONSTITUTION OF SUBORDINATE TEMPLES OF CANADA:

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

Amended by striking out the words "hailed and entitled" and inserting "known as."

Sec. 2, Art. 3, amended by striking out all the words enclosed in the brackets. The new section reads as follows:

SEC. 2.—The name and residence of a person offered for membership must be printed, or in writing, and the proposition made by a member of the Temple, with two references, which must be entered on the records, and the subject referred to three members for investigation, two of them shall be appointed by the W. C. T., and the third by the W. V. T., who shall report in writing, at the next regular meeting. All candidates must be balloted for with ball ballots, and if not more than four black balls appear against him or her, he or

*All members who are re-instated for violation of Articles II, must be re-obligated and re-sign the Constitution.

she shall be declared elected; but if more than four black balls appear, or if all the votes cast be black, he or she shall be rejected, and so declared. No person so rejected shall be again proposed or initiated in any Temple of the Order, under three months, unless by dispensation of the G. W. C. T., or his Deputy, at the request of the Temple.

Sec. 3 of this Article is expunged.

Sec. 4, amended by striking out the words "the Order," in first line, and inserting the words "another Temple."

ARTICLE IV.—FEES AND DUES.

SEC. 1.—The Initiation Fee of this Temple shall not be less than fifty cents for each male, and twenty-five cents for each female person initiated, payable in advance. Each Temple shall regulate their weekly dues so as to meet their expenditure, the dues paid quarterly, in advance.

Sec. 1, Art. 5, amended by striking out the words "Degree Templar" in last line, and inserting the word "Deputy."

The following report, from the Committee on the State of the Order, was then read :

MONTREAL, 2nd April, 1862.

To the G. W. C. T., Officers and Representatives :

We, your Committee on the State of the Order, beg leave to report as follows :

That the City of Montreal occupies an honorable position in the Temperance Cause for the early and indefatigable efforts of many of its leading citizens to promote the grand object at which it aims. It is an aus-

pieious day for the history of the I. O. G. T. in Canada, that the present session is held in this enterprising and prosperous city; and we hope the Temples in the Eastern part of Canada will be encouraged to push forward the interests and principles of our noble Order in this part of the Province.

The peace and prosperity of our Order is a most gratifying fact; and scarcely less so, is the improved financial position of this Grand Temple, furnishing good ground to believe that the capitation tax will be reduced at the next session—a matter of some importance to many of the Subordinate Temples.

We earnestly trust that our cherished hopes on Prohibition will soon be realized, and recommend that attention be given to having the matter properly brought before the House. In connection with this subject, we cordially approve the suggestions referring to the establishment of a Reformatory Home for Inebriates; and recommend the appointment of a Special Committee to report a petition to our Provincial Parliament, to be presented in conjunction with the S. of T.

With a view to sustain the revenue of this G. T., it is desirable that Sub. Temples should get their requisites from G. W. S., and that the tax should be paid promptly, so that all work done for the G. T. may be paid in cash.

We approve the decisions of G. W. C. T., and his diligence in answering questions and adjusting disputes which have arisen—no doubt requiring much wisdom and discretion.

We recommend the appointment of a Special Committee, to report a code of Laws for Degree Temples, to be submitted at the Annual Session.

We do not think it advisable that any steps should be taken to establish a newspaper organ for our order, but reiterate former recommendations for the extended circulation of the *Canada Temperance Advocate*.

We repeat what has been said often before, that the more thoroughly our Constitution and By-laws are acted up to, the more likely are we to prosper; and are sorry to believe that members would claim to enjoy privileges on any other than Constitutional grounds.

We would make special reference to the very excellent manner in which the Grand Worthy Secretary's books are kept, affording as they do every facility to enable your Committee to ascertain and report the real financial state of the Order.

In consequence of the very irregular manner in which the books of the Grand Temple were kept by P. G. W. Secretary, and the number of accounts in the books of doubtful collection, and others disputed, we recommend these accounts to be charged back to stock account, and thereby enable the G. W. Secretary to present in future a correct report of our actual assets, as these doubtful accounts continually recurring in his reports have a tendency to mislead in regard to the available assets of the Grand Temple.

To enable the G. W. S. to make out a new stock account, we recommend that he instruct all the Deputies to return to him all property in their hands, belonging to the Grand Temple, without delay.

In regard to the suggestions of the Grand Temple submitted to the consideration of your Committee, as to the propriety of printing the Constitution of the R. W. G. Lodge, along with the Constitution and By-laws of this Grand Temple, we recommend that, owing to the great additional expense it would incur, the G. W. S. be instructed to communicate with the R. W. G. Lodge, in order to obtain a sufficient quantity to supply orders that he may receive therefor,—the same to be furnished Temples or Deputies at the lowest possible prices.

Your Committee have great satisfaction in observing by the correspondence between the R. W. G. Lodge and our G. W. S., that the account in dispute is satisfactorily arranged, and we are now clear on their books.

On examining the correspondence from several Grand Lodges in the United States, we find that a good deal of the property of this Grand Temple is still in their hands unsold, and therefore recommend our G. W. S. to be instructed to make the best possible arrangement with them, to avoid the costs and charges of returning the same.

In regard to the alleged balance of account of Brother Donnelley for printing, your Committee having examined all the circumstances connected with the case, feel satisfied that his equitable claims have been fully paid by this Grand Temple, and therefore recommend that no further payments be made thereon.

Your Committee are equally satisfied that the account of Brother Barker has been fully paid, and recommend that no further payment be made on account thereof.

To the Honorable Members of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, in Parliament Assembled:

The Petition of the Grand Temple of the Independent Order of Good Templars of Canada, humbly sheweth:

That there exists in our country a large number of Inebriates, who have a strong desire to reform their habits of dissipation—by which they and their families are suffering;—but while they are desirous of reform, do not wish compulsory means to be resorted to for that purpose.

Your Petitioners humbly submit, that an asylum for Inebriates should be established, and receive the countenance and support of your Honorable body, inasmuch as the License system furnishes numerous and strong inducements to an indulgence in the use of intoxicating drinks, which lays the foundation for the appetite of the drunkard. That where this

appetite is formed, it is difficult to curb or restrain it while in the company of drinking associates; but were the victims of this system afforded a suitable place and opportunity to receive medical treatment, and the use of such moral appliances as would strengthen their laudable desire and resolution to reform, we might reasonably hope that a vast number would be saved to their families and the community; while to themselves, personally, would be restored the happiness of former years.

We have learned, with pleasure, the satisfactory results of an Institution of this character in the adjoining Republic, through whose instrumentality four-fifths of the inmates were hopefully recovered, and are now sober men.

We respectfully solicit your Honorable House to take this matter into consideration, and give the friends of Temperance that encouragement which every lover of his race will approve.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.




