There have been about 13,000 casualties so thaf there are still 67,000 fighting men In England and France, <br> Thie makes two army divisions. <br> There are nearly 65,000 men in training at the present time at the various camps In Canada. <br> There is a proposal under consideration by the militia authorities to ereate four Canadian army divisions, two to be at the front and two to continue In training in England and to act as reinforcements for the two in the fighting line. The present method of sending reinforcements from Canadia has been found disadvantageous, chiefly owing to the complete units, and this will be easler of accomplishment when the reserve troops are In England. |
