Sections 2, 3 and 4 are repealed and replaced by the following:

4. All Salmon nets shall have the name of the owner or owners legibly marked, on two pieces of wood or netal attached to the same, and such mark shall be preserved on such nets daring the fishing season in such manner as to be visible without taking up the net or net; and any net used without such mark shall be liable to forfeiture.
