

MAY BE OVERRULED

Opposition To Reduction of Heavy Penalty a Surprise.

Manager E. V. Buchanan of the public utilities commission is strongly opposed to rebating the double service charge of \$2 every two months to water consumers outside the city

At its last meeting, in response to a protest made by J. F. Thomson and Chas, Jolly, claiming to represent the Chas. Jolly, claiming to represent the London and Westminster township councils, Highland and Manor park residents, London trades and labor council, London Labor party and the city council the commission promised to consider the question of rebating the service charge for outsider consumers to \$1 on the bi-monthly bill, and referred the matter to the attention of the manager for a recommention of the manager for a recommendation, hoping, it seemed at the time, that he would recommend that the service charge be cut in half, as re-

Now, however, Mr. Buchanan de clares his opposition to the reduction as a matter of principle and policy. rather than equity," and intimates that if the commission desires, or has made up its mind, to make any rebate in the double charge, the change will be made on the commission's own responsibility, not upon any recommendation he may make.

A Matter of Policy.

"If the commission wants to place the outside consumer on the same basis as the consumer within the city limits, that of water at cost," served Mr. Buchanan, "then it becomes a matter of policy, and in such event it, of course, could not be equitable to double the service charge for those consumers who are beyond the city limits."

"As the double service charge to outside consumers stands at present. concluded Mr. Buchanan, "it is at least relatively equitable."

A Serious Division. Developments within the commission on the problem will be watched with interest, since, should Mr. Buchanan adhere to his stand and the vice charge to outside consumers, it will be the first occasion for years past that the commission has been even seriously divided among its members, aside from the commission members, aside from the commission over-riding the judgment and recommission nendation of its general manager.

CITY MAY NOW SPEND \$174,000

Electrical and Waterworks Extensions Made Possible This Year.

Official sanction has been received from the Ontario railway and municipal board by the public utilities commission for the issuing of

\$174,000 debentures. Extensions and improvements of \$75,000 to the electrical system and of \$99,000 to the water works system, which have been planned by the local commission are thus made pos-

sible this year.

The railway board's approval will permit of immediate construction of a 12-inch water main on Grosvenor street, which is being installed chiefly to provide adequate fire protection for St. Joseph's hospital, as well as

station No. 8 Richmond and Ann station No. 8 Richmond and Ann streets, thereby completing the ring main system as a prevention against interruptions, which might have occurred had the service wires been placed on poles on the streets instead of in underground cables.

For waterworks construction the commission first secured the approval of the local board of health, while the electrical constructions plans were first approved by the hydro-electric power commission of Ontario. The plans for both departments were then submitted to the city council, which passed bylaws approving of which passed bylaws approving them. Now comes the sanction of the railway board to the next twelve works and electrical departments.





Engineer's Department Using 200,000 Gallons This Year.

Increased attention to the conditio of the surfaces of unpaved streets in the city will not only make such streets much better thoroughfares, but will enable the city to oil a greater proportion of them each year, s the theory of W. P. Near, city engineer, whose department is daily brought into close touch with city road problems.

"We are using just about the same amount of oil this year as in former years," he states. "We use as a general rule about 200,000 gallons a year, and the miléage oiled does not vary greatly. Some streets are paved during a season and of course, these and the mileage olied does greatly. Some streets are paved durging a season, and, of course, these are not oiled, but we then oil some other unpaved section not previously attended to. In this way the oiling service is being gradually extended. "We have done a lot of work lately in scarifying and building up thin into a smooth surface many of our line a smooth surface many of o into a smooth surface many of our unpaved street, which, to tell the truth, are in bad condition in many instances. The building up of a proper crown on these roadways and the elimination of holes and depres-sions into which oil flows and creates objectionable puddles will go a long way towards economy in the use of oil, and will also make the work far less messy. We hope to do something in this line each year, until all the unpaved streets are in satisfactory condition."





Canadian Press Despatch. Toronto, June 10 .- Seven hundred housand strong, Methodists, Presbyterians and Congregationalists today marched into the United Church of Canada and demonstrated their unity in three sessions of devotion

and addresses, each of them attended

by between 7,000 and 8,000 persons. "This has been the greatest day in the hitsory of Canada, and in some respects, of the Christian world," said Rev. James Endicott, secretary for foreign missions of the Methodist church, in addressing the gathering this afternoon. The speakers were Dr. Endicott, Rev. Dr. D. L. Ritchie, principal of the Congregational college, at Montreal, and Rev. Dr. Clarence Mackinnon, ex-moderator of the

Presbyterian Church in Canada. Greetings from religious bodies in all parts of the English-speaking world were presented tonight. Some of them were presented verbally by special delegates, and others were in the form of messages read to the gathering. From all sides best wishes for the success of the church as a religious factor and the hope that it would be a profound influence on Canadian life were expressed.

Complete Dedication.

### **All Churches May Carry** Old Names Into the Union

Toronto, June 10.—Congregations of the uniting congregations may retain their local names—such as Metropolitan Methodist church, Bloor street Presbyterian and Bond street Congregational—in the opinion of the legal committee, of which N. W. Rowell, K.C., is chairman, which

"Your committee," says the report, "is of the opinion that local churches have the right to retain their existing names if they desire to do so. Your committee expresses no opinion on the question of policy involved in the continued use of such local names.'

Four London churches, representative of the three denominations which have formed the United church of Canada, have already changed their names. They are as follows: First Presbyterian to First Presbyterian, United church of Canada, London; Askin street Methodist to Wesley United church of Canada; Southern Congregational to Pilgrim United church of Canada, and First Methodist to Metropolitan United church of Canada, London. Numerous other changes are pending.

The call for unity transcended not of mind if he prayed for divisions. The call for unity transcended not merely denominationalism, but nationalism. If it were right for Knox to organize his church for the sake of Scotland, it could not be wrong for them today to organize the United church for the sake of Canada, but at the same time he wished to point out the danger of over-emphasis in nationalism.

Creeds Transcended.

"Today we have transcended the creeds," continued Dr. Endicott, How-ever good the old Westminster conever good the old Westminster confession might have been, for instance, it was better today in the basis of union than ever before. They had not taken out a single thing which ought to be in. If they had to choose between the past and the future they always would choose the future. Their fathers were not a bit more important than their children.

"We have made a great beginning, but no more," concluded the speaker. "Let us see that the principles which brought us together shall keep us together and make this movement triumphant to the ends of the earth."



Dr. Wilkie, missionary in China, who has announced him-self as remaining Presbyterian, and who is at the congress, reported to-night that 44 foreign missionaries had declared their intention of remaining Presbyterian. There are ten foreign missionaries attending the congress including two Chinese missionaries who work among their own people in


