

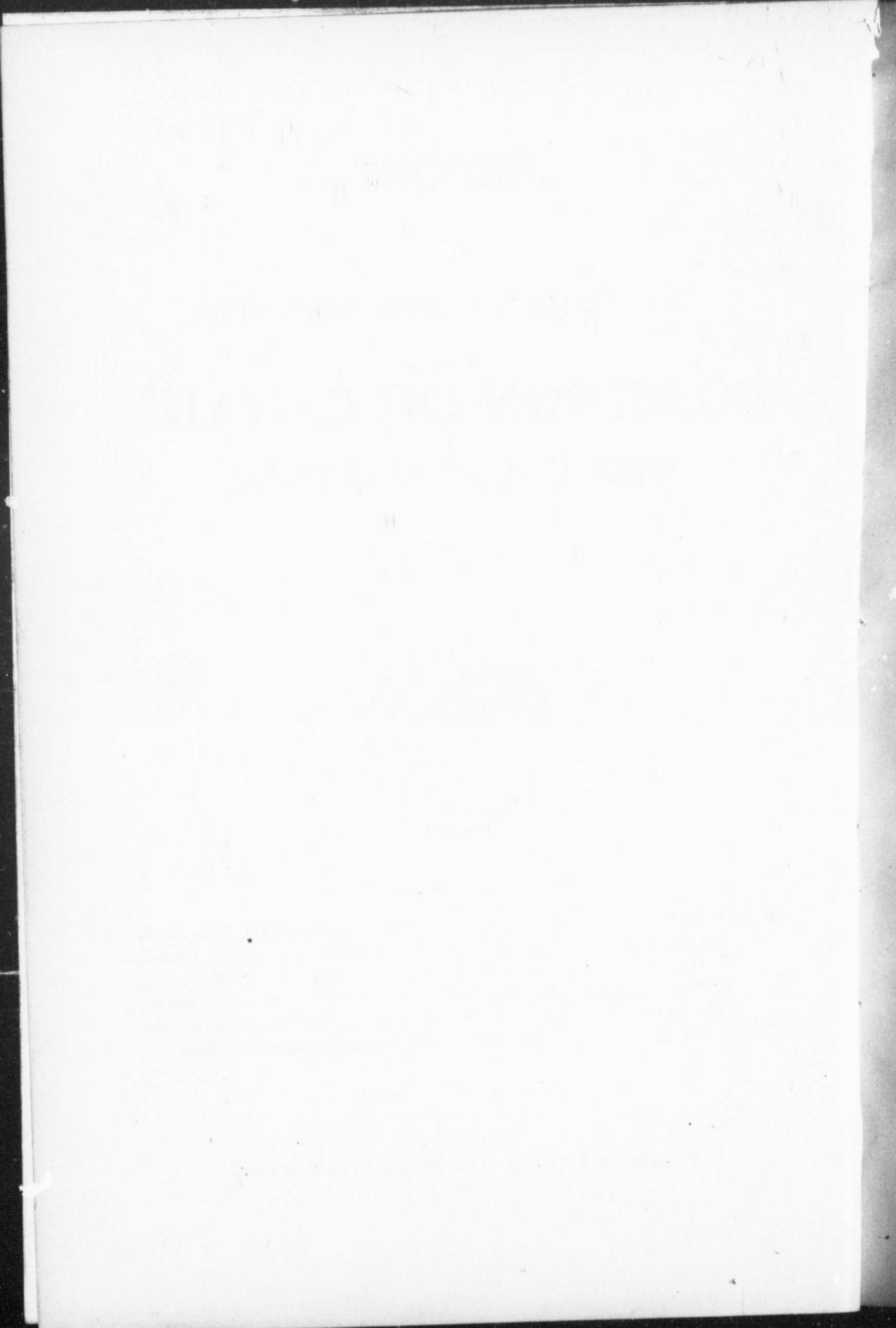

REPORT OF
MAJOR J. J. MASON, 13TH BATTALION, HAMILTON,
Commanding the Bisley Team for 1897.

HAMILTON, January, 1898.

To Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. M. Gibson,
President Dominion Rifle Association.

SIR,—As Commanding Officer of the Bisley Team for 1897, I beg to submit the following report:—

The members of the team, in accordance with the instructions that had been issued, reported at the Queen's Hotel on the morning of Friday, the 18th of June, and, with the kind permission of Lt.-Colonel Starke, at the Armoury of the Victoria Rifles at 11 o'clock on the same day. Fourteen members were present. By permission previously given, Captain Davidson and Lieut. Davidson joined the team at Quebec, Lieut. Kinnear and Trooper Langstroth at Rimouski, and Lieut. King and Sergt. Blair at Staines. The inspection was satisfactory in every respect, and instructive and complimentary addresses were made by Lt.-Colonel Tilton and the Rev. Dr. Barclay. We went on board the S.S. "Parisian" that evening, and were entertained most pleasantly by the officers of the Montreal corps, the band of the 3rd Victoria Rifles, and the pipers of the 5th Royal Scots. Notwithstanding that a heavy rainstorm prevailed, a large number of the members of the Quebec regiments were on hand on the morning of the 20th of June, just before our departure from Quebec, to wish us a happy voyage and unlimited success.

The steamer's accommodation was taxed to the utmost, but we had no complaint to make in respect of the berths assigned to us, or the accommodation generally. On account of experiencing somewhat rough weather shortly after starting, though it became finer towards the end of our voyage, the passage was longer than usual, and we did not reach Liverpool until the morning of Tuesday, the 29th of June.

Amongst the passengers was Sir Charles Tupper, G.C.M.G., C.B., who was kind enough to ask me to present him to the members of the team, and who, in a few kindly words wished them every success.

We were not detained many minutes at Liverpool, the Customs officers using every effort to expedite our departure, and through the kindness of the officials of the London & Northwestern Railway, who placed special carriages at our disposal, as they had also done in 1896, we reached Staines that afternoon without changing cars.

There we were joined by Lieut. King and Sergt. Blair, who had been doing some fine shooting at the Scottish meeting at Darnley.

I had intended, if possible, to quarter the whole of the team at one hotel in Staines, but this I found to be impracticable, and the arrangement made by Lt.-Col. Starke in 1896 was repeated, one half of the team staying at the "Angel and Crown" and the other at the "Pack Horse," the accommodation provided being in every way satisfactory.

I am also glad to endorse the remarks of Lt.-Colonel Starke with respect to the suitability of the Runemedes Ranges for team practice. The situation and direction of the range, the target accommodation, and the establishment on the ground of an excellent pavilion, all combine to make this a model practice ground.

In view of the fact that the members of the team had to shoot with a rifle of a new pattern, and one that had only been recently issued to them, the extension of the time for practice at Runemedes was of the greatest possible value, and fully justified the increased expenditure. The members of the team by degrees became more proficient with the new weapon, and the opportunities for more than the usual practice contributed largely to their success in the various competitions at Bisley.

A match had been arranged for us by Mr. G. Mortimer, the efficient Secretary of the Metropolitan Range Company, between twenty Canadians and a picked team of twenty from the London Scottish, the match resulting in our favor by thirty-two points. The excellent scores made by the team in the latter days of their practice at Staines, and in the match referred to, were ample evidence that they would do good work at Bisley.

On Saturday afternoon, the 10th of July, we left for Bisley. Arriving at our quarters on the evening of a beautiful English summer day, we were met by Major Perley, who gave us a hearty welcome. I saw at once that the work which he had undertaken, surrounded and hampered as it was with difficulties that do not obtain here, had been too much for his physical strength, and that he should not do any further work, though mentally he was as clear and bright as ever.

The building was not complete, nor was there any prospect of its being finished for some weeks, but Major Perley had, with kindly forethought, planned out his work in order that, notwithstanding the unfinished state of the building, the accommodation for the members of the team should be as perfect as was possible under the circumstances. With the consent of Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. M. Gibson, President of the Association, who fortunately happened to be with us, I relieved Major Perley from the superintendence of the work and took charge of it, in order that, first of all, as little interference as possible should be made with respect to the comfort of the members of the team, and, secondly, that visitors should have some opportunity of knowing what the general appearance of the building, both outside and inside, would be when it was completed.

It is erected on the site of the old camp ground occupied by the Canadians since the removal from Wimbledon, is near the entrance to the grounds,

occupies a commanding position, is visible for miles from the London & North-western Railway, and is the largest and most commodious of the kind on the Bisley Common. In fact, it was usually designated as the "Canadian Palace."

It is possible it may be considered too large for the requirements of the Canadian team, but it is admirably adapted in every way for their comfort and convenience, is a credit to Canada, and received the unqualified admiration of all our visitors, and now that it is finished, though only partly furnished, thoroughly represents Canadian wood, Canadian furniture and Canadian exhibits.

The donations of furniture and furnishings, though numerous and valuable, were not sufficient to fully supply the requirements of the building, and, unfortunately, a considerable portion did not arrive until we had occupied our quarters for some days, in consequence of which I was obliged to obtain from "T. White Co." of Aldershot, a considerable quantity of absolutely necessary articles. Through the kind offices of Messrs. Thos. Meadows & Co., shipping agents in London, the London & Southwestern Railway Co. forwarded, without charge, to Bisley all the materials and furnishings in connection with the building, a saving of seventy-five dollars being effected thereby.

Acting upon the suggestion of my predecessor, I made a contract with Mr. Paget, the camp caterer, to provide everything in connection with the messing of the team, and taking into consideration the fact that there is a difficulty in obtaining supplies at Bisley at short notice, and that the contractor had contracts in all parts of the camp, I have no reason to complain of the manner in which he carried out his agreement with us.

The meeting opened with perfect weather and under conditions most favorable for high scoring, and continued so, with only one interruption, during the entire fortnight. The favorable weather and perfect accuracy of the new rifle enabled the competitors to break all previous records; and, as the Canadians had had comparatively little experience with the new weapon, they are under the circumstances all the more to be complimented on the success they achieved during the meeting.

It is true that they did not win the Kolapore Cups, but there were no fewer than ten team entries in this match, and the successful team had been practising steadily at Bisley for some weeks before the Canadians arrived in England. I have no reason at all to be dissatisfied with the scores made by the Canadian representatives in this match, but the Victorian team, with a record average of 94 per man, were fully entitled to the victory, and were heartily congratulated by the Mother Country and Colonial teams.

Notwithstanding the fact that in the matches open to Colonials alone there were no fewer than one hundred entries, we managed to carry off a very fair share of the prizes, including the Gold and Bronze Medals in the "Imperial," which were won respectively by Corporal Windatt, of the 10th, and Gunner Miller, of the B. C. Artillery, and finished the meeting by securing nine places in the second stage of the "Queen's" and placing near the top of the list, in the third and last stage, four of our representatives. Lieut. W. L. Ross, of the

13th, finished fourth, breaking the record at 800 and 900 yards, with 92 points; whilst Corporal Kerr, of the 48th, and Captain White, of the 14th, were close behind him, and Sergeant Blair, of the 78th, was well up in the list. The prize of "The Secretary of State for War" was won by Private Swaine, who made 49 out of 50 at 800 yards, and the first prize in the "Duke of Cambridge" competition was won by Corporal Windatt, with 47 out of 50 at 900 yards.

We had four men in the second stage of the "St. George's," two of whom—Lieutenant Kinnear and Sergeant Drysdale—captured badges. We also had seven men in the "Imperial," first stage, and five in the final, in addition to four places in the "Prince of Wales" and ten in the "Association."

I regret that the "Mackinnon" match proved to be a regular fiasco. The conditions of the match were:—ten men, five volleys, one of which would be interrupted, at 500 yards; position, kneeling in single rank. At first there was some misunderstanding with regard to the sights, in consequence of which the Scotch team withdrew from the competition, leaving the English team as our only competitors. Captain Davidson, who was in charge of our team, was handed a slip of paper containing a sequence of the targets at which our team were to fire. These numbers were one to six, but when the targets appeared, instead of being one to six, they were thirty-two to thirty-seven. Captain Davidson saw at once that this would be very confusing, but there was no time to protest, as the five volleys had to be fired within one minute. Just as our third volley had been fired, an officer of the Association stopped Captain Davidson, telling him that he had not followed the proper sequence in the targets. The result was that, through the delay that ensued, our team lost one volley, the targets having disappeared before the volley could be fired. The loss of that volley lost us the Cup. The occurrence was a most unfortunate one, but I do not attach any blame whatever to Captain Davidson.

To give some idea of the wonderful shooting that was made generally throughout the meeting, I may mention that in several matches more "possibles" were made than prizes given, while 34's were "as plenty as blackberries." Twelve "possibles" were made by members of our team in single range matches, though they were unfortunate in tie shooting, and some eight or ten more in competitions which included two or more ranges.

On Monday, the 19th of July, we had the honor of a visit from H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught, commanding the Aldershot District, attended by Major Frend, the District Instructor of Musketry, and Captain Yarde-Buller, A.D.C. After a thorough inspection of every portion of the building, His Royal Highness expressed himself as being much pleased with the building and everything connected with it, said that he would be glad to be a member of the team that had such commodious and comfortable quarters—that it was a credit to Canada.

On Thursday, the 22nd of July, the Canadian "At Home" was held under the joint auspices of Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. M. Gibson, President of the D.R.A., and myself. The weather was perfect, and between four and five hundred visitors were present.

The opportunity of the "At Home" was taken advantage of to present the address to Sir Henry Fletcher, Chairman of the Council of the National Rifle Association, which had been adopted by the Council of the Dominion Rifle Association in May last. Sir Henry Fletcher briefly but earnestly responded to the address, making, in the course of his remarks, a touching reference to the late Major Perley, with whom he had had many conferences, and to whom he had become very much attached. Sir Henry also paid a graceful compliment to the Canadian Team, whose members, he said, each year were among the most welcome arrivals at Bisley.

Lt.-Colonel Gibson expressed the pleasure it afforded him to see the High Commissioner for Canada present, and after bearing a high testimony to his personal interest in the welfare of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, and the efficient services he had rendered to Canada, said that he was sure those assembled would be glad to have a few remarks from him. Lord Strathcona, in reply, said: "That he was sure it afforded them all much pleasure to meet at Bisley under such happy circumstances. He, and he was sure the visitors, felt proud of what had been accomplished by Canadian Teams in the past; that two years ago the Queen's prize, the highest and most valued of all, had been carried off by a member of the Canadian team, and that on several occasions the Kolapore Cups had been taken in triumph to Canada. He regretted, of course, that it was not won this year, but the Canadian competitors were not jealous; on the contrary, they were pleased that the victors in the contest (the Victoria team) were representatives of a far distant Colony of the Empire, whom they were pleased to meet in friendly rivalry on Bisley Common.

"The coming of teams from other Colonies besides Canada widened the competition for this prize, and consequently increased the interest in it. They had acquitted themselves most creditably during the late Jubilee celebrations, and as subjects of a common Sovereign, they could all rejoice in the victory of the Victorians. He then referred to the Canadian success in the Artillery competition at Shoeburyness last year, where the team had reflected the highest credit on the Dominion. In all these contests there was nothing but the most friendly emulation, and it was gratifying to find prizes going to all parts of the Empire. During the Jubilee proceedings, the visiting soldiers of the Queen had been the recipients of marked attention. Indeed, it could not be otherwise, for, although they came from various countries, widely separated, they were all one people as subjects of the Queen. Speaking for Canada, and he was sure he equally echoed the sentiments of other Colonies, he could repeat a declaration of loyalty and devotion to the Queen and to the Empire which was one with the feelings of their fellow-subjects in the United Kingdom. While much had been said about the loyalty of the Colonies, it was really not one whit more necessary to declare it than it was on the part of their friends and relations of the Mother Country. All considered themselves equally Englishmen, and were equally devoted to the maintenance of the British Empire in its entirety. It was his pleasing duty to present to the Commandant of this year's team, Major Mason, the Cup presented by the Canadian Club, and another, presented by himself—as was done last

year. He was sure it was gratifying to those whom he saw around him to know that they had with them on that occasion Colonel Gibson, President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association. The Association had been fortunate from its inception in having gentlemen at its head who had the confidence and esteem of the Volunteer Forces of the country, and who took a warm interest in its welfare and in the rifle matches which annually took place under its auspices. Foremost among them was Colonel Gibson."

The band of the 2nd King's Regiment, Liverpool, by the kind permission of the Officer Commanding, rendered an excellent programme of music on the lawn in front of the building during the afternoon.

The Canadian Club Cup was won by Lieut. Davidson of Quebec, and the High Commissioner's Cup by Capt. White, of Kingston.

In addition to the cups already referred to, I had the pleasure of receiving from Lord Mount-Stephen a cheque for £50 for competition amongst the members of the team.

The death of Major Perley, though to a certain extent expected, cast a deep gloom over the whole camp, but more especially over the Canadian quarters. The sad news was conveyed to us just as we were commencing the Kolapore Match. I at once cabled the fact to Lt.-Colonel Hodgins, Secretary of the D. R. A., and received a reply from Lt.-Colonel Tilton, expressing the deep grief and sympathy of the late Major Perley's Ottawa friends. The flag over the Canadian building was at once lowered to half-mast, and this was immediately followed by the lowering of every flag on the Common. Sir Henry Fletcher and Lt.-Colonel F. Lorn Campbell, Commandant of the Camp, shortly afterwards called upon me and expressed their deep sympathy with us in our loss. Lt.-Colonel Campbell said that he had received authority from Aldershot for a military funeral; that a gun carriage would be sent from there; that Capt. Pillian, of the 2nd Battalion Queen's Royal West Surrey Regiment, would furnish a funeral party of officers and fifty men; and that the band of the 1st South Staffordshire Regiment would attend. All the arrangements for the funeral were included in the camp orders of the 17th of July, which were carried out with perfect precision and accuracy. The funeral, which was very largely attended, took place on the afternoon of Sunday, the 18th of July. Amongst those in attendance were, Sir Henry Fletcher, Chairman of the Council of the N.R.A., in the uniform of a Brigadier General; Colonel Templeton and Lt.-Colonel Kelly, of the Victorias; Lt.-Colonel the Hon. J. M. Gibson, President of the D.R.A.; Major Wrothesley, representing the Engineers Staff at Aldershot; Colonel Mackinnon, Secretary of the N.R.A.; a number of prominent Regular and Volunteer Officers, and several members of the N.R.A. Council. The funeral procession started from the Lodge adjacent to the Shaftesbury Boys' Home, where Major Perley had died, and where he had had the constant and loving care of Mrs. Perley during his illness, and proceeded to the quaint old Bisley Church, which he had regularly attended, the pall-bearers being Major Hamilton, of Queensland; Major Somerville, of New Zealand; Major Woodhead, of Cape

Colony; Major Henderson, of the 48th Highlanders; Major Dunbar and myself. The impressive burial service of the Church of England was said in the church and at the grave by the rector, after which three volleys were fired, the grave was filled, and all that was mortal of our late friend and comrade was left to rest in that old and romantic churchyard.

A few days afterwards, at a meeting of the Council of the N.R.A., a resolution was unanimously passed, expressing their sympathy with Lt.-Colonel Gibson and the members of the Dominion Rifle Association in the loss they had sustained in the death of Major Perley.

Every possible kindness and service was extended to us by Sir Henry Fletcher, Chairman of the Council; by Colonel Mackinnon, the Secretary; by Captain Matthews, who had charge of the squadding arrangements; Mr. Martin, the statistical officer; Mr. Rooke, the accountant; Captain Hoey, the clerk of the works, and by members of the Council generally. I have also to thank Lt.-Colonel F. Lorn Campbell and his staff for many courtesies extended to us, and Mr. Colmer, of the Canadian Office, London, as of old, gave assistance in many ways.

I readily acceded to the request of Major Henderson, of the 48th Highlanders; Lieut. J. Duff Stuart, of the British Columbia Regiment of Artillery; Private K. Matthews, of the 3rd Victorias, and Private J. H. Simpson, of the 10th, who had personally made entries in the matches, to share our quarters with us.

Having noticed in the press that Jubilee medals had been awarded to the members of certain of the Colonial teams, I wrote to the High Commissioner, asking him to use his kind offices in endeavoring to obtain medals for the members of our team. The High Commissioner used his best endeavors to secure a favorable answer to my request, but unfortunately without avail. The reasons for the non-compliance with my appeal are set forth in the following letter from the Colonial Office:

“ COLONIAL OFFICE, Downing Street, Sept. 3rd, 1897.

“ SIR:—I am directed by the Secretary of State for the Colonies to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 14th of August, respecting the desire of the officers and members of the Canadian Rifle Team which has been sent over this year to compete at Bisley, to be allowed to participate in the distribution of Jubilee Medals.

I am to point out that the Jubilee Medal was granted to members of the Victoria, Queensland, and Cape Rifle Teams on the ground that those teams formed part of the detachments selected to attend the Jubilee celebrations, and the orders issued in those Colonies for the detachments to proceed to England support that view.

The position of the Canadian Rifle Team was different, as is clear from the terms of the Militia General Order dealing with the selection of the Jubilee detachment, which did not admit of the inclusion of the Bisley Team, and in these circumstances, the Secretary of State can only regret that Major Mason's request cannot be complied with.

With the exception of myself, all the members of the team left camp on the afternoon of the 25th of July, but before leaving, through Captain Davidson, they expressed to Major Dunbar and myself their acknowledgements of the general satisfaction which had prevailed with regard to the management of the team, and to the happy relations which had existed between themselves and the two Officers in command.

I was obliged to remain sole occupant of the building until the following Thursday, in order that, with the kind assistance of Colonel Mackinnon, arrangements could be made to complete the work of construction, and to arrange for the employment of a suitable caretaker; it having been found—after conferring with Colonel Gibson and Colonel Mackinnon—undesirable, even if practicable, to make any other arrangement with regard to its being properly looked after.

I was very fortunate in having Major Dunbar as my Adjutant. The zealous and efficient manner in which he discharged his duties, and the genial and courteous way in which they were discharged, made his services to me and to the members of the team most valuable and pleasant. His work throughout the entire trip was done both thoroughly and satisfactorily.

The appearance and conduct of the members of the team were everything that could be desired, from the day that we embarked at Montreal up to the day that we disbanded at Bisley. Perfect harmony and good-fellowship existed amongst themselves, and between them and the Officers of the team; and my only regret is that the cares and duties unexpectedly thrown upon me in continuing the work which the late Major Perley had so nearly completed, prevented my being with the members of the team as much as I would have desired.

I enclose general and detailed statements of expenditure, with the necessary vouchers and the usual tabulated statements.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

The Council have the honor to submit their thirtieth annual report of the proceedings of the Association, and, in doing so, have much pleasure in congratulating the members upon a fairly successful year.

The best thanks of the Association are due to His Excellency, Lord Aberdeen, Governor General of the Dominion, for the interest he has taken in the welfare of the Association during his term of office, and for his generous contribution of \$500.00 made to the Prize List.

To Surg. Lt.-Colonel the Hon. F. W. Borden, Minister of Militia and Defence, the Association is again much indebted for the free issue of ammunition to the competitors at the annual matches, which was much appreciated, and tended in no small degree to the success of the meeting. To the Minister of Militia and Defence; to Lt.-Colonel F. Massey, Chairman of Council, for their contributions of \$100.00 each; and to Messrs. Jno. Mather, Gerald Bate, and M. P. Davis, for the free use of their land for the purposes of the camp, the thanks of the Association are also due.

The Council would also record the obligations which the Association are under to the Corporation of Ottawa for defraying the expense of supplying water and electric light at the camp, and to the Hon. the Postmaster General for the establishment of a post office on the range, the convenience of which was much appreciated.

The Council regret to observe a falling off in the number of affiliating Rifle Associations, and cannot but feel that the number and amount of the annual subscriptions falls far short of the sum which the importance and work of the

Association to the Militia force and to the Dominion at large should warrant, and in the opinion of your Council the Association demands at the hands of its friends and supporters a more generous support than has hitherto been accorded.

The annual matches were held on the Rideau Range, commencing on Monday the 30th August. The Association were favored with splendid weather, and the meeting was a most successful and pleasant one throughout. From exceptional and other causes—notably, the contemplated change in the weapon of the force—the attendance was somewhat smaller than usual, the entries in the regular matches being only 357, as against 460 in 1896, and 416 in 1895. The shooting was very good, and the success of the team shooting of the 13th Battalion was a notable feature of the meeting, they having carried off most of the principal team prizes. The matches were carried out on time and with general satisfaction to all the competitors. The Council would record their appreciation of the excellent work accomplished by the Executive Officer, Major P. B. Taylor, G. G. Foot Guards, who proved himself an energetic and capable officer. They also desire to express their obligations to the Match Committee, the Range, Statistical and Medical Officers, and the officials in charge of the various sub-departments, for their services during the meeting.

The Extra Series competitions were very liberally patronized, and the Council attribute the continued interest largely to the facility afforded for the purchase of firing tickets, which were placed in the hands of the Range Officers, for sale to competitors at the firing points. Your Council would recommend that this system should in future be continued, as they believe it is not only appreciated by the competitors, but helps materially to augment the revenues of the Association.

The meeting of 1897 will long be remembered as the last one held at the historic "Rideau Range"—the battle ground of the D.R.A. for over a quarter of a century past—and the occasion was seized upon for making the firing of "the last shot" an event of interest. The Hon. Mr. Mulock, Postmaster General, himself an old militiaman and rifle shot, was requested to fire the shot which officially closed the meeting and the old range. This he did, after the regular matches were closed, on the afternoon of Friday, September 4th, surrounded by the chief officials of the Association and by the competitors and their friends. The scene will long be remembered by those who were privileged to take part in, or witness the ceremony, and which to many present was one of regret.

Through the kindness of the Ottawa Electric Ry. Co., and of Captain J. E. Hutcheson, 43rd Bn., the Superintendent, the competitors were afforded an opportunity of inspecting the site of the proposed new rifle range at Rockcliffe, the Company having placed special cars at the disposal of the Association. The general consensus of opinion was decidedly favorable to the new range, as being well adapted for the purposes of rifle shooting and convenient of access to the city. The Council have much satisfaction in being able to report that the Department of Militia and Defence has taken the necessary steps for the expropriation of the land at Rockcliffe for the new Rifle Range.

The Council have to record, with deep regret, the death of an old and valued member of the Association, Major Henry F. Perley, who died at his post of duty, being engaged at the time in the work of the D.R.A. in superintending the erection of the Canadian Building at Bisley. Major Perley's death removes from our midst one who had the best interests of the Association deeply at heart, and who labored zealously at all times for its welfare. As a fellow-laborer with them, the Council feel that they have lost a valued friend and colleague; and the Association at large have lost one whom it will be difficult to replace, and for whose untimely death every member will with them feel a genuine regret.

The Council are also called upon to mourn the loss of Major General Sir F. D. Middleton, C.B., K.C.M.G., a life member of the Association, and whose association with the Militia in the North-West Rebellion of 1885, and with the riflemen of Canada, in whom he took a deep interest, makes his death a matter of regret to the Association and to the Militia at large.

The office of the Association in the Metropolitan Life Building, 49 Metcalfe St., Ottawa, secured in May last under the authority of Council, has been found most convenient for the meetings and other work of the Association. The following papers are kept on file there for the use of members of the D. R. A. :— *The Volunteer Service Gazette*, *The Volunteer Record*, and the *Canadian Military Gazette*.

The Council submit herewith:—(1) The Report of the Commandant of the Bisley Team, which will be read with interest and pleasure, and from which it will be seen that the large and commodious home of the Canadian riflemen on Bisley Common was occupied for the first time. The usual financial and other statements accompany the same.

(2) The Report of the Bisley Building Committee, showing the progress made in the work of erection, and the statement of the receipts and expenditure in connection therewith, together with a list of the donations towards the furnishing of the building.

(3) The Treasurer's Statement of receipts and expenditure, duly audited.

FINANCE.

Affiliation Fees from Rifle Associations amounted to \$616.00, as against \$700.00 received last year, a decrease of \$84.00.

The number of Rifle Associations affiliating this year is as follows, viz:— Provincial, seven, County and other Rifle Associations, thirty-two, a decrease of five Associations as compared with 1896.

The Annual Subscriptions received to date for the year amount to \$212.00.

Associate Members Fees amounted to \$300.00, as against \$396.00 received in 1896, showing a falling off in the attendance of competitors in 1897.

The Receipts from special donations amounted to \$700.00, as against \$870.00, a decrease of \$170.00, the difference being represented by life members' fees received last year.

Donations from Banks continue as usual, and amount to \$750.00 this year.

Entry Fees to Matches, including post entries and fines for challenge shots, less refunds, amounted to \$4,149.23, as against \$4,642.48 received last year, a decrease of \$493.25.

Cash Prizes and Badges amounted to \$6,686.02, as against \$6,854.24 distributed last year, a decrease of \$168.22.

The expenditure on account of the Bisley Team of 1897 amounted to \$6,065.67, as against \$5,656.47 paid last year, an increase of \$409.20. This is accounted for by the Team sailing a week earlier than usual, and the consequent additional expense entailed for subsistence in England prior to the opening of the competition at Bisley. The refund, however, of the entry fees of the Team of 1897, amounting to £139 10 0, and an additional refund of £1 14 6 by Major Mason, (equal to \$687.28), makes the net charges for this year to be \$5,378.39, being a saving of \$278.08 as compared with last year.

Receipts from ordinary sources for the year amounted to \$16,816.39, which, with the balance of \$1,649.79 carried forward from last year, shows a total of \$18,466.18 at credit side of the account.

The General Expenditure amounted to \$16,635.31, including the balance of \$235.08 advanced as per Bisley Building Account, thus leaving a balance at credit of \$1,830.87.

Against this, however, the Bisley Building claims outstanding (which include \$3,500.00 due the Ontario Bank), have to be taken into account as liabilities, amounting in all to \$8,080.07.

Deducting the balance in hand from this amount, the net liabilities of the Association under the head of Bisley Building are \$6,249.20.

To offset this liability there is the Bisley Building and its valuable contents.

REPORT OF THE BISLEY BUILDING COMMITTEE.

So complete a record of the preliminary proceedings in connection with the proposed erection of a building to be used as the headquarters of the Canadian Team at Bisley appeared in the D. R. A. report for 1896, it seems unnecessary to make further reference thereto, beyond stating, that under the authority of the resolution of Council adopted March 3rd, 1897, the late Major Perley left Ottawa on the 9th March last to proceed to England to enter upon the work of construction. The site of the building, which had been previously under consideration, was fully approved by Major Perley, as being "the very best site on Bisley Common," and upon his arrival he at once proceeded with the work he had in hand.

It is much to be regretted that the plans and specifications of the building had not been sent to England for approval before being adopted, as the building regulations in force there rendered necessary many changes in the plans, amongst which was the substitution of iron girders for wooden beams, the erection of an iron tank in the top of the building, and other alterations, all of which added to its cost. It was also found necessary, instead of placing the building upon wooden supports, as provided by the plans, that a brick wall should be constructed under the entire building, to prevent the rabbits which infest Bisley from burrowing under the building, and thus rendering the foundation insecure.

The great demand for labor, in consequence of the then approaching Jubilee celebrations, was found to be a very serious item, but the work having been commenced, it was deemed expedient that it should be pushed forward with all possible speed, in order that the Team from Canada, to take part in the prize meeting at Bisley, might be housed in the new quarters.

Major Perley's illness during the progress of the work was also a serious drawback, and no doubt added very materially to the cost of the work, as the men employed were not familiar with the construction of a wooden building; indeed it would have paid your Association if some first-class carpenters had been taken to England in connection with the work.

The Treasurer's statement shows the total expenditure in connection with the Building up to the present time, to be \$9,696.65. Deducting from this sum the architect's fees, the late Major Perley's pay and allowance, and all other incidental expenses, amounting to \$3,278.62, it will be seen that the sum of \$6,418.03 has been expended upon the building proper.

The accounts still outstanding and unpaid amount to \$4,580.07, which, added to the \$9,696.65 as above, shows that the total cost of the Bisley Building will be \$14,276.72.

Your Committee greatly regret the unforeseen circumstances which have resulted in the cost so far exceeding the estimates, but having entered upon the work, there seemed no alternative but to push it on to completion, and this was done at the least possible cost consistent with the plans and permanency of the work. There is some satisfaction in knowing that the building is in every particular adapted for the purpose for which it was erected, and that the Canadian Headquarters is second to none on Bisley Common.

The sum of \$5,000 was granted by Parliament towards the cost of the building, and further sums of \$500 were received from the Governments of Ontario and Quebec respectively. Appeals have been made to the other Provincial Governments, and it is earnestly hoped that these may be successful.

The contributions towards furnishing the Building have been very generous, a complete list thereof is appended to this report.

The ground on which the building is erected has been leased for a period of twenty-one years at a rental of five pounds sterling per year, with the usual covenant for renewal.

An insurance of £1,200 has been effected upon the building, which your Committee would recommend be increased to £2,000 stg. The services of a caretaker, who lives upon the premises, have been secured at a cost of 10/ stg. per week, and fuel.

The total area of the enclosure at Bisley is 5966 superficial feet.

While your Committee cannot but regret the exceptional causes which led to the cost being largely in excess of the estimates, they are in some measure compensated therefor by the fact that the architectural features of the building have been very closely adhered to, and that in its commodiousness and appearance is all that could be desired.

The Committee are under many obligations to Colonel Mackinnon, Secretary of the National Rifle Association, for his kindness in connection with the completion and oversight of the building since Major Perley's death.

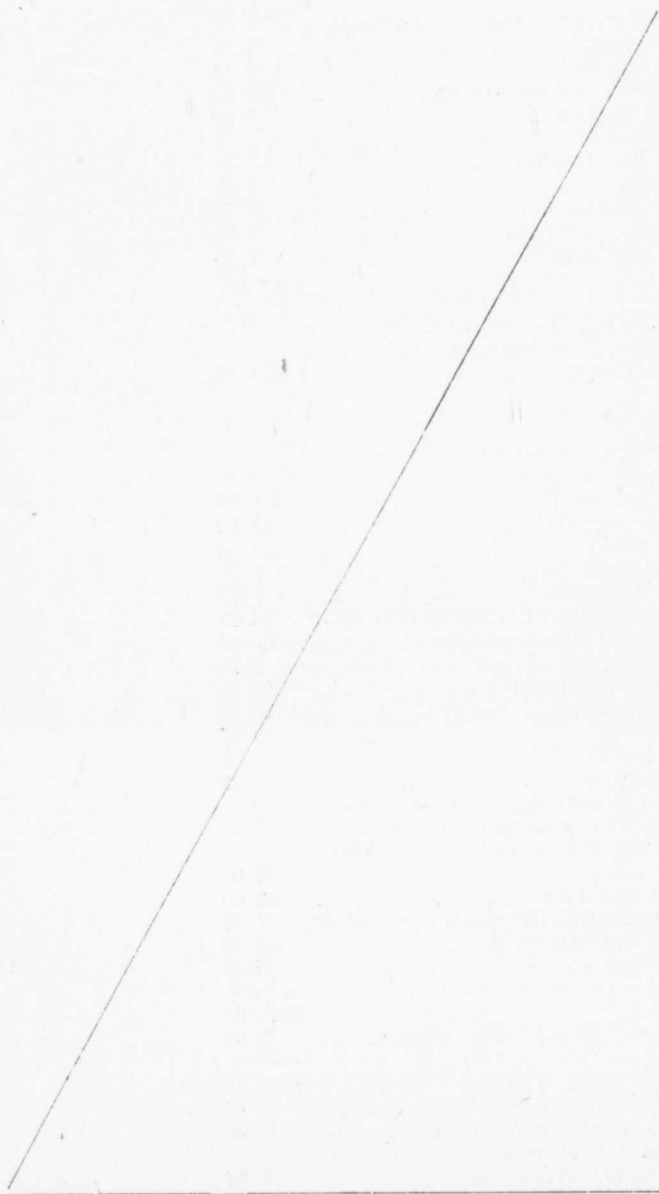

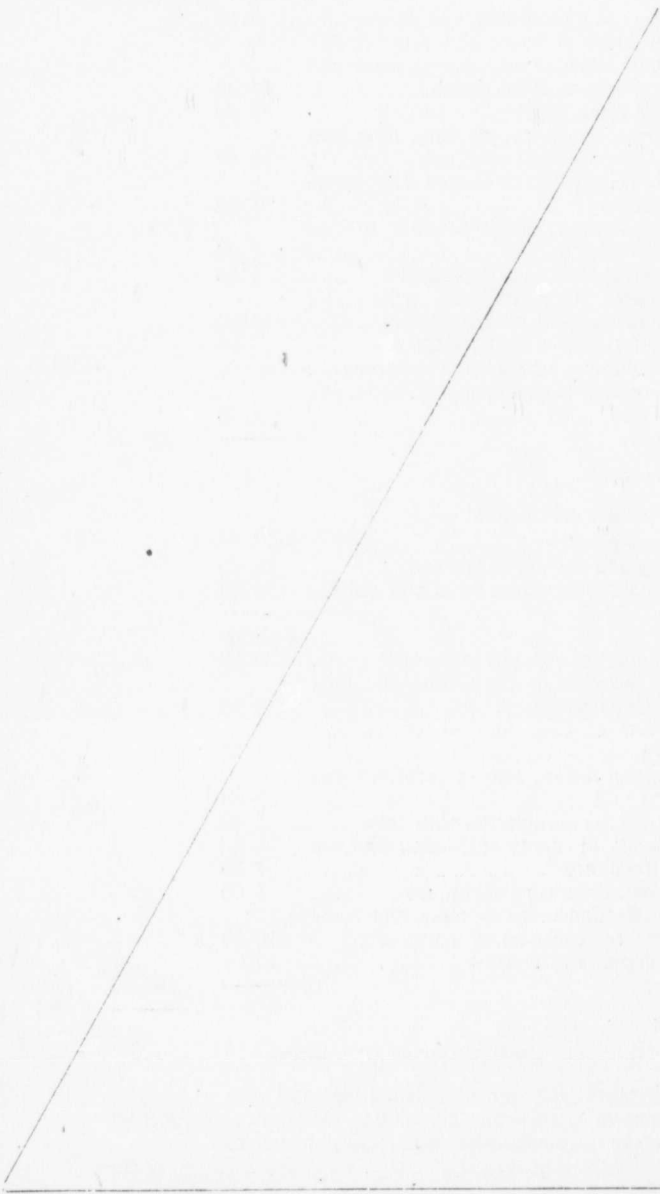

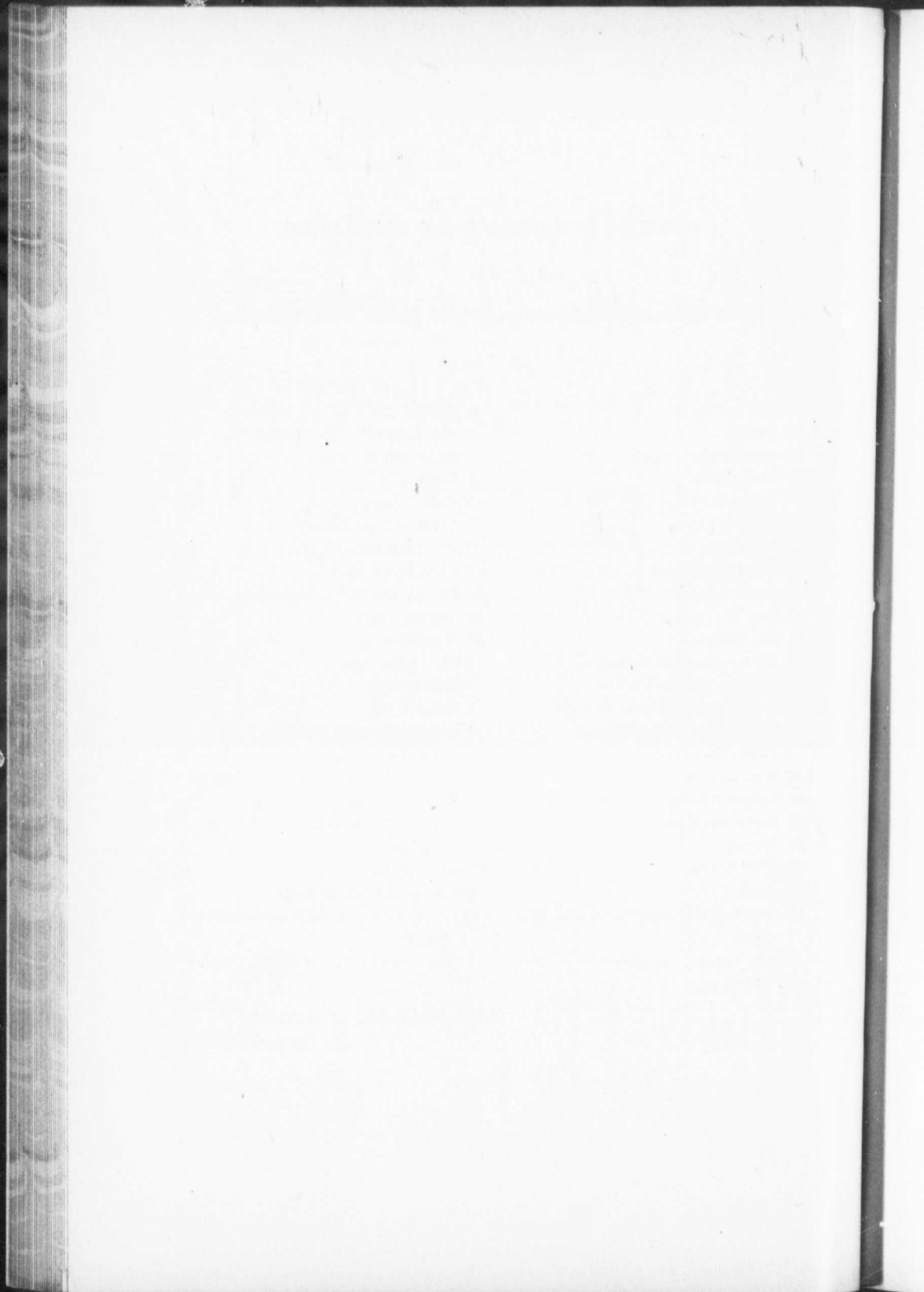

Present—Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Hood, D. A. Macdonald, Anderson and Starke, Majors S. Hughes, M.P., Mason, Blaiklock, Ibbotson and Delamere.

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Major Ibbotson,—

“That Lt.-Colonel Tilton be elected as Chairman.”—Carried.

Communications were read from Major General Gascoigne with referenee to (1) The challenge received from the Rajputana Rifle Club, of Victoria, Australia, to any corps of the Active Militia of Canada, for a friendly rifle match upon the terms mentioned in the correspondence, and (2) The offer from Major General Gascoigne to donate a silver challenge cup as a prize in a marching and firing competition, to be held during the prize meeting of the D. R. A.

Moved by Major Mason, seconded by Major Ibbotson,—

“That the communications from Major General Gascoigne be referred to a committee consisting of Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Anderson and Hood.”—Carried.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton brought up the question of the supply of Martini-Henry ammunition for the matches of the Association.

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Major Mason,—

“That Lt.-Colonel Tilton and Major Hughes, with Lt.-Colonel J. Macpherson, Treasurer, be a committee to arrange with the Department of Militia and Defence with respect to the ammunition to be supplied.”—Carried.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton explained to the meeting the proposed arrangements with respect to the transport of the Bisley Team for 1897, stating that the Allan Line would undertake the transport of the team to and from England on the same terms

as in former years, at the rate of \$100 for the double passage, a condition being that the members of the team should notify the Secretary immediately, as to the ships and dates for which their return passage would be required.

Moved by Major Mason, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Hood,—

“That the Team be sent over by the S. S. ‘Parisian,’ of the Allan Line, leaving Montreal on the 19th of June next, the rate for the double passage not to exceed \$100 per passage; accommodation to be arranged to the satisfaction of Major W. M. Blaiklock.”—Carried.

Major S. Hughes moved, seconded by Major Ibbotson,—

“That the Team be instructed to report to Major Mason, the Commandant, on Monday, the 18th June next, at 9 o’clock a.m., at the Queen’s Hotel, Montreal.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt. Colonel Starke, seconded by Major Ibbotson,—

“That the Secretary be instructed to communicate with Mr. Mortimer, the Secretary of the Runimede (Metropolitan) Rifle Range Co., (Ltd.) Staines, England, stating that it is proposed to send the Canadian Rifle Team to practice on that range during the week preceding the National Rifle Association meeting at Bisley, if accommodation therefor can be satisfactorily arranged.”—Carried.

Moved by Major Hughes, seconded by Lt.-Colonel D. A. Macdonald,—

“That the Treasurer arrange with the Ontario Bank for such advance of money as may be required for the expenses of the Bisley Team.”—Carried.

Major Blaiklock moved, seconded by Major Ibbotson,—

“That a sum not to exceed £105 stg. be advanced to the Commandant of the Team to provide for its subsistence while in camp at Bisley.”—Carried.

The following were appointed a committee to draw up and arrange for the programme for the annual matches, to be held on the 30th August next: Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Hood and Anderson, Majors J. J. Mason and Delamere.

Lt.-Colonel Starke brought up the subject of the allowance made to the members of the Bisley Team of 10/ per day from the close of the matches until the sailing of the steamer, and Major Ibbotson spoke on the same subject.

It was decided that all references to the allowance of 10/ per day for the four days, hitherto made to members of the Bisley Team from the close of the matches to the sailing of the steamer, be eliminated from the Instructions to the Commandant of the Bisley Team.

The meeting then adjourned.

The minutes of the meetings held on the 13th and 14th April last were read and confirmed.

Letters were read from Lieut. W. C. King and Sergt. H. C. Blair, members of the Bisley Team, asking to be allowed to proceed to England in advance of the team. A letter from Major Mason, Commandant, on the same subject, was also read.

The Committee decided to accede to the requests, provided that the leave was granted upon the understanding that Messrs. King and Blair would attend the rifle meeting at Darnley, for the purpose of obtaining additional practice ; also that they should satisfy the Commandant that they each possessed the necessary uniform and equipment, and should produce the required medical certificate ; also that they should report to the Commandant at such time and place as he should appoint after arrival in England. The applicants to make their own arrangements with the Allan Line for sailing, and to pay their passage money in advance, the amount of same (not exceeding \$100) to be refunded to them by the D. R. A. after having reported to the Commandant of the team.

The request of Lieut. G. S. Kinnear, 8th Hussars, to be allowed to join the Bisley team at Quebec instead of Montreal, was granted, the applicant to satisfy the Commandant as to his uniform, and to furnish medical certificate.

The Chairman read a letter from Major Perley, in which he suggested that a resolution of thanks should be sent to Sir H. Fletcher, M.P., in recognition of his kindness in connection with the Bisley Building, and in commemoration of his laying the foundation stone on the 9th April last.

The Chairman and Secretary were appointed as a sub-committee to prepare such resolution, and to have it engrossed at a cost not to exceed \$10.

The Chairman read a cablegram received from Major Perley, respecting the cost of the Bisley Building, and also read the letters of 14th and 17th May, which he had received respecting the progress of the work.

The Secretary read to the meeting the resolution of Council passed on the 14th April last, with respect to the arrangements for the prize meeting of the Association and the preparation of the programme therefor.

The Committee then took up and considered the Programme of Matches for the Prize Meeting on the 30th August next, and made certain changes therein, both as respects the number and amounts of the prizes and the amounts of the entrance fees.

The proposed programme having been drawn up, the Secretary was authorized to have the same set up in type and a proof sent to the members for revision. The Rules and Regulations to be revised by the Secretary and submitted for approval with the draft programme.

Moved by Lt. Colonel Anderson, seconded by Major S. Hughes, M.P.,—

“That the Secretary be instructed to make such arrangements as will prevent all employés of the D. R. A. from soliciting, participating in, or being interested in, any bet, pool, or stake on any match.”—Carried.

The draft of a letter to be sent to members of the Bisley Team on the subject of the deduction of the Team's entrance fees from their winnings before the division thereof, and also as to the withdrawal of the subsistence money after the close of the matches, having been submitted by the Chairman, was considered, and approved, and the Secretary was instructed to send the letter to each member of the Team.

The draft of the Agreement to be signed by the members of the Bisley Team was submitted and approved, and ordered to be printed for use.

The draft of the Instructions to the Commandant, and also of the supplemental instructions with reference to the payment of the additional cost of entertaining while at Bisley, were approved, and the Secretary was instructed to have them issued and signed by the Chairman of Council and forwarded to Major J. J. Mason.

The Chairman read a letter from Major Perley, covering correspondence with Colonel Vincent, C.B., Comdg. the Queen's Westminster Batt'n, on the subject of the proposed arrangement as to occupancy, under certain conditions, of the Canadian Bisley Building by the Queen's Westminster Volunteer Corps.

It was ordered that the letter be referred to Lt.-Colonel Gibson, President of the D.R.A., and Majors Perley and Mason, for conference with Colonel Vincent and for report thereon.

The Secretary was instructed to order for the use of the D.R.A., *The Volunteer Record*, the *Volunteer Service Gazette*, and the *Canadian Military Gazette*; and he was also requested to communicate to these papers any items of information which might be of interest to the N.R.A. and riflemen, with respect to the proceedings of the D.R.A.

The draft of the proposed medical certificate to be furnished by members of the Bisley team was submitted and approved, as was also the draft of a resolution of thanks to Sir H. Fletcher, Bart., M.P.

It was ordered that the resolution should be engrossed, and signed by the Chairman of Council and the Secretary, and forwarded to the Commandant of the Bisley team for presentation during the Bisley meeting.

A letter was read from Mr. T. G. Gillespie, addressed to the President of the D.R.A., and offering for competition at the prize meeting of the Association a challenge cup, to be called "The Gillespie Challenge Cup," together with medals to the members of the winning team.

It was ordered that the kind offer of Mr. Gillespie should be accepted, and that a suitable letter of thanks be sent him by the Chairman of Council, in the absence of the President.

The accounts for furnishing the office of the Association were approved, and the same ordered to be paid.

The draft of the proposed address to Lt.-Colonel Bacon, late Secretary of the Association, was submitted for consideration, and approved; and it was further decided that an amount of \$50.00 be given Lt.-Colonel Bacon as a testimonial, in view of his long services to the Association.

The purchase of the necessary ammunition for the practice of the Bisley team while at Staines was approved.

The meeting then adjourned.

A meeting of the Executive Committee was then held, and it was resolved that the Instructions to the Commandant be amended to read: "that the usual allowance of 10/ per day, in lieu of subsistence, be paid to the Team from the day of the close of the matches until the sailing of the steamer."

The meeting then adjourned.

Minutes of a Meeting of the Executive Committee held at the office of the Association on Wednesday, the 21st July, 1897.

Present--Lt.-Colonel Tilton in the chair; Lt.-Colonels Anderson, D. A. Macdonald, Hood, and Starke; Majors Blaiklock and Delamere, and Captain Sutherland, and the Secretary and Treasurer.

The minutes of the meeting of the 29th May and also of the meeting held at Montreal on the 18th June were read and confirmed.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Macdonald, seconded by Major Delamere,—

"That the minutes of the informal meeting held at Montreal on the 18th June, having been read, be confirmed."—Carried.

The Secretary read a letter from Sergeant F. Bartlett, 57th Battalion, claiming a refund of \$1.30 entrance fee to Dominion of Canada Match in the meeting of 1896, as the winner of the D.R.A. medal.

It was ordered that the previous decision that this refund could not be made, be confirmed, as no proper claim was then preferred, and no certificate furnished, as provided by the rules relating thereto. Also that the accounts for the year having been closed, the matter could not be reopened.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton stated that the question of ammunition had been settled, and that it had been decided by the Militia Department that the ammunition would be issued free to the competitors at the matches.

The draft of the Programme for the annual matches was then taken up and considered, and certain changes made in the value of the prizes in the Minister of Militia's Match.

In the competitions for the Gzowski Cup and British Challenge Shield, it was decided that Staff Sergeants should be excluded from the competitions and that they should be confined to Company N.-C.O.'s and rank and file.

The deduction of one to three points per shot for bad volleys in the Gzowski Match was altered so as to make the deductions apply to the volleys and not to shots thereof, and two officers were authorized to be chosen instead of one, as umpires in the judging of the points for bad volleys.

The question of the placing of the Gillespie Challenge Cup and Medal in the programme having been considered, it was decided that the cup should be awarded to the team of six N.C.O.'s and men (as in the Walker Match) making the highest aggregate scores at 500 and 600 yards in the competitions embraced in the Grand Aggregate Match, any number of teams allowed from any corps or battalion. Entrance fee, \$1.50 per team. Entries to be made with the Secretary in writing on or before 9 o'clock on Monday, the 30th August.

Claim cards to be obtained from the Secretary, which must be handed in to the Statistical Office within one hour after the completion of the Kirkpatrick Match.

The medal to be awarded to the N.C.O. or man making the highest individual aggregate scores in the competition.

It was decided that post entries in the Nursery should be accepted up to 8 o'clock; in the Bankers' until 9 o'clock a.m. on Monday, the 30th August.

The following Range Staff for the annual meeting was then appointed:—

Executive Officer—Major P. B. Taylor, G.G.F.G.

Statistical Officer—Major Walsh, Inf. Reserve.

Medical Officer—Surgeon Major Grant, G.G.F.G.

Range Officers—1. Major Mutton, Q.O.R.; 2. Major Evans, R.C.D.; 3. Capt. Street, G.G.F.G.; 4. Capt. Macnachtan, Cobourg Garrison Artillery; 5. Capt. W. G. Browne, 1st P.W.R.; 6. Capt. Aumond, R.L.; 7. Lieut. Burns, 5th Royal Scots; 8. Lieut. W. B. Anderson, Eng Reserve.

The Secretary was authorized to write Major Delamere, Q.O.R., to ascertain if he would act as Range Officer at the matches. In case of any of the above named officers declining to act, vacancies to be filled by a sub-committee consisting of Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Anderson and the Secretary.

A sub-committee consisting of Lt.-Colonels Tilton, Anderson and the Secretary were authorized to see as to the necessary repairs being made to the Rideau Range so as to put it in proper condition for the matches.

Lt.-Colonel D. A. Macdonald consented to supervise the pitching of the camp and the erection of the necessary marquees on the Range.

The Secretary was authorized to employ the necessary assistance on the Range and for the matches, and the arrangements for the sale of extra series tickets was left to the Treasurer and Secretary.

Applications were read from (1) L. Williams, (2) S. Cassidy, and (3) Taylor & Deslauriers, applying for the privilege of catering for the Association. The selection of the caterers was left to a sub-committee consisting of Lt.-Colonel Macdonald and the Secretary and Treasurer.

The Secretary was authorized to complete the necessary stores for use on the Ranges during the matches.

A short discussion took place upon the question of finances, occasioned by a statement of the receipts and expenditure submitted by the Treasurer, but it was decided that the matter was one to be dealt with by Council.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton then addressed the meeting and spoke feelingly of the death of Major H. F. Perley, and the great loss which the Association had sustained thereby.

Minutes of Competitors' Meeting, held at the Drill Shed, Ottawa, on Tuesday, 31st August, 1897, at 8.30 p.m.

Russell, J. E. Hutcheson; Lieutenants Desbarats, Pain, Dover, T. Mitchell, Davison, Crean, W. C. King, C. Mitchell; Sergt.-Major Huggins, 13th Bn., Currie (R.S.C.); Messrs. Binmore, Windatt, Skedden, J. Drysdale, W. Miller, Bennett, Nutting, Wilson, J. Broadhurst, and Lt.-Colonel Hodgins, Secretary D. R. A.

Upon motion of Lt.-Colonel Hood, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Hughes, the Chair was taken by Lt.-Colonel Tilton.

Upon opening the meeting, Lt.-Colonel Tilton spoke a few words of welcome to the riflemen attending the matches, and referred to the trip to visit the new Rockcliffe Ranges, given through the kindness of the Ottawa Electric Railway, and declared the meeting to be open for business.

It was moved by Lt.-Colonel J. Hughes, seconded by Lieut. Pain,--

“ That the thanks of the members and competitors at the D. R. A. matches be tendered the management of the Ottawa Electric Railway for their kindness in placing cars at the disposal of the Association to enable them to visit the site of the new ranges at Rockcliffe.”--Carried unanimously.

Surg.-Major McLaughlin, 45th Bn., brought up the question of the cost of the ammunition for the Lee-Enfield rifle, pointing out that the extra expense entailed in its purchase would be an obstacle to rifle practice, and urged that some steps should be taken with a view to lessening the cost to the riflemen of Canada.

It was then moved by Surg.-Major McLaughlin, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Wm. Walsh,--

“ That in order to encourage rifle shooting amongst the Militia of Canada, the Council of the D. R. A. be requested to petition the Dominion Government to issue ammunition at reduced prices.”--Carried.

The subject of the deduction of the cost of entrance fees from the winnings of the Bisley Team was introduced by Capt. R. Dillon, 34th Bn., and Gunners Miller and Wilson, 5th R.C.A., when the following discussion took place thereon:

Color-Sergt Skedden, 13th Bn.: I do not see why some better arrangement cannot be made about these fees. The paltry amount saved in this way by the Association will not put the D. R. A. in any better position. My idea is that this money should go for practice at Bisley, and not to help pay for any building. Men cannot go and pay 4/- or 5/- for Extra Series entrances often enough to be of use. We are badly handicapped in the second week's shooting, and only those

who spend money during the first week have any show in the second week. More means should be allowed for practice. As to the deduction of entrance fees, I consider that all men who shot for places on the team last year have as much right to be called upon to make up the deficiency as those who went over this year.

Corporal Windatt, 10th R. G. : All the members of this year's team feel keenly about this deduction of entrance fees, but the impression seems to prevail at this meeting that this deduction is only to be made for this year. This would be a very invidious distinction on this year's team, but if deductions are to be made, the members of the team should be told in plenty of time, and that in future deductions would be made—many do not seem to understand it that way.

The Chairman (Lt.-Colonel Tilton) : Quite right—this should apply not only to this year but in future. I cannot understand so much trouble over these deductions. We have had to cut our coat according to our cloth, and I see no unfairness in the competitors bearing a share of shortages when our funds are low, owing to heavy expenditure in your interest. Many say they are out of pocket, but you received about £10 in prizes.

Corporal Windatt: But why place the deductions on a selected few. Will the Association be in any worse position five years from now if the team's desires be carried out ?

The Chairman: What were your individual winnings?

Corporal Windatt: That is not pertinent to the question. I do not expect any man goes over to make money out of it.

The Chairman: We do not expect them to do so.

Corporal Windatt: The question struck me if the Association would be any worse off five years hence if fair treatment was accorded this year's team, but the truth is the building cost a great deal more than was necessary, and we are being mulcted for somebody else's mistake—that is how it looks to many of us.

The Chairman: About the building we did the very best we could. But we were very unfortunate in the loss of Major Perley, who had been sent over to look after its erection, &c., and many matters in connection therewith were entirely beyond the control of the D. R. A.

Corporal Windatt: I do not think, myself, these had anything to do with the cost.

Sergeant Broadhurst, 5th R. S. : The aim of every rifleman is to get to Bisley—that is undoubtedly the great prize which the D. R. A. offers to us. If you lessen the value of this prize by deductions, which virtually add to the cost of going, less will try to go. I believe the small attendance at this meeting this year is due largely to this deduction of expenses. If this is continued in future, it will have the effect of poorer attendance at our meetings, aside from the unfairness of saddling a few select men with a general deficit.

Lt.-Colonel W. P. Anderson, Reserve of Officers: As a member of the Executive, and one of those responsible for its action in this matter, I would like

to say a few words. The Executive considered that, in offering to the competitors the chance of being sent to Bisley, they are offering the chief prize of the meeting. This year they have had to face many extraordinary disadvantages--there was the great expense of the new building at Bisley, the providing and equipping of a new range next year to be thought of, and the increased cost of ammunition for the new rifle--all of which behooved the Executive to look carefully into the question of expenditure. A clean balance sheet was quite as essential to the future of prize meetings as a few £ to the Bisley Team. The Executive considered they had been too liberal in the past to the Team, and that there was no reason why those who were enjoying in a greater degree the fruits of its expenditures should not, when the Association found itself pinched for funds, contribute to the same by a return of those entrance fees from their prize money, which the Association had in the first place advanced for them. Even with this the Team is well treated, and I fail to see the hardship to the Team complained of.

Lieutenant T. Mitchell, 12th Bn: Did the Government give a specific sum towards the cost of the Canadian Building at Bisley ?

The Chairman: Yes; the Government gave \$5,000.

Lt. Mitchell: If they gave a specific sum, the D. R. A. had no right to take the amount required to make up any expenditures on building, &c., from only a certain number of individuals. Why should it not be more generally and evenly distributed ?

Captain Russell, 45th Bn.: I consider, Mr. Chairman, that if it is an honor to belong to the Team, the deduction should be made all round--Commandant, Adjutant and all. It is unreasonable to take such action as the D. R. A. has done in this matter. If this departure from the old system is to be continued, I would suggest that every man takes his place on the Team on his own footing--that is, that every man going over takes his own winnings and pays his own entrance fees, and that there be no division of prizes won, as has been the custom. I have been on the Team three times, and I feel strongly that every rifleman does not do his duty--there is too much of a feeling that all will share alike anyway, and this does affect some to the extent of making them indifferent and careless; and I know the Team has not, in several instances, had the advantage of certain men's best shooting powers just for this reason. I think if the men were more on their own bottom, as it were, they would do better individually, and, consequently, better for the Team; and it would result better all round.

Lieutenant Mitchell, 12th Bn.: Could you inform me what has been the cost of the Bisley building ?

The Chairman: I cannot; it has not reached that stage of completion yet to enable one to give any definite information as to cost.

A Voice: How much is this deduction complained of ?

The Chairman: £6 3s 6d.--about \$35.00 per man of the Team.

A Voice: About \$700.00 altogether. That seems a lot to take from the Team alone.

Surgeon McLaughlin, 45th Bn.: Upon this matter of complaint I think we should hear from the Commandant of the Team—Major Mason whom we are privileged in having with us. I am sure every rifleman will be much interested in hearing his opinion of this matter.

Major Mason, 13th Bn.: I have listened with much interest to this discussion, and approach the subject with much diffidence on account of the position just held by me as Commandant of the Bisley Team. Now, what is the primary idea of sending a team to Bisley? In the first place, the team of twenty men are sent there to win, if possible, the Kolapore Cup, and if they simply went over and shot for the Kolapore Cup with the eight men who would be selected, and not enter in any of the other competitions, no great question of expenses could arise. Looking at the question from the abstract point of view—if you pay £1 entrance fee for a man, and he wins £5, there is reasonableness in the proposition that that £1 should be returned to the man who paid that entrance fee. Unfortunately, we are in this position—the sending of twenty men for the Kolapore entails all the men shooting in all matches in order to find the best eight, and to give them sufficient practice for competing with any hope of success against the expert shots of the mother country. Now, all this requires a certain amount of money; and, although I do not for one moment think that, in the abstract, they should receive the full amount of prizes they win, the entrance fees being all paid by the Association, I do think a certain sum should be allowed them beyond absolute expenses; and, whether a man paid any entrance fees or not, Sir, I believe that all members of the team should have, for the benefit of the Association, as much practice as those who have the means of entering in other matches, in order that they may be fitted for the final struggle for the Kolapore Cups. If we guarantee their expenses to them, it would be unfair to cast them adrift on the Sunday afternoon at Bisley. Upon the present question of the refunds or deductions, it was practically understood at the meeting in Montreal that the Executive would consider a recommendation from the Commandant of the Team after coming back. I think it very unfortunate that more notice was not given. I said so in Montreal, and the greatest claim for it was in the case of Gunner Miller, of B. C., who was the farthest away and had to make his arrangements to go before notice that this rule was going into force this year was made known. It should have come into effect gradually, and not arbitrarily without sufficient notice, as has been done.

I am more strongly of opinion now that some further allowance should be made to the members of the Team, while in England, in addition to actual travelling expenses. This would be really in the interest of the Association, so that the Team might be equal to, if not better than, any team there. Why, you should have seen how the Australian teams were treated. The Victoria Team was sent there to practice six weeks before the contest took place, and all expenses paid, and no money spared to make them efficient. They were told to win the Cups cost

what it may—that was what the team was sent there for—and they did it, and only because they had plenty of practice. That is the only way any team can win, and our team should have all the practice possible. I do not condemn the Executive altogether—as an abstract principle their action is all right—but I assure them it is necessary, in order to obtain results, that more should be allowed the Team while in England. I do not think rich men only should be sent to represent Canada, but that every man should have a chance, and every one of the Team be on the same footing as regards opportunities for practice. This can be done only by a more liberal allowance, which will be spent by the men in entrance fees and ammunition. From the experience of other Colonial teams, and while I believe in a reasonable expenditure by the team, I do not believe they should have to go down into their own pockets to achieve a result which the Association sends them over there to attain for the credit of Canada.

Major Garrison, 1st Regt. Can. Artillery: How many of the Executive were at that meeting, at which the deduction from the Bisley men was made?

Major Ibbotson, 5th R. S.: The meeting was a larger one than usual.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton, Chairman: We have had considerable discussion on this matter, and it is probably well that the feeling of all parties on the subject should be made known. The Executive, of course, are your servants, and will carry out the wishes indicated in the matter. It goes without saying, that in all matters the Executive desire to do nothing to impair the efficiency of the Team, and its action towards the Team in the past must be proof to that effect, and that the Executive and Council had no earthly end to serve but the best interests of the Association, always keeping in mind that we have certain work to do and only certain sums to do it with. When Major Mason made the recommendation that the Team should go before the time first thought of, although that involved a cost of \$400 or \$500 over any other Team's expenses that had gone before, the Executive did not hesitate to accede to his wishes. The increased cost of ammunition was also a question the Executive were bound to consider. Then again, the increase of allowance from 6/ to 10/ a day was a big increase, but the Executive did not hesitate. And in all these matters the cost had been gradually rolling up. Now, if concurrently, the income of the Association had also been rolling up, the Executive, who are your servants, would have been only too glad to meet your wishes; but we felt, as business men, that we must keep the cost of the Team within a reasonable sum of that which we had for this purpose. No other Team has enjoyed such privileges at that of '97. The ships in which you were transported have been of the best. \$400 or \$500 might have been saved in sending the Team by another vessel, but the Executive deferred to the wishes and views of the Commandant of the Team, and the best accommodation was given them. Formerly, 6/ a day for the Team as allowance was ample--my Team got along very well on that amount, I remember very well--but now 10/ seems to be the fixed rate. I mention these instances to you to show that the expenses have been constantly rolling up all these years. Then, when it was

decided to proceed with the erection of the building at Bisley, the Executive threw their whole interest into the scheme, and with the funds provided have, I am sure you will all agree when you have thoroughly examined the whole matter, done wonderfully well, and given much gratuitous work to the Association. Under all the circumstances, perhaps we might have not troubled about the building, and the Team could have lived in tents, as formerly. I regret that more appreciation was not shown for the privilege and honor of occupying our fine building for the first time. Another thing, you must remember we have been deprived of the £80 prize for Colonial Teams. Major Perley had written me that the team which won it would do so, but if we had been fortunate enough to get the £80 as usual, the winnings of the Team would have been £14 stg. per man. It has been down as low as £8; and while I hold that the Executive is bound to deal liberally with the Team, still we are bound to administer your affairs so they will not come out in debt at the end of the year. Not one member of the Executive but felt, after considering the question in all its bearings, that it was only fair when bearing all expenses—paying transport to and from England, and providing for them as no other men at Bisley were provided for—it seemed only fair that the entrance fees should be deducted from the Team in matches where the prizes won became divisible. In this matter the Executive will not change its views, unless under a vote of this meeting, and an adverse vote of this meeting means reducing privileges which have been accorded to the Team heretofore. We simply had so much money to do our work with. The Executive did not, and do not now, desire to impair the efficiency of the Team, but they had to look at the matter from a business standpoint. I have no apology to make for this action—the conclusion of the Executive was unanimous. If you express a wish against us, we will simply have to ask that in future you get along with much less allowances than you enjoy at present.

Color-Sergeant Skedden, 13th Bn.: The loss of the £80 is made as an excuse by the Executive for the deduction, but is it not a fact that this was largely made up by the donation of £50 by Lord Mount-Stephen? It is scarcely fair to make this a reason for the deduction.

Gunner Miller, 5th R.C.A.: There is another matter I would desire to speak about. The B.C. Provincial Association pays all entrance fees of its team at the D.R.A., and each man takes his winnings and share of team prizes. The Government should give an increased grant to the Team. The B. C. men should not be charged more to go to Bisley than a man from Montreal. It costs a man from B.C. at least \$100 more to reach Bisley than a man from Montreal. The D.R.A. give a man going from the Team a ticket through to B. C., but he is not allowed to stay over at Ottawa. He should get a ticket all the way through, and be allowed to stay over on the way. It is as far from Ottawa to the coast as from Ottawa to Bisley.

The Chairman: The Provincial Associations always pay expenses of the Team to Montreal, but on return the D. R. A. sends them home.

Gunner Miller: Yes; but Ontario sends men for \$4 or \$5, while B. C. pays \$100 a man.

Corporal Windatt: The Provincial Association does not pay the expenses of Ontario members of the Team to Montreal. Other Provinces may, but I know Ontario does not.

Major Hartt, Reserve of Officers, N.B.: It used to be done, but not now.

The Chairman: Do you wish to move any resolution?

Private Fowler, 10th R. G.: I think that instead of making this deduction from the twenty men of the Team, that the Association fee should be increased from \$1 to \$2, and thus raise the money from all round, instead of from a few. This would be the proper way for this year.

Major Hartt, Infantry Reserve: Everyone wanting a place on the Team should be willing to sacrifice something. It is no small thing to get on the Team, and I think the deduction in question is not such an excessive hardship.

Private Clarke, 1st P.W. Rifles: Sacrifices may be all very well; but these deductions, by making it so much more expensive, and the evident desire to continue the system hereafter, simply puts it out of the reach of any mechanic or workingman who may like shooting, and can get on the Team. It costs \$150 or \$200 to every man who goes over, entirely aside from what the Association pays.

Lt.-Colonel Anderson, Reserve of Officers: But why so? Everything is paid by the Association—your entrance fees, living allowance and ammunition for practice. I know when I went over I got plenty of ammunition and practice.

Private Clarke, 1st P.W. Rifles: Yes; but that was for a favored few only—all did not get it. That is just what we feel badly about. When there was any extra ammunition and practice, it went to a favored few on the Team, but when it is a question of deductions all are brought in you may be sure. I would ask Major Mason if general entrance of his Team for practice was made this year?

Major Mason, 13th Bn.: No entrances were made for members during the first week.

Captain Smith, St. John Rifle Co.: I think this question of deductions should be approached by the Executive in a broad and liberal spirit. The great loss to men going on the Team is the loss of two months time, and certainly £10 prize money is no return for this. The Association should deal with this matter as generously as they have done in the past.

Major Blaiklock: How would it do to reduce the Team to twelve, paying all entrance fees?

The Chairman: Oh, there are many ways our expenditure can be brought in keeping with our income. There are many ways it could be done—either by reducing the Team or the prize list here.

Lieutenant T. Mitchell, 12th Bn.: Would it not be a good idea, instead of deducting money from the Team for entrance fees, to cut down entertaining expenses. It would not do to cut down to twelve men, with that big house to be occupied once a year—they would be lost there. I believe the cost and allowance for entertaining is about \$700.

Major Mason, 13th Bn.: No; \$300—it cost me \$500.

Lieutenant Mitchell, 12th Bn.: Then there is the cost of the house—it is a monstrous idea to take off money from the Team only to pay for that.

The Chairman: Don't mention the matter of the house; it was not on that account the fees were taken off.

Lieutenant Mitchell, 12th Bn.: Excuse me, Sir, the circular sent to members of the Team stated that because of the cost of the house, &c., the entrance fees were to be deducted. That was the very reason given. Now, aside from that, the men should have chances to practice in the first week, or they will not be in it at all. The Association should give the men an extra \$35, instead of taking it from them as at present.

Captain Russell, 45th Bn., seconded by Captain Smith, St. John Rifle Co., moved: That the Associate Members' Fee be increased to \$2, instead of \$1 as at present.

Captain Dennistoun, 57th Bn., moved in amendment, seconded by Captain Curren, 12th Bn.: That the entrance fee in the Governor General's Match be increased from \$1.50, as at present, to \$4.

Upon being put by the Chairman, the amendment was declared lost, and Captain Russell's motion carried.

Private F. G. Gray, G.G.F.G.: Does this abolish the Associate Members' Fee?

The Chairman: No; it only recommends the increase of the fee.

Captain Pope, 3rd V.R.C., seconded by Sergt.-Major Huggins, 13th Bn., moved: That a deputation of the Executive wait upon the Government, and urge the granting to the D. R. A. of an increased allowance of \$5,000, or \$15,000 yearly, instead of \$10,000 as at present.—Carried.

Lieutenant Stuart, 5th R.C.A., B.C., moved: That the entrance fees deducted from the Easley Team of 1897 be returned to them.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton, Chairman: Before this is seconded, let me explain that all resolutions here are but suggestions to the Executive and Council. I think the matter had better be left stand, and the motion not pressed. A note has been made of your wishes, and due consideration will be given them in every way.

The meeting then adjourned.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00. and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association, for the current year, upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete, free of entrance fee, in the "Dominion of Canada" and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner, and details of the matches at which it is won, shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons, to be named by the Council.

The Governor General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:—

Fourteen from Ontario, Ten from Quebec, Six from Nova Scotia, Six from New Brunswick, Four from Manitoba, Four from British Columbia, Four from Prince Edward Island, Two from each of the North West Territories, so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations, one half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Associations to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants-General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instructions as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held in Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or adjournment thereof, the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any members or competitors attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

GENERAL BY-LAWS OF THE ASSOCIATION
ADOPTED AT
ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

Amended 1881 and 1882.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first Meetings of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting. Council.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings. Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any member of the Council. The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting. Finance Committee.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association. Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or, in his absence, by some one of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner. Expenditure of sums for current expenses.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made upon the authority of the Council of the Association. Expenditure of a general nature.

A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November. Annual accounts.
