The Dominion government has decided to enter the protection cruiser Kingfisher in the sailing race of fishing vessels to be held on the 28th ult. from Halifax to Cross Island. The Kingfisher will not compete for a prize.

Advices from London say, that negotiations for the revision of the sliding scale in the South of Wales mines have failed and the owners will notify the men that contracts will be terminated at the end of March. About 100,000 miners are affected.

Sir William Manning died at Sydney, N. S. W., on the 27th ult., at the age of 75. He had been Secretary General, Attorney General, Judge of Supreme Court and member of the Legislative Council of New South Wales.

Advices from Month dated February 23rd say that a massacre occurred near Dillygonna, in which 300 Armenians of all ages and both sexes were killed by the Kurds. It had been intended to surrender under promise of protection.
