

The Korean government on the 23rd inst. telegraphically instructed the Gov-ernor of Wiji to arrest those Koreans who have sold their land and houses either to Russians or Chinese, and warned him that he will be responsible for the execution of this order. Since then a Japanese warship, with officials and soldiers aboard, is re orted to have left Mokpo to "inspect conditions in Northern Korea."
