SOME OLD-TIME ELECTIONS.

THE BELL OF SOME LATE DOINGS IN THE OLD LAND.

There's Nothing Half so Sweet in Life as a Election. - Tales of the late and Independent - How Money Made the Mare to Go - Some Stirring Incidents and Half-breath 'scapes.

The election is now over and gone - with its unfulfilled hopes and disappointed eyes. It is still the uppermost topic of conversation. Hence I deem it seasonable to give a yarn about old elections, spiced with some of my own experiences at election times in the Old Land.

Dear Both Sides. And yet seldom has a meeting broken up. The good old plan obtained in Yorkshire of holding a man to speak, resting full and undisturbed right to popularly endorse or condemn his utterances. The result is more amusing than was that at the Messy Music Hall meeting.

Nothing so interests every class in England as an election. It has been so from olden times. Admirably does the great comic poet Butler illustrate this in his day in "Hudibras":

Traders hawled about to settle. Borough squabblers in a noisy kettle; Oyster-women locked their fish up. Tailors left old clothes in the lurch. At Scarboro the election was a church; Some cried "The Oysterman," instead of pudding-pies and gingerbread. And hawled to purge the Commons House.

After the nomination and also after the declaration of the poll it was the custom to "chill" the candidates. Seated in a comfortable armchair the enthusiastic supporters of each candidate carried him, by poles placed underneath the chair, around the town. It considered a disgrace for a candidate to appear in a chair. On one occasion, when I was the chair, the Orange and Blue processions met in a narrow street in York, where a battle royal took place and some of the gentlemen being chaired was hurt.

And now the members, by freshers. Are mounted on the rabble's shoulders. Each new-made senator is willing by many a expense and a shilling. For broken heads and bloody noses. For damage done by sticks and scores. For pockets poked and broken shoes.

One Member Returned Two Members. "Old Sarum," now Salisbury, formerly returned two members to Parliament, the voting strength being 50. In Lord Chesterfield's Letters there is this paragraph: "I spoke to a borough-monger and offered £2000 for a secure seat in Parliament, but he would not take my offer and said that was no such thing as a borough to be had, for the rich East and West Indians had secured them all, at the rate of £2000 at least, but many at £4000 and two or three for £6000."
