STANDING RULES
FOR THE
CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT
OF THE
Newfoundland Church Society.

NAME.

1.—The name of this Society shall be "THE NEW-FOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY."

OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licenced Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement, or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-Rooms, and in the purchase of Land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles, Prayer-Books School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, and (4) to create and maintain a separate fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

MEMBERS.

3.—The members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual

sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's licence.

4.--All members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President, (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the Officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as Representatives in each of the Deaneries; viz., four elected by Members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; three by Members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by Members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by Members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a Meeting of the Members resident in each Mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge, at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the Mission, (if possible,) on some Sunday in the previous month; at which Meeting the Clergyman, or in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the Members shall preside, and the Members present shall

vote *seriatim* for the prescribed number of Representatives.

8.—When the voting (which may be continued, if necessary, six hours, but not longer) is completed, the presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives; provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas Quarterly Meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary from the death, absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese may in his discretion appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

12.—The President, or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.

13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese, holding the Bishop's licence, shall be *ex-officio* honorary Members of the Committee with the right of speaking, but not with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

15.—An annual general meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's, who shall publish it (with the Bishop's consent) in his Church on the previous Sunday.

16.—At the annual general meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's account duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, (1) by the President; (2) by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee; or (3) by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a Collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family, and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his Churchwardens and other respectable Members of his Congregation.

20.—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary, a list of the contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole Collections, on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N.B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their Collections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergymen who have collected, as far as possible, from every head of a family, or from every adult Member of the Church in their Mission, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole Collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; provided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from or independent of the general collection; and provided always that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

GRANTS.

22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.

23.—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the contributors and their payments and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grant from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society in his mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list with the fourth part of the collections

transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his first annual collection, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.

24.—If a Clergyman leave his mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Committee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

25.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or, in his absence, the Senior Vice-President, shall take the Chair at all meetings of the Committee or Members, and shall have a casting vote.

26.—The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.

27.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the amount to be paid, and its object; which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence by the Senior officer of the Society in St. John's.

28.—The Committee shall meet for despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, P.M.

29.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or [2] by two Vice-Presidents; or [3] by any five members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting with its object be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.

30.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall appoint two of their number to examine the Treasurer's account up to that season, which account examined, approved, and signed by the auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee to be by them incorporated in or appended to the next yearly Report, and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

31.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

32.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same, to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the annual report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

PRAYERS.

33.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

34.—These Rules may be altered, repealed, or added to by the Members assembled at any general meeting; provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing, by the person intending to propose it, to the Secretary at least a month before, for the information of the President and Committee, and that

assent has been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration; and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

NEW DEANERIES.

35.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives; provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and Congregations.

NOTE.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

The above rules were agreed to by the President and Members of the Church Society at an adjourned special general Meeting held on Friday, July 16th 1858.

The Report of the Committee having been read
by the Secretary, and the Treasurer's Account sub-
mitted, it was moved by C. F. BENNETT, Esq., se-
conded by JAMES CLIFT, Esq.—

1—That the Report now read be received, adopted, and printed,
together with the Treasurer's Account.

Moved by the Ven. the ARCHDEACON, seconded
by F. C. K. HEPBURN, Esq.—

2—That this meeting desires to acknowledge with devout thank-
fulness the blessing of Almighty GOD, which has enabled the
Society to prosecute its work since the last meeting.

Moved by H. W. HOYLES, Esq., seconded by J. W.
MARRIOTT, Esq.—

3—That it is desirable that the claims of the Society should
be brought home to all the members of the Church; and that every
one to whom GOD has given means should contribute, according
to his ability, to the maintenance and extension of true religion.

Moved by the Hon. Judge ROBINSON, seconded
by A. O. HAYWARD, Esq.—

4—That this Meeting desire to testify its sympathy and interest
in the Diocesan Church Societies which exist under the Bishops of the
Church, in other British Colonies, and to express its satisfac-
tion at their success.

5—That this meeting rejoices to hear of the present flourishing state of the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund; and would hope that the Clergy in their missions will do their utmost to promote its welfare.

6—That the thanks of this meeting be given to the Officers and Committee for their services during the past year; and that F. C. K. Hepburn, Esq., be requested to act as Treasurer, and the Rev. John Pearson as Secretary, for the ensuing year.

7—That the thanks of the meeting be offered to the Lord Bishop of the Diocese for his kindness in presiding on this occasion.

REPORT, &c.

In presenting their Report for the year which is now brought to a close, the Committee of the Newfoundland Church Society desire to express their gratitude to Almighty God for the measure of success which has attended their proceedings during the past twelve months, and their hope that, as time goes on, they may still have cause for congratulation, that the objects of the Society are more generally understood and its operations more widely extended.

Last year it was the privilege of the Committee to be allowed to allude to the formation of new Colonial Sees in connexion with the English Church, and the consequent wider spreading of our pure and holy religion. This year has seen the establishment of another Bishopric in North Australia, and the formation of a mission to Central Africa by a band of men from the two Universities of Oxford and Cambridge. These are now mentioned that we may here in Newfoundland understand that the sympathies and support of the Church at home are being continually enlisted on behalf of newly formed Dioceses or of missions to the heathen; and that consequently the measure of support which has hitherto been so generously given to this country by our fellow churchmen at home, becomes year by year more urgently required elsewhere. In connexion with this, your Committee feel that they would be wanting in their duty if they did not continually remind the members of the Church of their obligation; viz., to provide for the maintenance of the worship and Ministers of God, among themselves. This duty has never yet been adequately discharged, and perhaps never fully un-

derstood, in Newfoundland; and, while this is the case it must be felt that at least one object of the Society has not been accomplished.

It is to be remarked that the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel has actually to a very considerable extent reduced its annual grant to the Diocese of Newfoundland during the last four years. The following tables, extracted from the Annual Reports, will show how quickly a large reduction has been made, and of what importance it is that the members of the Church in this Colony should learn to depend upon themselves.

The net income of the Church Society has been about £960, of which nearly £645 has been raised in St. Johns, leaving about £315 as the contribution from the various Outharbours which have united themselves to the Church Society. It must, however, be borne in mind that this latter sum represents upwards of £1200 contributed in these Missions to the

general purposes of the Society, as three fourths of every collection in each mission may be retained by the Clergyman towards his maintenance. The Committee have much pleasure in reporting that during the past year they have been able to make the following grants in aid of different objects connected with the Diocese: towards the erection of St. Mary's Church, in St. John's, £100; towards the expenses of the Bishop's Visitation to the Western part of the Island in 1859, £75; towards the enlargement of the Parsonage at Hermitage Cove, £25; towards the erection of a new Church on the North side of Trinity Harbour, £75;—and towards payment of rent in a Mission where there is no Parsonage house £12 10s. 0d. It would have been a still greater pleasure to be able to speak of the establishment of new missions in those many parts of the island, which, alas! are and can be but seldom visited by the Clergy, for the performance of the ministrations of religion. Gladly would your Committee report the appropriation of funds for such an object. But at present this cannot be, owing not only to the deficiency of means, but also to the great want of

Clergymen to supply those missions which are already in existence.

During the past year the Diocese has lost the services of one of the Clergy by death, of another by removal to Australia, of a third by continued ill health. It is, understood, however, that the latter gentleman has so far recovered as to be now returning to his mission, where it is hoped his health may be re-established, and that he may live many years to continue his useful labours in the cause of God and the Church. And it is a occasion of great thankfulness that on Trinity Sunday his Lordship the BISHOP was enabled to Ordain the Missionary at King's Cove to the Priesthood, and Messrs. E. BORWOOD, and W. J. MILNER, of the Theological Institution, to the Diaconate. These fresh additions to the ranks of the Clergy, together with Mr. GABRIEL ordained last October, will, it is hoped, not only supply any existing vacancy but also enable our revered Diocesan at length to put into execution his proposal made two years ago,—at once to increase the number and decrease the size of some of the most extensive and laborious missions.

In connexion with this subject it is hoped that the Committee may be permitted again to allude to what must have occurred to those who have thought at all upon the matter,—the small number of natives of the Diocese who present themselves as candidates for Holy Orders. As a fact, the ranks of the Clergy are, and always in Newfoundland have been, nearly entirely recruited from England; and the consequence has been, that the Clergy, not being bound to the place by the feeling that this is their *home*, have continually removed away, to the great injury of the Church, and the embarrassment of endeavours for the permanent extension of our Missionary operations. Your Committee would not mention this, did they not hope that

the subject would attract the attention of the Clergy and Laity throughout the Diocese, and that those who are able would everywhere use their best endeavours to find out men of piety and capability who would devote themselves in singleness of heart to the service of Almighty God. Surely there must be some few who might be found among the members of the Church in this island, anxious for such a work. And there can be little doubt, that what the experience of all ages and of every branch of the Church has proved to be true elsewhere, will be also found true with us,—that, under God, one great means of firmly establishing the ministry, and securing for it a constant supply of earnest and devoted men, is for a race of Clergy to be raised up, in *every* way interested in the welfare of the country and bound to it by the powerful ties of home. Doubtless, among other things, this is one great cause of the comparatively more lasting ties which are formed by the Clergy of other Colonial Dioceses,—that they are doing the work of God in their native land, and are therefore much more closely attached to their spheres of labour than can otherwise be expected. Perhaps it is not generally known by the laity that in St. John's there is and has been for years maintained by the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel a College for the education of candidates for Holy Orders, in which young men of piety, who are otherwise qualified, may receive, *free of expense*, a good general Theological education, to fit them for the work of the ministry in this country. Any applications, properly recommended, his Lordship the Bishop is at all times prepared to receive; and the Committee would again press upon the members of the Church, in St. John's as well as in the country, the importance of endeavouring to serve God and increase his kingdom, not only by their larger contributions towards religious objects, but still more by

giving their sons, whose hearts may be moved by the Holy Spirit of God, to the highest, most honorable and most blessed of all objects,—the ministry and service of the LORD JESUS CHRIST.

The Fund for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy continues to receive support both from the Clergy, generally, and from their congregations. The income of the Fund, from subscriptions and collections, and the interest of the capital, has this year exceeded £200. At the same time, it must be pressed upon all the Clergy who expect to participate in the benefits of the Fund, that it is of the utmost consequence to its stability and welfare that their subscriptions and collections should be regularly transmitted to the Treasurer. During the past year several of the Clergy have omitted either to subscribe themselves or to forward contributions from their congregations: but it must be evident, that the Fund, kindly formed for the benefit of all, can only be sustained by the active co-operation of all those who are interested, and by a close adherence to its rules.—Your Committee have to mention that the removal by death of a valuable and devoted Clergyman, after a lingering and painful illness, has this year made the first claim upon the Fund; and they cannot but feel thankful to God that it was in their power at once to make some provision towards the support of his Widow and three Orphan children, by a pension of £40. The great desirability of such a Fund has more than once been felt during the past few years, and the Committee would express their earnest hope, that being now firmly and as they think safely established it may everywhere meet with that liberal support which its pious and charitable purpose demands.

Your Committee regret that they have received so few reports from the Clergy in the Outharbours, as

the details which might be expected from them could not but be instructive and gratifying, showing the difficulties which always attend the discharge of this duty in such extended spheres of labour on the rugged shores of this island, and the devotion to their ministry which we are always happy to think is characteristic of the Clergy of our beloved Church. The following are all that have been forwarded since the last report.

The Rev. W. K. WHITE, of Harbour Briton writes as follows:—

"My returns this year show a slight increase over last years amount of contributions to the Church Society in this Mission. And I have no doubt that the amount this year would have been greater if I had been able to carry out my intention of visiting every individual settlement. In the Spring, speaking of my plans to a friend he very handsomely offered me the use of his yacht and three hands, in August and September, free of all expense, and I should gladly have availed myself of the generous offer but for the delay in the arrival of the Bishop. I did make use of the yacht for a short time, and the Church in general is much indebted for this kindness.

"I cannot say I meet with much difficulty and unpleasantness in making the collections, the difficulty and unpleasantness arise from my inability to cruise when and where I ought, and to carry out the work I feel necessary to be done."

The Rev. J. MORETON, of Greenspond thus writes:—

"I beg to furnish you with a list of contributions in this Mission to the general Church Collection for 1859. The number of contributors and the amount contributed are much larger than in any year hitherto, though still much below what may and ought to be, and I trust will be, the yearly return from this large and generally prosperous flock. For this year's improvement in the collection, I acknowledge myself much indebted to the cordial co-operation of my Churchwardens and some other influential members of my flock. I am most happy also to testify that there is an encreasing right feeling in the Church members generally, of which the collection is a true criterion. The new Church in Greenspond was aided in its erection by a grant of money from the Church Society. I am able now to report with thankfulness, that the building is complete and furnished in almost every particular, and has been kept clear of debt. I believe it capable of accommodating about 700 persons. It awaits Consecration by his Lordship the Bishop, but has been in use for Divine Service since Sept. 1858; and the result of its erection has been that

which I hoped and anticipated : it has afforded the means for a more becoming celebration of all the acts of Divine Worship than was possible in the former unsuitable building ; and the regular and constant attendance of worshippers is nearly doubled.

"My flock in Greenspond has been called upon for some other contributions besides the general Church Collection in the past year ; and has responded to the call ; so as to give hope of yet better things. A collection has been made quarterly in Church, for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, the Clergy's Widows and Orphans Fund, and the Church's Widows and Orphans Asylum in St John's, each in turn. I am now remitting to the Treasurer £3 7s. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ collected in the Church for the last named object."

The Depository in St. Johns, for the supply of Bibles, Testaments, Prayer Books, Books of Devotion, School Books, and other works of a useful character, is still continued, and it is hoped is found of great service to the Diocese generally. Any suggestions as to books which might be useful for circulation would be gladly received at Mr. Burton's and as far as possible attended to by the Rev. J. F. Phelps, who is entrusted with the care of the Depot.

It is still a matter of great sorrow to the Committee that any of the missions, or rather the Clergy, do not avail themselves of the means of union for Church purposes offered by the Constitution of the Society. It was hoped that the alteration of the Rules made two years ago would have had the effect of bringing all to join heartily in visible union and active co-operation for the great objects which we all have at heart. Again the Committee would earnestly put to all who really have the welfare of the brethren at heart, to consider whether they can more effectually extend the ministrations of the Church and of pure religion than by uniting their alms as well as their prayers in behalf of the Church Society.

Since our last Anniversary the Bishop has consecrated the new Church on the South Side, which has been ever since regularly served twice every Lord's Day and three times on the Sundays when the Holy

Communion is administered, by the Rev. Mr. PEARSON, who has been constantly resident in his district:—a new, large, and handsome Church at Lower Burgeo, in the Mission of the Rev. Mr. CUNNINGHAM, built almost entirely by the contributions of the inhabitants:—and the beautiful Chapel in the St. John's Cemetery, for which we are indebted to the devotion and charity of a private individual. His Lordship also in his last Voyage of Visitation, in which he circumnavigated the Island, consecrated fourteen new Cemeteries; and confirmed in twenty-eight settlements, in several of them for the first time. Many harbours also were visited for the first time and the Services of the Church celebrated in them on board the Church-ship, of which the inhabitants availed themselves most gladly and thankfully;—many couples who never before had the opportunity presenting themselves to be united in Holy Matrimony, and bringing their children with them in great numbers for Baptism. The amount of spiritual destitution discovered in these visits and which was briefly related in a short summary of the voyage published in our local Newspapers, was truly affecting, and would we trust move all who read or heard it to exert themselves for the relief of all those perishing for lack of knowledge;—a famine as the Prophet speaks, not of bread nor of water, but of hearing the Word of the Lord. The Bishop has informed the Committee that some extracts from the Journal of his late Voyage, chiefly relating to the condition of the inhabitants of White Bay and the Bay of Islands, have been printed by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in a separate form, and will shortly be put in circulation.

New Churches are in progress at Salmon Cove, at Barenced, (nearly completed,) at Coley's Point, at Bay Roberts, at Carbonar, at New Perlican, and at

Ship-Cove in Trinity Bay. The Church at Harbor Grace has been doubled in size, and more than doubly improved in appearance and accommodation.

In conclusion your Committee would urge upon all to think upon the present great needs of the Church, in this Diocese, and the necessity which exists for great exertion and self-denial on the part of all her Members. There are many settlements which are still but scantily, some not at all, provided with the ministrations of religion; and it should be the earnest endeavour of those who have the privilege of living where the means of grace regular and frequent, not only to sustain them with all willingness, but also to contribute towards their continual progress and extension. That we may do this with readiness, and that all may be led with one heart and one mind to glorify our heavenly Father, may He grant for the sake our LORD and Saviour Jesus Christ.

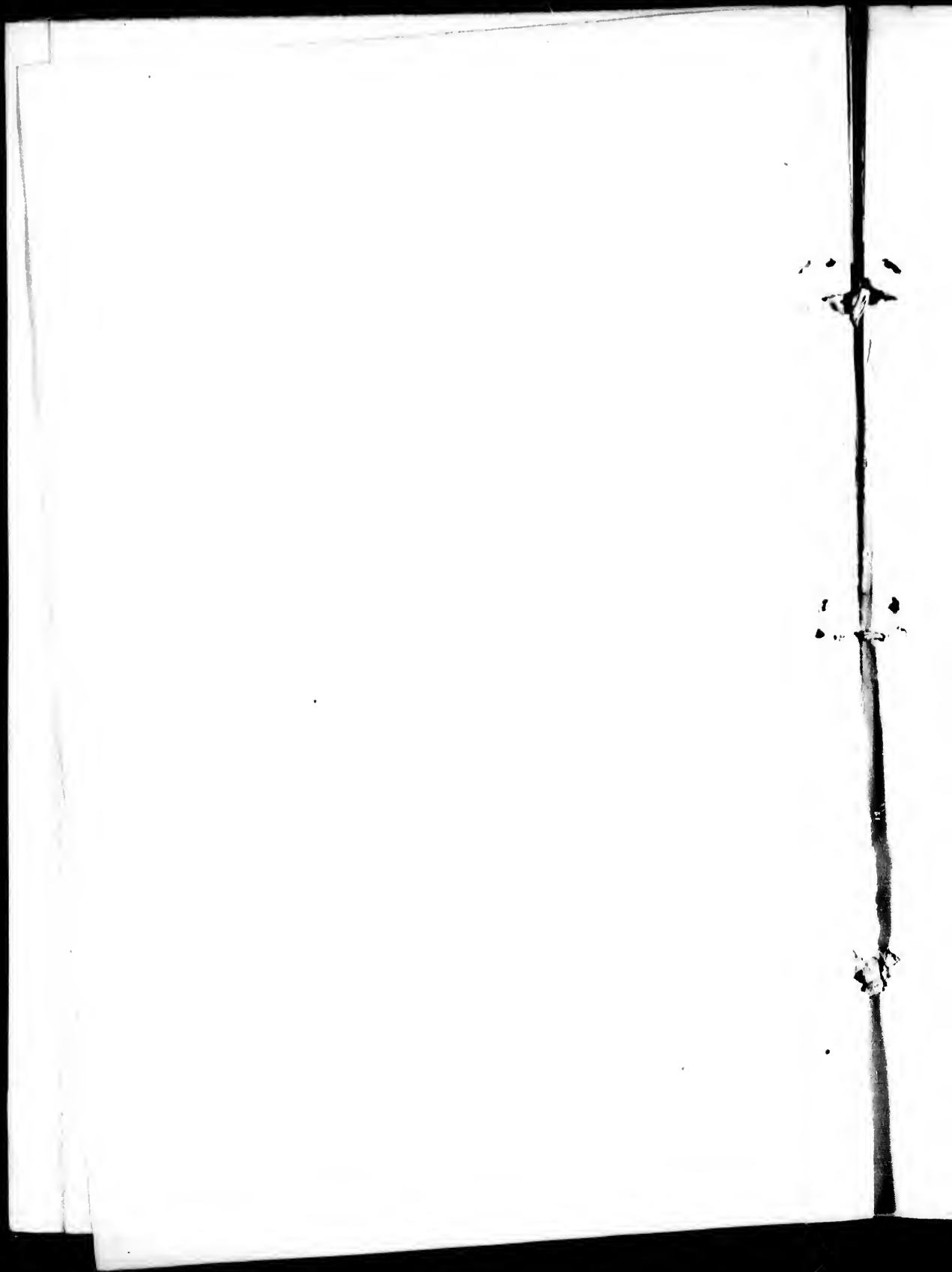
