"THE WORLD'S PLAYGROUND."

"This noble valley, practically unknown save to a few inhabitants, contains two-thirds more cultivable land and much more timber and pasture land than Switzerland, and in addition possesses a wealth of minerals which is wholly lacking in the Swiss Republic. Yet Switzerland supports a population of 3,500,000, and produces annually over two million head of live-stock, besides large quantities of butter, cheese, grains, fruits, and vegetables, while her scenery brings in \$200,000,000 yearly from tourists, mountain-climbers, hunters and invalids. With the universal adoption of rapid transit and increased facilities for travel by sea and land, the Columbia-Kootenay Valley should become the Switzerland of America—the playground of the world."

The products of this rich valley will pass through Athalmer on their way to to the markets of the world.

Note well the situation of Athalmer, with its large waterfrontage, and railroad connection, affording unexcelled facilities for wholesale manufacturing and other industries, in addition to those already located there.

The Columbia River Lumber Co. have their district headquarters at Athalmer, employing over 200 men and a large number of teams. Athalmer has an ideal climate all four seasons of the year.

Athalmer has the largest public school in the district and affords every facility for the education of the youth of this rapidly growing section.

Athalmer, is well supplied with churches, where services are held every Sunday.

Athalmer is the headquarters for the Golden, Cranbrook and Athalmer stage line.

Three steamboats ply several times a week between Athalmer and Golden. Two additional boats are now being built guaranteeing cheap transportation and low freight rates on the railway when completed this fall.

Athalmer has telephonic communication with Golden, connecting with the C.P. R. telegraph system to all parts of the world.


Athalmer is within a few miles of the best hunting grounds on the American Continent, in which all kinds of game are plentiful. Mr. A. Bryan Williams, Chief Game Warden, says:—

"The Columbia-Kootenay Valley offers exceptional opportunities to the sportsman; not only is excellent fishing obtainable, but in addition to ducks, geese, grouse, and prairie chickens, there is a greater variety of big game than in any other part of the Province; and, furthermore, the weather conditions during the shooting season are generally ideal. Another great alvantage the district has to offer is that it is easy of access. The main line of the C. P. R. passes pretty well through the centre of it, so that in a few days' travel some of the best parts of the country can be reached; to a man whose time is limited this is a matter of importance."

Athalmer has an up-to-date electric light plant, installed by Mr. James L. McKay, the owner of the townsite. Both street and residential rates are mere nomina', or slightly in excess of the actual cos of operation.

EARL GREY'S EULOGIUM.

Earl Grey, Governor-General of Canada, visited the Columbia-Kootenay Valley in October, 1908. His Excellency was delighted with his trip, so much so that he had a permanent camp built on Toby C eek, in which he and members of his family and household spent a pleasant holiday during the summer of 1909. Earl Grey was so impressed by the scenery, the climate, and the soil that he expressed his appreciation in a long letter to Hon. Richard McBride, Premier of British Columbia, from which the following extracts are borrowed:—

"Ottawa, October 18th, 1908.

"Dear Mr. McBride,—I have just returned to Ottawa from my trip to the West, and my first letter must be one of thanks to you for the gift from your beautiful Province of one of the most delightful holidays I have ever enjoyed since I first began to enjoy holidays, nearly fifty years ago.

"Wherever I went I found the same enthusiasm and confidence in the future of the fruit industry. With the necessary irrigation, transportation, and labor secured, every yard of that country to which water can be led will be under orchard. If your fruit industry is properly pushed and cared for, your fruit valleys will soon show a larger number of happy, prosperous, wealth-producing, beautiful homes to the square mile than will be found in ten times a larger area in any other part of Canada.


"I have travelled much, but I have never seen any district offering in a greater degree a combination of spiendid climate, beautiful scenery, rich land, and convenient situation.

"I have been to the Yellowstone Park, and do not hesitate to say that the area to which I have referred is more grand, more varied and attractive.

"It is estimated that the tide of tourist travel in Switzerland leaves behind in its wake annually the huge sum of \$200,000,000. It is in the power of your people to divert a large portion of this enriching tide from Switzerland to British Columbia."




Nature's Turkish Bath.

"Some eight miles to the north of Athalmer is another remarkable hot spring a little way up the Sinclair Pass. This has evidently been long known to, and visited by, the Indians. It is a sulphur spring, much stronger than that at Banff. The ice-cold stream coming down the creek passes within a few feet of the main basin. After becoming parboiled in the spring, it is a delightful sensation to take a dip into the stream after the manner of the cold plunge in a Turkish bath. The miners and

dwellers in the valley have a profound faith in this spring as a healer of rheumatism and of skin affections.

A Rival of Cashmere.


"I would, however, dwell more particularly on the main valley. Having



myself been attracted to it by its beauty and climate, and having spent several weeks in it each summer for now many years, I feel that I may speak with some authority regarding its qualifications as a summer resort. I may safely leave to others to des-

cribe its soil and agricultural advantages, as again what it affords in the way of big game and other sport.

"Perhaps the particular quality of its beauty is best indicated by the remark of a gifted Bostonian, a great traveller, who spent several days with us at Edenhome, last summer, as he was concluding a journey round the world: 'I have seen much, but nothing that I can compare with this, save, perhaps, the Vale of Cashmere.'

plantation, serving the east, west, and south with its products. I have traversed one hundred miles of the Columbia River, and have not seen a mile along the shores that is not a farmsite or a homesite in prospective. But this is not all of the wonder.


"In one more particular does this valley strike hard upon the sensibilities and impress me as no other spot I have ever visited. In all the world elsewhere there is



is not too weak fitly to describe either the scene or his sensations. There are famed rides in Europe, and celebrated scenic spots in all lands, but here we have the solemn


NATURE'S MASTERPIECE,

"Like it!" she exclaimed, "why I would walk all the way back to my school if they would let me stay. But my father wants me to go home. He sent me the money to go, but I wrote that I wouldn't. Then he bought my tickets and sent them over. So I have to go. But I shall not be satisfied until I can return."

With the Rockies on the East, the Selkirks on the West, the Columbia River on the North and East boundary, and the beautiful Lake Windermere on the South, the




