

BYE-LAWS

OF THE

Board of Home Missions.

1st. At all the meetings of the Board or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be Chairman of the Board, and the Very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be, *ex officio*, Vice-Chairmen. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary and a Treasurer.

3rd. The Board shall consist of the Chairman, Vice-Chairmen, Secretary, Assistant Secretary and the Treasurer of the Board, who shall fill the same offices in the Committees; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, together with twenty Laymen, to be chosen by the Diocesan Synod. At each ordinary meeting of the Synod one-half of the whole number of lay members of the Board shall go out of office, but they or any of them shall be eligible for re-election; the new members, having been proposed, seconded and elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list. No one shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its funds of at least one dollar.

4th. The Board shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July, or at the time of meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the general meeting of members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or, in his absence, by a Vice-Chairman.

5th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the Board, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as

shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the Board.

6th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Board as soon as its means may enable it to afford such attention :—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Board, shall then have received the approval of the Board ; and lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.—Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Board to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid for these objects.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied ; while those who desire it may have their individual contribution scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects.

7th. The Accounts of the Board shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from the time by auditors to be appointed by the Board.

8th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at an Ordinary Meeting of the Synod ; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

Prayers

APPOINTED TO BE USED "AT ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD, AND OF COMMITTEES," BEFORE THEY COMMENCE BUSINESS.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

(Board of Home Missions only.)

O God, from Whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria; and so to rule her heart that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing our missionary work. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the clergy; and the endeavours of all who are engaged in promoting the knowledge of true religion. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy Glory and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

(Board of Home Missions only.)

O Lord Jesu Christ, Who at Thy first coming didst send Thy messenger to prepare Thy way before Thee; grant that the ministers and stewards of Thy mysteries may likewise so prepare and make ready Thy way, by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at Thy second coming to judge the world, we may be found an acceptable people in Thy sight, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. *Amen.*

(Board of Foreign Missions only.)

Almighty God, who, by Thy Son Jesus Christ, didst give commandment to the Holy Apostles that they should go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature; grant to us whom Thou hast called into Thy Church, a ready will to obey Thy word,

and fill us with a hearty desire to make Thy way known upon earth, Thy saving health among all nations. Look with compassion upon the heathen that have not known Thee, and on the multitudes that are scattered abroad as sheep having no shepherd. O Heavenly Father, Lord of the harvest, have respect, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and send forth laborers into Thine harvest. Fit and prepare them by Thy grace for the work of their ministry; give them the spirit of power, and of love, and of a sound mind; strengthen them to endure hardness; and grant that both by their life and doctrine they may set forth Thy glory, and set forward the salvation of all men, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

(Board of Foreign Missions only.)

O merciful God who hast made all men, and hast nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but rather that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels and heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word, and so fetch them home, Blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we Thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving kindness to us and to all men; more particularly for the providential support by which our work has been thus far sustained; but above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy Blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to Whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

Our Father, which art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done in earth as it is in Heaven; give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for Thine is the Kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased clergymen, but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special account for this object, to be called the Widows' and Orphans' Fund. This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all premiums received under these Rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object and none other.

2nd. A Standing Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions (who shall be paid as Secretary of this Committee), shall be vested the whole management of this matter, subject to an appeal to the general Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund the pensions which become due under the following Rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund shall, within one year from taking Orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a Certificate of Pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant after such period of time shall only be permitted to receive such Certificate at the option of the Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every Clergyman applying for a Certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application.

7th. Every clergyman upon the Fund is required to make at least one collection annually in its behalf.

8th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

9th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium the applicant shall receive a Certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

10th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within 40 days after the payment becomes due all claim to the pension under his Certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void; but if he desires to have his claim to the pension renewed it shall be in the power of this Committee to re-admit him on such terms as they see fit.

11th. Removal of the clergyman from this Diocese, except in the case of any clergyman who shall become a missionary of the Board of Foreign Missions of this Diocese, or who undertakes work in Algoma while a Missionary Diocese, forfeits all claim to the pension. Seventy-five per cent. of the amount of premiums paid by the holder of the Certificate himself shall be returned to him upon the surrender of his Certificate.

12th. If any clergyman shall go beyond the limits of Europe, or of North America 35° North latitude, without the leave of the Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

13th. The widow of every clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of \$100 per annum during widowhood.

14th. If at any time it is the opinion of the Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their so doing, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

15th. If the widow die or marry again the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females; while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

16th. If the wife die before the husband, his child or children shall at his death receive the pension, under the above limitation as to ages.

17th. The pension shall be payable half-yearly, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of these days which shall happen after the decease of such person holding a Certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these Rules, such pension is to cease.

18th. The Clergy of Prince Edward Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

19th. The Certificate to be granted shall be in the following form, under the seal of the Synod and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

20th. None of the above Rules or Regulations shall be altered except at a regular meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

~~The~~ The Widows' and Orphans' Committee do not consider the Fund responsible for the payment of a larger pension than the \$100 named in the Certificate.

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

It shall be one of the objects of the Board of Home Missions to provide for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Synod therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Board of Home Missions will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund." This Fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies and other contributions given and paid to the Synod for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom ; and this Fund shall be held and applied to and for this object, and none other.

No. 2.—A Standing Committee of six Laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as Chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this Fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Synod undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this Fund the pensions which may become due under the following Rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this Fund shall make application to the Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension (not exceeding \$200) as they think expedient. But should the Committee refuse to grant the pension an appeal may be made by the applicant to the General Meeting of the Board.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this Fund unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this Fund a sum to be named by the Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from the falling off of the Fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner resides out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity should accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on

the first January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner should be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above Rules or Regulations shall be altered except at an ordinary meeting of the Synod, after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Committee were adopted May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the Incumbent or resident Missionary for the time being of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said Incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance of trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel or to the Church Corporation of the Parish or to the Diocesan Synod.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any Incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the churches in his Parish or Mission during the continuance of such suspension.

V. The Endowment Committee shall hold any sum contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission in trust for such

Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Committee, such opportunity or proposition for endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission, so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the General Meeting of the Board, at their meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Committee for aid shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Board of Home Missions in its favor in such Mission: and shall state the nature, situation, value and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Committee to form a correct judgment; all such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Board of Home Missions, who is *ex officio* Secretary of the Endowment Committee.

The Endowment Committee, in a Report May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

“That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its ‘*Reserved Fourths*’ and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Board and the interest be payable to the Incumbent.”

“With reference to the control of the Board over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the rights of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this Fund for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved Fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned

to this Board to be held under the same Rules and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment."

The first recommendation was adopted; the second is still under consideration.

QUEBEC SCHEME.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

Clause 1.—Where there is no special condition, all grants shall be made for three years from the first of the month preceding or following the date; yet the Board may, for what it considers good and sufficient reasons, discontinue a grant after six months' notice. In every case the grants shall cease at the expiration of the three years, unless renewed at least six months before their termination.

Clause 2.—All Parishes or Missions receiving aid from the Board shall, by their Wardens or other representatives, pay into the funds of the Board, through the Secretary, at least one month before the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 30th December in each year such amount as may by mutual consent be arranged between themselves and the Board; provided always, that the Board, if in any case it is satisfied that half-yearly payments would be more for the interests of all parties concerned than quarterly, may frame their agreement with the Parish accordingly.

Clause 3.—At the beginning of every quarter, to wit, on 1st April, 1st July, 1st October, and 1st January, the Secretary shall accept the order of the Missionary for the preceding quarter's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties. But where half-yearly payments have been allowed, the Secretary, at the expiration of the six months, if the amount due from the people has not been paid up, shall only accept the order for the amount of the Society's grant for that period.

Clause 4. When a Parish or Mission fails to make its regular remittances when due, the Secretary shall at once make enquiries by letter, or, if thought necessary, shall visit in person; or a deputation may be sent to enquire into the cause of such default, and report to the Board. Should the amount due from the Parish not be paid within three months from the date at which it becomes due under

the agreement with the Board the grant shall cease, and it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to make no further payments; nor shall the grant be renewed until the arrears due at the time of the cessation be paid up.

Clause 5.—The aim of the Board is, and it should be that of the Missions themselves, to make the Missions as quickly as possible self-sustaining, in order that the funds of the Board may be applied to the opening of new Missions and to the extension of the work throughout the Diocese.

Clause 6.—In furtherance of the objects of the Board it requires, that each of its Missionaries shall take care that every eligible person within their respected Missions be solicited to contribute to the General Fund of the Board, and that quarterly returns of the amount of such contributions shall be made by the Missionary to the Secretary in Halifax.

Clause 7.—The Board, for reasons which it shall deem good, may allow a Parish or Mission to pay a certain specified amount of their Incumbent's salary in kind, at *cash* prices, and his receipt for the sum, in the form of a bill of items, shall be counted by the Wardens or Representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the Parish or Mission; and may also allow the receipt of the clergyman for money given at the offertory to be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Board from the people.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information:—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.

6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Board of Home Missions that no clergyman should, when building a Church, rely upon aid from the Board without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Board to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely: That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years, from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

The Endowment Committee receive and hold any money given in trust for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same when invested towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given.

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Board.

The Board will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure unless the people there consent to pay *toward the Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission* all the proceeds of whatever globe lands may be in that Parish.

All subscription lists received before the 31st December in each year will appear in the next forthcoming Report, while those received after that date shall be omitted.

If the reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Board.

The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

All applications for aid from this Board are proposed at one meeting of the Board and considered at the next.

No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Board, nor to be elected a member, who has not been a subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting.

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted:—

The Church property in any Parish which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish shall be valued by competent

valuers upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz.: one by the Parish, one by the Board of Home Missions, and another by those two.

AN ACT to vest in the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia the Funds held by the D. C. S.

Whereas, At a meeting of the D. C. S. held in the month of July, 1876, it was resolved, &c., &c.:

And whereas, At the General Session of the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, held in the same month, the said resolution was adopted by the Synod:

And whereas, It is considered expedient, in order to carry such (resolution) into effect, that an Act be passed to vest in the said Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia all real and other property held in trust by or for the said D. C. S.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly as follows:

1. All property, real and personal, held by or in trust for the D. C. S., or other funds respectively connected therewith, are hereby declared to have become vested in the Diocesan Synod of N. S. in trust, to be held and managed for the several purposes for which they have heretofore been held and managed by the D.C.S., as fully and effectually as the same were previously vested in or held in trust for said D. C. S.

2. The said Synod shall be bound to fulfil all engagements made by the said Society previous to such transfer, and to observe all the conditions under which the several funds may have been held in trust by the said Society.

3. In all cases where moneys of D. C. S. have been loaned on mortgage in this Province for the benefit of any trust funds in connection with said Society and in all like cases it shall and may be lawful, in case of the payments of the amounts due on such mortgages, for the said Synod to discharge such mortgages by writing under their seal, and thereby the mortgagees, their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, shall be fully discharged from all further liability on account of such mortgages.

4. The receipt of the Treasurer of the Synod shall be a sufficient discharge to the Treasurer of the said Society for all monies and securities transferred by him.

REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The Board of Foreign Missions as constituted by our own Synod at its last meeting represents the two sections of the work as proposed by the Provincial Synod in 1880, viz., a Corresponding Committee of the Board of Domestic Missions, and a Corresponding Committee of the Board of Foreign Missions. The first referring to the work in the Dominion of Canada, the other to that carried on in Heathen lands. Committed to it, therefore, is the collecting of Funds for Algoma and the North West, and for Africa, China, India, etc.

The Board has had to assume on behalf of the Diocese the proportion of the Bishop of Algoma's salary, which was agreed upon at the Special Session of the Provincial Synod held a year ago, viz., \$300 a year, and this sum has to be paid quarterly into the hands of the Treasurer of the Diocese of Algoma, A. H. Campbell, Esq., of Toronto.

Besides this, the Board receives and transmits any sums which may be sent to it for any general or special object named by the donors.

During the past year the contributions have been even less than in the previous year, in which a decrease occurred, and it is hoped that our people will soon awake to the fact that nothing like the amount is being raised which the Church in the Diocese ought to contribute for such purposes.

The Board trusts that in each Parish and Mission the recommendation passed unanimously at our last Diocesan Synod will be strictly regarded, and that at least one collection each year will be devoted to these objects, and they suggest that if but one collection is made annually Algoma be always considered entitled to a portion or the whole of such collection.

The Treasurer's statement appears below; also names of Parishes and amounts transmitted to Secretary.

NOTE. The Board has no power to use the large balance for general purposes, it having been contributed towards the support of a Missionary of our own among the Heathen in foreign lands, and must be held in trust for that purpose.

It is a pleasure which it has not enjoyed for many years, for the Board of Home Missions, in presenting its Sixth Annual Report, to be able to congratulate the Diocese upon the fact that the Income of the past year has been sufficient to meet the Expenditure. This happy state of things, it regrets to say, has not been altogether due to the increase in the amount of the contributions, but in part to a reduction of ten per cent in the grants, reducing by so much the already small stipends of the Clergy. It is a subject for congratulation, however, that the receipts of the Board have been larger the past year than for several previous years, and were, particularly, largely in excess of 1880 and 1881. This encouraging fact leads the Board to hope that the Clergy and Laity are taking a more active interest in its welfare, and are realizing more fully the duty of giving for the work of the Church outside the limits of their own Parishes. The increase in the contributions of a few of the Parishes is specially noteworthy and calls for special mention.

While greater liberality has been shown the past year, the Board would impress upon the members of the Church throughout the Diocese that much more is still needed in order to place the funds in such a position that the calls of the destitute places of the Diocese may be responded to. It should not be forgotten that there are still several vacant Parishes, and places where Missions ought to be established; and also that the stipends of the Clergy in very many cases are altogether too small, and quite insufficient for their own and their families' wants. It is to be hoped that those Parishes which have hitherto done little or nothing for the general work of the Church in the Diocese, may be stimulated by the increased liberality of their brethren to do more themselves, in accordance with the ability God has given them, for His Holy Cause.

The three years for which the grants were made having expired at the end of 1882, new grants were made to some of the Missions, in almost every instance for a smaller amount and with larger conditions, and in some few the grants had to be altogether withdrawn

in order that the applications of several of those Missionaries who had lost a large part of their Income by the withdrawal of the S.P.G. Grant might receive what was an absolute necessity to the continuance of their work.

The Board assures those who contribute to its funds that it is using every effort to make the Missions, as soon as practicable, self-sustaining, and that in no case has a grant been given without a careful examination being made into the condition and ability of the people to help themselves.

It is full time that some of the more important places now receiving aid were able to sustain the ministrations of the Church in their midst from their own resources; and the Board trusts that the Clergy will not hesitate frequently to remind their people of this, and do all in their power to hasten so desirable a step.

The Report of the Widows' and Orphans' Committee is appended, and also the Treasurer's statements of the several Funds, which have been duly audited and found correct.

REPORT
OF THE
Widows' and Orphans' Committee,
TO THE BOARD OF HOME MISSIONS.

Your Committee last year were compelled to announce a probable reduction in the amount of the Pensions to Widows for the first half of 1882. Much to their regret, and no doubt to the very serious loss of some at least of the beneficiaries, they were unable to pay more than \$75 instead of the usual \$100 at that time. Most anxious to repair as soon as possible the injury caused by the reduction, and provided with the additional means by a few specially large contributions, your Committee restored the Pensions to the \$200 per annum for the last half of the year and for the first half of 1883, hoping that a generous response would be made to their appeal for help and an increased sympathy awakened, resulting in enlarged and permanent contributions, so that the larger amount could be continued. In this, however, they have been disappointed, the Parishes not fulfilling the expectations entertained, (although in a few cases the contributions were larger,) and notice has had to be given that unless unexpected receipts swell the funds the Pensions will have to be reduced for the next half year from \$100 to \$75.

Having exhausted every form of Appeal which they trusted would have led to enlarged contributions from the Parishes, your Committee can only now make public the fact that the reduction contemplated must take place, unless special collections place them in funds before the first of July next.

The number of widows on the Fund remain at thirteen, the same as last year.

Attention is directed to the new regulation adopted at the last Synod which reads as follows:—Every Clergyman upon the Fund is required to make at least one collection annually in its behalf.

Your Committee cannot close their report without again calling attention to the fact that notwithstanding the urgent appeals made to them, the Parishes of Prince Edward Island have continued to contribute nothing to the Fund, although a number of the Island Clergy enjoy its benefits.

RETURNS FROM PARISHES AND EXTRACTS FROM LETTERS.

Albion Mines—Decrease, \$33.90.

This large decrease is due, so the Missionary in charge says, to the Rector's absence in England. It is to be presumed that another year the Parish will again occupy the creditable position it occupied last year.

Amherst—Decrease, \$31.39.

The Rector, Canon Townshend, while expressing his regrets at the large decrease, accounts for it as due to the removal of quite a number of Church families to the North-West and other places. As Mr. Townshend has always shown a deep interest in the B. H. M., doubtless he will do all he can to increase the amount another year.

Annapolis—Decrease, \$52.40. Mr. Ritchie writes :

"This amount is less than the sum remitted last year, owing, I think, to the fact that the Parish, which recently received help from two societies on account of the poor settlements forming part of it, is now required, unaided, to raise \$600 for the salary of an assistant minister."

Antigonish—Decrease, \$3.98. Mr. Macdonald writes :

"Under another cover you will find enclosed subscription list for this Mission for 1882. I shall not attempt an apology for the decrease in the same under last year of some four dollars. To partially account for it, however, I shall mention two or three facts which speak for themselves. A decrease of stipend from external sources was announced by the executive last year, which took effect six months ago. About forty-five dollars of that deficiency has been made good by the Mission. A Curate has been provided, with \$150 per annum, at Antigonish, this amount to be paid over and above the Rector's share in that district. Parochial and extra parochial contributions will foot up at this rate to over \$550. I only hope that we sufficiently feel how greatly we are debtors to God for His unspeakable gift, and humbled, lest having fallen short of the *Christian* standard of giving, which should not be taken into account until the *tithes* have been brought into His storehouse. At the same time I am very thankful we are permitted to share in giving effect to the fruits of the Incarnation by such poor works, both among ourselves and our brethren in the world."

Aylesford—Decrease, \$0.73.

Baddeck, C.B.—\$7.87.

Mr. Gibbons' absence in England prevented any returns from this Mission last year, and but a small amount for General Purposes this year. No doubt another year will see a marked and gratifying improvement.

Beaver Harbour—Decrease, \$9.15. Mr. Smith writes as follows :

"I hasten to enclose list for B. H. M. I am sorry not to be able to send as much this year as last. The reasons for the decrease are as follows : The

fishing season was very bad with many of my people, some of whom were hardly able to provide the common necessaries of life for their families ; and the other loss sustained by them was through the failure of an "American Lobster Company," which loss prevents many from giving, for the reason they had nothing to give. Notwithstanding the present distress, I am happy to be able to send to the B. H. M. \$70.10., hoping, with my people, that we shall be able another year to make up the present deficit and do better than heretofore. You will please not look at this loss to the B. H. M. as an evidence of a want of interest on my part or on the part of my people. This decrease is a cause of sorrow to many."

Blandford—Nothing.

No returns have been received from this Mission either for the past or present year.

Bridgetown—Increase, \$4.13.

This Parish sends an increased amount over last year, which was also larger than the year previous.

Bridgewater—Decrease, \$51.02.

This Parish did exceptionally well last year (over \$110), and it is hoped that another year will enable the Missionary to overcome this year's deficiency and even go beyond last year's handsome amount.

Chester—Increase, \$14.91. This Parish is steadily increasing. Mr. Butler writes :

"Enclosed I send you our subscription list for B.H.M. and the amount collected, sixty dollars and ninety-five cents (\$60.95). I am glad to see it larger than last year, though much smaller than I would like to have it ; but I hope the Committee will not enforce the rule of having the lists in earlier, for I am afraid that, if they do, small as ours is, it will of necessity become smaller ; and I think it might have been larger this year if we had had till December 31st, as it used to be. Many of our fishermen have only just got home, while some are still to come, and those who are here have not all sold their fish as yet ; so that, as I said, it must be smaller if called in by October 31st."

Clements—Increase, \$24.57. This is a large and gratifying increase over last year, which showed an increase over the year before. Mr. McCully's hopeful letter is quite cheering. He says :

"I enclose herewith cheque on Halifax Banking Company for \$42.80, P.O. Order for \$3.77, draft on Archdeacon for \$10.00, in all, \$56.57, as per enclosed lists, subscriptions from this Parish for Board Home Missions for current year. This is almost double the amount sent by this Parish last year, and I hope to do better next year."

Cornwallis—Increase, \$19.23. This Parish gave an increase of \$16.31 last year, and this year continues to advance. Mr. Axford writes :

"Find enclosed list of subscriptions to B. H. M. for Cornwallis for 1882, with \$15.50, which, with the \$40.00 forwarded by Wm. Smith, my Churchwarden, makes \$56.50. This is best yet for Cornwallis. Getting a subscription to-day made me late for the mail, so this cannot go until Monday."

Dartmouth—Increase, \$6.81. This Parish is gradually recovering itself, and for the year 1883 has sent in, in addition to this increase for General Purposes, an unusually large sum for the W. & O. Fund.

Digby—Decrease, \$8.85. Mr. Ambrose writes :

"I herein enclose some additional names, with a draft for the total amount subscribed at the end of 1882 for the B. H. M., viz., \$78.09. This, with \$5.32, offertory on St. James' Day for Missions, and the offertory on Thanksgiving Day of \$12—\$10 for the W. & O. Fund—makes a total of \$95.50 contributed by this Parish to the B. H. M. during the year. Our Sunday School children also sent \$10 to the Shingwauk Home. If the Reports reach us in time I propose this year to get in the contributions to the B. H. M. on or about the end of September. This year, whilst the B. H. M. subscriptions were about to be called for, our Parish made up a sum of \$91 as interest then due on money borrowed to finish their new church. They also paid within the year \$100 to the sinking fund of this debt. I may add that the enclosed contribution was made in a spirit of self-denial, as the amount contributed would have gone a good way towards providing a furnace for the church, now sorely needed. But we prefer cold and smoke to the shame and sin of neglecting our duty to the claims of the Church outside our own border, and there is no spiritual growth where the Missionary duty and charity are neglected. I am very sorry our contribution is not larger."

Falkland—Increase, \$7.63.

Mr. Maynard, in sending in his list, promises to work hard for a still further increase next year.

Glace Bay—No returns.

This Mission has been vacant for some little time, and nothing has been received from it the past year.

Granville—Decrease, \$2.06. Mr. Greatorex writes :

"I enclose P. O. Order for \$65.80 for B. H. M. and W. & O. Fund, as per enclosed list. I am very glad to find we have done so well, for, owing to the great exodus from this Parish to the United States, I did not expect to nearly approach the amount sent last year. If some of our people had not largely increased their contributions there must have been a considerable decrease."

Halifax—BISHOP'S CHAPEL—Increase, \$71.70.

Again this Chapel shows a large increase for General Purposes, besides very largely increasing its contributions for W. & O. Fund over last year.

GARRISON CHAPEL—Decrease, \$37.95.

The Chaplain has always done what he could for the B.H.M., and although showing a considerable decrease this year, it is, perhaps, due to the fact that a special appeal was made last year, and a specially large amount received.

ST. GEORGE—Increase, \$58.42.

This Parish has this year, under its new Rector, made a decided improvement, and one which it is hoped will be still larger another year.

ST. LUKE—Increase, \$212.23.

The Cathedral congregation always does well, but this year its new Rector worked hard to increase the amount of the previous year, and the result of his efforts is apparent. When we remember the large amount sent in last year, the present increase is the more noteworthy, and calls for the warm appreciation of the Churchpeople of the Diocese, and especially of those Missions which directly benefit by St. Luke's liberality.

ST. PAUL'S—Decrease, \$34.75.

ST. MARK AND ST. JOHN—Increase, \$16.92.

Steadily each year this Parish is enlarging its contributions and taking increasing interest in the missionary work of the Church. Mr. Winterbourne promises still larger returns another year.

Eastern Passage—Decrease \$0.15.

Falmouth—\$15 00.

This Parish, now under Rev. Prof. Wilson's charge, comes in again, having sent nothing the previous year.

Guy'sboro'—\$5.00.

This Parish has been vacant for a long time, and this is the contribution of a single member sent in to the Clerical Secretary.

Horton—Nothing.

No returns have been received from this Parish up to the time of going to press.

Hubbard's Cove—Increase, \$38.90.

A blunder in the last Report, much regretted by the Secretary, made this Parish contribute less by \$13.85 than the previous year, when it should have been an increase of that amount. This year it has done splendidly and occupies an enviable position. We commend Mr. Stamer's letter to the careful consideration of other Parishes. He writes :

"After the Confirmation held in this Parish last October, and whilst the Bishop's earnest appeal in behalf of the funds of the Board of Home Missions was still fresh in the memories of the parishioners, I commenced, as usual, my house-to-house visiting in behalf of the Society. The people were, one and all, expecting me, not so much to be asked for their subscriptions as for the purpose of handing them to me that I may transmit them to the Committee in Halifax. Such as were prepared cheerfully paid then, and for the accommodation of those that were not prepared I agreed to keep the lists open until the 20th December, but that the money should be sent to my house; and day after day men and women—yea, and children, too—could be seen coming and depositing most cheerfully sums that would be a temptation to many to appropriate to their own use; but the love of giving for God's service was more powerful. On the 20th December, when the list was made up, the sum total amounted to \$116.33—by far the largest subscription that has ever been sent in from this Parish. When such a remittance can be forwarded from what may be considered one of the poorest Missions in this Diocese, the only surprise is that there ever should be a call for additional funds. I hope that such an error as has taken place in page 41 of last year's Report—namely, Hubbard's Cove, Decrease, \$13.85, when it should have been Increase, \$13.85—may not occur in this."

Liverpool—Increase, \$22.89.

Dr. Nichols and his people always do well, and this year has been no exception to the rule. A steady increase in the amount sent marks each year's remittance, notwithstanding the great financial losses and the consequent business depression for some years past.

Liverpool Road—Increase, \$8.50.

Mr. DeBlois, we are glad to say, was not away from his charge long

enough to affect our funds. One of his last acts before accepting St. Stephens, N.B., was to send a very respectable remittance to the funds of the Board, and one of his first acts on his return to the Mission was to make a successful canvass of his flock in its behalf. He writes as follows :

"Enclosed I send you a P. O. Order for \$25 as a contribution to the funds of the Board Home Missions, from the 'Liverpool Road Mission.' I need not tell you that this amount represents a great deal of exertion and self-denial on the part of those who have given, and they have tried to evince their increasing interest in the Society's objects by increased subscriptions to its funds, the sum now sent being fully one-half more than that contributed last year. This poor and scattered Mission, embracing twelve stations, and a distance of over twenty miles, is doing its very utmost to support a missionary in its midst, but work as the people may, unless outside help be extended, their efforts, I am afraid, will be in vain. They are now busily occupied in trying to build a small Church at Pleasant River, one of the most populous districts. The small increase, as evinced by our last Church Census, is no doubt owing in a great measure to the fact that these poor and necessitous parts of the Vineyard have been neglected."

Lockeport—Decrease, \$34.17.

This new Mission, which did so well last year, lost its head early in 1882, Mr. Churchward's ill health forcing him to resign and go to a warmer climate. Mr. Croucher, his successor, did not enter upon his duties in time to make a personal canvass for the B. H. M., and was only able to remit \$16.49, but promises to recover lost ground another year.

Londonderry Mines—Decrease, \$1.43. Mr. Harris writes :

"The total amount sent from this Parish for General Purposes is \$43.10—not quite so much as last year. This new Parish has, however, this year contributed to the B. F. M., W. & O. Fund and the Superannuation Fund, so our contributions for extra parochial purposes are much in excess of last year."

Lunenburg—Increase, \$134.92.

The splendid increase in the amount sent from this Parish is worthy of special notice. Lunenburg is beginning to occupy the position which its numbers and prosperity ought to secure it. Mr. Harris, Dr. Owen's Curate, writes:

"Enclosed please find cheque for \$169 (one hundred and sixty-nine dollars), the amount raised by subscription in this Parish for the funds of Board of Home Missions. We held a public missionary meeting on Wednesday evening, 13th December, at which Rev. Mr. Gelling, of Bridgewater, and Rev. Mr. Sutherland, of Mahone Bay, Hon. C. E. Kaulbach and myself spoke on the subject of missions, bringing the matter as forcibly and as pointedly as possible before the people. Collectors were then sent out, with the above result. The amount this year, I am happy to say, largely exceeds any former year. Many gave largely at the offertory collections Thanksgiving Day, thinking that was the collection for the year. The whole amount given by Lunenburg this year is \$239.70. Will you please publish in the Report the amounts of the two collections, and thus show the total from this Parish? Rev. Mr. Owen told me to-day he would send you an order for \$31.60, the amount of the "Trinity" collection. The Report will then show as follows:—Subscriptions, per names, \$169; Offertory Trinity Sunday, June 4, \$31.60; Offertory Thanksgiving, Nov. 9, \$36.10; since received, \$3; total, \$239.70."

Mahone Bay—Decrease, \$7.27. Mr. Snyder writes as follows :

“Enclosed please find P. O. Order for seventy-six dollars and thirteen cents (\$76.13), being the amount contributed to date by my parishioners towards the funds of the B. H. M. Had the Reports been forwarded earlier, and had not the Curate (Mr. Sutherland) been unavoidably absent in Halifax about the time the collections were being made, I am quite sure we should have been able to have added considerably to our last year's subscription. As it is, when the Curate has visited the three most distant stations in the Parish, and a few dollars yet to be collected about the Bay and vicinity have been paid in, we shall still reach and probably exceed the amount sent in last year.”

Mattland—Decrease, \$23.20.

Mr. Jamison succeeded by a personal energetic canvass last year in obtaining a large increase over the previous year, but ill health compelled him to spend some months away from his charge, during which time the collections this year were made. Consequently the Parish did not do so well as last year.

Manchester—Decrease, \$1.41.

Newport—Increase, \$17.67.

This Parish gave a large increase last year, and again this year, with promises of doing still better another year. Mr. How writes :

“I have great pleasure in forwarding \$73.49, the amount of this year's subscriptions to the B. H. M.—an increase over last year's sum by \$17.67. Tho' I feel much gratified at this improvement, I trust we have not yet reached the maximum amount available from this portion of our Blessed Lord's Vineyard. All gave most cheerfully, and the greater number expressed regret that they were really unable to do more. Some I was not able to see and ask. I was particularly pleased at the response to my appeal for greater aid for Algoma. The offertories were increased to \$12.60. These are signs of life for which God the Holy Ghost must be thanked. Please God, with more machinery in operation next year, we may hope to do even a little better, though I know we are to lose by removals in the coming spring *several* who have willingly offered this season. May God bless these givers and grant them grace that they may never grow weary in well-doing.”

New Ross—Increase, \$4.62. Mr. Groser writes as follows :

“We are again *ahead*, to my agreeable surprise, considering how the account stood three weeks ago. We only gave out to the Sunday School the Army Chests, some 27 in number, on October 3th ult., yet realized on the average only one cent short of the whole year's collection in '81. And on inspection and comparison with last year's Report you will detect a general improvement in the enclosed list, the General Collection in which more than equals the gross total of last year. Mrs. Groser and I hunted up every available person in the distant Dalhousie Settlement, and the array of names shows with what result. In my humble opinion, the Executive Committee will do well to spare no pains in getting the Army Chest system on a practical basis in every nook and corner of the Diocese. It is simply astonishing to note what an easy yet effectual barrier it would present to the *wasting* or leakage of money in Christian homes. Next year (now begun) I purpose scattering the boxes all around our Mission. Last year I had to newly seat the church here, then to provide two new stoves and look after other expenses; still our return to B. H. M. shows a marked increase,

and my salary return is, I believe, the largest ever sent in by this Mission at any past time."

Parrsboro'—Decrease, \$13.27.

Last year this Parish showed a large and unexpected decrease over the previous year, and, unhappily, this year it has sent in a less amount than last year.

Petite Riviere—Same as last year.

Pictou—Decrease, \$13.75.

Pictou has not improved on last year, as its Rector hoped it would. Perhaps another year it may make amends.

Port Medway—\$36.67.

This Parish was vacant last year and gave nothing. Mr. Parkinson, late of Shelburne, is now its Rector, and the receipts have been as above. Mr. Parkinson writes as follows:

"With this I hand you a P. O. Order for \$36.67, being the amount subscribed by this Parish for B. H. M. I could wish it had been larger, and also that it had been sent sooner, but in both particulars I have done my utmost to secure a return sooner and also a better subscription. I will place before you one or two reasons why matters stand as they do: First, the condition of the Parish, without a priest for many months; next, and chiefly, the time at which the subscription has been asked for, viz., three months too soon (*i. e.*, for the purses). I wish I knew any way in which I could impress the B. H. M. Committee that the former time of collecting (*i. e.*, January to March) gave the shore Parishes some hope of really making a reasonable offering. Now, I verily believe that many give nothing and will never give because just at the time it is asked they have none to give. I have worked very hard in the worst of weather to get what I have now to send. The collectors have done all they could. The list I enclose shows the result. It is true it more than doubles the last return made hence, but if March could have been waited for I believe at least three times as much would have been realized."

Pugwash—Decrease, \$18.60.

This Parish was vacant for nearly the whole year, and to that may be attributed the large decrease as shown above. The Rev. C. P. Wilson is now in charge, and his exertions, with the railway now being built, will, it is hoped, make a material improvement another year.

Bawdon—Increase, \$1.45.

River John—Increase, \$7.77.

Sackville—Increase, \$21.08.

This Parish has nearly doubled its contributions of last year, and promises to do yet better another year.

Seaforth—Increase, \$0.10.

Sydney, C. B.—Increase, \$9.12.

This Parish sent last year an increase over the year previous, and this year shows a still further increase. Mr. Smith writes:

"We have made this year the largest remittance since 1874, and I have little doubt that we shall do better next year."

Sydney Mines and North Sydney, C. B.—Increase, \$22.60.

The new Rector, Mr. Bambrick, and his people, have shown their interest in the Fund by sending in the largest amount received from these Parishes, with the promise of better things another year.

St. Margaret's Bay—\$33.67.

This Parish has made no returns for several years. It has now come in again, and as "times" are better with them the missionary hopes to increase the amount another year. He writes :

"I send you list of names, and hope next year, by making a personal canvass through the whole Parish, to do much better."

Shelburne—Increase, \$13.06.

Notwithstanding the large increase of last year, Shelburne has again sent a considerable increase, and the Curate writes that but for Dr. White's and his own illness the amount would have been much larger.

Ship Harbor—No returns.

This is the first time for many years that no returns have been received from Ship Harbor.

Spring Hill—No returns.

This Parish has been vacant for a time, and the Incumbent sick for some months before he went away.

Tangier—Increase, \$40.74.

Mr. Ball succeeded to the charge of this Parish a few months ago, and has given abundant evidence here as at Spring Hill that he will do all in his power to forward the interests of the B. H. M. The receipts this year are more than double the whole amount sent last year, and the Missionary expects to remit a larger amount next year.

Truro—Increase \$0.82.**Weymouth**—Increase, \$24.87.

This Parish forwarded last year an amount considerably in excess of the previous year, and this year it has also sent in a large increase over last year. Mr. Filleul and his people have the true Missionary spirit.

Wilmot—Nothing.**Windsor**—Increase, \$57.36.

Dr. Maynard was able to send last year a large increase over the previous year. This year his people have nobly responded to his appeal, and have sent the very large increase as above for General Purposes, besides a large amount for the W. & O. and other Funds. Dr. Maynard writes :

"You will receive probably by to night's mail from my Parish to B. H. M. the sum of \$301.16. When I wrote you a few days since I thought \$250 would be about as much as we could get together, but I am very happy to say that my expectations are exceeded. It gives me great pleasure to send this handsome sum."

The Churchwarden, Mr. Geo. C. Wilcox, in remitting the amount, says :—
"Enclosed please find a list of the subscriptions to the Mission Funds of our

Church for the year from this Parish; also, a draft on Halifax Bank for the amount, \$301.16, which is one hundred dollars more than last year, or 50% increase. A great effort has been made to support the Fund, and considering the very large sum (\$6,000) just subscribed by the few Church people here to the "New Church Building Fund," I think the Parish of Windsor has done well this year."

Windsor Forks—Increase, \$2.60.

Yarmouth—Decrease, \$10.00.

Yarmouth always gives largely. A small decrease this year is accounted for by Mr. Moody, who writes as follows:

"Enclosed please find a draft on my agents at Halifax for \$175; also, a cheque for \$109.55; total, \$284.55, which please credit us with for Home Missions. I have kept it in hand several days, hoping to make up \$300. You will notice several gaps in our list, made by dilatory ones. When they pay up I will remit with directions. One of our liberal ones who gave us \$20 last year is now in California, but is expected to return next month. Yarmouth has raised for extra parochial work during 1882 (and in addition to that which a few subscribed for King's College) thus: Offertory for King's College running expenses, \$34; Offertory to Lockeport, \$38; Offertory to Algoma, \$35; Collection for Algoma, \$70; Offertory for W. & O., \$8.67; Collections for Home Missions, \$284.55; total, \$460.22. I hope you will present us with an encouraging list."


