## WON'T LEAVE LONDON

KING OF ENGLISH DOORS LOVES  
THE OLD FASHIONS.

Thomas Davey Excludes French From  
His Menu and Is Firmly Decided  
That "One Cockney Is Best"  
He Is Seventy-One Years of Age  
and the Most Celebrated Cook in  
the Metropolis.

On Easter Eve of the year 1867  
Thomas Davey stepped out of the Old  
Rainbow Tavern, Fleet Street, London,  
to take a vacation. The next  
morning at eleven o'clock, instead of  
carrying out this threat, he donned a  
white apron in that ancient Atrium  
of healthy appetites known through-  
out the world as "Simpson's-in-the-  
Strand." At that moment he came  
into his own; and it is still his own,  
and although the throne from which  
he holds sway as chef of the mighty  
Simpson's is situated two stories be-  
low ground, in a little six by six snug  
garage of an office, he ranks with King  
Nicholas of Montenegro, who rules  
from many stories above ground in  
his mountain fastnesses, as one of the  
most powerful monarchs of the world.

On the thirty-first of July "Davey," he  
best the "Thames" for a menu of  
seventy-one years of age, the same  
as King Nicholas. And again to  
draw a comparison with the Balkan  
ruler, he holds his despotic sceptre  
with an arm that is unshaken by age  
and yet with a democracy that has  
brought all the great London Bohemians  
of the last half century to bend  
the knee before his chef d'oeuvre of  
culinary art.

Did I say chef d'oeuvre? Davey  
would not be guilty of such a  
claim. There is not a French word in  
Simpson's bill of fare, and Davey is a  
Simpson's bill of fare, and Davey is a

believer in the contents cordial only  
to the extent of having the choicest  
burgundies, clares, and Chablis listed  
on the early de vin "wine list" it is  
called as Simpson's.

Davey's motto is that "good Eng-  
lish food is food." He has a nega-  
tive contempt for the menus of Paris  
and Berlin which have found their  
way into many parts of the British  
metropolis. As he expressed it in his  
unshaken Cockney "for Davey's is  
born well within the sound of Bow  
Bells." "We a man eats makes a  
man. Well, look at them Frenchies  
downstairs, they're all fat and  
Englishmen. That makes it "One  
cockney for me!"

His reverence of his motto in his daily life has brought him  
retundity of figure.

Davey's rotundity is scarcely sur-  
prising; for Davey's menu for Davey  
is not slender once. His eyes twink-  
le and more merrily than a man who  
hot-hot soup, which is mutton  
juice with chopped parsley and  
cream, then some salmon with hot-  
hot sauce, or "a bit of white fish,"  
these merely as appetizers; the real  
hunger allayer is to roast chicken  
and bath chap, which is cured pig's  
face, or some roast duckling and  
"and then," said Davey, "I'm  
should top off with some currant and  
raspberry tart with lemon peddling  
and cream, with a variety of bladders  
roses on toast." This, with some "stout  
and bitter," and fine old tawny port.

Because of Davey's distinctively  
English menu he has an enormous fol-  
lowing of foreigners, and in running  
the restaurant is crowded with Amer-  
icans. When the "old Simpson's"  
hall before the house-breaker nine  
years ago and a new, and palatial  
Simpson's rose phoenix-like from the  
ashes, Davey perceptibly constituted the  
old traditions, and the joints still  
so ground on wheeled trays to each  
guest, the coffee is just the same,  
and the old romance is still there,

again enlarged to meet the require-  
ments.

Many attempts have been made,  
especially to lure Davey away. Great  
restaurants have vied in offers for his  
services, asking him to "name his  
own price." And then Davey, who  
Simpsonites have gone down the two  
stairs of stairs to wait with bated  
breath for Davey's decision. But at  
Davey explained, with just a sur-  
prise of a quaver in his voice, "a sur-  
vivor of a century ago, when I was still  
young and foolish, they might have  
tempted me. But it's too late now.  
And as an Englishman, I'm still able  
to back my cooking against that of  
any man in the world."
