PRESBYTERY OF LONDON.

REPORT

STATISTICS AND FINANCES.

OUR Committee, in presenting their Annual Report on Statistics and Finances, beg leave to submit the following summary. In doing so, they would not fail to acknowledge the good hand of God towards us during the year, in the measure of success that has attended our efforts as a Presbytery. Numerous additions were made to the roll of membership, and our people in general manifest a sustained interest in the support of ordinances at home and abroad. It is to be regretted, however, that not a few of them habitually shrink from bearing anything like a proportionate share of the financial burdens of the Church. It is to be hoped that the revived attention now given to the subject of systematic beneficence may serve to bring these delinquents into line with the recommendations of the Church anent this important duty. The Presbytery of London is composed of 33 pastoral charges, 15 of these consisting of one and 18 of two congregations each; making in all 53 congregations. Of this number 2 have made only a partial report, while 8 have made no report. The last named, however, were vacant at the time. Such omissions, no doubt, account largely for apparent deficit in several departments of finance. Two thousand seven hundred and two families are reported, and 298 single persons not connected with families. There are 5,082 communicants, of which 661 were added during the year - 478 by profession and 183 by certificate. Such numbers indicate an advance over the previous year. Baptism was administered to 279 persons during the year, of which 67 were adults. There are 168 elders and 281 other office-bearers, which leaves an average of 18 families to each elder, and 9 to the other office-bearers. Nearly one half of the members

are reported as attending prayer meetings; in all 1,384, or 123 in advance of last year. But why not the other half, or at least a fair proportion of them? Four thousand two hundred and twelve attend Sabbath School and Bible Class instruction. The number of teachers reported is 414. These schools are furnished with 1,262 more volumes of religious literature than was reported for previous years. As the subject of missions is now engrossing the attention of Christian nations in an unwonted measure, it will be gratifying to learn that our own Presbytery has caught something of the flame, as there are no less than 32 Societies within our bounds devoting their efforts more or less intently to that cause—16 of these are Missionary Associations and 24 Woman's Foreign Missionary Societies. If only animated by love to Christ, such multiplied agencies must exert a powerful influence for good.

FINANCES.

There was raised in all for stipend \$22,760, making an average of \$8.42 per family, and \$4.48 per member. In this important department we stand .10 per family below the general average of the whole Church, and .8 per member above it. The total raised for congregational purposes was \$50,003, some \$946 in excess of previous year: leaving an average of \$18.50 per family, and \$9.84 per member. In both these items also we are below the general average \$1.02 per family, and 39 cents per member. The aggregate contribution for schemes of the Church was \$9,567, making an average of \$3.54 per family, and \$1.88 per member. In these we rise above the general average 12 cents per family, and 8 cents per member. Of this total sum distribution was made in the following proportion: To College Fund (ordinary and special), \$812; Home Missions, \$1,977; Augmentation, \$934; French Evangelization, \$903; Foreign Missions, \$3,919; Aged and Infirm Ministers' Fund, \$560; Widows and Orphans' Fund, \$264; Assembly Fund, \$198. These numbers indicate an advance of \$681 over previous year. For all purposes \$63,984 was raised, as against \$62,451 for year ending 1887, or an excess of \$1,533. The average per family of this aggregate is \$23 31, and per member, \$12.59. In this total also we are \$1.09 per family, and 27 cents per member, below the general average.

As will appear from the appended table, 21 congregations in our Presbytery rise above the general average in stipend, while 12 are below it. For congregational purposes, schemes and all purposes, 10 only are above, while 23 are below. Such is

the relative liberality of reporting congregations. liberality as a Presbytery stands thus: Out of the 42 Presbyteries in our Church, 21 are above us per family and per communicant in the matter of stipend; for congregational purposes, 16 per family and 19 per communicant; for schemes, 5 per family and 6 per communicant; for all purposes, 13 per family and 14 per communicant. It may be stated in brief that while the aggregate contributions of the present year are \$1,533 in excess of the sum reported for 1887, yet the rate of increase has not been equal to that of said year, nor have we kept pace with the advance of the Church as a whole; for at no period since the union in 1875 have the material resources of our Church been developed at so rapid a ratio as during the year ending 1888, being nearly \$16,000 above the increase of the preceding year. May the zeal of others provoke us to devise more liberal things; that while we seek to excel in other gifts, we may not fail to abound in this grace also.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

1st. That in terms of the injunctions of the General Assembly, all vacant congregations, as well as those having settled pastors, be instructed through their sessions to report accurately both their statistics and finances.

and That, in view of the manifest disparity in the relative liberality of congregations, the Committee on Systematic Beneficence be encouraged in their efforts to commend the principles and methods of Scriptural giving.
