## Eclipses for the Year 1849.

This year there will be two Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. An Eclipse of the Sun on the 22d February—invisible.

II. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, on Thursday, March 8th:—

Middle of eclipse, . . . . . 7	56	
Eclipse ends, . . . . . 9	26	

Duration of Eclipse, three hours.

III. Total Eclipse of the Sun, August 18, invisible in Canada. This eclipse will be visible to a small portion of the south east of Africa, and more than one half of Australia.

IV. Partial eclipse of the Moon, September 2d, invisible.

*Apogee*—The greatest distance from the earth. *Perigee*—The least distance from the earth. *Aphelion*—The greatest distance from the sun. *Perihelion*—The least distance from the Sun. *Digit*—One-twelfth part of the diameter of the Sun or Moon.

## Queen and Royal Family.

THE QUEEN.—Victoria, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, was born 24th May, 1819; succeeded to the Throne, 20th June, 1837, on the death of her uncle, King William IV; crowned, 28th June, 1838, and married 10th Feb., 1840, to His Royal Highness Prince Albert, named below. Her Majesty is the only daughter of His late Royal Highness Edward, Duke of Kent, son of King Geo. III.

His Royal Highness Francis Albert Augustus Charles Emanuel, Duke of Saxe, Prince of Cobourg and Gotha, K. G., consort of Her Majesty, born 26th August, 1819.

Her Royal Highness, Victoria Adelaide Mary Louisa, Princess Royal, born 21st November, 1840.

His Royal Highness, Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, born 9th November, 1841.

Her Royal Highness, Alice Mand Mary, born April 25, 1843.

His Royal Highness, Alfred Ernest Albert, born Aug. 6, 1844.

Her Royal Highness, Princess Helena Augusta Victoria, born 25th May, 1846.

Her Royal Highness, Princess Louise Carolina Alberta, born 18th March, 1848.

The Queen Dowager—Amelia Adelaide Louisa Theresa, born 13th August, 1792. Married 11th July, 1818. Crowned 8th September, 1831.

Duchess of Kent, mother of Her Majesty, born 17th August, 1786.

*Fire and water-proof Cement.*—To half a pint of milk, put an equal quantity of vinegar, in order to curdle it; then separate the curd from the whey and mix the whey with 4 or 5 eggs, beating the whole well together.

When it is well mixed, add a little quicklime through a sieve, until it has acquired the consistence of thick paste. With this cement, broken vessels and cracks of all kinds may be mended.

*Tooth-Ache.*—Put a piece of lime, about the size of a walnut, into a quart bottle of water; with this rinse the mouth two or three times a day, and cleanse the teeth, using the water every morning. If it tastes strong,

dilute it, for it should be just strong enough to taste the lime.

*To render Boots water-proof.*—Boiled oil, 16 parts; turpentine, (spirits), 2 parts; bee's wax, 1 part; resin, 1 part; turpentine, (Venice), 2 parts. Melt, and use hot.

**Beeswax.**—The neatest way to separate beeswax from the comb, is to tie it in a piece of linen or woollen cloth or bag, with a pebble or two to keep it from floating; place it in a kettle of cold water, which is hung over the fire; as the water heats, the wax melts and rises to the surface, while all the impurities remain in the bag.

Obtain good seed, prepare your ground well, sow early, and pay very little attention to the moon.

## District Courts, U. C.

In each District of Western Canada, there is established by statute, a Court, which is presided over by one Judge, who must have been a Barrister of five years standing. The jurisdiction of the Court is entirely confined to civil matters, and is limited to

£50, currency, in cases of Notes of Hand, &c., and to £25, currency, in cases of open accounts. The forms of procedure are similar to those in use in the Court of Queen's Bench, and each case is submitted to a Jury.

TERMS:—5th to 10th March; 4th to 9th June; 22nd to 27th October; and 3rd to 8th December.

SITTINGS—Same as Quarter Sessions.

#### **Court of Quarter Sessions, U. C.**

This Court is held Quarterly in each District, and by adjournment from time to time, for a period not exceeding 30 days. The Judge of the District Court is *ex officio* Chairman of the Quarter Sessions, who, together with one or more magistrates of the District constitute the Court. The Court has jurisdiction over all cases of Larceny, Misdemeanor, and other minor offences. Trials are by Jury. To this Court is also confided the granting of Tavern Licenses in the respective Districts, the auditing of certain Public Accounts relating to the Administration of Justice in the District, &c. SITTINGS—Tuesday, 2d January, Tuesday, 3rd April, Tuesday 3rd July, and Tuesday, 20th November.

**District Councils.**—The ordinary meetings of these bodies are held twice a year, commencing on the first Tuesdays in the months of February and October; the duration of each Meeting is restricted to a period not exceeding nine days (Sundays excepted.)

#### **Terms of the Court of Queen's Bench.**

HILARY commences on the first Monday in February, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

EASTER TERM on the second Monday in June, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

TRINITY, on the last Monday in July, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

MICHAELMAS, on the first Monday in November, and ends on the Saturday of the following week.

The TERM COURT, in which Law points and other matters of practice are settled, always precedes the time of holding the Quarter Sessions, and the District Court as follows: that is, the terms of the District Court, severally commence on the Monday in the week next but three preceeding the week, and at the place in which the Sessions are holden, ending on Saturday of same week.
